HIGH HOPES FOR FASIG-TIPTON

Boasting one of the deepest catalogs in the auction's history, Fasig-Tipton enters its November Selected Mixed Sale with the sort of fire-power that has sale officials optimistic of a record-breaking day. A total of 108 weanlings, 76 broodmares or racing prospects, one stallion prospect, a stallion share and two lifetime breeding rights have been cataloged for the one-day event, which gets underway this afternoon at Newtown Paddocks in Lexington, Kentucky at 4:00 p.m. "We are very happy with the high quality and diversity of our November catalogue," said

Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "It has been many years since we have seen a group of stars like this come together in one night." No fewer than five Grade I winners will be available to buyers, with the impressive turf triumvirate **Riskaverse** (Dynaformer), **Angara (GB)** (Alzao), and **Amorama (Fr)** (Sri Pekan) joined by **My Trusty Cat** (Tale of the Cat) and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up **Wild Fit** (Wild Wonder). Proven producers are well represented, too, with the dams of Grade I heroes Lost in the Fog, Lion Heart, Bellamy Road, Toccet, Bandini, champion Declan's Moon and Juvenile Fillies winner Folklore on offer.

The Young and the Resplendent...

But before those heavy hitters are the weanlings, with a heavy emphasis on young sires. Included are weanlings from the first crops of Cactus Ride, Century City (Ire), Changeintheweather, D'wildcat, Harlan's Holiday, Hold That Tiger, Kafwain, Macho Uno, Milwaukee Brew, Najran, Posse, Proud Citizen, Sunday Break (Jpn), Trust N Luck, Whywhywhy, Wiseman's Ferry, Yankee Gentleman, and Zavata. The five-year-old GSW & MGISP **Fairly Ransom** (Red Ransom) sells as a stallion prospect as hip [109](#), while a share to top young sire Distorted Humor and two lifetime breeding rights to Medaglia d'Oro wrap up the sale as hips [187](#), [188](#), and [189](#), respectively. CLOSE, BUT NO CIGAR

Dual Classic winner **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet) will not participate in the GI Cigar Mile at Aqueduct Nov. 26, but is scheduled to return to action in 2006, according to trainer Tim Ritchey. "He's healed nicely, but is not completely healed," Ritchey told TVG. "In the last set of digitals there was a very small area that's not healed yet."

Ritchey said that Afleet Alex will need 30 days of hand walking, but he looks forward to having a sound, healthy horse for a four-year-old campaign. The conditioner mentioned targets such as the Jan. 29 Sunshine Millions, the GI Santa Anita H. in March and the GII Oaklawn H. in April for the Cash is King colorbearer. "He's unbelievable," Ritchey added. "I am very fortunate to be around greatness every day. There's an awe about him." The bay colt, who overcame a near spill to win the GI Preakness S. in May, has not raced since his towering victory in the GI Belmont S. in June.

'CAT' COMES LATE IN IROQUOIS

Catcominatcha (Tale of the Cat) rallied past **High Cotton** (Dixie Union) to take the GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill Downs yesterday. After breaking his maiden by 15 lengths in for a \$50,000 tag Aug. 4 at Ellis, the blaze-faced chestnut ran second in the John C. Ellis Juvenile S. Aug. 20 and fourth in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. at Turfway Sept. 17. He came into this one off a second in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity Oct.

French Park was let go at 12-1 for her Keeneland debut Oct. 20, but looked more like an odds-on favorite. She streaked under the line 12 1/4 lengths in front, stopping the clock at 1:18 2/5 for six and half furlongs, and was tabbed as a *TDN* Rising Star. The gray breezed four furlongs over this strip in :50 2/5 Oct. 31 and was sent off as the lukewarm choice for her stakes debut. Breaking from the eight hole, French Park was away well with jockey Mark Guidry aboard and stayed close to the early leaders through fractions of :22

and :45. The Stevestan Stables colorbearer took a narrow lead after six furlongs and fought her way to the line to remain perfect in two starts. Trippi Street, a nine-length maiden winner in her bow at Hawthorne Oct. 8, battled her way through traffic to place second, with GIII Arlington Breeders' Cup Lassie S. third Coolwind completing the trifecta. "I just thought it was a big jump to go from a maiden win to a stake like this, but it was either that or the allowance race going two turns," explained winning trainer Helen Pitts. "You like to take it step-by-step, and, obviously, going from 6 1/2 furlongs to a mile is ideal." French Park could go next in the Gil Golden Rod S. at Churchill Nov. 26.

