REMATCH IN THE CHAMPAGNE

First Samurai (Giant's Causeway) looks to remain perfect in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont after easily defeating **Henny Hughes** (Hennessy) and **Too Much**

Bling (Rubiano) in the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Aug. 27. First Samurai crossed the line 4 1/4 lengths clear that day, but raced greenly in the stretch. "I think he is just a very green, immature colt," trainer Frank Brothers commented. "Actually in his first three races he has done a couple little quirky things. Hopefully I think as he goes down the line,

he will learn his lesson and run straight." Henny Hughes, an impressive winner of the Tremont S. and the GII Saratoga Special S., suffered his first career defeat in the Hopeful. "On the day First Samurai was better than us," trainer Patrick Biancone said. "He just ran faster than we did." The Darley colorbearer has trained forwardly since the Hopeful, posting bullets in four out of five of his workouts, including a :47 1/5 over the Saratoga training track Oct. 4. "He's trained very well since the Hopeful," Biancone added. "We've started to press on him a little bit now. I'm very happy with him."

BREEDERS' FUTURITY DRAWS A FULL FIELD

A wide-open field of 14 will line up at Keeneland today for the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity S. Claiborne Farm's **Laity** (Pulpit) could only manage a seventh-place finish in his debut at Churchill June 25, but has really come of age since. He graduated in his next start at Arlington Aug. 5, then dominated his rivals in the Cradle S. at River Downs by 11 3/4 lengths Sept. 5. The bay must overcome the 12-hole to keep the winning streak alive. **High Cotton** (Dixie Union), trained by Todd Pletcher, received a 92 Beyer Speed Figure in a six-furlong Belmont maiden special weight tally Sept. 17. Robby Albarado will be aboard the \$110,000 KEESep yearling purchase for his first attempt versus winners. The most accomplished runner in the group makes his first start in this country after making nine starts overseas. **Cool Creek (Ire)** made five starts versus group competition in Europe and came home victorious in his latest, taking the G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury Sept. 17. The bay makes his dirt debut here with the addition of Lasix. **Field, p3**

Fisher Debutante S. Aug. 20. She was a game second in the Pepsi Bassinet S. at River Downs last time Sept. 3 and was the fourth choice to take her two-turn debut here. Sent right to the lead from the nine hole, the bay cut out :23 4/5 and :48 1/5 fractions and reported home to a comfortable victory. "She's a fantastic filly with a lot of stamina," commented winning trainer Vickie Foley. "I knew she wouldn't have any trouble going two turns."

Bobby Frankel will saddle a pair of talented imports, Australian standout **Alinghi** and ex-European **Three Valleys**. Alinghi, who captured a clutch of Group 1 races in her native land despite bleeding troubles, added Lasix for her U.S. bow in the GIII Ballston Spa Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 29 at Saratoga and came away with a smooth success. She beat the boys regularly in Australia and should make her presence felt here. Her stable-mate was a hard-charging winner of the GII Del Mar Breeders' Cup H. Sept. 4 in his last start. **Durban Thunder**, an unbeaten Group 1 winner in Brazil, is perfect in four starts on turf, including both of his outings in this country. The bay was a rallying winner of the Kentucky Cup Dash Sept. 24 and will be flying at the finish. Shipping over from Ireland is **Ad Valorem**, who capped an unbeaten juvenile campaign in the G1 Middle Park S. last October. In his first start this year, the bay ran second to Shamardal in the G1 St. James's Palace S. June 14, finishing ahead of Oratorio (Ire). He ran fifth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat July 3, but rebounded to take third in the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood July 27, behind the highly regarded pair of Proclamation (Ire) and Soviet Song (Ire).

DUBAWI RETIRED Godolphin's **Dubawi (Ire)** (Dubai Millennium {GB}--Zomaradah {GB}, by Deploy {GB}) has sustained an injury to a hind ligament and been retired, it was announced yesterday. The homebred was being geared up for a tilt at the Oct. 29 G1 Breeders' Cup Mile at Belmont, where he was due to renew rivalry with his G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. conqueror **Starcraft (NZ)** (Soviet Star). Trainer Saeed bin Suroor paid tribute yesterday. "He was a great racehorse by a great stallion," he said. "We are going to miss him at Godolphin--he was the best three-year-old we had. Dubawi showed his class before he raced--he always had plenty of speed--which gave me the confidence that he would be a good horse. He is a very relaxed horse, very quiet. He concentrated and focused on his work--he wanted to be the star and he was. I am sure he is going to take his place among the best stallions in the world." Dubawi was one of many Dubai Millenniums to make an instant impact at two, but he soon established himself as his finest progeny when taking the G3 Superlative S. at Newmarket in July and G1 National S. at The Curragh in September. He lost his unbeaten tag when only fifth in the Apr. 30 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, but rebounded to beat Oratorio (Ire) in the Irish equivalent back at The Curragh three weeks later. He failed to see out the 12 furlongs of the June 4 G1 Epsom Derby and finished third before beating a field including Whipper, Valixir (Ire) and Divine Proportions in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois back over a mile at Deauville Aug. 14. His half-length defeat by Starcraft in the QEII at Newmarket on his last start Sept. 24 was the subject of intense scrutiny, as he had crossed over from the center of the track to launch his challenge late on. Jockey Frankie Dettori believes he was unfortunate not to cap his record with a win. "Dubawi was a real champion as a two-year-old and won a Classic for me this year--that performance in the Irish 2000 Guineas was probably his best run," he commented. "He gave me a fantastic ride in the Derby and proved how good he was by winning the Prix Jacques le Marois and was unlucky not to win the Queen Elizabeth II Stakes. He was a great horse to be around, very tough and very good. He had excellent cruising speed and a tremendous turn of foot. Dubawi achieved a lot during his career but there is plenty more that he could have done." Dubawi retires with a career record of 8-5-1-1 and earnings of \$1,325,125.

