POWERSCOURT RETIRED TO ASHFORD

Multiple Group 1 winner **Powerscourt (GB)** (Sadler's Wells--Rainbow Lake {GB}, by Rainbow Quest) has been retired to Ashford Stud in Kentucky, according to a press release. His stud fee will be announced at a

later date. The five-year-old had been expected to run in next week's GI Breeders' Cup Turf, but was ruled out of that race by trainer Aidan O'Brien. "I very much wanted to win the Breeders' Cup Turf with him, but he wasn't quite right on Monday, so we've decided to

retire him," O'Brien said. Bred by Juddmonte Farms, the bay concluded his juvenile season in 2002 with a second in the G1 Racing Post Trophy. As a three-year-old, he won the G2 Great Voltigeur S. and ran a close third to Vinnie Roe (Ire) in the G1 Irish St. Leger S. Powerscourt kicked off 2004 with a victory in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and followed that with a runner-up finish to Rakti (GB) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. He was first past the post in the GI Arlington Million later that summer, but was disqualified to fourth, and later returned to the U.S. to run third to Better Talk Now in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Lone Star. After taking some time to find his best form this season, the five-year-old saved the best for last, quickening past champion Kitten's Joy and Better Talk Now to take the Arlington Million in August in what would be his final career start. "Like many of the very best 10-furlong horses, Powerscourt has that ability to quicken," O'Brien added. "He's a very tough and genuine horse and was a joy to train." He retires with a record of 21-5-6-3 and earnings of \$1,912,272. Produced by the Group 3 winner Rainbow Lake, he is a half brother to the stakes-winning filly Kind (Ire).

STARCRAFT TAKES SPIN AT SOUTHWELL

Paul Makin's **Starcraft (NZ)** (Soviet Star), expected to be pre-entered for both the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, traveled to Southwell yesterday for a seven-furlong workout over the all-weather surface. Working with three stablemates, the towering chestnut raced at the rear in the early stages before moving by the others in the straight. "I was pleased with that--he seemed to go on the surface, but I was hoping for a bit more kickback," trainer Luca Cumani told *PA Sport*. "He has got a bit on his chest and legs, but as he is so much bigger than the others, his head was above the kickback in his face. I told [rider Guillermo Arizkorreta] to follow the other horses round and he came through as he should have. It looks like he will be going for the Classic--I think he could win the Mile, and I hope he will be good enough in the mile and a quarter. We just wanted to give him a taste of the surface, and this is as near as you can get to the American surface in England." A multiple Group 1 winner in Australia, Starcraft captured the G1 Prix du Moulin at Longchamp before defeating Dubawi (Ire) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Newmarket Sept. 24. Both of those races were at a mile on grass; the \$4-million Classic would mark his dirt debut. Starcraft is slated to have Pat Valenzuela in the irons if he runs in the Classic.

FIVE FOR FIGHTING

Though trainer Aidan O'Brien lost a legitimate Breeders' Cup competitor when **Powerscourt (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) was retired yesterday, the Irishman still has plenty of firepower with five runners pre-entered for next Saturday's event at Belmont. The Ballydoyle entrants are **Oratorio (Ire)** (Danehill) in the Classic, **Ace (Ire)** (Danehill) in the Turf, **Ad Valorem** (Danzig) in the Mile, **Ivan Denisovich (Ire)** (Danehill) in the Juvenile and **Mona Lisa (GB)** (Giant's Causeway) in the F/M Turf. JOHN DEERE TURF, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/2mT

Shakespeare (Theatrical {Ire}), undefeated in five lifetime starts, including the GI Turf Classic Invitational Oct. 1, breezed five furlongs over Belmont's inner turf course in 1:00 4/5 yesterday. "He finished up nicely, did what we asked and looked fine," said trainer Bill Mott. The likely favorite for the Turf, the stately bay completed the last three furlongs in :35 3/5. "It was maybe a little tougher race than you would want," said Mott, commenting on the colt's latest victory. "I guess it showed he can battle. You always hope you have something left in the tank. If the workout was any indication, he looked fine, but you never know until they run back."