France for trainer Jean-Claude Rouget, capturing her debut last August at La Teste de Buch. It took her six more tries to visit the winner's enclosure again, but she did so in the Listed Derby du Languedoc June 19 at Toulouse. She concluded her French sojourn with a fifth-place finish to Oiseau Rare (Fr) in the G3 Prix Minerve Aug. 23 and was the second

choice here in her U.S. bow. Reserved in sixth through easy fractions of 1:16.4 and 1:41.94, Olaya waited for room on the inside as they straightened for home. She split horses and finished up willingly to catch the streaking Spotlight. "She relaxed most of the way," said winning rider Edgar Prado. "I kept her covered up until it was time to go. When I found some room, she really kicked in." The 4-5 favorite Latice (Inchinor {GB}) looked to be dropping back on the turn before winding up fifth. Mea Domina had been perfect in three previous outings over the Santa Anita turf course, including a front-running allowance victory at this distance Apr. 1. She ran fourth to Pickle (Piccolo {GB}) in the GIII Wilshire H. at Hollywood Apr. 23, but fended off all comers in the GI Gamely Breeders' Cup H. May 30 at the Inglewood course. With no GI Matriarch S. on tap this year due to the Hollywood turf woes, the Las Palmas took on added significance for these locally based runners. Breaking from post two, Mea Domina went up to assume her customary position on the front end. The Whitham homebred sailed through splits of :46 and 1:09 2/5 and stayed on gamely in the lane over favored Elusive Diva. "We weren't planning to run," admitted winning trainer Ron McAnally. "We were waiting for her race at Hollywood [Matriarch, Nov. 27]. When they cancelled turf racing, we had to go. We'll look around [for a race], but more than likely we'll have to wait for Santa Anita." Eastern Sand finally earned a graded stakes victory after consistently running well in Southern California.

After finishing third in the GIII Will Rogers H. at Hollywood May 28, the Florida-bred finished seventh in the Oceanside S. at Del Mar July 20, but rebounded with an allowance victory over that course Aug. 7. He missed by just a length when fourth in the GII Del Mar Derby Sept. 5 and was most recently second by a nose in the Oak Tree Derby Oct. 15. The crowd's choice got off to an alert beginning and tracked the pacesetter Mr. Splash to the stretch. He finally drew on even terms in the final furlong and got his nose down on the line.

Last year's G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup winner Epalo lines up in a sixth different country here. Gary Tanaka's six-year-old secured a first win since his Kranji triumph when taking the Apr. 10 G3 Grosser Preis der Bremer Wirtschaft at Bremen, but bounced in his two latest goes. He was seventh in the G1 QEII Cup at Sha Tin Apr. 25 and eighth when defending the International Cup at Kranji May 15.

An 'A' Cup...

While it remains to be seen if the folks at Fasig-Tipton had any money riding on the race, the company sure cashed a big-time ticket when Folklore and Wild Fit finished one-two in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Belmont Oct. 29. Wild Fit had already been catalogued for the sale and, after some uncertainty over whether she'd actually go through the ring or not, connections confirmed that the grey would indeed be on the auction block today. Meanwhile, the dam of Folklore, the Storm Cat mare Contrive, was always a sure bet for the sale and, with

her daughter all but crowned juvenile filly champion, she's odds-on to attract plenty of attention. Fasig-Tipton got an additional boost from the Juvenile Fillies result when a full sister to Contrive, Queen's Lady (hip [175a](#)), was an 11th-hour addition. In foal on a Mar. 6 cover to Medaglia d'Oro, Queen's Lady was supplemented to the sale earlier this week by Taylor Made Sales Agency, which also consigns Contrive.

