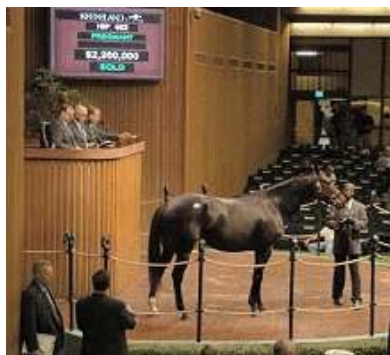

**MY FAIR LADY**

The family of Win Crafty Lady has been exceptionally good to Joe Greeley, owner of Sabine Stable. The mare had already produced the likes of outstanding performers Grade I winner Harmony Lodge and GII Arkansas Derby winner Graeme Hall, and it was her multiple stakes winning daughter **Win's Fair Lady** (Dehere) who

stole the show at yesterday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington. Spencer Plummer, bidding on behalf of the ClassicStar partnership, went to \$2.2 million for the six-year-old mare, carrying a foal by the successful young stallion Giant's Causeway. Blackburn Farm, the operation of Michael T. Barnett, explained why

the mare was offered at auction as opposed to joining the Sabine broodmare band. "She's in foal to Giant's Causeway, and Giant's Causeway got so hot," the consignor explained. "And we own the two-year-old filly out of the mare [Aug. 12 maiden winner Win McCool, by Giant's Causeway]. But it was really on the strength of Giant's Causeway that we decided that it was a really good time to bring her to the marketplace. She exceeded our expectations. We were hoping to get a million." For ClassicStar, the purchase was a virtual no-brainer. Very active at this venue over the past several years, they acquired Win Crafty Lady, in foal to Giant's Causeway, for \$900,000 at the Fasig-Tipton November Sale in 2003. "She's a beautiful filly, a stakes winner, half to a Grade I winner and her mother's a stakes winner," said Plummer, the president of ClassicStar. "I think the market is really strong. We had to stretch ourselves being on this mare, but I think it's worth the stretch. We own the family and it makes all our fillies more valuable." Plummer indicated that the 2004 foal, a colt by Giant's Causeway, is currently in training in Ireland. **Keeneland cont. p2-9**

Jim Tafel has owned his fair share of outstanding racemares, including the likes of champion Banshee Breeze, MGISP Til Forbid and the latter's graded stakes winning daughter **Scoop** (Gone West). In an effort to

slightly reduce his broodmare band, Tafel entered the seven-year-old mare into the sale. She rewarded her owner yesterday, realizing a bid of \$2.1 million from Charlotte Weber's Live Oak Stud. "I'm in ecstasy," the venerable Kentucky horseman commented. "It was the right time to sell her. I have three foals of hers and the first one looks like a real runner. We're just thrilled with the sale--it far exceeded our expectations, it really did." Tafel was thrilled that Weber thought enough of Scoop to add her

to an already powerful broodmare band. When told who the winning bidder was, Tafel said, "Oh, she was?" and exclaimed, "Oh yeah! I'm delighted." Scoop is already the dam of the two-year-old Forest Wildcat filly Coolwind, who broke her maiden at first asking at Arlington and has since raced exclusively in stakes, finishing third in the GIII Arlington-Washington Breeders' Cup Lassie S. and the GIII Pocahontas S. last weekend. John Rasmussen of Live Oak Stud explained what attracted him to the mare. "It's an active family," he said. "Her first foal is real active right now. We like the fact that she's a younger mare, she's carrying a filly and it looks like her fillies can run. And I think she's a great addition to the broodmare band." Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, the dark bay is carrying a filly by El Prado (Ire).

**Making an Impact...**

Standing at the left-side entrance to the pavilion and propped against the wall to the press box, agent Federico Barberini kept his ear pressed to his cell phone, gesturing to the bid spotter once, then again, then again. When the dust settled, the young Italian found

himself the last one standing on the Arazi mare **Glint in Her Eye**, a half sister to recent Japanese Triple Crown hero Deep Impact (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). The winning bid was \$1,050,000. Barberini declined to say who he was representing. Asked to comment on the Brookdale Sales consignee, who sold in foal to Empire Maker, Barberini said,

"She's from a very good family. The dam was a very good mare in Europe. It's a lovely pedigree. You really couldn't ask for more on a catalog page." Out of German Group 1 winner Wind in her Hair (Ire) (Alzao), who also was second in the G1 Epsom Oaks in 1994, Glint in Her Eye (hip 582) sports a truly international pedigree. In addition to Deep Impact, she's a half to Black Tide (Jpn), a stakes winner of over \$900,000 in Japan, and to American graded stakes winner Veil of Avalon. Barberini acknowledged that Deep Impact's recent win in the third leg of the Japanese Triple Crown, the Kikura Sho (Japanese St Leger), didn't make acquiring his sister any easier. "It's obviously a very good horse, so that had to make difference," he said. Barberini was also in on the action for Glint in Her Eye's weanling filly by El Prado (Ire), who followed her into the ring as 583, but failed to match Katsumi Yoshida's \$410,000 offer. Barberini said that Glint in Her Eye would go to Europe. Or, more accurately, back to Europe. After racing in England at two and three, Glint in Her Eye was purchased by Brookdale's Fred Seitz for 135,000gns at the Tattersalls December sale in 2002 while in foal to Danehill Dancer (Ire).

