### DIVA GOES OUT ON A HIGH NOTE

**Makybe Diva (GB)** (Desert King {Ire}) brought the curtain down on a history-making career when she became the first horse to win three consecutive G1 Melbourne Cups at Flemington yesterday, triumphing with characteristic insouciance. Speaking at the official presentation, owner Tony Santic announced that Makybe Diva, who returned to scale nodding and acknowledging her fans on both left and right, would retire immediately. "We had all decided that after this great race, she is to be retired," Santic said. "To ask any more of her would not be fair."

### NO TURF RACING AT HOLLYWOOD

Hollywood Park has canceled turf racing for its 31-day Autumn Meet slated to begin Nov. 9. There were 11 stakes races scheduled for the fall meet, including the G1 Hollywood Derby, the G1 Matriarch S. and the G1 Citation H. "The course did not meet our expectations," General Manager Eual G. Wyatt Jr. said of the newly installed turf course. "We don't want to mislead anyone or put any individuals or horses in jeopardy. We're doing what is right under the circumstances and will begin work immediately on the installation of a new course." According to a report in *Daily Racing Form*, Hollywood considered an alternate venue for the Autumn Turf Festival, but decided to transfer the purse money into the overnight program. "It was an option, but we thought it was more important to address the overnight program," stakes coordinator Dan Eidson told *DRF*.

### LIMEHOUSE RETIRED TO VINERY

**Limehouse** (Grand Slam--Dixieland Blues, by Dixieland Band), a graded stakes winner at ages two, three and four, has been retired from racing and will stand at Vinery in Lexington, Ky. for a fee of \$17,500. As a juvenile the Dogwood colorbearer captured the Three Chimneys S. and the GIII Bashford Manor S. and added the GII Hutcheson S. and GIII Tampa Bay Derby as a sophomore. He collected a win in the GII Brooklyn H. this term and ran well in his final two starts on the turf, finishing a respectable fifth in the GII Kelso Breeders' Cup H. and sixth, beaten only 2 1/2 lengths in the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile. Bred in Florida by Cheryl Curtin, Limehouse retires with seven wins from 21 starts and \$1,110,433 in earnings. His half brother, the ill-fated Blues and Royals, took this year's G2 UAE Derby.

## SOLD FOR \$900,000 AS A 2YO

At the FT Calder 2YO in training sale, Forest Danger breezed a blistering quarter in 21 and 2/5th, catching the attention of famed horseman Buzz Chace who purchased him for \$900,000 on behalf of Marie and Aaron Jones. The same Marie and Aaron Jones that purchased his sire, Forestry, for \$1.5 million as the Keeneland July Sales Topper and developed him into a Leading Sire.



**SIMPLY DIVINE** Sent out as the 7-2 favourite on a humid day, Makybe Diva broke from post 14, but was angled toward the inside by jockey Glen Boss. She settled in eighth from the rear until the 800-meter marker, when Boss sent her out around horses to take command in the lead with customary arrogance. She charged past tiring leaders **Portland Singa (NZ)** (Danasinga {Aus}) and **Eye Popper (Jpn)** (Soccer Boy {Jpn}) and left latecomers **Xcellent (NZ)** (Pentire {GB}), **Leica Falcon (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) and **On a Jeune (Aus)** (Jeune {GB}) in her wake. Under a hand ride, Makybe Diva won easily by 1 1/4 lengths with On A Jeune flying home wide after being fourth from the rear throughout to snatch second, and Xcellent clinging on for third, a further half-length away. Boss shook his head as though he could not believe he had won a third Cup aboard the mare, then buried his head in his hand as he began to cry. "She is full of courage, full of strength; she just wanted to get out there and tango and all I had to do was point her in the right direction," Boss said. "She just gives you so much. I was giggling at the mile, I was so confident. I just talked to her throughout and she relaxed and I knew we'd gotten to the front too soon, but nothing comes from behind her. She has given me the most incredible joy. Nothing else I will ever do with top this!" Trainer Lee Freedman, fighting to retain his usual inscrutable veneer, said, "Find the youngest child here today on the racecourse because they may be the only one that will ever see something like that again. I said to Glen, 'Don't go for an inside run and get bottled up,' and he brought her out at just the right time. "It was perfect. From then on, it was like watching a Bendigo maiden." He also added, "Her performances speak for themselves. None of us will ever see anything like her again. I think it is a fabulous decision to retire her and go out on a high note. It has been a great ride, and I think it has come to an end in a perfect way."

