Did jockey Garrett Gomez ever dream he would ride a Breeders' Cup winner? Just minutes after guiding **Stevie Wonderboy** (Stephen Got Even) to a 1 1/4-length

victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Gomez admitted, "A couple of years ago, I was wondering if I would ever ride again." His career was nearly derailed, not by injury, but by substance abuse problems. Gomez, 33, started riding in 1988 at small tracks in New Mexico and Nebraska, and by 1998

had earned his first Hollywood Park riding title. The following season, he found himself with four Breeders' Cup mounts and nearly pulled off a huge upset in the Classic, finishing second with 26-1 Budroyale. But hard riding went hand and hand with hard living, and it wasn't long before business began to slide. Gomez was off the board with a pair of longshots in the 2000 Breeders' Cup and again in his lone opportunity in 2001. He didn't make it to the starting gate for racing's championship event in 2002 and quit riding altogether just a couple of months later. "That was difficult," the rider said. "What made it really hard was knowing I might not ever be back." It took nearly two years, but Gomez got help and got it together. "I had to deal with my past and make amends," he said. "Once I stepped up to the plate, I found some gratitude and grew up. I realized that the most important thing is family." Gomez returned to the saddle last September, and was back on top of the standings at Hollywood Park this summer. The Arizona native came into the Breeders' Cup loaded for bear, commanding seven mounts on the card. After his win in the Juvenile, he just missed in the Sprint, running second to **Silver Train** (Old Trieste) with **Taste of Paradise** (Conquistador Cielo), then came back to pilot **Artie Schiller** (El Prado {Ire}) to a 3/4-length tally in the Mile. "It's unbelievable," he said. "I never expected to have so much success so soon after coming back. Now I just can't wait to get home and see my kids."

A CLASSIC MOMENT

If jockey Jerry Bailey decides to call it quits at the end of the year, the 22nd running of the GI Breeders' Cup Classic will provide a fitting ending to a stellar career. The seven-time champion rider picked up his fifth Classic triumph, driving 2-1 favorite **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado) to a game length victory over **Flower Alley** (Distorted Humor) at Belmont Park yesterday. The 48-year-old rider had a tough time of it up to the final race of the day, running third with Juvenile favorite **First Samurai** (Giant's Causeway) and finishing off the board with four of his first six mounts. But Bailey felt good about his chances in the Classic. "I didn't have my bottom lip dragging walking into the paddock," he said. "I really felt confident that this horse would pull me out, and he did." **Classic cont. p2**

SAINT'S ALIVE

Jerry Bailey had every reason to believe in the five-year-old Saint Liam. The bay had been first or second in eight of his 10 starts over the last two seasons and

was coming off a 2-length tally in the Sept. 10 GI Woodward S. over the Belmont main track, his third Grade I victory of the season. He did have to break from post 12 in the 13-horse Classic field, but he overcame that obstacle for the win. Bailey sent Saint Liam away from his disadvantageous post, and the Kentucky-bred took up a stalking

position off 30-1 pacesetter Sun King. Fourth for the opening half mile, he dropped back a bit after six panels in 1:12.23, but powered to the front at the head of the stretch. Always prominent, Flower Alley tried to keep pace with the crowd's choice while racing along the rail and even got a head in front as they neared the wire, but Saint Liam would not be denied. "When he broke, he broke out sharply and stayed there for 20 or 30 yards, so instead of saving ground for the first few jumps," Bailey said, "I was losing ground, but I was trying to keep him off the leaders as long as possible so I could leave him with a target to run at. When I turned up the backside, I was really pleased with how well he was travelling." The jockey was never worried that three-year-old Flowey Alley might get the better of him. "I knew I had that horse," he said.

Double Trouble...

Trainer Rick Dutrow Jr., who earlier in the day sent out Silver Train to post an 11-1 upset in the Sprint, was not quite as certain of the outcome. "I thought he'd win easier than he did," he admitted, but added, "I couldn't be happier. Oh my God, what a day!" Dutrow saddled his first Breeders' Cup starter in 2002, sending out Carson Hollow to finish 13th in the Sprint. He finished fourth in last year's Juvenile Fillies with Sis City.

Making His Mark...