NETJETS MILE, \$1,500,000, 3yo/up, 1mT

It was confirmed yesterday that the Sangster Family Stable's **Sand Springs** (Dynaformer) would bypass the 10-furlong GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf in favor of the the Mile, a race that finds her facing males for the first time in her career. Trainer Bill Mott said distance played a major factor in the decision. "A mile and a quarter has always been a little too far for her," he explained. "We knew that the other day when we ran her in the Flower Bowl, but took our chance." Sand Springs tired as the pacesetter in the Oct. 1 GI Flower Bowl Invitational H. over Belmont's sod, finishing a close-up fourth. The presence of the dark bay, who won the GII Just a Game Breeders' Cup H. at a flat mile over the summer, adds an interesting twist to the Mile's pace scenario, as the free-wheeling five-year-old could find herself vying for the lead with the likely favorite **Leroidesanimaux (Brz)** (Candy Stripes). Asked about strategy, Mott laughed, "We might just take him by the horns; I can't be telling you what we're going to do. Take back? Come on! We don't want to give the race to him." Bobby Frankel, who conditions Leroidesanimaux for TNT Stud, wasn't overly concerned with Sandspring's inclusion. "She'll be chasing 'Leroy,'" he said. "She's got speed, but she's got :47 speed or :46 and change speed. Leroidesanimaux, he goes :45 and change."

EMIRATES AIRLINE DISTAFF, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m

Godolphin had a pretty good Breeders' Cup day the last time it was run at Belmont Park, in 2001. **Tempera** and **Imperial Gesture** finished one-two in the Juvenile Fillies, **Fantastic Light** shined in the Turf and **Sakhee** was beaten just a nose by **Tiznow** in the Classic. This year, the organization has pre-entered just two, **Stellar Jayne** (Wild Rush) in the Distaff and **Sundrop (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) in the Filly & Mare Turf, with its best chance likely coming with the former. Winner of the GI Ruffian H. and third in last year's renewal of the Distaff, **Stellar Jayne** breezed five panels yesterday at Belmont in 1:04 1/5. "It was a nice five-eighths," said Rick Mettee, assistant to conditioner Saeed bin Suroor, who added that jockey Frankie Dettori was booked to ride the gray on Breeders' Cup day.

TVG SPRINT, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 6f

Several analysts have already tabbed **Wildcat Heir** (Forest Wildcat) a horse to watch in the Sprint and the lightly raced five-year-old did nothing yesterday to cast doubt that he's ready, despite having just one 2005 start to his credit. The New Farm homebred drilled a bullet five furlongs in :59 2/5, breezing in company with a horse named Wild Jam. "He needed a stiff work," said trainer Ben Perkins, Jr. "We put him in company so he'd have someone to carry him along." Wildcat Heir's lone effort this season, a 5 3/4-length romp in the Teddy Drone S. at Monmouth Aug. 7, yielded a sparkling 117 Beyer, which is tied for fourth best on the year for races up to a mile. **Cont. p3**

EMIRATES AIRLINE F/M TURF, \$ 1,000,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/4mT

Bobby Frankel won the 2002 Filly & Mare Turf with Starine and is optimistic about his chances this year with a pair of top-quality fillies in **Intercontinental (GB)** (Danehill) and **Megahertz (GB)** (Pivotal {GB}). There are

questions about both--Megahertz has done her best running on the firm courses of California and Intercontinental has yet to tackle further than nine furlongs--but few are discounting a pair of fillies that have won a combined 26 races, including 16 at the graded level. Asked about Intercontinental's ability to get the 10 panels of the Filly & Mare Turf, Frankel commented, "We've never

tried her, so how do we know she can't do it? She waits on horses, so forget about the distance she wins by. She went a mile and an eighth at Del Mar this summer, couldn't have been in more trouble and was still finishing [when third in the GI John C. Mabee H.] You know they're going to let me make the lead. Nobody's going to want to go with her. I'm excited about her. She's doing really well and she looks great. Just looking at her, you've got to love her." Unfortunately, Frankel's star three-year-old filly **Melhor Ainda** (Pulpit) won't make the Filly & Mare Turf after developing ankle problems. "She's in Kentucky getting operated on [today]," Frankel said. "She's getting some chips taken out of her ankle. Hopefully, she'll be back next year. She's always had rough ankles. We X-Rayed her after the American Oaks and she didn't have them. She was operated on for the same thing last year. She's not lame or anything, her ankles were puffy. I probably could have run her in the Filly & Mare Turf, but I'm not comfortable running her in that kind of race with problems."

