WELL WORTH THE RISK

Eaton Sales' Reiley McDonald, bidding on behalf of a "partnership which wishes to remain nameless," went to an even \$5 million for the multiple Grade I winner **Riskaverse** (Dynaformer), the top price at last night's Fasig-Tipton November Mixed Sale at the Newtown

Paddocks. Following an opening bid of a half-million dollars, the tote board climbed steadily to the \$3-million level, with bids both inside and outside of the pavilion. But, shortly thereafter, it was McDonald going toe-to-toe with John Ferguson in the back and the Eaton co-principal

got the better of the battle. It marks the end of a brilliant racing career for the six-year-old mare, who won no fewer than six stakes, including back-to-back renewals of the GI Flower Bowl Invitational. She heads to the breeding shed, and a date with either Storm Cat or Giant's Causeway, with a career record of 32-9-6-4 and earnings of \$2,182,429. "The reason we loved her is because you can breed her to anything," McDonald commented. "She's a big, beautiful, lovely mare with great presence. She had a lot of races and she was very sound." He added that the partnership, also responsible for purchasing Take Charge Lady (\$4.2 million) and Santa Catarina (\$4.8 million) at last year's Keeneland November sale, would consider racing her foals or offer them commercially. *Cont. p2*

KEENELAND KICKS OFF 12-DAY RUN

They've gathered from places as far away as India and South America for the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale, which kicks off this morning at 10 a.m. in Lexington. And if the success of the sales company's September yearling sale is any barometer, there are plenty more blue skies ahead over the course of the next 12 days. "The success of the November sale is always based on the success of the yearling sales, and we had one of the strongest September sales ever," commented Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "We hope that success will parlay into November and the breeders will restock their barns with more mares." Indeed, the September sale, conducted amidst an air of uncertainty, performed remarkably well, blasting through the record numbers set in 2004. Sales officials see no evidence indicating an upcoming reversal of fortune. "The yearling market has continued on since the September sale," Russell said. "The European sales have been very strong, and that's very important, because we consider ourselves to be the global marketplace."

'A Once-In-a Lifetime' Opportunity...

Among a strong group of mares, both in and not-in foal, the spotlight on the November sale clearly shines upon last year's champion three-year-old filly **Ashado** (Saint Ballado). The last time the attractive dark bay set foot in the Keeneland pavilion, she was knocked down for \$170,000. Suffice to say the tote board will have to work much harder this time around. Owned in equal parts by Starlight Stables, Paul Saylor and Johns Martin, Ashado is offered by Taylor Made, the same agency who consigned her as a yearling. "These mares are so rare," said Russell. "Here's a

horse that has won seven Grade I stakes, breaks her maiden and runs in nothing but graded races after that. She gives her all everytime she goes. She's a big, gorgeous, attractive physical and she has impeccable racing performance, but she also is the physical type that breeders are going to look at. She's a big, strong, rangy mare that should carry and raise a good foal. We talk about jewels--she's bigger than a jewel." *cont. p7*

Bittersweet Sale for Stuart, Kelly...

John Stuart and Peter Bance's Bluegrass Thoroughbred Services agency consigned Riskaverse on behalf of owner Peter Schiff. "You hate to lose a mare like that out of the group of mares that you manage, but what a wonderful mare," Stuart commented. "It's a great female family," he continued, adding that the Schiffs raised such horses as Raja Baba and Sauce Boat from the same family. As for the final price, "It exceeded expectations...slightly," he stated. "I thought she'd sell between \$4 and \$5 million. She was well past her reserve." Stuart's association with the Schiff family dates back to the mid-80s, when he sold Riskaverse's third dam (Toll Booth) for John M. Schiff in 1986. Trainer Pat Kelly was also on hand last night and reflected on the mare's career. "She's been the bulkhead of our operation and it's sad to see her go, but it's satisfying to see her sell for so much, because we knew she was a valuable filly and this is her crowning achievement," he said. It was a tough decision to sell her." The Schiffs retain a yearling half sister by A.P. Indy as well as a two-year-old full sister to Riskaverse.


My Cherie Amor...

