SHERMEEN TOPS TATTERSALLS OPENER

British-born Jamie Lloyd, currently assistant to Patrick Gallagher in California, is set to train the top lot at yesterday's Tattersalls Autumn Horses In Training Sale--160,000gns two-year-old **Shermeen (Ire)** (Desert Style {Ire}). Lloyd outbid agent Gordian Troeller for the juvenile, who will race for Ticker Tape (GB)'s owner Jim Ford in partnership with Jim Stutts and Rick Holliday. "She'll go back to [English trainer] Jamie Osborne now and it's 50/50 whether she runs in a Listed race [Bosra Sham S. at Newmarket] on Friday," said Lloyd. "She'll

then ship out just before the Nov. 26 GIII Miesque S. at Hollywood Park. Let's hope she might be another Ticker Tape." Shoppers for runners at the Dubai Carnival were busy and three-year-old **Hippodrome (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) has that target after selling for 110,000gns. He will be trained in Dubai by South African Herman Brown for the VIP Thoroughbreds Syndicate. Domestic jumping buyers were again among those with the largest budgets and four-year-old **Turnstile (GB)** (Linamix {Fr}) will go hurdling for big-spending owner Graham Wylie and trainer Howard Johnson. Agent Bobby O'Ryan paid 145,000gns for the gelding with Timmy Hyde the underbidder. The sale continues today with a session starting at 9:30 a.m., but lost a potential star when G1 Racing Post Trophy winner **Palace Episode** (Machiavellian) was yesterday withdrawn from the auction.

JAPANESE TRIPLE FOR DEEP IMPACT

A jubilant crowd of 136,701 cheered Japanese superstar **Deep Impact (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) across the wire at Kyoto Sunday as the three-year-old became the first



unbeaten Japanese Triple Crown winner since Symboli Rudolf (Jpn) in 1984 with a two-length victory in the G1 Kikuka Sho (Japanese St Leger). Sent off the odds-on favorite, Deep Impact tugged at Yutaka Take in the early

going, while the jockey attempted to rate the unbeaten colt in seventh in the 16-horse field. Angled to the outside on the turn for home, Deep Impact unleashed a powerful stretch run, flying past **Admire Japan (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) with 80 meters to run, pulling away late. He led home a St. Leger one-two-three finish for his sire, the late Sunday Silence. "I am very pleased to win this race and feel relieved that Deep Impact is a Triple Crown winner," Take said after the race. "He wanted to go faster in the early stages, so he actually didn't show his best performance late, but he won anyway. He is a brilliant horse." Deep Impact became the sixth Japanese Triple Crown winner and second unbeaten victor. His next start is undecided, but he may go in the Nov. 27 G1 Japan Cup or the Dec. 25 G1 Grand Prix Arima. **Click for [JRA race video](#). cont. p2**

ROMAN RULER OUT OF BC SPRINT

Roman Ruler (Fusaichi Pegasus), winner of the G1 Haskell Invitational H. Aug. 7, will not run in Saturday's G1 Breeders' Cup Sprint after trainer Bob Baffert detected soreness in the colt's right front foot. Following his 1 1/4-length score over Sun King in the Haskell, the chestnut finished third behind Flower Alley in the Aug. 27 G1 Travers S. before coming up a length short to Rock Hard Ten in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 1. Winner of the GII Best Pal S. and GII Norfolk S. last year, he was sidelined by a quarter crack earlier this, before returning to action with a victory in the GII Dwyer S. July 4. The three-year-old will take up stud duty at Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington at the conclusion of his racing career.

BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

CLASSIC, POWERED BY DODGE, \$4,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/4m

StarCraft (NZ) (Soviet Star), who was cross-entered in the Mile and Classic, will lineup in the 10-furlong Classic, according to the *International Racing Bureau*. The five-year-old's connections will have to pony up 20 percent (\$800,000) of the \$4-million purse to start.

A handful of Classic contenders were sent out for their final major preparatory moves at Belmont Park Monday morning. The group was headed by **Borrego** (El Prado {Ire}), winner of the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 10, who worked 5 furlongs in 1:01 2/5 under exercise rider Andy Durnin. "He went very well," said Beau Greely. "It was a very nice, easy work." Was it what the trainer hoped for? "It was perfect," he said. "If he's happy, I'm happy." Also on the worktab, **Lord of the Game** (Saint Ballado), with rider Hugo Rodriguez aboard, went four panels in :46 flat. "He looked like he finished up real good," said trainer Tom Tomillo. The gelding is first on the preference list for the Classic. According to Tomillo, if the team doesn't make it into the 10-furlong race, he will make his next start in the GIII Fayette S. on the same day. Across town at Aqueduct, likely Classic favorite **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado) breezed five furlongs over the main track in 1:01 3/5. "He did it effortlessly," said trainer Rick Dutrow Jr. The move was the sixth fastest of 12 at the distance. "We didn't need any pressure," he added. "If we wanted him to breeze really good, I would've breezed him in company. I don't think we need that. He galloped out good and finished up good. That's what he's going to do in the race."