DIVA FAVORED IN COX PLATE **Makybe Diva (GB)** (Desert King {Ire}) is the clear 2-1 favorite for Saturday's G1 Cox Plate and drew favorably in barrier four during yesterday's post position draw at Moonee Valley Racecourse. The six-year-old mare is poised to become the leading Australasian money earner of all time, if she can take down the top prize of A\$1.8 million. A victory in Saturday's feature would take her career bankroll to an amount in excess of A\$11.4 million, some A\$50,000 better than the legendary dual Cox Plate winner Sunline (NZ). Trainer Lee Freedman brought Makybe Diva to train over the Moonee Valley track Monday and she looked spectacular, working over 1600 meters with a final quarter mile in :23.8 seconds. "She felt fantastic," said her big-day rider Glen Boss. "She was really aggressive and wanted to work. She really wanted to chase and beat the other horse," he added, referring to her stable companion Pentacolo (Aus). Freedman is also looking forward to Saturday's test. "I'm pretty confident--why wouldn't I be?" he commented.

THE DADDY UNDERGOES SURGERY Greg Norman's **The Daddy** (Valid Expectations), derailed from a bid at the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic after he was found to have fractured a splint bone in his left foreleg, underwent surgery last Wednesday and will be out for the remainder of the year. The New York-bred three-year-old, who notched his biggest victory in the 10-furlong GII Super Derby at Louisiana Downs Oct. 1, is expected to return to the races in 2006. "We're disappointed," acknowledged Norman, a San Diego-based construction businessman who lives in Agoura Hills, California. "We were really, really looking forward to the race [Breeders' Cup Classic]."

"We have two choices, the International and the Breeders' Cup," the Frenchman explained. "He would be between 5-1 and 8-1 at Woodbine and 20-1 to 25-1 [at Belmont].

That's the decision." The chestnut tuned up for the race Monday at Belmont, working a half mile on the turf in :50 before galloping out five-eighths in 1:03.

Grey Swallow (Ire), the 2004 G1 Irish Derby hero, makes his North American bow in the International for trainer Dermot Weld. The grey son of 1999 Breeders' Cup Turf winner Daylami (Ire) has made his last eight starts at the highest level and has one win from three starts this season, a 3/4-length victory over Bago (Fr) in the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup in May. He was most recently sixth to Oratorio in the G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 10. "I couldn't be happier with the horse," the conditioner commented. "He's a lovely horse."

Want a good two-year-old? Use a son of Storm Cat.

That was the message delivered by my colleague Andrew Caulfield in his column in this publication on Oct. 11. That statement followed a dominant weekend for Storm Cat in juvenile events in the U.S. and Europe. This weekend also offered evidence that runners by sons of Storm Cat musn't be overlooked in three-year-old events either, with Aragorn (by Giant's Causeway) capturing the GII Oak Tree Derby, and Sweet Talker winning the GI Queen Elizabeth Challenge II Cup S.

Sweet Talker won the Caressing H. last year and the Martha Washington Breeders' Cup S. and Edgewood S. this year, but had never previously recorded a graded victory, so her Grade I triumph over a strong field here marked a big step forward. If Sweet Talker is improving with age, it may be because she is following in the footsteps of her sire, Stormin Fever.

A maiden winner in two starts at two, Stormin Fever won three times in five outings the following, and achieved a black-type place when third in the GII Withers S. Kept in training at four, Stormin Fever didn't get that all important stakes victory until the end of the year, when he captured the GIII Sport Page Handicap in the swift time of 1:21.49. However, he'd early on shown some very good form over a variety of distances: in the nine-furlong GII Philip H. Iselin H., he gave the eventual Horse of the Year, Skip Away, a fright when missing by just a nose, and he also took second to Affirmed Success in the seven-furlong GI Vosburgh S., and second in the GIII Salvator Mile H.

