KERASHAN TOPS TATTS DAY 2

The Aga Khan's homebred **Kerashan (Ire)** (Sinndar {Ire}) topped day two of Tattersalls' Autumn Horses In Training Sale yesterday when bought for 300,000gns by trainer David Loder, who is soon to retire. Agent John McCormack was the underbidder on the three-year-old, with Alastair Donald of the Kern/Lillingston Association, seated with trainer Ben Cecil, another to bid. "He's going to come back to my place for the time being and then hopefully he'll be racing here and abroad next year," said Loder, who would not name his client. Four-year-old sprinter **Moss Vale (Ire)** (Shinko Forest {Ire}), a multiple stakes winner, will leave Barry Hills' stable to join North Yorkshire handler David Nicholls after making 260,000gns. Agent Bobby O'Ryan bought the colt--who could head to the Hong Kong International races in December--on behalf of owner Lady Chrissy O'Reilly. Lincoln Handicap winner **Stream of Gold (Ire)** (Rainbow Quest) will continue racing in the Middle East after being bought for 220,000gns by Richard Venn of Anthony Stroud Bloodstock on behalf of an undisclosed client. The two-year-old **Genre (GB)** (Orpen), an eight-length nursery winner at Doncaster on Friday, is heading to Ben Cecil at Santa Anita after Alastair Donald secured the colt for 140,000gns. OLD AND NEW AT TAYLOR MADE

Taylor Made Farm near Nicholasville, Kentucky, has announced its stud fees for the 2006 breeding season, highlighted by a jump for mainstays **Unbridled's Song** and **Forestry**. The former, the sire of 11 stakes winners in 2006, will command \$150,000, up from \$125,000 for this year while Forestry, the leading third-crop sire by number of stakes winners, joins the six-figure club and will fetch a fee of \$100,000, up from \$75,000. Two new stallions join the Taylor Made roster--MGISW **Southern Image** (Halo's Image)--at \$15,000; and Forestry's son **Forest Danger**. The winner of this year's GI Carter H. will enter stud at \$20,000. **Northern Afleet**, the sire of dual Classic winner Afleet Alex gets a bump to \$20,000 from \$12,500. "We believe that our service fees for 2006 offer very good value to the breeder," commented Taylor Made Vice President of Stallions Ben Taylor. All stallions stand on live foal terms, payable September 1.

ALL SYSTEMS GO FOR STARCRAFT

On a rainy, blustery Tuesday morning in New York, Australasian superstar **Starcraft (NZ)** (Soviet Star) was rerouted from the main track to trainer Allen Jerkens's indoor jogging track in Barn 30. In company with trainer

Luca Cumani's other Breeders' Cup entrant, Turf hopeful **Alkaased** (Kingmambo), the five-year-old jogged just shy of two miles. Cumani is not concerned about Saturday's track condition. "He's trying the dirt for the first time, so whatever dirt turns up, it will be new to him," the trainer

explained. "Tomorrow we'll take him to the track to see how he likes it." Of running Starcraft in the Classic instead of the Mile, Cumani said, "It's a bold decision to run in the Classic, but one I totally agree with. He's a fully mature street-wise horse and if you didn't try the Classic with a horse like him, you'd never try it. There's less pressure on me to run him in the Classic. If you run him in the Mile, he has to win. If he runs in the Classic and he doesn't win, we can blame the dirt, so we're OK." Spearheading the decision to run in the Classic was Starcraft's owner Paul Makin, who paid an \$800,000 supplement to get into the race. "It's a lot of money, but I'm an old guy," Makin said. "It's not a dress rehearsal. If you've got a really good horse, you should try to excel. He's won all the races he can win in Europe. He's won five Group 1s from seven furlongs to 1 1/2 miles. He should be given his chance to transit from turf to dirt. Of course he's never been on dirt and I'm only getting about even-money on my money. I've made a lot of money betting horses, but this is the worst bet I've ever made."

"There were no holes or tears, but the veterinarian said it would take 30 days of rest to get the swelling out of the suspensory."