### *Diva Trip...*

Makybe Diva won at the country Victorian track Wangaratta in her second career start for trainer David Hall. She was fourth to the ill-fated Mummify (Aus) at her first Group 1 attempt in the 2003 Caulfield Cup, but rebounded with her first win in the G1 Melbourne Cup. The following autumn, transferred to Freedman when Hall moved to Hong Kong, she won the G1 Sydney Cup and was runner-up to Elvstroem (Aus) in the G1 Caulfield Cup en route to her second Melbourne Cup, won from European champion Vinnie Roe (Ire). This year, the star mare won the G1 Australian Cup over 2000 meters, the 2400-meter G1 BMW, the 1400-meter G2 Memsie S., the 2000-meter G2 Turnbull S. and the G1 Cox Plate over an extended 10 furlongs en route to her memorable Cup win. Glen Boss said Makybe Diva was so professional he could rely on her to trot straight as an arrow back to scale while he stood in the stirrups and raised his arms and danced about. "Believe me, if she took one step sideways I'd hit the deck and embarrass myself, but nothing worries her," Boss said. "She comes back along the fence and has a good look at the crowd."

### *A Choice That Changed History...*

South Australian tuna fisherman Tony Santic and his bloodstock agent John Foote made a simple decision that would have a profound impact on Australian racing when they opted to send Makybe Diva Down Under after she failed to reach her 25,000 guineas reserve at the 1999 Tattersalls December Sales. Foote had earlier purchased her dam Tugela--while carrying the Diva--for 60,000 guineas, and intended to follow a well-trodden path whereby the resultant foal is sold to fund the mare's trip to Australia. But the filly was sent to Arrowfield Stud in the Hunter Valley at a distinct six-month age disadvantage. She was sent to breaker and trainer Greg Bennett, who recalls, "She was a beautiful mover with a faultless attitude. She was younger, she wasn't overly big, but it was like she had been here before. She was very smooth to ride, you could almost sit on her back, canter along, roll a smoke and drink a cup of tea at the same time."

Balthazaar's Gift served an apprenticeship of sorts with off-the-board efforts in the Aug. 17 G2 Gimcrack S. at York and G2 Mill Reef S. at Newbury a month later, but rebounded in emphatic style to plunder the Listed Rockingham S. back on the Knavesmire Oct. 8. Given a peach of a ride in this by Britain's champion jockey elect, Jamie Spencer, the 27-5 chance proved patience is a virtue and pounced late for a career-best win in an excellent time. Spencer was content to settle his mount in eighth off a smart break through the early fractions and was alert to the danger of a looming pocket at the two pole. Angled away from that hazard, Balthazaar's Gift surged to the front with 100 meters remaining and was all over Gwenseb from there for a commanding score. The colt's win continued Yorkshire-based trainer Kevin Ryan's excellent season with two-year-olds, as he had already saddled Amadeus Wolf (GB) to win the Sept. 30 G1 Middle Park S. and Palace Episode to win the G1 Racing Post Trophy Oct. 22.

Quiet Royal stepped off a win at Compiègne July 29 to run second in the G3 Prix du Calvados at Deauville Aug. 20. She recorded a career best when runner-up to Rumpelstiltskin (Ire) in the Oct. 2 G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp last time and rebounded here to secure a decisive first group success. Settled in the wake of Mednaya from flagfall, the bay homebred angled out effortlessly to join the leader with 400 meters remaining and required mild encouragement from there to comfortably hold that rallying rival. "She fully deserved to win this after running second in the Marcel Boussac and she won in good style," said winning trainer Criquette Head-Maarek. "She's now on vacation, and we will get her ready for the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket or the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches at Longchamp, but maybe with a preference for the former as she seems to like running on a straight course."

