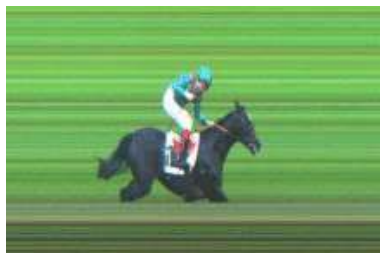

GILCHRIST MAKES NO EXCUSES FOR 'FOGGY'

A disappointing seventh as the odds-on chalk in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, **Lost in the Fog** (Lost Solider) exited the race with no problems and no excuses, according to trainer Greg Gilchrist. "I think excuses are for losers," said Gilchrist, who is based on the West Coast. "I'm not going to make any excuses. He just got outrun." Lost in the Fog is scheduled to ship out of Belmont Park tomorrow to Southern Chase Farm in Ocala, Florida for a two- to three-month vacation. "I would say he'd be ready to run in the month of April," added Gilchrist.

STARCRAFT CIGAR-BOUND?

Paul Makin put his money where his mouth is and ponied up \$800,000 to supplement **Starcraft (NZ)** (Soviet Star) to the mile-and-a-quarter GI Breeders' Cup Classic, only to see his towering star tire down the lane and finish seventh to Saint Liam. While Makin was disappointed with the effort, and with some of the restrictions he encountered in America, he told *Racing Post* that Starcraft might remain in the States. "We might run him in the [Nov. 26, GI] Cigar Mile [at Aqueduct] or could leave him here with Christophe Clement," Makin told the publication. "I think he probably doesn't stay a mile and a quarter, that plus the dirt issue." Starcraft, winner of the G1 Prix de Moulin and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. this term in Europe, was making his dirt debut in the Classic. Makin added that he was disappointed with some of the treatment he and his horse received during the week. "We have had two inspectors with our vet who walked round every five minutes," he said. "We couldn't even wash his eye. They wanted to see what it was we were going to use, and stopped us from doing it. It probably didn't affect the horse, but it affected us." **Breeders' Cup Wrap-up cont. p2**

THE WAY TO GO Longchamp's G3 Prix des Chenes provided the springboard to success in this contest for Dalakhani (Ire) in 2002, Bago (Fr) in 2003 and Helios Quercus (Fr) last year. **Carlotamix** enjoyed that golden route into this, returning for the Sept. 17 Longchamp score off a debut win at Deauville's all-weather track Aug. 2. Settled four lengths off the pace in fifth, the eventual winner was sent wide to the stands' side off the home turn. Followed only by **Porto Santo**, he had that rival's measure throughout the straight and--separated from Stormy River by the width of the course--was pushed out along the hedge to secure a decisive victory. "He's a nice little horse with plenty of ability," explained his winning handler. "He is now finished for the season, but will most definitely stay further [than a mile] next year," he added. Porto Santo stayed on for third to complete a big weekend for his dam Exciting Times (Fr) (Jeune Homme), whose daughter Gorella (Fr) was a close third in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Saturday.

BREEDERS' CUP BOASTS RECORD HANDLE

Saturday's 10-race card at Belmont, featuring the eight races of the Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, saw a new record in total wagering of \$122,106,154 from common and separate pools. Total wagering on the eight Breeders' Cup races also produced a record of \$112,865,068. The marks surpassed those established last year, but officials are still waiting for figures from Italy, Sweden, Norway and the Caribbean. Belmont's on-track wagering for the 10-race card, including the Head-2-Head wager, was \$14,742,520. That figure was a record for Belmont, topping the \$14,461,402 wagered by the 120,000-plus crowd at the 2004 GI Belmont S. won by Smarty Jones. The attendance for the championship day was 54,289, achieved despite chilly, windy weather. It was the highest attendance ever for the Breeders' Cup at Belmont, surpassing the mark of 52,987 set in 2001. "When you quantify it and look at on site and off site, it was a big day," NTRA Commissioner and Breeders' Cup President D.G. Van Clief Jr. told *The Blood-Horse*.

CUP AN EMOTIONAL RUN FOR DUTROW During a breakfast yesterday to honor the winners from Saturday's program, an emotionally and physically drained

Rick Dutrow Jr. reflected on his Breeders' Cup victories with favored **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado) in the Classic and with 11-1 **Silver Train** (Old Trieste) in the Sprint. Completely hoarse the morning after, the 46-year-old says he is living out a fantasy. "To be in this kind of position is something you dream of...and that's what I've been doing a lot of," said Dutrow Jr., the tears welling up as he recounted accompanying his father to the track during his youth. Richard Dutrow Sr., the trainer of such

horses as Lite the Fuse and King's Swan, passed away in 1999. Regarding the Classic, the conditioner and owner William Warren Jr. mapped out a strategy at the beginning of the year and saw that plan come to fruition on Saturday. "When we skipped this race last year, this was the only thing that was on my mind all year," Dutrow Jr. explained. "We skipped Dubai [World Cup] with him, we just wanted him to have a chance to be Horse of the Year and to win a big race like this."