Kept in training at five, Stormin Fever started just four times, winning a 6 1/2 furlong allowance race, and finishing second to the year's champion sprinter, Artax, in the GI Vosburgh S.

From his first crop, Stormin Fever sired English juvenile group winner Howick Falls; Tarlow, heroine this year of the GI Santa Anita Invitational H. and GII La Canada S.; and stakes-winner After the Tone. Sweet Talker is a member of his second crop, as is the GII Lazaro Barrera Memorial S. winner, Storm Wolf.

Stormin Fever is one of at least 11 sons of Storm Cat to have already sired a Grade I winner, as far as we can tell, the others being Harlan, Storm Creek, Forest Wildcat, Hennessy, Tabasco Cat, Delineator, Tale of the Cat, Forestry, Giant's Causeway and Bernstein. Both Stormin Fever, and another highly promising young Storm Cat son, Stormy Atlantic, are by Storm Cat out of mares by Seattle Slew.

Sweet Talker is the third foal and first stakes winner for her dam, Another Vegetarian. She was a daughter of the Hoist the Flag horse, Stalwart, winner of four of five races at two--the only season in which he started--including the GI Norfolk S. and the Hollywood Futurity. Another Vegetarian was half sister to Tiffany Diamond, a smart West Coast performer who took two California restricted events, and also captured a second in the GII Railbird S., and thirds in the GII La Brea S. and GIII Rancho Bernardo H. Tiffany Diamond had rather an interesting pedigree, as she was by Tiffany Ice, a son of Icecapade, and her dam was by the top-class European miler, Northjet, a grandson of Northern Dancer, giving her the three-quarters related Icecapade and Northern Dancer 2x4.

Sweet Talker's granddam, Lucy Sims, was unraced. She was half sister to the minor stakes winner Visual Emotion, but had another half sister who generated rather greater class. This was the Gallant Man mare Porthole, whose daughter Personable Lady was a two-time stakes winner who was also runner-up in the GI Santa Susana S, and who subsequently produced an ever better runner in the GI Las Virgenes S. victress Likeable Style.

Sweet Talker's fourth dam is the imported mare Nato II, a juvenile black-type winner in England. Nato II is ancestress of numerous major winners on both sides of the Atlantic, including the outstanding turf horse Quack, and group and Grade I winners Wild Rush, Flemensfirth and Hayil.

Sweet Talker is the product of a Storm Cat/Hoist the Flag cross, and this combination has produced at least seven other stakes winners, including graded winner Sardula, and two other winners out of Stalwart mares. Stormin Fever himself has Hoist the Flag as sire of his third dam, and the pedigree also has Northern Dancer 4x5, with Nasrullah 6x6x6, and Princequillo 6x6. The arrangement of this inbreeding and linebreeding is quite interesting. MAJORS GROSS RECORD \$719-MILLION

I suppose one good thing about there being no official international reporting of the Thoroughbred auction market is that it leaves those of us who report on such things to design our own models. This is all right as long as we have some idea what we're doing--and since this is about year 25 of my doing it, I reckon I have as much chance as anybody else of coming up with something comprehensible. But it's a poor substitute for something official.

Since it is guaranteed that 97 percent of readers will drop off if I go into too much detail about how we've arrived at these numbers, I'll just say this much: we've collected the stats from nine major yearling sales in North America and Europe--Fasig July, Saratoga, and Keeneland September in America, and the six sales detailed in the table in Europe. We converted guineas (from the British sales) to Euros for the six European sales, and then, for our little bottom table, converted the lot to dollars. We used October 1 conversion rates; other, official versions (I wish) might have used conversion figures on the day of sale, i.e. the Sept. 6 rates for the opening day of the Doncaster St. Leger sale, Sept. 7 rates for the next day, and so on. So there could be slight variations in the numbers compiled by other sources, but we're sure that we're close enough for the figures to be meaningful.

And they do look very meaningful. We will have to add Tatts' October 3 sale, scheduled for Oct. 28, to complete a true sale-by-sale comparison with last year (I'll bet you're dying to know why. It's because this year's October 3 really compares with the final two days of last year's October 2). This will result in a very modest increase in the 2005 gross, and a very modest drop in the 2005 average. But we're about 99 percent done now. Here's what we know.