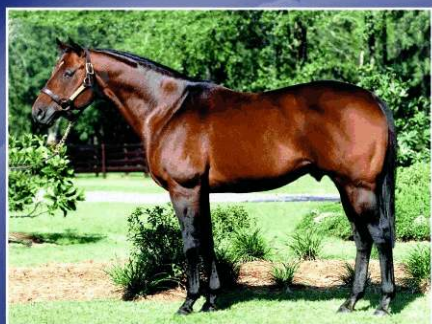
With two former winners of this race lining up, this dash would be no easy task, and so it proved as Miss Emma asserted in a pulsating finish to record back-to-back victories. The five-year-old had not scored in five stakes attempts since winning last year's contest, finishing third in the Sept. 4 G3 Prix du Petit Couvert in her penultimate out at Longchamp and 13th in the G1 Prix de l'Abbaye back at the Bois de Boulogne last time Oct. 2. Springing from the gate to dispute the fractions with Welsh Emperor here, she traveled sweetly throughout and was last under pressure approaching the final eighth. The bay was ridden out sympathetically in the closing stages and always had the measure of her game, late-closing rival Soave, winner of the 2003 renewal.

**GRAND REWARD RETIRED TO HILL 'N' DALE**

The regally bred four-year-old graded stakes winner **Grand Reward** (Storm Cat--Serena's Song, by Rahy) has been retired to Hill 'n' Dale Farm. He will stand for \$12,500, live foal, as property of a syndicate. "Grand Reward is a stellar individual who has as much upside as any stallion in the breed," said John G. Sikura, president of Hill 'n' Dale Farms. "He is bred just like leading sire Giant's Causeway. His sire, Storm Cat, is the modern day Northern Dancer and his dam, Serena's Song, who is in the Racing Hall of Fame, is one of the most accomplished distaffers of all time. Additionally, she has become a fabulous broodmare. Grand Reward reminds me of a Saint Ballado or a Rahy, both good racehorses with great pedigrees who developed into great sires. This is a stallion for the commercial breeder." Out of champion Serena's Song, Grand Reward began his career for trainer Aidan O'Brien in Ireland, finishing second in the G2 Mill Reef S. and third in the G2 Gimcrack S. while racing in the colors of Bob and Beverly Lewis, Michael Tabor and Mrs. John Magnier. He was transferred to D. Wayne Lukas at the end of his three-year-old season. After winning an allowance race in February, the dark bay ran fourth to Rock Hard Ten in the G1 Santa Anita H. in March, then took the GII Oaklawn H. in April. Sixth to Borrego in the G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup Oct. 1, Grand Reward had been entered in the GIII Sport Page H. on the Breeders' Cup undercard, but was scratched. His record stands at 24-4-3-4 with earnings of \$552,026. The colt gained the admiration of his Hall of Fame conditioner. "Grand Reward is not only the best-looking son of Storm Cat I have ever trained, but he is the best-looking son of Storm Cat I have seen," Lukas said. "He's by the best sire in the world out of one of the greatest fillies to ever run. He has all the ingredients to become a home-run sire." Grand Reward is a full brother to Group 1 winner Sophisticat and a half brother to stakes winner Serena's Tune (Mr. Prospector) as well as the stakes-placed Arbitrate (Deputy Minister).

**HOT SIRES FROM THE BREEDERS' CUP**

Though Classic winner Saint Liam is the most obvious high-profile stallion beneficiary of the Breeders' Cup results--he now retires to Lane's End at \$50,000, rather than \$40,000--probably the highest percentage jump after the Breeders' Cup results is another Lane's End stallion, Stephen Got Even. Owned by television legend Merv Griffin (How good could this be for the business?), Stevie Wonderboy hadn't run since winning the GI Del Mar Futurity in early September, but that proved no impediment to a decisive victory, and he won with the fastest Beyer figure (104) since Andy and his team started publishing their figures, a little over 10 years ago. It resulted in a doubling of Stephen Got Even's fee, to \$25,000 for next year. That still looks cheap to me, because Stevie Wonderboy must have a great shot of breaking the hoodoo of Breeders' Cup Juvenile winners never yet winning the Kentucky Derby. He won the Juvenile with the best figure of at least the last 10 years, he is lightly raced (the Juvenile was just his fifth lifetime start), and he has the right style. He should get 10 furlongs no problem--and that is, truly, the most difficult hurdle for most Derby contenders to overcome, actually getting the trip.

