FIRST AND FOREMOST

First Samurai (Giant's Causeway) solidified his status as the nation's top two-year-old with his victory in the GI Champagne S. at Belmont yesterday, overcoming a valiant **Henny Hughes** (Hennessy) in dire conditions. "He struggled a bit with the track, but it didn't surprise me," said winning rider Jerry Bailey. "He is a big, heavy horse. I didn't think he would bounce through it the first time." The unbeaten winner will make his next appearance in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Oct. 29,

but may ship back to trainer Frank Brothers's Churchill base in the meantime. "He'll probably stay here, but we'll see how he is over the next few days and decide," Brothers said. **Cont. p2**

DAWNING REALIZATION

For the second day in a row at Keeneland, the runner-up in a stakes race at River Downs wired the field as a longshot in the juvenile feature race. On Friday, She Says It Best led throughout in the GII Darley Alcibiades; yesterday **Dawn of War** (Catienus) was an uncontested 36-1 winner of the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity. "It's always nice to have a speed horse at Keeneland," noted winning conditioner Dale Romans,

HOST OF UPSETS

A horse bred in the Southern Hemisphere was expected to win the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland yesterday, but while second choice **Alinghi (Aus)** (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) didn't care for the going, **Host (Chi)** (Hussonet) came flying late in his first start off an eight-month layoff. "When I asked him to run, he just exploded," said winning rider Rafael Bejarano. **Cont. p3**

CHAMPAGNE WISHES First Samurai had displayed both serious talent and greenness in his first three outings. After romping by 5 1/2 lengths in his debut at Churchill July 9, the handsome chestnut traveled up to Saratoga, where he captured an allowance contest Aug. 7 by six lengths despite lugging in in the stretch. Three weeks later, he was the second choice to Henny Hughes in the GI Hopeful S., but answered the class question by besting the favorite by 4 1/4 lengths. He lugged in once again that day, prompting trainer Frank Brothers to change bits and do a bit more work with the colt in the morning. "I thought he was much more professional today," Brothers said. "Maybe the homework we did with him helped him. He rated a little bit today, and Jerry [Bailey] said he ran very straight. That's what we were looking for."

Race Ready...

Breaking from post seven, the odds-on First Samurai was able to secure a perfect spot as **Too Much Bling** (Rubiano) and Henny Hughes scorched through fractions of :21.63 and :43.67. He ranged up on the turn, and for a few strides it looked to be a match race between the two chestnuts. But once again, First Samurai had a bit more in the tank and earned his second Grade I victory. "He came home a little slow, but they went pretty fast in the earlier part," Bailey explained. "We had a helluva tailwind...he struggled a little bit more than I thought he would, but I thought that was a product of them going fast early. He was very good in the gate and he broke well. And he keeps on winning." There was no word immediately after the Champagne as to whether Henny Hughes would point for the Breeders' Cup, but trainer Nick Zito indicated that the third-place finisher **Superfly** (Fusaichi Pegasus) was a go. "We'll go on to the Breeders' Cup Juvenile," said the Hall of Fame conditioner. "He's got a good chance to improve."

A champion juvenile in his native country, Host was named Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old in Chile after winning the G1 Chilean 2000 Guineas by 6 1/4 lengths. The chestnut was shipped to the U.S. at the end of his 2003 campaign and picked up checks in his first four U.S. appearances before earning his first American victory in the GII Knickerbocker H. at Aqueduct last October. He made it two in a row in the Dec. 4 GIII Tropical Turf H. at Calder, but had not been out since running second in the Feb. 12 GIII Appleton H. at Gulfstream. Tossed into a tough spot for his return, Host was unhurried early after an awkward break. He was bumped around in traffic on the first turn before taking the overland route down the backstretch and around the final bend. Adieu won at first asking less than two months after being acquired at the Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, taking an Apr. 22 maiden at Keeneland. In her first round with Folklore, Adieu took the Astoria S. July 3, but wound up fourth to her rival in the GII Adirondack S. on Saratoga's opening day. She took back the advantage by defeating Folklore in the GII Spinaway S. Aug. 25 at the Spa, and stayed in the barn when that filly romped in the GI Matron S. The bay broke from the rail and went at it with unbeaten Mykindasaint (Saint Ballado) for a bit, but conceded the lead to that filly before shifting to the outside. The favorite took charge on the turn and held Along the Sea at bay in the lane. "It looks like the Spinaway and those races are holding up their form very good," Pletcher added. Dawn of War broke his maiden against stakes company in the Canterbury Juvenile S. July 23 and added a River Downs allowance in his next start Aug. 13. Sent off as the 8-5 chalk in the Miller Lite Cradle S., he finished second, beaten 11 3/4 lengths by Laity (Pulpit) Sept. 5. Not given much respect by the Keeneland faithful, the Ramsey homebred broke sharply from the nine hole and cut out :23 4/5 and :48 2/5 fractions, while 3-1 favorite Laity sat in second. Already well clear in the stretch, Dawn of War raced greenly, but maintained his advantage to the wire. Laity tired to finish fifth. "This is the biggest win I have ever had," winning rider John Jacinto commented. "Mr. Romans told me that if I wanted to go to the lead it was OK. My horse is fast and he ran easy." Dawn of War has never finished worse than second in six career starts. "This horse always tries hard," trainer Dale Romans said. "We kind of let Laity get away from us at River Downs. Call him Captain Courageous. Captain Squire looked beaten in the stretch, but summoned all of his back class to prevail in tight finish. Second in this race in 2003, the Florida-bred posted just one win in 2004, an \$80,000 claimer going a mile on the grass. Second to Singletary in the GII San Francisco Breeders' Cup H. at Bay Meadows, he was sidelined following a third-place finish in a turf allowance at Hollywood last June. He didn't make it back to the races until Aug. 24, but the 14-month layoff wasn't a problem as he wired a Del Mar optional claimer by four lengths. Favored here, the six-year-old set out in front and posted fractions of :21 and :43 1/5. Though he was getting leg weary, Captain Squire fought back when Zanzibar headed him and got his nose down on the wire. "I'm sure he was tired, but he has such a big heart...he fought him to the end," said winning rider Alex Solis. Heavy rains forced Belmont track officials to take this contest off of the turf and to run in it on the main track instead, causing the field to be decimated. The two main-track only entrants, Watchmon and Crown Point, drew in and wound up with the top two spots.