With his latest Classic success, Bailey extended his lead as the Breeders' Cup's winningest jockey, earning his 15th victory in the event. He has earned \$21,794,440 in Breeders' Cup purses, but is still \$1,238,920 shy of the mark held by now retired rider Pat Day. Will Bailey, who has contemplated retirement for the past couple of years, be hanging up his boots, or will he be back next year to try and break Day's mark? He hasn't yet decided. "I'm going to treat (this year) like I have the past several," he said. "I'll finish it out, take time off with my family and decide if I want to do it another year. It's wonderful to win these races, but I have a family that I miss a lot. I'm on the road a lot. There's so much to be weighed." TALKING HORSE MAKES GOOD

For a good portion of the week leading up to yesterday's program, punters were left to debate the condition of the turf course. Given the recent spate of rainy weather in the New York area, there was certain to be ease in the ground, which suited the connections of **Shirocco (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) just fine. The winner of the 2004 G1 Deutsches Derby has always excelled over an off turf and did so again yesterday, leading a clean sweep of the GI John Deere Turf for Europe. After closing 2004 with a nose defeat of Electrocutonist in the Oct. 17 G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club, his final start for Andreas Schutz, the bay joined the Andre Fabre stable and made a favorable impression in his seasonal debut, a third in the G2 Prix Foy at Longchamp Sept. 11. He was given his chance in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe three weeks later and again gave an excellent account of himself, running fourth. The Longchamp centerpiece had produced no fewer than five previous winners of the Turf. Could it tack on another? Piloted by the flamboyant Christophe Soumillon, Shirocco broke smartly to sit off the early pace. Soumillon sent his mount to the front on the far turn and he shrugged off all challenges.

Family Values...

A full sister to multiple graded-stakes winner Country Hideaway--a stretch-running sprinter--Pleasant Home mirrored her sister's style. She broke her maiden in her second start last July and added an allowance win over this track next out in September. Following a close third going nine panels at Gulfstream Jan. 16, the dark bay had her picture taken in a one-mile contest at the Hallandale oval Mar. 27. She shipped in to surprise the GIII Bed O' Roses H. at Aqueduct Apr. 23 and, following a pair of disappointing efforts, rallied for second to **Happy Ticket** (Anet) in the seven-furlong GI Ballerina H. at Saratoga Aug. 28. McGaughey sent the four-year-old to Keeneland from her Saratoga base for the GI Spinster S. Oct. 9 and Pleasant Home gave a good account of herself, rallying very wide to claim the runner-up spot. She continued to progress, and McGaughey opted to enter her here. "She has really come around lately," he said. "My crew up at Saratoga had her. They did a great job with her." The Phipps homebred didn't attract much attention in the early stages of the Distaff as she assumed her usual spot near the back while **Capeside Lady** (Cape Town) led through fractions of :46 1/5 and 1:10 3/5. But that changed in a hurry on the sweeping turn, when the longshot rocketed into contention while travelling four wide. With **Ashado** (Saint Ballado) and **Society Selection** (Coronado's Quest) locked in their private battle on the inside, Pleasant Home went by in midstretch and poured it on late. "When I entered the turn, I knew had so much horse, I knew I was going to win," said winning rider Cornelio Velasquez. This was the seventh Breeders' Cup victory for the Phipps family. As for 2004 Distaff winner Ashado, she ran third in what was likely her career finale. "This is bittersweet," admitted trainer Todd Pletcher. "I would have liked to send her out with a win, but you could never be disappointed with the career that this filly has had. It's been a tremendous run these last three years." The four-year-old, runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in 2003 and an Eclipse Award winner last year, is slated to sell at Keeneland November.

THE KING IS DETHRONED

Yesterday's Breeders' Cup card was not kind to favorites. Caught by 5-1 **Artie Schiller** (El Prado {Ire}) in the final yards, **Leroidesanimaux (Brz)** (Candy Stripes) became the fourth of six favorites to come up short, losing the Mile by 3/4 of a length. Leroidesanimaux was bet down to 6-5 after winning eight consecutive races. He looked unbeatable when romping to a 7 3/4-length score in the GI Atto Mile at Woodbine Sept. 18, and seemed to be on the way to his ninth straight victory at the top of the lane yesterday. The chestnut rated just off solid splits and forged to the lead as they straightened for home. But jockey of the moment Garrett Gomez guided Artie Schiller through traffic, joined Leroidesanimaux at the top of the lane and was able get the better of that foe at the wire.

Double Your Money...

Twice a Grade II winner at three, Artie Schiller ended the term with a troubled 12th-place finish on Breeders' Cup day. The bay kicked off 2005 with a win in the Apr. 15 GII Maker's Mark Mile, then was second by a nose in the May 21 GII Dixie S. Third in the June 11 GI Manhattan H., he came back to take the Aug. 1 GII Bernard Baruch H. at Saratoga, but came out on the losing end of the photo in the Oct. 2 GII Kelso Breeders' Cup Mile. He closed from just off the leaders to run his record on the Belmont turf to five-for-eight with the victory, and more than doubled his earnings, pushing his bankroll to \$2,003,853. "This horse always runs his eyeballs out," said trainer Jimmy Jerkens, who was celebrating his first Breeders' Cup success. "The race happened the way you dream about it. He saved ground and got out at just the right time and everything worked out." Added Gomez, who picked up the mount after the colt's regular rider, Richie Migliore, broke his leg in a paddock accident last week, "When he went, he really went. It was a pleasure to ride him."