TVG SPRINT, \$1,000,000, 3yo/up, 6f

Wildcat Heir (Forest Wildcat), accompanied by jockey Stewart Elliot, recorded a sharp half-mile work in :46 1/5 at Belmont Monday. The move was the second fastest of 132 works at the distance yesterday. "We let him roll," said trainer Ben Perkins Jr. "Stewart was happy with him, and he said that he did it easy. He looked good and pulled up good." The five-year-old, who won last year's GI Frank J DeFrancis Memorial, was impressive in his only start this term, a 5 3/4-length score in the Teddy Drone S. Aug. 7.

ALBERTO V05 JUVENILE FILLIES, \$1,000,000, 2yo, f, 1 1/16m

Adieu (El Corredor), winner of the GI Frizette S. Oct. 8, impressed trainer Todd Pletcher with a smart five-furlong move in 1:01 3/5 over Belmont's main track Monday morning. "What I saw from her was exceptional," enthused Pletcher. The filly worked in company with stablemate Bluegrass Cat (Storm Cat), who broke his maiden by an eye-catching 6 1/2-length margin at Belmont Sept. 24. "She was right up in her bridle and moving very nicely, where before she hadn't been much of a workhorse."

JOHN DEERE TURF, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, 1 1/2mT

Trainer John Oxx yesterday reported His Highness the Aga Khan's **Azamour (Ire)** (Night Shift) arrived safely in New York yesterday. The four-year-old will make career finale in Saturday's Breeders' Cup Turf. While the threat of more rain is a concern for this year's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. and G1 Prince of Wales's S. hero, race tactics were on the conditioner's mind yesterday. "It's a big week for him and when you have to travel to a completely different environment, it's uncertain, but he had an uneventful trip and arrived this morning and is settling in," Oxx said at The Curragh yesterday. "There are one or two good local opponents on their home turf, so it'll be a tough race and we could get a lot of rain. He's fairly uncomplicated and has speed and stamina and a nice even pace is the most important thing--the biggest worry is a messy race."

EMIRATES AIRLINE DISTAFF, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m

Yolanda B. Too (Two Punch) will get the services of jockey Eibar Coa in Saturday's Distaff, according to trainer Rick Violette Jr. Monday. The three-year-old, who was sent out for a work at the Big A yesterday, was caught by clockers going 1:45.20 for a mile. "She's doing great, and traveling wonderfully," said Violette. "She's very fit, similar to her fitness level for the Cotillion, and we just wanted her to string along some 13 [second eighths] this morning. She keeps on improving and moving forward." The West Point Thoroughbred-owned filly finished second by a nose to Nothing But Fun in the GII Cotillion H. Oct. 2.

Any movie which features racing, be it National Velvet, The Champ or even the factual Seabiscuit, is usually about as grounded in reality as the Marx Brothers' A Day At The Races. Yet the plots of these films seem no more far-fetched than what has actually happened this year in Britain's top-flight two-year-old races. Last month the G1 Shadwell Stud Middle Park S. fell to Amadeus Wolf, who had been hip number [23](#) at Tattersalls' Breeze Up Sale. Then, three days ago, the G1 Racing Post Trophy was unexpectedly won by Palace Episode, a Machiavellian colt who had followed Amadeus Wolf into the ring as hip [24](#).

Before I go any further, I ought to explain that Britain's breeze-up sales have faced a long, hard struggle in their bid to match the popularity and quality of their American counterparts. Perhaps the climate had a lot to do with it. After all, Doncaster in March, or even Newmarket in April, is hardly comparable to balmy Florida or California in springtime.

As recently as 1998 the median price at Tattersalls' sale was only 10,000gns, with the average falling short of 16,000gns, but there has been a marked improvement over the last five or six years in the quality of the youngsters on offer both at

Doncaster and Newmarket. A growing number of successful graduates have effectively raised the sales' profiles, and this year's Tattersalls catalogue reminded buyers that the 2004 offerings had included Paita (G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud), Montgomery's Arch (G2 Richmond S.) and

Walk in the Park (third in the G1 Criterium International, and later to finish second in the Derby).

