ROBERT SCANLON PASSES AWAY

Robert N. Scanlon, who set a world record when selling a juvenile colt by Tale of the Cat for \$5.2 million to Darley at Fasig-Tipton Calder in March, passed away Thursday. He was 57. "His impact on the Darley operation was big and broad," said Jimmy Bell, president of Darley USA. "John Ferguson first established our association with him and, over the last three years, we have sent all of our yearlings to him, as well as our two-year-old purchases. Sheikh Mohammed and Princess Haya came to know him very quickly, and Sheikh Mohammed himself invited Bob to England on several occasions to observe our horses there. That speaks volumes on how everyone, top to bottom, felt

about Bob Scanlon. He was spot-on when it came to judging a horse's potential. He could appraise a horse so accurately without a lot of fluff. His insight was really phenomenal and always to the point." Bell added, "From a personal standpoint, Bob was always so much fun to be around. He enjoyed his family and his friends and his horses. It was a pleasure to know him, and I think Sheikh Mohammed and Princess Haya and John Ferguson would echo those sentiments." One of the industries leading consignors of two-year-olds, the Irish horseman also operated Scanlon Training Center near Williston, Florida, with his wife, Connie, and his son David. Both Darley and Coolmore sent young horses to the training center. Sales graduates included champion Artax, GI Preakness and GI Belmont S. hero Afleet Alex, GI Haskell Invitational H. winner Lion Heart, Grade I winner and top sire Unbridled's Song and Grade I winner and leading freshman sire Songandaprayer. Scanlon is survived by his wife, sons David and Rob, grandson Ryley, mother Nellie, brothers Lee, Jimmy and Liam and sisters Betty, Marlene and Helen. A memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 18 at Blessed Trinity Catholic Church in Ocala, Florida. In lieu of flowers, contributions are suggested to the American Cancer Society or Hospice of North Central Florida.

REPEAT PERFORMANCE?

Susan Magnier's **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) is used to being the underdog, but he will start as the warm favorite in today's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket as he bids for a third straight score at the highest level. Having upset Motivator (GB) at 12-1 in the July 2 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown and at 7-1 in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 10 on his last two starts, the sophomore bids to end Aidan O'Brien's drought in this event while emulating the 1997 hero Pilsudski (Ire) in completing the Irish-English Champion double. "Oratorio is an amazing horse," O'Brien said after the Irish Champion. "He has everything--speed, stamina and a big heart." **Champion S. cont. p2**

DECISIONS, DECISIONS...

Whether it is **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) or **Horatio Nelson (Ire)** (Danehill) that lines up in today's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket, there is a sense of inevitability that Ballydoyle will collect its second renewal. The former looked explosive when powering to an eight-length tally in the Aug. 7 G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh, his third straight victory. The bay was simply going through the motions to collect the Sept. 18 G1 National S. by two lengths, but jockey Kieren Fallon said after the race, "He's inclined to idle when he gets there and that's what he did. I was very impressed, but there was nothing to test him. He needs good horses to up his game." If the Suffolk winds fail to dry the ground, George Washington will stay home and unbeaten stable companion Horatio Nelson will be asked to follow up on his success in the G2 Futurity S. at The Curragh Aug. 20 and in the G1 Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere at Longchamp just 13 days ago. Fallon, who has been aboard the bay in each of his four career starts, said after his win in the July 7 G3 Superlative S. at Newmarket, "He stays well and he quickens--he's got everything you need in a good horse. It's still early days, but he's a horse you want on your side." **Dewhurst S. cont. p3**