This Fit Has Just Started...

With a Grade I triumph already on her resume, **Wild Fit** (Wild Wonder--Grannies Feather, by At Full Feather) appears to have little downside to potential bidders. Her full sibling Fusaichi Rock Star kicked off the year with a victory in February's GII San Vicente S., and it wasn't long before little sis was making a name for herself, as well. Purchased privately by juvenile consignor Murray Smith and brought out to California for the Barretts March sale, Wild Fit was bought back for \$240,000. Jim Brewer's Brewer Racing Stable subsequently took an interest in the gray, and his investment yielded a quick return in the form of a victory in the Aug. 27 GI Del Mar Debutante. After running second to Wild Omi in the GII Oak Leaf S., Wild Fit made up considerable ground in the Breeders' Cup to get up for second. The Eaton Sales consignee sells today as hip [114](#), and whoever takes her home has a filly who could be a force in her division next year.

Strive to Contrive...

When she enters the ring this evening, it will be the fourth time seven-year-old Contrive (hip [131](#)) has been offered at public auction. The daughter of Storm Cat was purchased as a yearling by Bob and Beverly Lewis for \$825,000 at the 1999 Keeneland September sale, but never made it to the races and was bred to two-time GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow. A year later, to the cover of Orientate, Contrive (Storm Cat--Jeano, by Fappiano) RNA'd at Keeneland November for \$245,000, but found a buyer at last year's renewal when sold to Pollack Farms for \$140,000 carrying a Silver Charm foal. That was all before her first offspring hit the track. Her Tiznow daughter, later named Folklore, quickly became one of the best fillies on the East Coast this year, winning the GII Adirondack S. and running second in the GII Spinaway S. It was her 14-length dominance in the GI Matron S., however, that earned her favoritism in the Breeders' Cup, and she didn't let her backers down with a determined, near wire-to-wire victory. From the extended family of GI Kentucky Derby hero and champion Smarty Jones, Contrive sells in foal to 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Pleasantly Perfect.

Come Together, Right Now...

By all accounts, Fasig-Tipton has gone above and beyond assembling this year's November catalog, and company brass is quick to acknowledge the star power. "This is the most fantastic group of mares that we've ever had," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "We've had some pretty nice dispersals over the years, but this sale, it's just one right after another. It just all came together." Asked if Fasig-Tipton had made a concerted effort to go after some of the bigger names, Robertson said, "Well, it's been an ongoing process over the last several years. We've always had one or two really big mares. Last year, of course, we had the dam of Smarty Jones, and we did real well with her. It's been an evolution. We've earned the consignors' confidence, and they know they can come here and get a good price for a horse." The dam of Smarty Jones, the then-12-year-old Smile mare I'll Get Along, topped last year's event with a sparkling \$5 million bid from agent Gaines-Gentry Thoroughbreds. Though it was the only seven-figure mare of the evening, it underlined the fact that there was a market at Fasig-Tipton for big-ticket horses. "I'd be lying if I said it wasn't huge for us--it was huge," Robertson said about the sale.

The three-year-old, who typically outbreaks his opponents and never looks back, came into the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint with an unblemished 10-for-10 record, having won five graded events, including the GI King's Bishop S. The effects of a long season seemed to take its toll when the colt ran seventh, but he will be back next year. Cloud Break is in foal to last year's champion sprinter Speightstown.

The apprentices' championship was shared between the Newmarket-based pair of Saleem Golam and Hayley Turner, attached to the Mark Tompkins and Michael Bell yards respectively, with both riding 44 winners. Turner's achievement is all the more notable as it is the first championship success for a female in Britain.