Consequently, demand continued to rise at this year's sale, with the median climbing to 35,000gns and the average breaking through the 50,000-guinea barrier for the first time. Now that Amadeus Wolf and Palace Episode have emerged from the sizeable consignment of Con Marnane's Irish-based Bansha House Stables, the average may well be set for a substantial rise in 2006.

The 2005 Bansha House team featured youngsters by such popular stallions as Montjeu, Cape Cross, Green Desert, Danzig, Danehill, Rainbow Quest and In the Wings, plus a colt and a filly by Fusaichi Pegasus. The quality of this team--and the involvement with Fusaichi Pegasus--no doubt reflected Bansha House's triumph at the 2004 Breeze Up, when an 80,000-guinea investment in a Fusaichi Pegasus--Lyric Fantasy colt was transformed into a new European Breeze Up Sale record of 500,000gns. Bansha House also set new European figures for a Breeze Up filly, with a 240,000-guinea daughter of Danehill.

Although this year's Bansha House horses achieved such good prices as 140,000 and 150,000gns, quite a few of them failed to find buyers. Amadeus Wolf was returned to his vendor at 50,000gns--less than Anthony Stroud had paid for him as a yearling in Italy--and Palace Episode was unsold at 44,000gns. Both went into training with the hard-working Kevin Ryan and the Marnane family must now be thrilled that Palace Episode failed to find a buyer, as he carries the colors of Mrs. Marnane.

Palace Episode had been bought by Peter Doyle at Keeneland, Doyle being the buyer of a lot of the Bansha House youngsters.

Palace Episode was conceived at a fee of £80,000 in 2002, Machiavellian's price having been boosted by the 2001 exploits of Medicean, No Excuse Needed and Storming Home.

Palace Episode--a colt bred by Catesby W. Clay's Runnymede Farm--was one of 14 members of Machiavellian's 2003 crop which were sold last year at American yearling sales. This sizeable collection was a response to Darley's prolonged advertising campaign which aimed to convince American breeders of Machiavellian's talents. The gist of these advertisements was that if American breeders wanted to use "the world's best stallion son of Mr. Prospector," they would have to send mares to England to visit Machiavellian. Darley also offered the incentive of foal-share arrangements and special terms for American-based mares.

Machiavellian also did his bit to encourage American support, supplying the likes of Fictitious (GIII De la Rose H.), Horatia (GIII Vinery Matchmaker S.), Kahal (GII Nearctic H.), Majorien (San Marino H.) and Street Cry. He also underlined his ability to get leading performers on Dubai's sand track, where Almutawakel and Street Cry won the World Cup in 1999 and 2002.

Machiavellian may have convinced the breeders, but the venture didn't really succeed at last year's sales, when the 14 yearlings achieving a median of \$122,500. This was some way short of Machiavellian's fee, with Palace Episode's price being \$100,000.

Palace Episode ought to have had greater appeal, as he comes from an excellent family and was bred on the same Machiavellian/Nijinsky cross which had produced Patavellian (G1), Right Approach (G1) and Majorien (G2). Indeed his dam, the unraced Palace Weekend, is inbred 2x4 to the great Nijinsky, through Seattle Dancer and Green Dancer.

Palace Weekend has some distinguished relatives, led by her half brothers Tejano Run (runner-up in the Kentucky Derby) and More Royal (GII Jersey Derby).

The Racing Post winner's third dam, Kazadancoa, was a sister to The Dancer, a Classic-placed filly who now ranks as the third dam of The Deputy (GI Santa Anita Derby) and King Kamehameha (G1 Japanese Derby). Kazadancoa herself produced three graded stakes winners, while another of her half sisters, Beaming Bride, produced the Grade I winners Alwuhush and Husband and the Grade II winner Simply Majestic. Beaming Bride's name provides a clue to the fact that Palace Episode's fifth dam, Aimee, was the second dam of the exceptional Blushing Groom.

There are 1 1/2-mile horses in this list by the likes of Kingmambo, Nureyev and Diesis, which encourages the belief that Palace Episode is going to be one of the Machiavellians which stay the Derby distance. The main question about this progressive colt is whether he is going to be able to reproduce his Group 1-winning form on ground much faster than the boggy ground at Doncaster. Don't rule it out--stranger things have happened.
