Anthony Pakenham's **Sir Percy (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) delivered a telling run in the clear spaces of the

Rowley Mile to upset **Horatio Nelson (Ire)** (Danehill) and stretch his perfect record to four in yesterday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. at Newmarket. Kept fresh after annexing the July 27 G2 Vintage S. at Goodwood, the 9-2 second favorite arrived from the rear under Martin Dywer and was rolling as the 8-11 pick ran into a traffic jam under Kieren Fallon. Hitting the front with 150 yards remaining, he was driven out as Horatio Nelson bore down in the closing stages and held on by a neck. "He's the real deal," his rider commented. "He hasn't run for a

while and was a bit fresh, but was really impressive and just idled a bit when he heard the crowd."

KIDS PLAY

Friendless before yesterday's G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. at Newmarket, Roldvale Limited's **David Junior** (Pleasant Tap) had the last laugh when defying his 25-1 tag to best **Pride (Fr)** (Peintre Celebre) by 3/4 lengths. Coming off a smooth score in the G3 Select S. at Goodwood Sept. 11, the sophomore was held up towards the rear by a confident Jamie Spencer early before eating up the ground out wide passing halfway. Tackling **Maraahel (Ire)** (Alzao) at the quarter pole, he got the better of that rival soon after and maintained the gallop as the French mare closed late under Christophe Soumillon. "It was a tough race and the bookies gave us no chance, but I really liked him at Goodwood," Spencer commented. "He's a long-striding horse and I took no chances in moving him out wide and took the cowardly route. I went way too soon on him, but he got into a rhythm and I just let him go and he really picked up. Fingers crossed, if he stays in training he'll be a lovely horse to look forward to next year."

A Turf-Lovin' Filly...

The winner of the grassy Caressing S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 20 to conclude her freshman campaign, **Sweet Talker** began this season on the main track, finishing fifth in the GII Bonnie Miss S. Mar. 5 and fourth in the Bourbonette Breeders' Cup Mar. 26. Returned to her preferred surface, the daughter of Stormin Fever was third to Melhor Ainda in this track's Appalachian S. Apr. 24 before taking the Edgewood S. back on the Matt Winn turf course May 6. A half-length allowance winner beneath the Twin Spires May 27, the dark bay was third in the June 18 GIII Regret S., but got a well-deserved rest thereafter. She resurfaced with a solid 1 1/4-length success in the Martha Washington Breeders' Cup S. at Laurel Sept. 24, but was lightly regarded in this salty by-invitation-only event.

Whisper to a Scream...

Eased back to track a slow pace set alternately by favored **Luas Line (Ire)** (Danehill) and **Naissance Royale (Ire)** (Giant's Causeway), Sweet Talker gained ground while travelling well into the stretch and was driven to the front with a furlong to race. From there it was a mad dash to the cash, as Sweet Talker from between horses found the line just ahead of a game **Karen's Capar** (War Chant) and **Gorella (Fr)** (Grape Tree Road {GB}), whose furious rail rush just failed. "Down the stretch, I tried to urge her on, but she wouldn't cooperate," said winning rider Rafael Bejarano. "I thought I might have lost it, but thank God we didn't"

David Junior finished only 11th in the G1 2000 Guineas at this venue Apr. 30, but rebounded to run away with the May 21 Listed Fairway S. back here and Listed Gala S. at Sandown July 1. His run ended abruptly when seventh in the July 27 G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood and he could manage only third in the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. 10 days later at Haydock. Given a short break, he returned with the perfect prep at Goodwood last time and confirmed trainer Brian Meehan's lofty opinion with this surprise score. "We've liked him so much all year and we have given him time and given him chances," said the conditioner. "The ground was against him in the Sussex and I waited as he's only three, but he was impressive and has beaten older horses and he's one of the best around." David Junior was produced by a full sister to U.S. champion grass horse Paradise Creek and a half to Grade I winners Wild Event and Forbidden Apple. Oratorio (Ire) (Danehill), who was sent off the 9-4 favorite, stayed on from the pack into fourth in the closing stages without threatening.

Sir Percy showed an impressive turn of acceleration to score on debut at Goodwood May 28 before following up in a conditions race at Salisbury June 23. He beat the subsequent G2 Mill Reef S. scorer Cool Creek (Ire) in the Vintage before his summer break and, following this score, connections have the G1 2000 Guineas in mind back at this track in May. "This is a good horse," trainer Marcus Tregoning commented. "He's progressed all the way and done all the right things and was showing me all the signs that he's a real good horse. It's a thrill to have had him since the early days and the Guineas is on the agenda now, but he won't run unless we think he's got a really good chance. I don't want to rush him and we'll just see how he does over the winter, but don't underestimate him, because I think he might improve yet." Aidan O'Brien, who scratched George Washington (Ire) after the first race, was not too downcast by the first defeat of Horatio Nelson, who suffered a troubled trip and was making up ground on the winner late on. "He ran a great race and was coming home really well," he commented.