Frank Stronach was extended to \$1.05 million to secure this year's GI John C. Mabee H. winner **Amorama (Fr)** (Sri Pekan) from the consignment of Narvick International, agent for Marsha Naify and Woodside Farms LLC. The four-year-old could be kept in training in 2006. "We have to analyze her and if she's very, very healthy, we could race her," said Stronach. "Anything she earns would be icing on the cake." A two-time winner in five starts in France at two, the dark bay made her biggest U.S. impression midway through her sophomore season, rallying to upset the GI Del Mar Oaks by a nose. On the board in four of her six starts this term, the former Julio Canani trainee defeated Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf winner Intercontinental (GB), among others, in the Mabee and was a close second to that rival in the GII Palomar H. at Del Mar Sept. 3. She was most recently fourth to Megahertz (GB) in the GI Yellow Ribbon S. at Santa Anita. Oct. 1.

Ferguson Lands Folklore's Dam Contrive...

At the Keeneland September Sale, Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum indicated that Godolphin was making a renewed effort to purchase runners who would thrive over America's dirt tracks. That effort was in evidence last night, as well, as Godolphin representative John Ferguson shopped for broodmares. Ferguson purchased just one mare all evening, but made it count when going to \$3 million for hip [131](#), the Storm Cat daughter **Contrive**. The unraced mare is just seven, but has already produced a Breeders' Cup winner in Folklore (Tiznow), who last Saturday likely earned herself divisional honors by capturing the GI Juvenile Fillies. Ferguson purchased the Taylor Made sales consignee, who sold in foal to GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Pleasantly Perfect, with the hopes she can reproduce some of that main-track magic. "From our point of view, Sheikh Mohammed is very keen to have more

mares that fit American racing," said Ferguson. "She's a mare that fits that very nicely. She's a beautiful mare who's got off to a great start. She's from a very good family that goes back to a great mare, *La Troienne." Contrive represented a substantial score for Pollock Farms, which bought her for \$140,000 out of

last year's Keeneland November sale in foal to Silver Charm. A late addition to the sale, Contrive's full sister **Queen's Lady** also sold well, eliciting a \$750,000 bid from Dell Ridge Farm. The unraced five-year-old, hailing from Taylor Made's draft, was supplemented to the sale as hip [175a](#). Queen's Lady is in foal to Medaglia d'Oro.

Gimme a Break...

The page opposite her pedigree said it best. "Dam of the fastest....in foal to the fastest." **Cloud Break**, the dam of the probable champion sprinter Lost in the Fog, was purchased by WinStar Farm for \$600,000, carrying a foal from the first crop of the 2004 Eclipse Award winning sprinter Speightstown (Gone West). "Lost in the Fog is one of the best looking horses in the country, and Speightstown might be the second best," said WinStar President Doug Cauthen. "The foal she's carrying could be just awesome." Not mated in 2004, Cloud Break failed to get in foal the following year, causing some concern to the braintrust at WinStar Farm as they were building Speightstown's first book of mares. But that hesitation turned quickly to jubilation. Cauthen indicated that a decision would be made at a later date as to whether the Speightstown foal will be kept or sold.

Sent From Above...

Just three hips after the sale-topping Riskaverse sold and with the pavilion still abuzz, **Divine Dixie** (Dixieland Band) strode into the ring and made some waves herself. Cataloged as hip [170](#), the dam of GI Bluegrass S. hero Bandini found a home at Stonerside Farm when the operation's bloodstock advisor, John Adger, went to a cool \$2 million for the 10-year-old. Divine Dixie is

in foal to Fusaichi Pegasus, thus she's carrying a full sibling to Bandini, but Adger said she was purchased for the express purpose of breeding to another top sire. "We breed to Storm Cat every year, and the fact that she's a half to Stormy Atlantic [the promising young Hill 'n' Dale by Storm Cat], it looks like an obvious mate," explained Adger.

"She's already proven she can produce a top-class runner in Bandini, and we like her physically. She's very well balanced, and has a beautiful neck and head." Adger said Stonerside owns two shares in the 22-year-old Storm Cat and typically breeds from five to seven mares to the leading sire each year.

A Wild Night for Smith...

Murray Smith stood in the back walking ring, flanked by Eaton Sales' Tom Van Meter, and did a good job of hiding her nervousness. Wearing sunglasses and a suede jacket, she laughed with Van Meter and accepted the good-luck wishes from a few people walking by. But as Wild Fit (hip 114), the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies runner-up she owned with Ron Brewer, entered the ring, Smith tensed up a bit. And why wouldn't she? She was about to sell a filly for \$3 million to Demi O'Byrne, the bloodstock advisor to Coolmore.