"An agreement has been reached with the Japan Racing Association for...Bago to stand in Japan at the end of his racing career," racing manager Alan Cooper told *Racing Post*. "In the meantime, Bago continues his race program with the Breeders' Cup and the Japan Cup as his last objectives before retiring." Now four, Bago was a perfect four-for-four as a juvenile, with wins in the G3 Prix des Chenes and G1 Criterium International. The bay opened 2004

with victories in the G1 Prix Jean Prat and G1 Grand Prix de Paris before suffering his first defeat when third in the G1 Juddmonte International. Third again in the G2 Prix Niel, he came back to win the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Bago opened this season with a win in the G1 Prix Ganay, then was second in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup before finishing third in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud, G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and when defending his title in the Oct. 2 Arc. Overall, he has eight wins, a second and five thirds from his 14 career starts for earnings of £1,483,828. It has not yet been decided if he will make his next start in the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic or the G1 Breeders' Cup Turf.

TATTERSALLS PART ONE CONCLUDES

Tattersalls's 2005 October Yearling Sale (Part One) posted a 13-percent rise in turnover on 2005 to 59,635,000gns with the 119,509gns average up 16 percent. The median was 70,000gns, level with 2004. "We have seen a number of individual records broken in the course of the last four days with perhaps the most notable being the record aggregate for a European yearling sale by a very wide margin," said Tattersalls Chairman Edmund Mahony. "In addition, the Kingmambo colt out of Last Second was a record price for the sale, and at 1,250,000 guineas, the highest price for a yearling in Europe this year, while the average has comfortably bettered last year's level. Most important, however, has been the overall feel to the sale. There has been a genuine buzz around Park Paddocks from start to finish and the sale format has met with universal approval. After last year's yearling sales we said that we felt the numbers should be controlled more tightly and the decision to cut the numbers and to catalogue alphabetically by dams name throughout the sale has been the key to attracting a greater number of buyers and to keeping them here throughout the week."

Sadler's Wells Filly Tops Final Day...

A 570,000gns Sadler's Wells filly out of G3 Musidora S. winner Time Away (Ire) (Darshaan), offered through Jamie Railton, was kicked off at 200,000gns by Hugo Merry, but he was soon knocked from the bidding, as was Charlie Gordon-Watson when the price went beyond a half-million guineas. Demi O'Byrne, with John Magnier and Michael Tabor, joined the battle shortly thereafter, but ultimately it was trainer John Gosden landing the prized lot on behalf of Ira Gumberg's Skara Glen Stables. O'Byrne had been more successful when outbidding Frank Stronach, then agents Bobby O'Ryan and Peter Doyle to secure a 550,000gns Danehill half-brother to G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Seazun (Ire) (Zieten). "This was a very nice horse with a great pedigree and it's the sad thing is he's the last Danehill yearling colt to be offered. His achievements as a stallion are just extraordinary," said O'Byrne. While the sale's new format of cataloguing alphabetically throughout the week was well received in many quarters, O'Byrne found last year's schedule, beginning with two select days, more manageable. "I personally prefer a select sale, they are easier to work and I was a big fan of the Houghton. I also would rather have a sale with racing attached to it," said the Coolmore agent. "But the quality has been good here and anything I liked took plenty of getting. I've ended up as underbidder a few times." Stronach, buying through Anthony Stroud Bloodstock, later paid 410,000gns for a Montjeu (Ire) colt consigned from Barronstown Stud while a half brother to multiple G1 winner Alexander Goldrun (Ire) (Gold Away {Ire}) by Machiavellian will join Sheikh Mohammed's 2006 juvenile team after a successful 400,000gns bid from John Ferguson.

MARYLAND COMMISSION DELAYS DECISION ON 2006 DATES The Maryland Racing Commission voted Thursday to delay its decision on a racing schedule proposed by Magna Entertainment that would have reduced the number of live racing days in the state from about 200 to 129 next year. Magna owns the Maryland Jockey Club, which operates Laurel Park and Pimlico Race Course. The company had originally come up with a proposal that offered just 94 live dates, then amended that plan to allow for 112 racing days. The revised schedule, which added another 17 dates to the calendar, was put before the MRC Thursday, but the Commission determined that the proposal violated the current contract between Magna and the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, which calls for live racing five days a week. That contract expires next June. Magna had hoped to cut the number of live dates in order to boost purses, which have averaged just over \$190,000 per day this year, to levels competitive with neighboring states that are subsidized by slots revenue. MRC Chairman Thomas McDonough urged MJC President Joe DeFrancis to work with the horsemen to come up with a plan that is satisfactory to all concerned. The Commission meets again Nov. 8; racing dates for 2006 must, by law, be awarded by Dec. 1, 2005.

CHRB Calls for New Weigh-Out Procedures:

The California Horse Racing Board Thursday called for the development of procedures to ensure that horses always carry the correct weight when racing, and that information regarding the actual weight and equipment that each horse carries is made easily available to the betting public. CHRB Chairman John Harris has created a committee to work with owners, trainers, jockeys and racing officials to come up with a plan that will make the weighing process open to public inspection. "The goal...is not to review the riding scale of weights, but rather to make certain that horses are carrying the accurate weights assigned to them, and to fully disclose to the public what weight is being carried," said Commissioner Richard Shapiro, who will chair the committee.