In 2004, at the nine major sales, 7,108 yearlings grossed \$632,647,811 (using the same 10-1-05 rates as 2005, to have a base year), and averaged \$89,005. In 2005, the corresponding sales saw 7,163 yearlings sell for a record \$720,953,456, and average a record \$100,649. The number of yearlings sold is up just under one percent, the gross is up almost 14 percent, and the average up 13 percent. These numbers are staggering, for three reasons. First, that there were over \$700-million worth of yearlings sold, just in these nine sales. Second, that the yearling market was up 13-14 percent instead of being down by that much. There's been some chat in the *Racing Post* this week about overproduction and fundamentals, and nothing has changed on those fronts since last year: the huge books, resulting in massive overbreeding of mares who previously wouldn't have been in the same area code as the stallions they've been bred to--it's all just the same as, if not worse than, it was last year. But here's truly staggering point number three: we can say what we like, but the fact is that over 7,000 yearlings this year AVERAGED over \$100,000 each. I just can't get over how much money that means there must be in circulation. Think of it: seven thousand yearlings averaging \$100,000 each. I mean, it's fair to ask, isn't it--where has all the money come from?

I've speculated out loud all through the past couple of months about this, and one conclusion is that, dot-com crash of 1999-2000 included, there is still a huge amount of new wealth in circulation, a lot of it (especially in Ireland and America) property-driven. But another factor which surely contributes to the flood of money spent on yearlings is the relative unattractiveness of more traditional repositories of cash. People aren't impressed by the prospect of being paid four-percent interest by the banks, and one thing the dot-com crash accomplished was to shatter the illusion that stock markets always go up. So people don't want their money in banks, and they don't want their money in the stock market--not all of it, anyway.

So my best guess is that, really, the combination of two external factors has fuelled the 2005 yearling price boom: the creation of new wealth, and the reluctance of old wealth to over-commit to bank interest and the stock markets. It would be great to think there were also internal reasons for this \$88-million boost in prices, but for those we would search, indefinitely, in vain. The yearling market has increased in spite of the industry's internal conditions, not because of it. Of course, that means the industry's internal woes, like overproduction, are masked by these successes, rather than highlighted.

Sales Companies: Keeneland Rules...

Though they have to share 'Yearling Sales Company of the Year' honors with a resurgent Goffs, a look at how this nine-sale market breaks down by region and sales company is, as always, revealing. There may only be three sales among the nine 'majors' in America, but they constitute just over five-eighths (63.09 percent) of the nine-sale market. Keeneland September is the true behemoth of yearling sales. This year, almost exactly half (3,545, or 49.5 percent) of the 7,163 yearlings sold in the nine sales were at Keeneland September, and its \$384-million gross actually constituted 53.3 percent of the \$720-million gross for all nine sales. It's more than 'as Keeneland goes, so goes the market' ... it actually is half the market. Five of every eight yearlings sold were in America, four of those five at Keeneland. Who needs a July sale?

Of the three-eighths of the market which is in Europe, Tattersalls (including Tattersalls Ireland) is dominant, with 57.28 percent of the European market. Goffs has regained a strong second spot in Europe, with just under a quarter of the European sales. Goffs (9.17 percent of the overall market) and Fasig-Tipton (9.78 percent) have always had sort of a parallel existence, as each market's respective number two. Both look well placed in the existing strong market, though Fasig did suffer a \$14-million drop in gross this year. Also in Europe, Deauville August was about 10 percent of the major European yearling market this year, Doncaster St. Leger's sale was about 7.5 percent. **Oppenheim cont. p9**

The European yearling sales are not quite finished. The second-tier sales at Deauville and Doncaster are on this week, and, as mentioned, Tattersalls finishes off with October 3 next Friday. We are working on incorporating these figures into a more complete European summary, which would also include the top sales in Germany and Italy. But these sales will not significantly alter what we may say with certainty about the 2005 yearling market. The Northern Hemisphere's top 7,000 yearlings, incredibly, are now worth an average of \$100,000 each. **Bill Oppenheim may be contacted at bopp@erb.com.