A top two-year-old consignor, Smith was convinced she had a runner on her hands when she sent Wild Fit out to California for the Barretts March Sale earlier this year. But bidding stalled out at \$240,000, and Smith bought her back. Right after the sale, Smith was enjoying a scotch at a local watering hole and began talking about Wild Fit with trainer Jeff Mullins and his associate, Ron Brewer. Brewer, convinced Smith wasn't giving him a line, took a chance and purchased a half interest in Wild Fit.

The decision immediately looked like the right one. Wild Fit won her debut by four lengths at Del Mar in mid-August, then came back 13 days later to win the GI Del Mar Debutante. A second in the Oct. 1 GI Oak Leaf S. was followed by a game effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, where she overcame trouble on the turn and came charging late to fill the place spot. After the race, Smith had a decision to make--to sell, or not to sell?

"We had a lot of interest in her after she broke her maiden," explained Smith. "And Ron begged me, 'Can we go to the Grade I?...can we go to the Del Mar Debutante?' And I said, yeah, we can do that. After that, we can sell. After we won, Boyd Browning [Fasig-Tipton COO] called and said, 'Why don't we enter her in the Fasig sale?' I was hesitant at first. And I told him, 'Look, I'll enter her, but don't hold me to it.' We didn't commit until Tuesday of this week. [The Breeders' Cup] was very emotional, and we couldn't make our minds up the next day. But I sell horses for a living."

Yesterday, Smith went to work and, most would agree, walked away with a decent day's wages. She kept her eyes glued to the television monitor as O'Byrne bid alongside Coolmore head John Magnier from the back of the pavilion, seeing off the challenges of the B. Wayne Hughes' team and several others.

When the hammer fell at \$3 million for the Eaton Sales consignee, Smith allowed herself a few tears and walked over to O'Byrne to plant one on the Irishman's cheek.

For his part, O'Byrne wasn't surprised by the price tag. "I actually did think she'd go for that kind of money, in fact, I thought maybe she would bring a bit more," he said. "I've given \$3 million for [unraced] two-year-olds and she's already a Grade I winner."

The bloodstock advisor said Wild Fit would stay in training and would naturally remain in this country. A decision on a trainer would be made at a later date.

So what were Smith's expectations coming into the evening?

"Well, she doesn't have much pedigree, she's making her pedigree," she admitted. "So I thought that, maybe, \$2 to \$3.5 [million], something like that. You have to be realistic. Her value's as a racehorse prospect, but, if she continues to run well, her value goes up as a broodmare prospect."

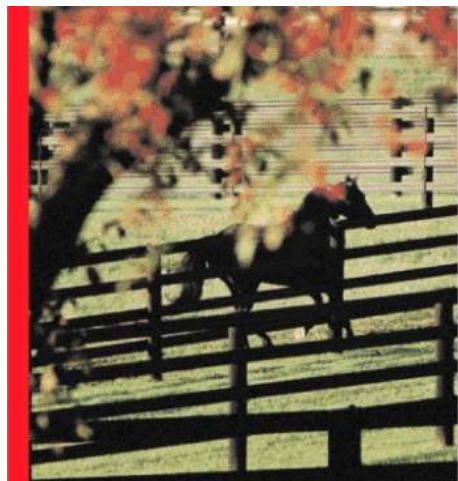
From what Smith has seen, she expects Wild Fit to be better at three than she was as a juvenile.

"I think she will be better," said Smith. "She's just starting to get mature, just starting to come into her own--her mind and her body. She's a very smart filly, very classy."

While Smith's association with Wild Fit as an active participant ended last night, she says she'll be rooting for her next year. And who knows? Maybe there will be another Wild Fit in her two-year-old consignment next year.

"It's been a fun ride," Smith concluded. "I've enjoyed it. I would encourage anybody out there to go by a two-year-old in training and have fun racing horses. There's no greater thrill."

The Coast is Clear for Forest Wildcat Filly...