An Open Letter to His Highness General Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum

Dear Sheik Mohammed,

This is a letter from me, a small breeder who loves our sport, to you, one of its current champions. It is an open letter because, first, I don't know how to reach you privately, and second, because the significance of recent events goes far beyond our personal and business concerns.

You and I met briefly while I was in Dubai for the inaugural World Cup, that landmark in thoroughbred racing that has given all of us so much reason for pride. You spoke eloquently on that occasion and showed yourself once again worthy of this sport of kings. I knew after just a few minutes that you were a man who loves horses as much as I do, and truly cares about the breed.

Now events have connected us in a different and unexpected way, though in a way that you are unlikely to realize and few will bother to acquaint you with. Ray Paulick's article in Bloodhorse reported that you were no longer buying horses sired by Coolmore/Ashford stallions. Indeed, you didn't buy a single one of some 400 of these offered in the September yearling sales, though Coolmore/Ashford sires have produced many — perhaps the majority — of your champions.

I am the person who bred one of your current top-class, multiple-grades stakes horses, Council Member. You bought him as a weanling three years ago. He was the highest priced weanling colt in North America that year and proved himself in three of Europe's most prestigious two-year-old races, while adding two more stakes wins to your stable this year.

It was after we saw Council Member's performance that I decided to breed his mother, Zoe Montana, to Fusaichi Pegasus, who stands at Coolmore/Ashford. Through much research, I had determined that this mating would produce a horse with the potential to make a lasting impact on the breed. I believed so strongly in this mating, I borrowed the funds to make it a reality. The pedigree — the inbreeding to Northern Dancer and Mr. Prospector through their best sons and daughters — sires of some of your greatest champions — is enough to fill even the most critical pedigree pundit with admiration. His first few steps through the shed row left all of us in awe. He soon showed his superiority to the dozens of other top-bred weanlings sharing the same field.

Sheik Mohammed, this is what the staff who advise you may not tell you: though your dealings with Coolmore/Ashford are no affair of small breeders like us, by extending business policy down the bloodlines, you inadvertently punish not just me, but every small breeder who toils and dares to contribute to this great sport. Such a policy wounds many of us as devoted to horses as you. We small breeders — for our sakes and for the industry's sake — ask you not to forsake future champions because of the stall their sires stand in.

We breed to produce the best possible horses, regardless of where their sires stand, or who may have conflicts with whom. We are accustomed to risk the security of ourselves and our families. Should we now turn away from these risks and avoid the stallions stabled by you and Coolmore/Ashford? Together, you represent more than 50% of the global buying market.

Zoe Montana is by a Claiborne stallion, Seeking the Gold, sire of your favorite, Dubai Millennium. She is open this year because of her late foaling date and I had wanted to breed her to Shamardal or Fusaichi Pegasus. But, as things stand, I cannot afford to gamble on these sires because, were I to do so, I might find her foal excluded from half the market. I do not believe that this is the message you want to send to the breeding world, a message that would hurt the very foundation of both our businesses. Of course you and Coolmore will survive. And an embargo against horses such as mine inevitably creates unexpected opportunities for other owners — wine, public storage or beer magnates for instance — to take advantage of the opportunity you have created. But the subtle chill such a policy imposes can only weaken our sport.

Your Highness, I am one of your biggest fans. You need simply read my correspondence with your staff to see how much I appreciate having a horse I bred racing in your stable. Each racing picture you have sent me of Council Member is framed on my wall. Your staff has been wonderful about sending me videos of the races, as well as e-mailing me when Council Member runs. My family and I have supported your stallions each year, and I will personally be rooting again for Council Member to continue his graded-stakes form.

No doubt you will buy many horses at Keeneland this week. As you do, please remember people like me, the foot soldiers of the breeding industry, who underwrite the risks that produce many classic winners. We are sorry for your disagreements, wish a happy resolution to whatever problems you may have, and look to you with hope for your continued support of our work.