On the Muscle...

Leroidesanimaux raced with a sharp pace and took over at the top of the lane, but could not fend off the winner and had his winning streak broken. "I tried to get him to stay back off the others on the backstretch, but he was strong the whole way," jockey John Velazquez said. "He was just very aggressive and, because of that, I could never get him to the point where he felt comfortable. He kind of overused himself the first part. He did try in the stretch when I asked him; he just didn't have enough left to hold off the other one. I thought I had a good post to get him to relax outside. He just never did." The race was marred by the injury of **Funfair (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}), who broke down on the backstretch. The six-year-old gelding suffered a compound fracture of the right hind cannon bone and had to be euthanized. Undefeated in his first three starts in the U.S., the bay beat Artie Schiller a head in the Oct. 2 GII Kelso Breeders' Cup H. at Belmont. Overall, he had six wins, two seconds and two thirds from his 17 career starts for earnings of \$432,459.

ALL GOOD THINGS MUST COME TO AN END

It had to happen sometime. **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Soldier) was a perfect 10-for-10 coming into the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but had to battle on the front end early and came up empty in the stretch, fading to seventh at odds of 7-10. The beneficiary of the speed duel was longshot **Silver Train** (Old Trieste), who rallied as the pacemakers wilted and held off **Taste of Paradise** (Conquistador Cielo) for a head victory. "We have to take the bad with the good," said Greg Gilchrist, the trainer of Lost in the Fog. "That's the way things go. He'll be back next year--that wasn't his last race."

Silver Train, off at odds of 11-1, proved he was graded-stakes material with a five-length victory in the GI Jerome H. going a mile at Belmont Sept. 11, and showed he was a threat at six furlongs when he stopped the clock in 1:07 3/5 in an allowance at the track in July. Overlooked despite the solid credentials, the three-year-old settled in fifth as 45-1 **Attila's Storm** (Forest Wildcat), 16-1 **Battle Won** (Honour and Glory) and Lost in the Fog fought through fractions of :22.01 and :44.56. Silver Train came running on the outside to take the lead near the eighth pole and gave it everything he had to the wire to hold on. Taste of Paradise had to steady in the stretch, but came flying once clear to just miss. "Everybody came out running and I sat behind them," said winning jockey Edgar Prado, who also took the Juvenile Fillies with Folklore. "It worked out great. The best day of my life was when my child was born, but the best day of my racing life is today."

No Excuses...

There were no excuses for Lost in the Fog. "I shook the stick at him at the head of the lane and he opened up, but then he just flattened out on me," jockey Russell Baze said. Added Greg Gilchrist, "He was laying third and I was kind of happy with that. In the turn for home, he didn't have it in him today for no apparent reason. It would have been nice to cap it off today, but it wasn't meant to be. He'll take a flight home Tuesday. I'll keep him at the barn and check him out. After that, he'll be in line for a vacation."

Wildcat Heir (Forest Wildcat) pressed the pace, but tired badly to finish 10th as the 6-1 second choice. The five-year-old stumbled as he crossed the finish line, then fell and had to be vanned back to the barn, but did not appear to be seriously injured.

International Star...

Intercontinental, a Group 1-placed runner at two and Classic-placed at three, plied her trade at a mile upon arriving in the States following a French campaign under the guidance of Andre Fabre. The regally bred bay capped 2004 with her first Grade I victory in the Matriarch S., a race won by her 3/4-sister Heat Haze (GB) the previous year. Sportingly kept in training this year at age five, Intercontinental kicked off her campaign with a successful title defense in the GIII Jenny Wiley S. at Keeneland in April despite being very rank in the early stages of that race. She followed with a second to Sand Springs in the GII Just a Game Breeders' Cup H.--which she won in 2004--at Belmont, but rebounded to land the GIII Royal Heroine H. at Hollywood July 3. Her temperment issues resurfaced in the GI John C. Mabee H. at Del Mar three weeks later, when she pulled and failed to settle under jockey Alex Solis before ultimately finishing third, beaten just 1 1/4 lengths. Jerry Bailey climbed back aboard for the GII Palomar H. Sept. 3 at Del Mar and had a tough time restraining the five-year-old, who repeatedly tossed her head while leading throughout. She broke alertly in her next start, the one-mile GII WinStar Galaxy S. Oct. 9 at Keeneland, and settled much more kindly for Bailey while fending off **Wend** (Pulpit) for her fourth graded stakes victory of the year. Intercontinental had never before been farther than nine furlongs, and had tried that trip only twice at that. Her first attempt was in the 2004 GI Diana H. at Saratoga, when she floundered over yielding ground en route to a fifth-place finish as the 4-5 favorite. The second was the aforementioned John C. Mabee at Del Mar. With the bay mare training smartly in recent weeks, trainer Bobby Frankel decided to try her over these 10 furlongs. Bailey opted to ride the favored defending champion **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}), but Rafael Bejarano proved an able deputy. The duo bounced out of post 10 and took the lead heading into the first turn. Able to post comfortable fractions of :48 4/5 and 1:13 3/5 over the good ground, Intercontinental opened a bit of daylight passing the quarter pole and kept on going in the stretch. The victory just might have secured her an Eclipse Award as the nation's top turf distaffer. "I feel really, really happy," said Bejarano, winning his first Breeders' Cup race. "I want to thank everyone for this great opportunity. The horse broke good, but she wasn't going as fast as she has. I tried to take hold and stay comfortable. At the quarter pole, I could feel the other horses coming, but I knew she could hold on."