Lance Robinson, general manager of Gulf Coast Farms Bloodstock, sitting alongside partner Jerry Bailey, outlasted several rivals to land hip 12, a Forest Wildcat filly who became the evening's highest-priced weanling. As the asking price quickly escalated, a bidder to the left of the auctioneer's stand reluctantly agreed to \$245,000, but the Gulf Coast contingent--on the opposite side of the pavilion--quickly countered with a \$250,000 winning bid. "We thought she was a nice individual, she had some family," said Robinson afterward. "We're in the broodmare business, and we like to buy well-bred fillies that look like they might be racehorses." Consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent, hip 12 is a daughter of Be a Prospector (Mr. Prospector), a half to Belong to Me. Be a Prospector has already proven herself as a producer, with three of her six foals to race having already earned black type. In addition to the SP Fiddler's Find (Dixieland Band), she's the dam of SW Rich Find (Exploit) and SW & MGSP Away (Dixieland Band). Robinson said that the filly would be sent down to a farm near Ocala, Florida. "We'll break her, then go from there and see what we're going to do," he said when asked if the organization planned to pinhook the filly. It's been a good year for Gulf Coast. After buying back the pinhooked Henny Hughes for \$370,000 at Barretts March, they went on to sell the colt privately for a reported \$4.3 million to Darley. Henny Hughes subsequently won the GII Saratoga Special and was second in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile.

Jupiter Aligns With Mars...

For the second year in a row, a mare was sold for \$5 million at Fasig-Tipton, and given the rousing success of this year's event, such prices could become the norm and not the exception. "This has been a seven or eight-year process where we have been hustling these better mares and put a real focus on this sale," said Walt Robertson, president of Fasig-Tipton. "Last year, we came up with the dam of Smarty Jones, sold her for \$5 million, and we were able to garner other owners' faith in the fact that we could do the job and it all came together this year. We've had a nice mare for the past five years. Smarty's dam last year pushed us over the top. It's been a long hard push. We didn't leave any stones unturned in the recruiting process and it paid off." The broodmare section of the sale alone grossed over \$27 million for 53 sold and an average of \$512,679. "A half-million dollar [average] broodmare sale...that's as strong as we know how to do it. We're exceptionally pleased," Robertson said.

Distorted Humor Share Brings \$1 Million...


The bidding at Fasig-Tipton concluded last night with a share to 12-year-old stallion Distorted Humor and two lifetime breeding rights to Medaglia d'Oro. The share was purchased by Barry Weisbord--publisher of the TDN--acting as agent, for \$1 million. Distorted Humor, the sire of 2003 GI Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide, had a banner year this term with no fewer than five graded stakes winners, including Grade I winners Flower Alley and Commentator. The chestnut's fee was increased to \$150,000 for the upcoming breeding season, up from \$60,000 last year. WinStar Farm stands the son of Forty Niner. The first of the lifetime breeding rights to MGISW Medaglia d'Oro was knocked down to agent Phillip F McCarthy for \$130,000, while Gallagher's Stud acquired the second for \$115,000. Medaglia d'Oro stands at the newly established Stonewall Farm near Lexington, Kentucky for \$40,000.

'Report' on the Card...

When **Yearly Report** (General Meeting) first stepped onto the track as a two-year-old in the fall of 2003, the report on her was this: she's pretty darn good. And California-bred bay, a homebred of Betty Mabee's Golden Eagle Farm, backed it up. She won five of her first six starts, including the GII Santa Ynez S. and GII Black-Eyed Susan S., and in the fall of last year she took the seven-furlong Stonerside S. at Lone Star in 1:20 flat, establishing a new track record. Yearly Report was retired after suffering a suspensory injury in the Sunshine Millions Distaff in January, and now gets her chance to shine in the sales ring. According to Braxton Lynch, co-director of sales for consignor Three Chimneys Sales, interest in the four-year-old has been high. "It's been very strong--all the right people have looked at her," said Lynch. "I think we're in good shape on her." Yearly Report sells as hip 174 in foal to Gone West, and is believed to be carrying a colt, a bonus for many buyers. But Lynch believes that, in addition to a race record that saw her win six of 10 starts and bank over \$800,000, it could be that intangible called presence that could be her best attribute. "She's got a lot of presence about her, like most good racehorses do," said Lynch. "She's a star."

Great Expectations...

