DANEHILL FILLY TOPS TATTERSALLS DAY II

David and Patricia Thompson's locally based Cheveley Park Stud topped day two of the Tattersalls October Yearling Sale yesterday when paying 575,000gns for a Danehill filly out of Jiving (GB) (Generous {Ire}), a half sister to the dams of Breeders' Cup heroine Banks Hill (GB) (Danehill) and G1 Atto Mile winner Leroidesanimaux (Brz) (Candy Stripes). Castleton Lyons owner Dr. Tony Ryan, founder of budget airline Ryanair, sold the filly, cataloged as lot **320**. Michael Youngs was the underbidder and Frank Stronach was also involved in the bidding. "The market for these well-bred

fillies has been tough and I'm delighted to have got her," said Cheveley Park managing director Chris Richardson. "She's a lovely filly with a proper pedigree and there are not many more of these Danehills. She'll go to Sir Michael Stoute." Pegasus Farms manager Herve Barjot was another in the market for blueblooded fillies. Barjot went to 475,000gns to secure a Sadler's Wells filly out of G1 Canadian International heroine Infamy (GB) (Shirley Heights {GB}). Lady Chryss O'Reilly's representative Henri Bozo was underbidder. "She is most likely to race for a syndicate, but I don't even know which country she will be trained in," said Barjot. Coolmore agent Demi O'Byrne's purchases included a 400,000gns Alhaarth (Ire) half brother to Grade 3 winner Bonus (Ire) (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) consigned through Camas Park Stud, while the same price was paid by trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam for a Montjeu (Ire) colt who cost 95,000gns as a foal last November. "He's been bought for one of my oldest-established clients who does not want to be named," said Chapple-Hyam. Maktoum family purchases were headed by a 300,000gns Kyllachy (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) half brother to G1 Fillies' Mile winner Nannina (Ire) (Danehill) bought by Shadwell's racing manager Angus Gold and sold by Tony O'Callaghan's Tally-Ho Stud. NETJETS MILE, \$1,500,000, 3yo/up, 1mT

Funfair (GB) (Singspiel {Ire}) and **Artie Schiller** (El Prado {Ire}), first and second, respectively, in Sunday's GII Kelso BC H., will renew their rivalry in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 29 at Belmont Park, according to connections yesterday. "He came out of the race in great shape," said Funfair's trainer Graham Motion. "He hasn't done anything wrong to this point." Kelso runner-up Artie Schiller was also reported in good shape following a head loss. "Laying close to that pace probably didn't help him stick it out in the stretch," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens, explaining his colt's loss. "He probably didn't see the other horse coming on the inside. He's very game and I was very happy with his race."

BESSEMER TRUST JUVENILE, \$1,500,000, 2yo, c, 1 1/16m

Sunday's GII Norfolk S. hero **Brother Derek** (Benchmark) is being pointed toward the Juvenile, confirmed conditioner Dan Hendricks. "If everything goes well in the next three weeks, we're there," said Hendricks. "But if he's got a hiccup of any kind, we'll just go to the Cal Cup [Juvenile, at Santa Anita Nov. 6]." Hendricks has had one previous Breeders' Cup starter, Grey Slewpy, who ran 11th behind Thirty SLEWS in the 1992 renewal of the Sprint.

OWNER JACKSON FILES SUIT AGAINST EX-ADVISORS

California wine magnate Jess Jackson has filed suit in California Superior Court in San Diego against three former advisors, charging them with fraudulent misrepresentation, breach of fiduciary duty, and unjust enrichment in the purchase of horses both privately and at public sales.

Named in the suit, filed by Jackson and his operating entities of Four Star Stables and Stonestreet Thoroughbred Holdings, are bloodstock agent Emmanuel de Seroux and his companies Narvick International and Continental Bloodstock; trainer Bruce Headley; and Brad Martin.

Jackson, founder of Kendall-Jackson Wine Estates, began making a big splash in Thoroughbred purchases in 2003, and has subsequently bought not only tens of millions of dollars worth of bloodstock, but farms as well, including the former Buckram Oak Farm near Lexington and Adena Springs near Versailles.