A \$100,000 graduate of this year's Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, Stevie Wonderboy had the misfortune of running into the ill-fated What A Song in his first two career trips to the post, finishing second in their respective bows at Hollywood Park June 18, but his third-place effort in the July 16 GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S.--where he was gobbling up ground late--stamped him as one to keep a close eye on. A four-length maiden winner at Del Mar Aug. 6, the chestnut with the red shadow roll overcame a very wide journey to win the GII Del Mar Futurity by an impressive five lengths Sept. 7. The 52-day layoff to this race, though by design, was a question mark, but he was nonetheless sent off the second choice to undefeated **First Samurai** (Giant's Causeway).

Tough Start, Smooth Finish...

Stevie Wonderboy, checked at the break, stumbled along the backstretch run and raced far back as Henny Hughes disputed the pace with **Dawn of War** (Catenus). Given his cue by Garrett Gomez on the sweeping Belmont turn, the colt weaved his way

through the field and into contention as they reached the quarter pole. Four wide into the stretch, he still had 2 1/2 lengths to find with a furlong to race, but covered the final sixteenth of a mile in less than six seconds and won going away. "My horse has a

heckuva turn of foot, but I had trouble getting to [Henny Hughes and First Samurai] for a minute," said Gomez, winning his first Breeders' Cup event. "I hope he's my Derby horse." First Samurai raced further back than in his previous races, challenged four wide into the lane, but could not sustain his bid and suffered his first career defeat. Every Picture Tells a Story...

Second in her career debut in May, Folklore earned her diploma in her next start at Belmont June 3 and followed that with a game runner-up effort to **Adieu** (El Corredor) in the Astoria S. July 3. She turned the tables on that rival at Saratoga in the GII Adirondack S. July 27, but was forced to settle for second to that rival in the GII Spinaway S. Aug. 26 at the Spa. With Adieu absent from the GI Matron S. Sept. 17, Folklore turned in a tour-de-force, romping by 14 lengths with Prado aboard for the first time. Lukas opted to train her up to the Breeders' Cup instead of going for the GI Frizette S. Oct. 8, which Adieu annexed. "She puts so much into her mornings, and when she ran that monster race here in the Matron, she didn't even hit the wire and I said, 'That's it,'" Lukas explained. "I called Bob and Beverly Lewis that night and said, 'Bob, if it's all the same to you, I'd like to go the 42-day break and come into this off that one good effort.' And of course, typical Bob and Beverly Lewis, Bob said, 'You're driving the bus.' That was that."

Racing into History...

Folklore drew the rail, but was the clear favorite despite the presence of her nemesis Adieu. An alert start allowed her to alternate for the lead down the backstretch before being eased to the outside by Prado. She overtook **Knights Templar** (Exploit) on the turn and had a three-length lead in midstretch, which was cut into late by the rallying **Wild Fit** (Wild Wonder). "I said to Edgar, 'This is a Breeder's Cup and this is not the junior prom,'" Lukas said. "Ride your race like she was the best filly." He added that Folklore was a bit of a departure for him in certain ways. "She's a slight filly," he admitted. "She is not a typical Wayne Lukas filly that we would buy maybe in a sale. But she's got a little more scope and length to her. I think she's going to be a great two-turn filly. I'm already thinking Oaks, and you can put that down."

Pedigree Power...

Folklore, from the family of champion Smarty Jones, is the first foal from the Storm Cat mare Contrive, who was purchased by the Lewises as a yearling for \$825,000. She didn't make it to the races, and was sold for \$140,000 last year at Keeneland November while in foal to Silver Charm. Contrive is slated to go through the ring again at the upcoming Keeneland sale, but the guess is that she will bring considerably more this time.