GII Darley Alcibiades S. winner **She Says It Best** (Stormy Atlantic) worked a bullet three furlongs yesterday over a muddy Churchill Downs strip in :36 2/5. It was the fastest of 10 works at the distance. "She's doing fine," said trainer Vickie Foley. "The track was muddy and on the heavy side, so it was a good work. She won the [Aug. 20] Debutante [at Ellis Park] in the slop, so I don't see that being a problem."

BESSEMER TRUST JUVENILE, \$1,500,000, 2yo, c/g, 1 1/16m

Leo (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) cantered 1 1/2 miles around Belmont's training track yesterday in preparation for his first start on the main track. "I think he'll like the dirt," said trainer John Gosden. "He's got good action and a good foot for it, and he's handled the Polytrack very well at home." Leo is coming off a win in the Sept. 25 G2 Royal Lodge S. He was sixth over a soft course at Deauville in August. "It was a bog at Deauville and he absolutely hated the track that day," Gosden explained. "He likes something firmer underfoot and that's why I think he'll do well on dirt."

Artie Schiller (El Prado {Ire}), considered one of the country's best turf horses the past two seasons, is still looking for his first Grade I victory. "It's been very frustrating," admitted trainer James Jerkens. "If he retires without a Grade I race, I'll consider it a personal failure." Coming off a narrow loss in the Oct. 2 GII Kelso Breeders' Cup H., Artie Schiller will face a tough task on Saturday when he'll face likely favorite **Leroidesanimaux** (Brz) (Candy Stripes). "If you take both horses' best races, it doesn't look like [Artie Schiller can win]," Jerkens said. "But his last race was one of his best, which is really good to see coming into such a big race."

EMIRATES AIRLINE DISTAFF, \$2,000,000, 3yo/up, f/m, 1 1/8m

While the rest of the competition was content to dodge yesterday's raindrops, it was business as usual for Pamela Ziebarth's **Healthy Addiction** (Boston Harbor). The four-year-old filly, winner in her most recent appearance of the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita Oct. 2, went to the training track and galloped 1 1/2 miles in the mud. "We had the place almost all to ourselves," commented trainer John Sadler. "I guess we were the only ones crazy enough to go out there." The conditioner added that he would not be disappointed if Saturday's race were to take place on a wet track. "She doesn't mind the off going," he explained. In her lone try over a surface rated something other than fast, Healthy Addiction was second to the talented Two Trail Sioux at Santa Anita in January.

"We are pleased to offer this Pay-Per-View option to Breeders' Cup enthusiasts around the world who do not have easy access to live television coverage of the event," said Ken Kirchner, senior vice president of product development for the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "This offering increases the global stature of the Breeders' Cup, and is something we hope to build upon in the years to come."

NEW SHOOTERS

They're finishing up the last Kentucky yearling sale of the year at Fasig today, and plowing through day three of four, of the world's biggest Used Horse sale, the Autumn Horses-In-Training Sale at Tattersalls in Newmarket. Then there is this weekend's Breeders' Cup at Belmont Park, where connections of most of the top European horses are hoping ground conditions are not too soft; that's a switch, isn't it? After all that excitement, it's time to head to Lexington again, where Fasig-Tipton has put together a pretty stellar catalogue to kick off 13 days of mixed sales, beginning Sunday, Nov. 6.

Appropriately enough, one of the many features of this catalogue will be the first of 23 mares, catalogued in the first five days of Lexington's November mixed sales (Fasig and Keeneland Books 1-2), in foal to last year's superstar three-year-old, Smarty Jones. His race record evokes comparisons with some of the great champions, and champion sires, of yesteryear. Like Secretariat, his most impressive Triple Crown race was the Preakness, in which Smarty Jones pulverized his opposition, winning by more than 11 lengths and running a Beyer 118 (equivalent to at least a Timeform 130) in the process. Like Northern Dancer (and quite a few others with far less distinguished stallion careers), his Triple Crown bid came a cropper in the Belmont. Heady comparisons, I know, but this was a seriously good horse, and the first mares in foal to him are sure to be received with intense interest.