The suit, dated Sept. 22, alleges that the "defendants acted pursuant to a conspiracy to defraud Jackson." Jackson claims that Headley was hired by him to advise "what horses he should bid on and purchase and what prices he should pay," while Martin "also participated in the process of selecting and bidding and encouraged and recommended horses to be bid upon as well as prices..." **For complete story, click [here](#).**

DOYEN RETIRED TO DALHAM STUD English champion **Doyen (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells--Moon Cactus {GB}, by Kris {GB}) has been retired and will stand the 2006 season at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in

Newmarket, England. A fee will be announced later this autumn. Winner of the G3 Prix du Lys and second in the G2 Prix Niel at Longchamp at three, the bay started off his four-year-old campaign with a runner-up finish in the G1 Coronation Cup. Ready to step it up a notch, the colt reeled off consecutive victories in Ascot's G2 Hardwicke S. and G1 King George and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and capped off the year by collecting the English Highweight Older Horse title over 11-14 furlongs. Unplaced in three starts this year, Doyen retires with five wins from 14 starts and earnings of \$1,302,823. "At his best, he was just about as good as they get," said Sam Bullard, head of nominations at Darley. "And he's really a good looking horse too, and one with a magnificent pedigree. We were fortunate to stand In The Wings, who was a tremendous stallion son of Sadler's Wells, and we're hopeful Doyen, who's right out of the Monjeu mould, can do even better." Doyen, whose sister Moonshell won the English Oaks and ran third in the 1000 Guineas in only her second career start, is out of group winner and G1 French Oaks runner-up Moon Cactus.

SONG CARRIES ON The Elite Racing Club's **Soviet Song (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) will race on in 2006, connections announced yesterday. After suffering a stop-start campaign this term, retirement had been touted for the five-year-old multiple Group 1 heroine, but the James Fanshawe-trained mare will be back for another campaign centered around winning Newmarket's G1 Falmouth S. at the July meeting for the third consecutive year. "She came back this year and looked as good as ever, so the decision has been made to keep her in training," Racing Manager Matthew Budden said yesterday. "It's a bold move, but hopefully it will pay off and there is a lot more to look forward to. We bred Soviet Song ourselves and the plan is hopefully to retain her for our own program, but essentially, the Club is about racing--when you've got one as good as her, and there are plenty of good races for mares, it can pay to keep them in training. The Falmouth is a chief target again and hopefully we'll have a clean run with her next year."

SONGANDAPRAYER COLT TOPS FASIG-

TIPTON The Fasig-Tipton Midlantic Eastern Fall Yearling Sale, held this year with three sessions instead of two, concluded yesterday in Timonium, Maryland with positive results. Topping the session, and the sale, was hip 876, a Songandaprayer colt out of the winning Fortunate Prospect mare Tobin's Fortune. Named Tobin's Bobcat, the Paramount Sales consignee was purchased by Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables. Neither Jackson nor his bloodstock advisor, John Moynihan, were able to attend yesterday, but both were on the phone with Fasig-Tipton officials as the topper went through the ring. "He's a beautiful horse," explained Moynihan after securing the bay. "He looks early, looks fast. He's probably the best Songandaprayer I've seen. He was the standout of the sale, but would have been a standout at any sale." Last year's two-day edition of the sale saw nine horses realize \$100,000 or more, compared with 26 over this year's three-day stand, and with average up 7.7 percent--from \$21,889 to \$23,577--sale officials were pleased. "We are delighted with the results," said Fasig-Tipton's Terence Collier. "We've been worried about supply and demand all year, but with a lot of big numbers coming late in the sale, we proved that the supply of quality yearlings is still met eagerly by demand."

FIT TO FIGHT PENSIONED Lane's End stallion **Fit to Fight** (Chieftain--Hasty Queen II, by One Count) has been pensioned from stallion duty due to old age, reports *The Blood-Horse*. The 26-year-old is scheduled to be retired to Blue Ridge Farm in Virginia, where fellow Lane's End pensioners Lord Avie and Miner's Mark currently reside. Bred by Robert Courtney and Robert Congleton in Kentucky, **Fit to Fight** was a three-time Grade I winner on the track who had his best season as a five-year-old in 1984. In that year, the Paul Mellon colorbearer won four of six starts, including the GI Metropolitan Mile, GI Brooklyn H. and GI Suburban H. **Fit to Fight** was retired to stand at Lane's End in 1985 with a record of 14 wins from 26 starts and earnings of over \$1 million. At stud, **Fit to Fight** was represented by 33 stakes winners and the earners of over \$37 million, including Grade I winners Key Contender and **Fit to Scout**, multiple graded-stakes winner **Fit For a Queen**, and this year's GIII Withers S. winner and GI Preakness S. runner-up **Scrappy T**.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

MINISTER ERIC RETIRED **Minister Eric** (Old Trieste--Musical Minister, by Deputy Minister), winner of the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. in February,