Considering he has good, consistent figures (1.52 A index, 3.03 B index, through August 1), and had sired a very legit three-year-old in his first crop (Don't Get Mad), I'd say Stephen Got Even still represents good value at \$25,000. And, by the way, though Afleet Alex didn't make the Breeders' Cup, I'd say the same about his sire, Northern Afleet, who will be standing for \$20,000 at Taylor Made next year. It's not like he's a one-trick pony: Northern Afleet had a 2.86 A Runner index through Aug. 1, a number which demonstrates he's consistently throwing class.

Folklore registered only an 87 Beyer figure when scoring over an arguably unlucky Wild Fit in the Juvenile Fillies. True, the time was slow, but as she had run a 99 when scorching the opposition in the GI Matron in her previous start, there's less of a necessity to take that figure at face value. She is the best of what may or may not be a moderate bunch, but there's no doubt she deserves the Eclipse Award, just as Stevie Wonderboy does. It's a fairly huge feather in the cap of dual Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow, who now looks odds-on to be leading Freshman Sire, currently with a lead of about \$138,000. You wouldn't have bet the ranch--at least, I wouldn't have--on Tiznow making such a big impression with his two-year-olds, and, to be fair to the opposition, his three closest pursuers on the Freshman Sire money list all have nearly twice as many winners, or more, as he does. These include El Corredor (11 winners; Tiznow has six), Songandaprayer (12 winners), and City Zip (17 winners)--each of whom also has two stakes winners so far, to just Folklore for Tiznow. It makes all four look pretty good value for next year. In spite of a high placing on the Freshman Sire list being a notoriously poor pointer to eventual sire success, this year's four current leaders don't look overpriced for 2006: Tiznow and Songandaprayer will be \$35,000; El Corredor is priced at \$30,000; and Ghostzapper's half brother, City Zip, remains at a very interesting-looking \$15,000, considering his current placing.

The standard of turf racing in Europe wasn't enhanced much by the American 1-2 in the Mile, but very much was by the results of the other two grass races. The superfecta in the Turf was all-European as Arc fourth (and soft ground lover) Shirocco overcame Ace, and Azamour ran on to catch Bago for third. Ace was making his eighth start this year, all in Group/Grade I races. He has run two seconds, three thirds, two fourths, and one fifth, earned \$846,000, and would be 1-100 in a 'non-winners of a race this year.' Azamour hated the surface less than Bago; even so, Bago was almost six lengths clear of this first American finisher, English Channel.

But, for a demonstration of sheer class, Intercontinental's front-running win over last year's Oaks and BC Filly & Mare Turf winner, Ouija Board, sets the standard. The second clearly was right back to her best; she even finished one place ahead of Film Maker again, just as she had when they were first and second last year. The point about Intercontinental is this: the 2003 English 1000 Guineas, Newmarket, May 4: 1st, Russian Rhythm; 2nd, Six Perfections; 3rd, Intercontinental; 4th, Soviet Song. Intercontinental's Breeders' Cup win was the 14th Grade/Group I victory scored by that quartet. Saturday's result supports the view that was one of the best filly races of recent times.

### November Sales...

Last year, Fasig-Tipton kicked off the November sales with a \$20-million day on Sunday, highlighted by the sale of Smarty Jones' dam for \$5 million, and the stallion prospect, Toccet, for \$3.35 million. By the time the Keeneland supermarket closed two weeks later, a total of 3,140 horses had sold for \$302,618,500, which was, not incidentally, an average of \$96,375. It's impossible to predict what will happen from November to November, because of possible wide variations in what's in the catalogues. With yearlings, the pedigrees of 7,000 of them, taken collectively, don't vary so much from year to year; but with Mixed sales, there really can be a wide variation of what is available, which makes analysis of the numbers that much more difficult.