For jockey Jerry Bailey, it was a fifth victory in North America's richest event, but possibly his final one. Bailey has intimated that retirement looms a distinct possibility. "If it is my last one, it's a great way to go out," said the 48-year-old. And the odds of being back for the 2006 Breeders' Cup? "Probably the same as they would have been last year, and I didn't think I'd be here then. I'll finish up at Thanksgiving, take a month off and figure it out."

SHOEMAKER WINNER GOMEZ EYES DERBY

Garrett Gomez was in no hurry to leave the Big Apple following his dual Breeders' Cup victories aboard **Stevie**

Wonderboy (Stephen Got Even) in the Juvenile and **Artie Schiller** (El Prado {Ire}) in the Mile.

Gomez, who has overcome personal problems to rank in the top five among the country's leading riders this year, was looking ahead to next year's Triple Crown yesterday with cautious optimism. "[The Derby] is quite a ways down the road and we've got a long road to the Derby, but I think he's got the

capability to do it, [the] farther the better and I don't think the distance will be a problem," commented Gomez, who has had only two mounts in the Derby, his last coming in 1995. "He's got a great mind and he's never done anything to make us second guess him. He's done everything in stride." As has Gomez, who turns 34 on New Year's Day 2006. So good right now is the native of Tucson, Arizona, that he was hand-picked by trainer Jimmy Jerkens to replace the injured Richard Migliore astride Artie Schiller, who bested favored Leroidesanimaux (Brz) for a well-deserved first Grade I victory. As if he needed further recognition for his efforts, Gomez was named this year's winner of the Bill Shoemaker Award, an honor bestowed upon the day's outstanding jockey by members of the press. "He's a great individual and has overcome personal problems and I could not be happier to present this award to him," said retired jockey Pat Day, who was on hand. "I think if yesterday is any indication, he's going to be a force to reckon with for many years to come. He's a credit to our profession."

ROCK HARD TEN COULD BE BACK IN 2006

Mercedes Stable's four-year-old **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.), a late defecation from the GI Breeders' Cup Classic after shedding a frog following a gallop at Belmont Friday, could race in 2006, according to trainer Richard Mandella. "His owners are thinking hard about keeping him in training next year," said Mandella yesterday morning. "The thing is healing up OK and looks good. He will return to California on Tues-

day." Winner of the GII Strub S., GI Santa Anita H. and GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. this year, Rock Hard Ten is expected to miss one to two weeks of training.

TOUGH DAY FOR MOTION Graham Motion woke up Saturday with high expectations, knowing that, later in the afternoon, he'd be sending out **Better Talk Now** (Talkin Man) to defend his title in the GI Turf, **Funfair (GB)** (Singspiel {Ire}) in the Mile, and the talented **Film Maker** (Dynaformer), who was trying to improve off her runner-up effort in last year's Filly and Mare Turf. Film Maker ran with credit to be third, but Better Talk Now never got going and finished seventh to **Shirocco (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}). The most crushing blow on the afternoon, however, was the injury Funfair suffered on the backstretch, a fractured rear leg that necessitated the six-year-old be humanely destroyed. "To go into a day like that with a lot of dreams, you don't expect that kind of nightmare. [Funfair] didn't deserve that kind of end," said Motion, who speculated the horse had taken a bed step on the grass. "It had to be something like that. The state vet said it was a very unusual fracture, high up on the cannon bone."

'ARTIE' MAY RACE AGAIN THIS YEAR GI Breed-

ers' Cup Mile hero **Artie Schiller** (El Prado {Ire}) has earned a reputation has a blue-collar brawler and may still have a few fights left in him this year. "He'll get a few days off, but he won't be getting any kind of long break," said Steve Moyer, assistant to trainer Jimmy Jerkens. "He could still race again this year." Moyer said the GI Citation H. at Hollywood Park Nov. 26 could be next up for the four-year-old, who was bright and alert Sunday morning.

OUIJA BOARD DONE? DON'T COUNT ON IT

Lord Derby's **Ouija Board** (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) lost little in defeat in Saturday's GI Filly and Mare Turf, running second to **Intercontinental** (GB) (Danehill) despite entering the race off just one prep since being injured in June. The four-year-old Ed Dunlop charge, who won the race in 2004, is likely to continue on this year, with a possible tilt in November's G1 Japan Cup in the works. "It was an amazing feat of training and amazing for the filly to come back from injury and do that," Lord Derby told *Racing Post*. "Winning is nice, but there was no disgrace. I think on the back of this she's ready to go to Japan." He added, "That was not her swan song. As long as she is enjoying it, the Japan Cup beckons. It's too early to say about next year, but we will work on the assumption that the breeding sheds probably beckon."