Oratorio will be favored, but he will be at his best on fast ground, as will **Alkaased**, who relished quick conditions when recording an impressive score in the June 26 G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud. He was runner-up to N P Bloodstock's **Pride (Fr)** in the Sept. 11 G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp and connections are hoping that the forecasted dry spell does its work. Sir Michael Stoute saddles a trio including Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's **Maraahel**. He lost out in a blanket finish when third in the Aug. 16 G1 International S. at York before disappointing when only third in the G3 Strensall S. back there 15 days later. "The International was a tremendous run and he will wear blinkers to squeeze a bit more out of him," jockey Richard Hills said. "They'll just help him concentrate a little bit more, as he travels very well in his races and we just need him to finish out a bit better." Godolphin rely on **Layman** and **Echo of Light (GB)**. The former took the G3 Sovereign S. at Salisbury on his belated sophomore bow Aug. 11 before disappointing when sixth behind Cheveley Park Stud's **Chic (GB)** (Machiavellian) in the G2 Celebration Mile 17 days later. Echo of Light steps up off an impressive conditions score at Doncaster Sept. 9.

Second behind George Washington in the G1 Phoenix S., Ronnie Arculli's G2 Coventry S. winner **Red Clubs** gave further credence to the form with seconds in the Aug. 17 G2 Gimcrack S. at York and the G1 Middle Park S. here Sept. 30. Vanquished by Horatio Nelson in the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere, **Opera Cape** squares up again. He had previously won the G3 Solario S. at a rain-soaked Sandown Aug. 20 and connections are hoping that the weather swings things in their favor. "My horse goes into the race in good form, but it looks as if Aidan O'Brien has all the aces in the pack," trainer Sylvester Kirk told the *Racing Post*. "Opera Cape has come out of the Prix Jean-Luc Lagardere well and deserves his chance in another Group 1 and he won't mind it if there's a bit of rain." **Close to You** disappointed when only sixth in the Solario, but rebounded to share the spoils with Silent Times (Ire) in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 9, while Highclere Thoroughbred Racing's **Primary** bids to extend his unbeaten streak after scores at Leicester Aug. 22 and on the July Course Sept. 3. "Primary is a Giant's Causeway through and through," trainer David Loder told *PA Sport*. "He is a tough, solid horse, although he will be better next year. But he has done nothing wrong and deserves to take his chance."

Luas Line captured back-to-back Listed stakes in Ireland, taking the Aug. 1 Platinum S. at Cork and scoring at that level at Gowran Park 20 days later. Off at 9-5 in the Sept. 10 GI Garden City BC H. at Belmont Park, she pressed the pace early and prevailed late to win it by 1 1/2 lengths. **Singhalese**, a Doncaster handicap winner at two, was fourth behind **Three Degrees** in the June 5 GII Honeymoon BC S. at Hollywood in her second U.S. outing, then finished third in the July 3 GI American Oaks. The chestnut followed an optional-claiming score at Del Mar Aug. 1 with a half-length tally over **Three Degrees** in the Aug. 20 GI Del Mar Oaks, but drifted out late in the Sept. 17 GIII Pucker Up S. at Arlington and had to settle for second. G2 Prix de Sandringham heroine **Gorella** was third behind Divine Proportions in the July 31 G1 Prix d'Astarte. She went up against older males in the Sept. 4 G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and ran a respectable second behind GI BC Classic contender Starcraft (NZ) at 18-1.

The winner of the G2 Premio Ribot in Rome in 2002, **Altieri** collected his first success at the highest level in the G1 Premio Presidente della Repubblica back there the following May. He added a second renewal of that contest this term May 15 before finishing third behind Oratorio (Ire) and Motivator (GB) in the July 2 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. Following his customary summer holiday, he was not disgraced when sixth in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp on his last start Sept. 4 and bids to better his previous runs in this when fourth in 2002 and only ninth the following year. **Anna Monda** relishes the soft, as she showed when running away with the May 8 G2 Henkel-Rennen (German 1000 Guineas) at Dusseldorf and the G2 Grosse Europe-Meile at Cologne last time Sept. 24, when her compatriot **Martillo** was only sixth. **Distant Way** took the Apr. 17 Listed Premio Natale di Roma at the Capannelle and Listed Premio Bereguardo over course and distance May 14 before returning here to finish third behind **Nordhal** in the June 2 G2 Premio Emilio Turati. He avenged that defeat by reversing the form in a Rome conditions event last time Sept. 25 and warrants respect, as does **De Sica**, who reappears from a lengthy absence after winning the G1 Derby Italiano over a mile and a half at the Capannelle May 22.