One thing we can say for sure this November: by universal acclamation, Fasig has put together a terrific catalogue. There are almost 80 fewer catalogued than for last year's Sunday sale, but their catalogue this year includes the dams of Breeders' Cup or top three-year-old performers Declan's Moon, Lost in the Fog, Folklore, Bellamy Road, Bandini, and Lion Heart, as well as top racemares like Wild Fit and Riskaverse. You'd almost say there are just as many stars in at Fasig on Sunday as there are at Keeneland on Monday, and definitely on Tuesday.

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

### BREEDERS' CUP WRAP-UP

Despite the gray skies, this weekend's Breeders' Cup provided a lot of bright spots particularly for those seeking alternative sire lines to the nearly all-pervasive Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector. They should have been heartened by the performance of the two strains which are vying to be the third major force in North American breeding: Bold Ruler (via A.P. Indy) and Hail to Reason (via Halo), while another outcross sire line, that of In Reality, came up with a winner from the very first crop of Tiznow.

A.P. Indy's growing status as a sire of sires was underlined with victories for sons of Stephen Got Even and the sadly-deceased Old Trieste. The pair is joined by Pulpit, Malibu Moon and Golden Missile, as A.P. Indy sons who have a Grade I winner in their first or second crops. That quintet are the only top-class sons of A.P. Indy with runners three and up, so the omens are very good, especially as A.P. Indy's best son, Mineshaft, is still waiting in the wings. Meanwhile, Saint Liam, almost certainly wrapped-up Horse of the Year honors with a win in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, and as the best runner by the best U.S. son of Halo (Saint Ballado), he'll be bidding to secure the influence of his male line.

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile victor, Stevie Wonderboy, owns one of the weekend's most intriguing pedigrees. From the second crop of Stephen Got Even, Stevie Wonderboy is out of a mare by A.P. Indy's half-brother, Summer Squall. As a result, Stevie Wonderboy has Weekend Surprise 3x3 in his pedigree. In fact, Stevie Wonderboy is an unusual example of close inbreeding to a mare who herself is closely inbred, as Weekend Surprise is by Secretariat, and her second dam is by Secretariat's half-brother, Sir Gaylord, giving her Somethingroyal 2x4. We should also note that Stevie Wonderboy has Bold Ruler 6x5x6, and that his fourth dam is by Loser Weeper, a brother to Bold Ruler's dam, Miss Disco. Stevie Wonderboy's second dam, Mystical Mood, is a stakes-winning daughter of Roberto, and his fourth dam, Moaning Low, is also third dam of the GI Pimlico Special victor, and GI Belmont Stakes runner-up, Star Standard (by a son of Secretariat, who is doubled in this pedigree), so there is plenty of classic stamina in this pedigree.

The GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies went to Folklore. She by Tiznow, who is just about home and dry as leading freshman sire (emulating Honour and Glory, by Tiznow's grandsire, Relaunch, who grabbed his freshman crown through the victory of Caressing in the same race in 2000). Like Stevie Wonderboy, Folklore has a pedigree with some interesting inbreeding. Her third dam, Basie (a half-sister to the granddam of Smarty Jones), is a daughter of In Reality, the great-grand sire of Tiznow. This gives Folklore a 4x4 cross of In Reality, and since her granddam, Jeano, is by Fappiano (dam by Dr. Fager, a son of In Reality's broodmare sire, Rough'n Tumble) there are also three crosses of Rough'n Tumble. It's probably no coincidence that In Reality and Rough'n Tumble are themselves closely inbred horses: In Reality has War Relic (another closely inbred horse) 3x3 at the top and bottom of his pedigree, and Rough'n Tumble had Spearmint and Whisk Broom 4x4. Folklore also has Northern Dancer 5x5x4, with two of the strains having an interesting connection. Both Tiznow's granddam, Lonely Dancer, and Storm Cat are by sons of Northern Dancer, and Sleep Lonely's granddam is a half-sister (more nearly five-eighths) to Crimson Satan, the sire of the second dam of Storm Cat. Lonely Dancer and Storm Cat also have three-quarters relatives (Tom Fool and First Rose) close up in their pedigrees, so it won't be surprising if Tiznow hits again with Storm Cat.