Given the uncertain composition of the November catalogue, it is difficult to make comparisons year over year. So, what would constitute a positive result in 2005? "The two things I'd like to see is the median to go up and the not-solds to go down," says Russell. "The size of the catalogue is comparable to last year, so I would the hope the gross would remain about the same. The ladies in the credit department have been keeping very busy. We've had several old clients re-establishing credit, which is always very good. We like to see people that have been in the game and left, for whatever reason, coming back. That's a very positive thing for our industry and gives a boost to everyone else. Internationally, we've had applications coming from places like India, and domestic applications have been very good as well." The bar was certainly set high last year, when 2,873 horses sold for \$279,680,200, the third-highest in the history of the sale. The average of \$97,348 set a new mark and the median of \$32,000 equaled the previous record set in 2003.

New Marketing Initiatives Seem Popular...

On the suggestion of Associate Director of Sales Tom Thornbury, Keeneland initiated an Internet marketing campaign to generate interest in the November sale. One such undertaking was an e-mail "blitz" to advertise the aforementioned horses related to Breeders' Cup runners. According to Geoff Russell, some 46 percent of the e-mails which were sent out were actually opened, a statistic he called "phenomenal." Of those that read the email, 25 percent clicked through to at least one of several hyperlinks in the e-mail.

A number of accomplished racemares have graced the Keeneland sales pavilion, but never has one come as accomplished as Ashado. After breaking her maiden at first asking at Saratoga, she went on to make 20

additional starts over the course of three seasons, all in graded-stakes company. The grand filly boasts seven Grade I victories; has finished off the board just twice in her career; holds a record of one win, a second and a third in three tries on Breeders' Cup day; and has amassed nearly \$4 million in career earnings.

But, all good things must come to an end and no one is more acutely aware of that than Jack Wolf, owner of Starlight Stables along with his wife Laurie.

"It's going to be hard, because she's given us so much fun at the races," Wolf said yesterday after leaving Barn 4, temporary home to the four-year-old filly. "She's been wonderful, but I think this is the right thing for her, and whoever buys her, it's going to be a good spot for her."

Ashado has been the consummate professional since her arrival in Kentucky and has arguably spent more time out of her stall than in it.

"She is the most professional, classy mare that I've ever had the pleasure of dealing with," said Taylor Made's Chad Cockerham, who estimates that he has personally shown Ashado at least 100 times. "She could handle herself on the racetrack and she's just a classy individual. She's a mare everyone needs to see and she's one of a kind."

Although she looks as if she could race tomorrow, Ashado sells as a broodmare prospect only. If she turns out to be as good a producer as she was a runner, today's final bid could prove to be a bargain.

Foret Hoping for Storybook Ending...

When Donald Foret dropped a \$25,000 claim slip for Louisiana-bred Leslie's Love in 2001, he was hoping for a "nice mare we could race and have a little fun with." What he ended up with turned out to be that and a whole lot more.

A daughter of the Fit to Fight stallion Combat Ready, the durable dark bay became a win machine for her new connections, reaching the winner's circle a total of 19 times from 43 starts over nearly four years of racing. After ascending through the claiming ranks, she became a reliable stakes horse, taking down a half dozen added-money events and placing in another four, while bankrolling well over a half-million dollars for Foret.

Leslie's Love was retired after her seven-year-old campaign and paid a visit to Tiznow, sire of Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and likely Eclipse Award winner Folklore. Foret gives full credit for that decision to his son, a graduate of the University of Kentucky's racing program.

"He thought that Tiznow would be the leading freshman sire and just took a shot," he explained. "We won that bet, and hopefully, we can cash in [today]."

But Lexington in November is not exactly where the team planned on being. Foret, an attorney in New Orleans, lost his downtown office, among other things, during Hurricane Katrina.

"Actually, we weren't really going to sell, but with the storm coming, things are so uncertain now that we decided to just go ahead and, if we get a fair value for her, we'll let her go," Foret said, adding that Leslie's Love has been in Kentucky since her retirement last October.

Catalogued as [hip 25](#), the eight-year-old mare is being consigned by Moonestone LLC, the first-ever Keeneland draft for the agency. Sean Curtin, partners in Moonestone with Empire Stud, is optimistic about the mare's chances.

"We're hoping to kick things off with a star," he said. "She's doing great and she's been out a lot. She's a big, strong, correct filly and we're hoping she'll do well."

The catalogue page received a nice update when her five-year-old full sister, Our Love, won the Sept. 17 Walmac Inter. Matchmaker S. at Louisiana Downs.