Peeress makes a quick return to the scene of her finest hour after winning the G1 Sun Chariot S. in similar conditions. Every race has been a step forward this term and she followed a shock success in the June 15 G2 Windsor Forest S. at Royal Ascot at York with a fine third behind her illustrious peers Soviet Song (Ire) and Alexander Goldrun (Ire) in the July 5 G1 Falmouth S. on the July Course. She battled through the mire a fortnight ago and, despite dropping back a panel, has outstanding claims of providing Sir Michael Stoute with his third renewal. Recent rain will be welcome for the connections of **Sleeping Indian**, who took the Aug. 13 G3 Hungerford S. at Newbury before failing by a short-head to hold off Iffraaj (GB) in the G2 Park S. at Doncaster Sept. 8. Last year's G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest and G1 Prix de la Foret hero **Somnus** has a series of disappointments to put behind him and looked to struggle when only sixth in this year's renewal of the Foret on his last outing Oct. 1. **Etlaala** promised a return to his peak when third in the July Cup. Only sixth in the Sept. 3 G1 Haydock Sprint Cup, he failed to build on that when trailing in the G2 Diadem S. at this track last time Sept. 25 and steps back up in trip as Barry Hills seeks his third win in this.

Abigail Pett took the July 13 Listed Silver Flash S. at Leopardstown before claiming the notable scalp of sunsequent G3 Somerville Tattersall S. winner Aussie Rules in the Sept. 4 G3 Round Tower S. at The Curragh. She found only the smart Ugo Fire (Ire) too good in the G3 C L Weld Park S. back there last time Oct. 1 and races under a penalty. That anchor also applies to the G3 Firth of Clyde S. heroine **Violette**, who has to rebound off a runner-up finish in the Listed Two-Year-Old Trophy at Redcar Oct. 1. Aidan O'Brien's three-strong team is headed by **Beauty Bright**, who steps up to seven furlongs for the first time and returns from a third in the Aug. 18 G2 Lowther S. at York and a sixth in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at this track Sept. 29. Of the unexposed types, **Short Skirt** created a highly favorable impression when scoring on debut at the July Course Aug. 26 and represents the Stoute stable successful with Musical Bliss in 1988. **Expensive** upset Flashy Wings (GB) in the Watership Down Stud Sales S. at Newbury last time Sept. 17 and rates a threat, while the Haydock maiden winner **Montreux** is put forward by John Gosden.

OWNERS BRING WRONGFUL DEATH CLAIMS

The owners of rising three-year-old sprint star **Egg Head** (Honor Grades) and millionaire sprinter **Saratoga County** (Valid Expectations) are among a group of six Thoroughbred owners bringing suit in the alleged wrongful deaths of three racehorses and for severe damage to a fourth, according to a recent report in the Schenectady, New York *Daily Gazette*. In a civil action filed Sept. 29 in the United States District Court for the Northern District of New York in Albany, plaintiffs are claiming negligence, breach of warranty and strict products liability against the New Jersey-based Wedgewood Village Pharmacy involving an antibiotic product they claim necessitated the humane killing of the animals in the weeks leading up to the 2005 Saratoga race meet. According to the suit, three of the four horses were staying in the same Saratoga barn where they contracted a laryngeal infection known as Arytenoiditis. The owners claim that, within hours of being injected with Wedgewood's Chloramphenicol Palmitate Product, the condition of the horses deteriorated drastically. According to the filing, among the symptoms Saratoga County (euthanized July 29), **Cathy's Choice** (euthanized), and **Yankee Penny** (Quiet American) (severely damaged) suffered were loss of appetite, intestinal distention, depression, elevated heart rate and colic. Egg Head, who was treated at the barn of trainer Kiaran McLaughlin at Belmont Park after suffering a cut over one of his hocks, exhibited diarrhea and laminitis "to such an extent that it required his humane destruction on or about July 11."