MIGLIORE LUCKY, EVEN WITHOUT CUP

It was the night before the Breeders' Cup when they took jockey Mike Lapensee off life support. He was 58, never a star, never the sort who could even dream of having a mount in the Breeders' Cup. He put up with this dangerous sport because he had to: riding was how he fed his family. In the end, his devotion was what got him killed. At an age when most jockeys would have been long since retired, he lost his life riding a \$4,000 claimer at Suffolk Downs, trying to make \$372, the amount paid to the winning jockey.

When the biggest riding stars in the sport, many of them millionaires, gathered for the Breeders' Cup and their slice of the more than \$15 million being awarded that day, Richard Migliore was on the sidelines. Nine days earlier, he broke his leg in a freakish accident in the paddock at Belmont Park. He knew the second it happened that his dream of winning his first Breeders' Cup race was done for this year. He couldn't have known exactly how it would feel when one of his two Breeders' Cup mounts, Artie Schiller, won the Mile.

"It was like getting punched in the nose...you know, when tears well up in your eyes and everything is kind of stuck behind your eyes," Migliore said of his post-race reaction. "That was the feeling. I was proud of Artie and I was so proud of Jimmy Jerkens. Yet, I felt bad that it wasn't me."

The whole thing hit him pretty hard, so much so that the night of the race he just went home and pretty much wanted to be left alone. That gave him time to think, and not just about Artie Schiller, but about Mike Lapensee.

He had met him a couple of times, once when he went up to ride at Rockingham, once when Lapensee made a rare visit to Aqueduct.

"I remember one time I went up to Rockingham and I won the stakes up there," Migliore said. "We talked a little bit. He just seemed like a really good guy. I didn't know him well. We just had a couple of chance meetings."

Their paths rarely crossed because Lapensee and Migliore weren't in the same league. Though Migliore may not be a star on par with a Jerry Bailey or Edgar Prado, he rides at the best tracks in the country, makes a lot of money and, for him, winning a Breeders' Cup race is a realistic goal. He rides for fortune and for fame.

Lapensee last won a stakes race in 2000, and that was in a \$25,000 race at Suffolk Downs. Before the Oct. 24 accident that claimed his life, he had won 25 races this year for purse earnings of \$392,697 or about \$39,000 after he got his cut. Subbing for Migliore, Garret Gomez made \$105,000 for 96 seconds of work in the Mile.

"After Artie won, I'd be lying if I said I didn't have that split second where I thought, 'why couldn't that have been me?'" Migliore said. "It was just a split second, though. Quite honestly, the night before the Breeders' Cup I went on line and I saw that they had taken Michael Lapensee off life support.

"Let's gain some perspective here. I've been extremely fortunate my whole career to ride in a great place, to ride really good horses for really good people. And I've been very successful and have been able to do something that I dreamed about doing since I was a little kid. I'm not going to feel sorry for myself. Here was a poor man riding a \$4,000 claimer to support his family and he lost his life doing it. I'm going to go boo-hoo because I broke my leg and didn't win the Breeders' Cup? Get realistic."

In 2004, Migliore was injured in the starting gate two days before the Breeders' Cup, but said he felt well enough to accept his two Breeders' Cup mounts, Artie Schiller and sprinter Bwana Charlie. After he failed to win on either mount, it was discovered that he had a broken wrist and a broken rib and he missed the next two months. He has been injured more than most, a reason why his career has never cracked the very top echelon of his profession.

"If God has a Breeders' Cup with my name on it, it will happen," Migliore said. "If it doesn't, I'll never make any excuses to anybody. I'll know that I went out there every day and did the best I could and that's all you can ever ask of yourself."

Migliore will get out of his cast around Thanksgiving time and then will begin a couple of weeks of therapy. He'll be back in time for the prime racing season in 2006 and there's no reason why he can't get back aboard Artie Schiller for next year's Breeders' Cup.

Mike Lapensee was buried Thursday.

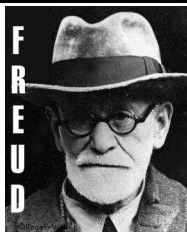