'Smarty' is one of six first-year stallions with nine or more mares catalogued in foal in the November sales' first five days, and it may not be a coincidence that, in the cases of three of the six, it doesn't take very long to get to Gone West's name in the pedigree. He's definitely staking his claim to be regarded as Mr. Prospector's number two sire of sires (behind Fappiano). His successful sire sons include Mr. Greeley, Elusive Quality (sire of Smarty Jones, of course), and Grand Slam. His son Came Home was very well received at the yearling sales, and will certainly be a candidate for 2006 freshman sire honors, and Gone West himself is also the sire of

Speightstown, last year's champion sprinter, who is represented by 19 mares-in-foal in the sales' first five days. Grand Slam is the sire of another of the six, Strong Hope, with 13 mares catalogued in foal. Like Speightstown, an expensive yearling raced by Eugene and Laura Melnyk, Strong Hope was a dual Grade II winner, a credential which has been working out just fine for another Claiborne stallion, Pulpit.

Aside from the Gone West contingent, Medaglia d'Oro has 22 catalogued, and his credentials are really impressive, too. The son of El Prado ran first or second in 13 Grade I or Grade II stakes in 17 career starts. Considering El Prado's fantastic record at stud, and that Medaglia d'Oro is a stunning looker, it's not surprising he's proving very popular with breeders. Also deservedly popular is Pleasantly Perfect, who twice had Medaglia d'Oro's measure in two huge 10-furlong events in 2003-04 (in fairness, maybe a tick beyond Medaglia's best distance), the 2003 Breeders' Cup Classic and the 2004 Dubai World Cup. The only other son of Pleasant Colony to stand at Lane's End has been Pleasant Tap, also his most (some would say only) successful son, and for sure Pleasantly Perfect was good enough to defy that hoodoo.

Rounding out the top six first-year covering sires in first-five-day representation is Lion Heart (14 catalogued), the best colt yet sired by Storm Cat's son Tale of the Cat. He was a Grade I winner at two and three, and ran second to Smarty Jones in last year's Kentucky Derby.

Bold Ruler Survival Strategies...

Incredibly, the very survival of eight-time champion sire Bold Ruler's line has been hanging by a thread--by the name of A.P. Indy--for the last few years, so advocates and admirers of the line will be heartened by the prominence of Seattle Slew (a great-grandson of Bold Ruler, via Boldnesian and the short-lived Bold Reasoning) among young sires in the sales' first five days. Even though Mineshaft (by A.P. Indy) and Empire Maker (by Unbridled) stood for more money, Vindication is going to generate just as much excitement. A spectacular individual, born when his dad, Seattle Slew, was 26, Vindication was the unbeaten, untested, champion two-year-old colt of 2002, but never ran again. Since I'm in the mood today for bringing up some of those great names from yesteryear, it does kind of remind you of Raise a Native, doesn't it? Four starts, four wins as a two-year-old in 1963, never ran again. That didn't hurt his chances at stud.

Vindication presents the tantalizing possibility that there could be another Seattle Slew as good as A.P. Indy, so the fact that Mineshaft is the best son yet of A.P. Indy to go to stud is maybe relevant, too. In his final seven career starts, all nine to 10-furlong dirt races in 2003, Mineshaft ran a Beyer number between 114-118 seven times. He did lose one of those, when Perfect Drift beat him in the Stephen Foster, but talk about a model of consistency. Vindication, with 14 foals catalogued, is sure to grab the headlines, and deservedly so, but that's not to say those Classic types Mineshaft and 2003 Belmont winner Empire Maker, who each have four foals catalogued in the first five days, aren't going to have their admirers, too. Sure they will, and so they should.

A.P. Indy's best sire son to date would be Pulpit, so string number three to the Bold Ruler-through-Seattle Slew bow this year is Sky Mesa, who was the second-best two-year-old of 2002, behind Vindication. He was unbeaten in three starts at two and was on course to meet Vindication in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but injury intervened. He ran but didn't win at three--another characteristic which is no impediment to future sire success. Sky Mesa has a terrific pedigree, too. He's out of Caress, a multiple Grade III winner of \$666,076 by Storm Cat, and a full sister to Bernstein, from the La Troienne branch (Busanda) which also produced Outstandingly. He has 12 foals catalogued. So between the three of them--Vindication, Mineshaft, and Sky Mesa--there's at least a chance of an impending Bold Ruler revival.