Anna Monda became the latest German-trained filly to plunder a major prize when putting her trademark trail-blazing style to maximum effect here. Impressive when winning the May 8 G2 Henkel-Rennen (German 1000 Guineas) at Dusseldorf, she was sent overseas with disappointing results on her next two starts. Readily brushed aside when seventh in both the June 5 G2 Prix de Sandringham at Chantilly and G3 Oak Tree S. at Goodwood July 29, she rebounded after a freshener to take the G2 Grosse Europe-Meile at Cologne last time Sept. 24. Soon in control here, she dictated an even tempo throughout before having to dig in as Martillo delivered his challenge approaching the eighth pole. Responding gamely, she soon had that rival's measure and was the comfortable scorer at the line.

Aragorn was second in his lone start at two in June 2004, but got off the mark in his seasonal debut when he was guided by Frankie Dettori to a four-length win in a Doncaster maiden May 2. Third in the Listed King Charles II S. at Newmarket May 21, the chestnut was a well-beaten eighth to Proclamation in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot at York June 15. In his final European appearance for trainer David Loder, the May foal was fifth in a July 9 conditions event at Chester and made a favorable impression in his U.S. bow, finishing runner-up to Follow the Rainbow (Event of the Year) in a second-level allowance test going a flat mile Sept. 29. Settled along the inside, Aragorn bid between rivals into the stretch, joined forces with Eastern Sand at the eighth pole and prevailed after a long drive. Morning-line choice Willow O Wisp (Misnomer) was scratched sick and will be pointed for the GI Hollywood Derby.

Le Vie dei Colori was the winner of the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua in Milan two years ago, but after a fine third in the G1 Sussex S. on his first start for Luca Cumani at Goodwood last July had failed to scale the heights. Third on his final run of 2004 in the G1 Prix de la Foret at Longchamp in October, he returned to take the Apr. 23 Listed Leicestershire S. at Leicester before finishing off the board in the G1 Lockinge S. at Newbury May 14. After two more unplaced efforts in the G3 Criterion S. on the July Course June 25 and this year's renewal of the Sussex July 27, he showed a glimpse of promise when fifth in the G2 Celebration Mile at Goodwood last time Aug. 28. Reserved towards the rear by Gerald Mosse throughout the early stages, he swooped down the outer to collar Sleeping Indian with 125 yards remaining before drawing away on the uphill climb to the line. "The ground was perfect for him and I kept him quiet early on, as he feels like a sprinter to ride and gallops like one," his rider explained.

"I bought her off Willie Browne at the Breeze-Ups and, when Mark Johnston was the underbidder, I thought I wasn't too far off and she had a good pedigree. Michael said if the others didn't break fast he'd go on to the rail, but she's finished now and I'll probably turn her out. The G1 1000 Guineas might come into consideration and she stayed a mile at Doncaster last time. She has a few months to strengthen and is quite a big filly, so I think she will."

On paper, Gun Salute looked like he would simply eat the competition for lunch, but, alas, races are not run on paper and the GI Secretariat S. winner had to call upon all his reserves to stave off a stretch-long challenge from unheralded Cosmic Kris for the victory. Sixth in the GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream Mar. 26, the bay was equipped with blinkers for the Apr. 21 Forerunner S. at Keeneland and responded with a 2 1/2-length victory. Third, beaten a half-length by the talented sophomore turfer Rush Bay in the GIII Jefferson Cup S. at Churchill Downs June 18, he made his first venture to Chicago a winning one as well, taking the GII American Derby by a nose July 23. His Secretariat win came at the expense of English Channel, who subsequently was a close runner-up to Shakespeare in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic and is being pointed for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf in two weeks' time. Settled within easy striking distance for the opening salvos of this one, the prohibitive chalk launched his bid on the far turn and was bumped soundly in upper stretch. Cosmic Kris came to him on the outside and snatched a narrow lead at the furlong grounds, but Gun Salute would not capitulate and fought back gamely for the win. Kenny McCarthy, assistant to trainer Bill Mott, indicated that the winner could be pointed for the GI Hollywood Derby at the end of November.

Rated along in fifth as Dream On Dream On cut out the pace, he came three wide around the final bend, but angled to the rail for the stretch drive and slipped inside the front runner to gain the victory. "If this race hadn't come off the turf, he would have run against older horses in the [GIII Spend a Buck H. later on the card]," said trainer Luis Olivares, who claimed the winner for \$25,000 out of his first start. Added jockey Julio Garcia, "When this race was taken off the turf, I was very confident that we could win it. All you have to do with him is sit back for the first five-eighths of a mile and then turn him loose."

What an old character he is."

The six-year-old gelding was vanned back to the barn, but trainer Lee Freedman told Channel 7 that he was "not overconfident" that the veterinarians would be able to save him.

Trainer Wally Dollase has informed officials at Woodbine that he plans on shipping in **Meteor Storm (GB)** (Bigstone {Ire}) for next Sunday's GI Pattison Canadian International S. The winner of the GI Manhattan H. in 2004, things have not gone so smoothly for the six-year-old since then as he has been shut out in eight subsequent starts. Meteor Storm has had the misfortune of running into the Breeders' Cup Turf-bound Shakespeare in his last two, finishing second to the Bill Mott-trainee in the GII Belmont Breeders' Cup H. Sept. 11 and fourth in the GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Oct. 1.