A three-year-old was widely expected to win the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but the identity of that sophomore was generally assumed to be Lost in the Fog, not the eventual victor, the improving Silver Train. Silver Train's sire, Old Trieste, was a very speedy son of A.P. Indy, who from his first two crops has sired six other stakes winners, including graded scorers, Minister Eric (also second in the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile); Honolua Storm and Japanese group winner, Maltese Heat. Silver Train's dam, Ridden in the Stars, a daughter of Cormorant, was stakes placed in New York restricted company and is half-sister to New York-bred stakes winner, Pro Cove. The second dam, the Far North mare, Shelter Strait is half-sister to stakes winner Sunset Strait (dam of stakes winning and Grade I placed sprinter, Placid Fund) and to Such a Nut (granddam of GIII Regret S. winner, Sister Star). Silver Train is quite an outcross, with the nearest duplication being a 5x5 cross of Bold Ruler. He's the product of a cross--A.P. Indy/His Majesty--which hasn't been a prolific one, but Old Trieste's broodmare sire, Vigors, is by Grey Dawn II, a horse who's tended to combine quite well with His Majesty.

The pedigree also has a combination of related English speedsters, as Silver Train's broodmare sire, Cormorant, is out of a mare by Tudor Minstrel, while Old Trieste's fourth dam is by Fair Trial, a close genetic relative to Tudor Minstrel.

The His Majesty line also put in an appearance in the broodmare sire line of runaway GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine Pleasant Home, who is out of a mare by Pleasant Colony. A sister to the multiple graded stakes winning Country Hideaway, Pleasant Home is a granddaughter of the GI Alabama S. and GI Monmouth Oaks heroine Maplejinsky, also dam of champion and filly Triple Crown winner, Sky Beauty. In turn, Maplejinsky is half-sister (actually three-parts) to European champion Dayjur--famous for the "shadow jump" which cost him the GI Breeder's Cup Sprint--and out of Champion Sprinter Gold Beauty, so this is a pretty fancy family. Pleasant Home is inbred 2x4 to Mr. Prospector through Seeking the Gold and Gold Beauty. Overall, this Breeders' Cup was a good one for inbreeding in general and inbreeding to Mr. Prospector: in addition to the previously mentioned Juvenile winners, one inbred 3x3 and the other 4x4, Pleasant Home's runner-up, Society Selection has Mr. Prospector 3x3, and gallant Classic runner-up Flower Alley has Mr. Prospector 3x3 and Northern Dancer 4x5x4.

The turf events--somewhat predictably--fell to horses which if not European-bred, stemmed from European lines. The GI Breeders' Cup Turf went to the German-sired Shirocco, who has a pedigree gathered from all points of the compass. In addition to having a German sire, Shirocco is out of a mare by the American-bred The Minstrel and from a good Irish female line. His sire, Monsun, was Horse of the Year in Germany and was a top-class performer over 1 1/2 miles. He, his sire, Konigsstuhl, and his grandsire, Dschingis Khan, have all been champion sires in Germany. Dschingis Khan was sired by an English stallion, the 2,000 Guineas winner, Tamerlane, a grandson of the 1935 Triple Crown victor, Bahram. Monsun has the sister and brother Kaiserkrone and Kaiseradler 4x4. Ironically, in his case, it's Northern Dancer whose acted as an outcross Monsun and he's thrived when crossed over a wide variety of producers descending from that tribe. In fact he's sired at least 16 black-type winners on the cross, 13 group winners, and five Group 1 winners. Shirocco's dam, So Sedulous, has produce a total of four of these, with Shirocco being joined by group winners Subiaco and Storm Trooper and Listed scorer September Storm.