Besides Empire Maker, who represents Fappiano through Unbridled, this great sire line is also represented by perhaps Mr. Prospector's last high-profile son, 2003 champion sprinter Aldebaran, who has five foals from his first crop catalogued during the sales' first five days. Impreccably bred, out of European champion Chimes of Freedom from another blockbuster family, Aldebaran had form behind horses like Mozart in Europe, then came to America and ran second in four Grade I's at four before coming into his own in his championship year, when he won three Grade I's at seven furlongs to a mile. He's getting a serious shot at Darby Dan, and there are plenty who fancy his chances of becoming Mr. Prospector's last seriously successful sire son, too.

With the highest number of first-crop representatives on the first five days is Airdrie Stud's Harlan's Holiday, with 18 catalogued between Fasig and Keeneland's first two books. He was a triple Grade I winner at three and four, earning \$3.6 million, and is by the same son of Storm Cat--Harlan--as the highly rated Menifee. Ashford is represented by two Storm Cat sons, Hold That Tiger (11) and Van Nistelrooy (6). Latter named after a Dutch soccer star for Manchester United, for those of you puzzling over that one.

Also with five or more catalogued during the first five days are: the speedy sprinter Posse, by Silver Deputy (nine); another by Gone West, 2002 Kentucky Derby second (to War Emblem) Proud Citizen (eight), also at Airdrie; Darley-at-Jonabell's 2002 Breeders' Cup Juvenile second (to Vindication) Kafwain (six), by the same stud's Cherokee Run; Gainesway's Forty Niner horse, trained by Neil Drysdale, Sunday Break (five); and New York sire Wiseman's Ferry (also five), by that extra-hot 2005 two-year-old sire, Hennessy. **Bill Oppenheim may be contacted at bopp@erb.com. In the very first James Bond film, Dr. No, Honey Ryder, in the alluring screen form of Ursula Andress, makes a stunning entrance as she emerges from the Jamaican seas. On Sunday at Woodbine, the equine Honey Ryder, surged through a sea of rivals to claim the GI E.P. Taylor S. The win, which saw Honey Ryder take her earnings to over \$1,000,000 crowns a season in which the four-year-old has captured five of seven starts, including the GII The Very One H., GII Orchid H. and GIII Glens Falls H.

Honey Ryder is one of two stakes winners sired by the With Approval horse, Lasting Approval. With Approval has primarily made his name as a sire of turf horses, and Lasting Approval was no exception, capturing the Cumberland S., Seattle Slew S. and GII Oak Tree Derby on the grass at three, and the GIII Maker's Mark Mile at four. He also captured seconds in a pair of Grade I's, the GI Hollywood Derby at three and the GI Early Times Classic at four.

Honey Ryder's dam Cuando Quiere, a daughter of Affirmed, had already made her name as a producer well before Honey Ryder was foaled. Her first two foals were Cuando, a three-time listed stakes winner, who also earned places in four graded stakes; and Cuando Puede, heroine of the GIII Arlington Heights Oaks. Her third foal, Cuanto Es, didn't capture a stakes, but did take second in the GIII Ballston Spa Breeders' Cup H.

One would have thought that those achievements would have earned Cuando Quiere a visit to a stallion rather more fashionable than Lasting Approval, whose stud fee the year Honey Ryder was conceived stood at \$6,500. However, at the time, commercial considerations were not at the forefront of her breeders'--Wimborne Farm--and as far as breeding a racehorse was concerned, there was a "method in the madness." Cuando and Cuando Puede had been sired by Lord At War. A grandson of the great British racehorse, Brigadier Gerard, Lord At War was a champion in his native Argentina, and subsequently a top-class runner, and very effective sire in North America.

With Lord At War no longer available, it was an enterprising move to breed the mare to Lasting Approval, who was out of a daughter of Lord At War. Ultimately, the decision proved to be a very reasonable one from a commercial standpoint, as Honey Ryder realized \$70,000 as a yearling at the Wimbledon Farm dispersal in July, 2002.