Watchmon broke his maiden at the rarely run distance of 1 7/16 miles over a sloppy track at Gulfstream Apr. 8. Following a second against older allowance horses May 22 at Belmont, the grey tried the GI Belmont S. June 11, but wound up a distant ninth in that 12-furlong event and was given some time off. He resurfaced with a 6 1/4-length win in a seven-furlong allowance at Saratoga Aug. 27 and followed that with another allowance victory, this one over 8 1/2 panels at Belmont Sept. 17. Watchmon came away well and raced alongside Woodlander down the backstretch. After putting his head in front on the turn, the favorite disposed of the pacesetter and was never seriously threatened by Crown Point for his first stakes victory. "I'm lucky I've got an owner that allows me to do what I need to do," said winning trainer Patrick Reynolds. "We called an audible at the last minute...that's 300,000 'skippies' they hung up there. It was too much to pass."

Singletery trailed this field for the opening three-quarters of a mile, but rallied widest of all into the stretch and reported home an easy winner in the penultimate start of his career. The bargain-basement yearling purchase endured a wide trip when third by a head in this event a year ago, but moved forward off that effort to post a half-length victory at 16-1 in the GI NetJets Breeders' Cup Mile Oct. 30. Rested thereafter, the bay could do no better than seventh to Leroidesanimaux (Brz) in the GI F.E. Kilroe Mile H. Mar. 5, but rebounded to win the Apr. 9 GII Arcadia H. by a length. A disappointing fourth as the favorite in the GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile on Memorial Day, he was last seen finishing third in the nine-furlong GI Eddie Reed H. July 24. Pointing for this spot since the Del Mar effort and training superbly, Singletery was always traveling well beneath David Flores and heads to New York, where he'll be just a fraction of his 2004 value. "I was very impressed today," the victorious rider commented. "All I had to do was get him relaxed and he just flowed the last quarter of a mile." Singletery covered his final two furlongs in a shade over 22 seconds. "He ran great," Flores continued. "I was just patient because I had the horse to do it. I waited and then at the top of the stretch I turned him loose and he exploded."

Trainer Todd Pletcher will be double-fisted in this \$500,000 contest with multiple graded stakes winners **Isola Piu Bella** and **Capeside Lady**. The Chilean-bred Isola Piu Bella won Grade III events at Gulfstream and Hawthorne earlier in the season, but faltered as the favorite in the GII Delaware H., finishing eighth in that 10-furlong contest July 17. "Basically everything went awry in Delaware, even before the race started," Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. "It was really, really hot that day, and she didn't seem to handle that very well. Then she was fractious in the gate, and she just never fired." This marks her first start back. "Since Delaware, she's trained well...I expect her to go over and run her race Sunday," Pletcher added. Stablemate Capeside Lady has done her best running on the front end, wiring her rivals by five lengths in the GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. July 9 at Monmouth. She checked in sixth in the GI Ruffian H. at Belmont Sept. 11 in her latest, but won't be facing the likes of Stellar Jayne and Society Selection here. However, the third-place finisher in the Ruffian, **Halory Leigh**, might be the one to spoil the Pletcher party. An allowance win over this surface preceded her two graded stakes victories at Keeneland last fall, and the chestnut appears to be rounding into form. She returned from a nine-month hiatus to run second in the GIII Gardenia H. at Ellis Aug. 20 prior to her Belmont effort.

But at a short price, she has to be an underlay.