In the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf it was a case of déjà vu all over again, as Intercontinental emulated her sister Banks Hill, winner of this race in 2001. Banks Hill was the Champion Turf Mare that year, and with four other 2005 graded stakes wins to her name, Intercontinental is a good bet to follow in her sister's hoofprints there too. Banks Hill and Intercontinental are by Danehill out of the remarkable Hasili. A black-type winning daughter of Kahyasi, Hasili has produced five group/grade winners with her first five foals, Banks Hill and Intercontinental being joined by siblings Dansili (co-highweighted older horse in England and France, and in addition to three group wins, also placed second in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile) and Cacique (a three time group winner who is also multiple Group 1 placed), and three-parts sister Heat Haze (by Green Desert, and winner of the GI Beverly D. S. and GI Matriarch S.).

Intercontinental has Northern Dancer 3x5 and his dam, Natalma 4x4x6.

Leroidesanimaux, who is out of a half-sister to Hasili, was bidding to give the family a double in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, but from an unfavorable draw, and running in bar shoes, he couldn't handle Artie Schiller, who recorded a deserved first Grade I triumph. Artie Schiller is a son of El Prado, a horse who has single-handedly established a North American branch of the Sadler's Wells line. Artie Schiller's dam, Hidden Light (by Majestic Light) was an absolutely top-class runner who won half of her 12 starts, including the GI Santa Anita Oaks, GI Hollywood Oaks, GII Del Mar Oaks, and the La Habra S. At stud, Hidden Light was tried with a wide variety of sires, most of them proven and top-class, but didn't produce her first black-type performer until her ninth foal, the Red Ransom filly, Speed to Burn, took third in the 2001 renewal of the GII Astarita S. Artie Schiller, her first stakes winner, is her 11th foal. Hidden Light is a sister to the GI San Juan Capistrano Invitational H. hero, Prince True, she is out of the tremendously accomplished racemare, Tallahto, a daughter of Nantallah who took the scalps of colts in the GI Oak Tree Invitational and GII Carleton F. Burke H.

Artie Schiller actually has Nantallah 6X3 through Thong (third dam of Sadler's Wells) and Tallahto. We can also note that El Prado is inbred to Turn-to, and that his dam is by a grandson of Turn-to out of a mare by a son of Menow. Majestic Light's granddam, champion High Voltage, is by Ambiorix (half-brother to the dam of Turn-to) out of a mare by Menow, so somewhat echoing that cross.

Saint Liam, who is off to Lane's End Farm for the 2006 breeding season, ended his racing career in the best possible way. The logical replacement for his deceased sire, Saint Ballado, who looks sure to land the 2005 sire's title, Saint Liam is out of the stakes winning and graded-placed Quiet Dance, a daughter of the up-and-coming broodmare sire, Quiet American. The second dam, Misty Dancer, a daughter of Lyphard. Is was three-parts sister to champion Irish juvenile filly Minstrella (by The Minstrel), herself dam of graded winners Colonial Minstrel and Minidar, and half-sister to the five time Grade I winner, Misty Gallore, subsequently dam of the very useful sire, Silver Ghost. Misty Gallore was a daughter of Halo, the grandsire of Saint Liam, so bred on somewhat similar lines. We can also note that Saint Liam's fifth dam is the great racemare, Gallorette. Saint Liam does have Mr. Prospector and Northern Dancer in the dam, but these horses will be back in the fifth generation of his foals, so he's free to cross with mares carrying either, in fact we'd imagine he might be suited to mares by the legion of stallions bred on the Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross.