Cuando Quiere herself was never able to win a race. She does, however, own a very interesting pedigree. Her fifth dam, Level Best, was a top-class mare whose

numerous stakes victories included the Coaching Club American Oaks. Level Best was a daughter of the great horse Equipoise and Cuando Quiere has Equipoise and his sister Schwester 5x5x6. The connection gets even closer with Cuando Quiere's third dam, the Lafayette and Debutante S. winner, Bright Silver. She was by Native Dancer, with Level Best (by Equipoise) as her third dam, while Cuando Quiere's grandsire, Exclusive Native, was by a son of Raise a Native out of a mare by a son of Equipoise. Bright Silver produced the Juvenile S. winner Prize Silver, but Cuando Quiere's granddam, the Olympia mare, Alpine Peak, was only a winner. She did better at stud, however, producing three stakes winners, headed by Sun and Snow, a daughter of Hawaii, who captured the GII Kentucky Oaks and GII Ashland S. Sun and Snow subsequently produced a pair of stakes winners and is ancestress of seven more, including the GIII Miss Preakness S. victress Belong to Sea; Chilly Billy, winner in England of the G2 Gimcrack S.; and the Italian group winner, Fisich.

Another of Alpine Peak's stakes winners was Cuando Quiere's dam Quatre Saisons, a daughter of Court Recess (who had Equipoise and his sister Schwester 4x5). Quatre Saisons never produced a stakes winner, but Cuando Quiere is not the only one of her daughters to become the dam of a graded stakes winners, as Quatre Saisons' unplaced Dynaformer filly Dnya Peak is the dam of the GIII Valley View S. winner Dyna Da Wyna.

Honey Ryder is a complete outcross at five generations. We can, however, note that Lasting Approval has Busanda and her three-parts sister Searching 4x4. They are by War Admiral out of daughters of La Troienne, the greatest producing daughter of Teddy. Cuando Quiere's sire Affirmed carries something of a reverse of this cross through his broodmare sire Crafty Admiral, who is by a grandson of Teddy out of a War Admiral mare. We can also note that Honey Ryder is by a Caro-line stallion out of an Exclusive Native line mare. The Caro/Exclusive Native cross produced the Grade I winning two-year-old Tejano, and the pair crop up together in a number of other good runners, including the Group/Grade I winner Occupandiste and Songandaprayner, and the group and graded scorers Belle Cherie, Firm Pledge, Rapid Selection, Royal Spy, Wings of Erin, Bernimixa, Logia, Majmu and Miraculous.

DISTORTED HUMOR COLT TOPS F-T FALL A colt by Distorted Humor distanced all other yearlings with a whopping \$600,000 final bid from Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stables LLC at Tuesday's second session of the Fasig-Tipton Fall Yearlings Sale, conducted at the Newtown Paddocks in Lexington. The second foal produced from the Lear Fan mare Happy Nation, hip 417 was consigned by James Keogh's Grovendale, acting as agent. The Mar. 14 foal is from the family of multiple stakes winner and graded stakes placed Happily Unbridled. Distorted Humor is the sire of Grade I winners Funny Cide, Awesome Humor, Flower Alley and Commentator. Today's final session begins at 10 a.m.

MOBIL RETIRED TO WINDFIELDS Canadian champion Mobil (Langfuhr--Kinetigal, by Naskra) has been retired and will begin his stud career next season at Windfields Farm near Oshawa, Ontario. The Gustav Schickedanz homebred was named Canada's champion older horse in 2004 after winning the GIII Dominion Day H., GIII Vigil H. and Halton S. In his final career start, the five-year-old was second behind Leroidesanimaux (Brz) in the Sept. 18 GI Atto Mile. "We are tremendously excited to bring a horse as good-looking and talented as Mobil into our stallion barn," said Windfields farm manager Simon Cassidy. "His soundness, tenacity and sheer will to win make him a wonderful sire prospect. The Schickedanz family has bred some really brilliant horses and we are glad to be associated with them." Mobil retires with 12 wins, 11 in stakes company, and 10 placings from 29 starts and earnings of \$1,877,136. He will stand as the property of Schickedanz for a fee of C\$6,500, payable when the foal stands and nurses.