Great Intentions was a smart maiden winner at the Big A last November, then ran second behind Maddalena in a Gulfstream allowance Jan. 16. She could only manage a well-beaten fourth in the GIII Old Hat S. Feb. 5 and was freshened up for a fall campaign. Making her return to the races at the Spa, the bay overcame a stumbling beginning to roll by seven in an allowance Sept. 4 and came back to dead-heat for a victory in Belmont's Oh What A Windfall S. Sept. 25. The second choice off that 107 Beyer Speed Figure performance, she sat a stalking third as favored Smokey Glacken showed the early way. The Barry Schwartz colorbearer began to hit her best stride in deep stretch and came home a much-the-best winner. "In this race, she really relaxed well and came when he asked," winning trainer Mike Hushion commented. "We had nervousness trouble with her early. She wasn't settling great and we thought she'd only be a sprinter. After watching today, I think we've got another eighth of a mile coming. I think she'll be okay going a mile. The other thing that's sweet about her is that she's gotten bigger and stronger with each race. The [GII] Top Flight [Nov. 25 at Aqueduct] would probably be the first consideration." The lightly raced Golden Rahy, who could've been haltered for just \$40,000 in his most recent effort, put it all together yesterday and captured his first graded success. The six-year-old gelding has had a stop-start career. He broke his maiden in April of 2003 and collected two allowance wins that year, but was off for more than 17 months before returning to be sixth in a Santa Anita allowance in March. An eighth against \$62,500 claimers May 12 was followed by a running-on second vs. \$40,000 foes last time at Del Mar July 22, and the chestnut was given a 5-1 chance here off the three-month break. Saving ground while trailing the six-horse field early, he kicked into gear down the lane and was up in time. Victory was sweet for jockey Alex Solis, who didn't get to California until one o'clock Sunday morning after riding in the Breeders' Cup. "I was exhausted...very tired," Solis said. "Before the race, the owner asked me, 'Are you tired?' I said, 'Yes, I am very tired. But trust me, as soon as we're in the gate that won't be in my mind. I'm just going to ride the race.'"

Picking up where he left off Saturday, jockey Jerry Bailey put on a riding clinic in front of Belmont's faithful, willing home Euro invader Atlando to victory here. Atlando capped a three-race winning skein in the Listed Boulogne S. at Chantilly Sept. 7 and concluded his stint in France with a close-up third in the G3 La Coupe de Maisons-Laffite Sept. 24. Last of 10 as Certifiably Crazy set relaxed splits of :25, :50 1/5, and 1:14 3/5, he still caboosed the field as they turned into the lane. Gaining steam as he began picked off foes, Atlando hit full stride in the final eighth and got up in the last jump. "The pace was just far too fast for me," said Bailey. "Even though it was slow on the board, my horse just couldn't keep up. The ground was so dug up on the inside; I just wheeled him out. I didn't think I had a chance to hit the board as we were turning for home." In the money in a pair of sprint starts at Saratoga last summer, third time proved the charm for Better Now, when she came from off the pace to graduate by a 1/2 length going a mile over this track Sept. 11. Long-time ante-post Melbourne Cup favourite **Makybe Diva (GB)** will attempt an unprecedented third victory unless the track is not too firm, with forecast rain in Melbourne failing to materialize and track watering likely to occur ahead of the Cup. "She will be given her shot at history," said trainer Lee Freedman of the mare, who had a searching gallop over 2000 metres at his Mornington complex Saturday morning. "If there was any physical impediment why we wouldn't run, she wouldn't be running. The final hurdle would be the track, but I think things will work out." Irish invader **Vinnie Roe**, runner-up to Makybe Diva last year, drew the outside barrier 24, but trainer Dermot Weld has warned unless he is satisfied the track is not too firm, he will scratch the grand stayer from the race.

STEVENS WINS 5,000th AT BELMONT Gary Stevens reached the milestone 5,000-win plateau at Belmont yesterday when he piloted Joint Aspiration (GB) to a two-length victory in the \$65,000 Gaviola S. (*see below*). The second-youngest rider in history to be elected into the Hall of Fame at 34, Stevens, now 42, received the Eclipse Award as outstanding jockey in 1998. His eight Classic wins include victories in the GI Kentucky Derby on Winning Colors, Thunder Gulch, and Silver Charm. Stevens has won eight Breeders' Cup races, including a thrilling finish aboard War Chant in the 2000 GI Mile. Though blanked during Saturday's Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships, Stevens got 13-1 Gorella (Fr) up for third in the GI Mile.

Up to take a narrow lead with a sixteenth left to negotiate, she drew clear late to gain her first stakes victory under Gary Stevens.

Equine Equity Act Introduced in House:

The Equine Equity Act, which will attempt to end the disparate treatment of the horse industry versus other businesses, has been introduced in the House of Representatives by Ron Lewis (R-Ky), Hal Rogers (R-Ky), Ed Whitfield (R-Ky), Ben Chandler (R-Ky) and Geoff Davis (R-Ky). The bill has been referred to the House Agriculture Committee and the Ways and Means committee. If passed into law, it would make horses eligible for capital gains treatment after 12 months, place all racehorses in the three-year category for depreciation purposes and make horses eligible for federal emergency assistance under circumstances presently used by other livestock and crop producers.