**END OF THE ROAD FOR VINNIE ROE** Vinnie Roe (Ire) (Definite Article {GB}) closed out his career with an eighth-place finish in the G1 Melbourne Cup. The venerable stayer will join Coolmore Stud's National Hunt roster. Jockey Pat Smullen said Vinnie Roe, who trailed Makybe Diva in the race, had pulled up in distress due to the heat. "He found it difficult, he got a little bit further back than ideal and it turned into a sprint down the straight," Smullen said. "But he has run his heart out, and it is a testament to the horse that he nearly collapsed after the race in this heat and putting in such an effort. He's been a great horse and he goes off to stud now." Runner-up to Makybe Diva in the 2004 Cup and fourth to Media Puzzle in 2002, the Dermot Weld-trained seven-year-old retires with four wins in the G1 Irish St. Leger S., a victory in the 2001 G1 Prix Royal Oak as well as a second and third in the G1 Ascot Gold Cup (2002 and 2005, respectively). He heads to stud with a record of 28-13-4-5 and earnings of £1,218,418.

**FNYR Releases OTB Research Report:**

The Friends of New York Racing, a non-profit research and industry advocacy group, has released the results of a study detailing the financial problems of New York's six off-track betting corporations. In 2002, the study shows, total OTB contributions to local governments were \$73 million. Following a 17-percent decrease in 2003, contributions to localities fell another 26 percent to a low of \$45 million in 2004. Of the \$45 million, \$42 million was generated by so-called "surcharges," which are taxes levied on winning wagers at OTB branches. Only \$3 million represented distributions from net operating revenues. "There has been a steady erosion of OTB operating profits, especially in the last few years," said FNYR President Tim Smith. "It is not just the NYRA or on-track model that needs fixing, but the entire pari-mutuel wagering system in New York, including off-track and account wagering. A comprehensive approach is needed to save the many jobs and horse farms involved." During the three-year period researched, statewide OTB handle and gross revenues have remained relatively flat at \$2 billion and \$500 million, respectively. Operating costs have gradually increased from 44 percent to 47 percent of gross revenues, with new capital expenditures amounting to 1 percent of revenue. Payments to New York State have increased from \$25 million to \$31 million, mostly due to a new regulatory fee charged to all pari-mutuel operators, including the OTBs. Legislatively mandated payments to the horse racing industry also increased by \$7 million since 2002. For more information, go to [www.friendsofnyr.com](http://www.friendsofnyr.com).

(twice), the G2 Ridgewood Pearl S., the G3 Prix de Psyche and the G3 Golden Daffodil S., and ran fourth to Attraction (GB) in the G1 1000 Guineas. She heads to the breeding shed with a record of 16-6-3-2 and earnings of £240,640.

## ROYAL ACADEMY COLT TOPS INGLIS READY TO RUN

A colt by Royal Academy sold for A\$250,000 to expatriate Australian trainer Gary Moore to top the second annual Inglis Ready to Run Sale Monday at Oaklands in Melbourne. Selling as [lot 94](#) from the draft of Carbine Vale Thoroughbreds, the bay youngster was produced by the Woodman mare Ranghiroah. "I've had great interest in this horse since I saw his half-brother Crown's Master win in Macau, and I came out to Australia to buy him," said Moore. "I thought he breezed like a real professional; he was a really nice type with a great attitude, and Woodman is really exciting as a broodmare sire at present. Hopefully, he will do well in Hong Kong." The sale's highest-priced filly was a A\$220,000 daughter of Encosta de Lago (Aus). David O'Callaghan, as agent, bought [lot 29](#) from the consignment of Kerrygail Farm. The next highest price was achieved by a More Than Ready colt selling as [lot 172](#) for A\$130,000. Nolen Racing consigned the brown colt, who was purchased by promising young trainer Tom Dabernig. "He is a really nice colt and I liked the way he moved; More Than Ready is the sire of the moment," said Dabernig. With more than twice the number of horses available compared to last year, a total of 117 horses were sold at an average price of A\$30,549 and achieving a gross of A\$3,602,250. There were purchasers from Japan, Hong Kong and South Korea active along with several prominent Australian trainers. "We had good support from international buyers with Katsumi Yoshida and the Yushun Racing Club among Japanese purchasers," said Reg Inglis, managing director of the auction company. "We're pleased with the results; we had a good catalogue of horses, but we are little disappointed that there was not more local interest, particularly as we are very positive that these horses will prove themselves on the racetrack. Already 23 horses sold at the 2004 Breeze Up have either won or placed."