**Glint in Her Eye - Hip 582 cont.**

The resulting foal, named Jeremy, was recently second in the Oct. 22, Listed totesport.com S. at Doncaster. Seitz shipped Glint in Her Eye to the U.S. and bred her to Dixieland Band in 2003 and El Prado last year. Seitz had good luck with another European import earlier in the day. Seitz had acquired hip 491, the Bering (GB) mare Bayberry (UAE), for €230,000 during a 2003 excursion to the Deauville December sale. Yesterday, the five-year-old stakes-placed chestnut resold for \$925,000 to Margaret O'Toole. Bayberry was the lone mare in the catalog in foal to Montjeu (Ire), whose three Classic winners in Europe this year led to his stud fee increasing to €125,000 for 2006.

**Home Court Advantage...**

One of the last horses to go through the ring yesterday was also one with perhaps the largest pedigree on day two. Hip 601 was an attractive mare by Storm Cat out of 1996 Breeders' Cup Distaff winner Jewel Princess (Key to the Mint), which was knocked down for a final bid of \$1.4 million to AGS Thoroughbreds from the consignment of Craig and Holly Bandoroff's Denali Stud. She is carrying a foal, on an early cover date, by Gone West. "We were very happy with the price," said Craig Bandoroff. "We had a modest reserve on her because it was for a man that races and doesn't have much of an interest in breeding. It's an example that happens time and again of a great physical paying dividends and helping a horse bring a very good price. She was very well conformed for a Storm Cat and she had a little bit of race record, but the physical is sort of what got everyone interested in her." A full sister to One Nice Cat, the four-year-old raced in the colors of Alnoff Stables, winning her lone start at two before returning from an eight-month absence to take a Churchill allowance test last May. Third in an overnight handicap at Arlington the following month, she was third in the GIII Iowa Oaks in her lone try at two turns in July in what would prove to be her final start.

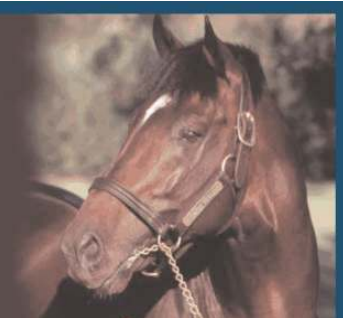

**Happy Trails....**

One of the great stories of Thoroughbred racing in 2005 has been Louisiana-bred Happy Ticket (Anet). Owned by 61-year-old Stewart Madison, a co-owner of Malaco Records, a production company which manu-

factures and distributes R & B and gospel music, the bay won her first eight career starts in the Palmetto state. She took her game to the next level by winning the GIII Chicago Breeders' Cup H. June 18. After finishing runner-up to Madcap Escapade in the GII Princess Rooney H. in July, Happy Ticket got back on the beam with a 5 1/2-length success

over Pleasant Home in the GI Ballerina S. Aug. 28. Second, beaten a half-length to Ashado in the GI Beldame S. Oct. 1, the four-year-old filly was a distant 11<sup>th</sup> in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff Oct. 29 and has subsequently undergone throat surgery. Soon after the Chicago effort, David Greathouse of Four Star Sales, who had purchased Happy Ticket's dam, Love and Happiness (Septieme Ciel), for \$45,000 at the 1994 Keeneland September sale, suggested to Madison that he consider entering the mare, in foal to Not For Love, for the November sale. Madison obliged and the decision paid dividends yesterday, as Love and Happiness was hammered down for \$650,000 to Gaines-Gentry, agent. "I prefer to race, but you have to sell from time to time to keep your business straight and I thought this was a good time to do it and it turned out to be just that. I'm thrilled with the result," Madison commented. "I still own Happy Ticket, a full sister and a half sister, so I still have a female part of the family." Happy Ticket, the winner of \$782,260 to date, arrived back in Louisiana on Sunday and will get a few weeks off before returning to the track. She stays in training with Andy Leggio for 2006, with an eye on the Breeders' Cup Distaff at Churchill Downs.

**Capeside Lady Brings \$700K....**

So Madcapt Stables' **Capeside Lady** (Cape Town) elicited a \$700,000 bid from Mike Akers, who operated

Dapple Bloodstock. "I didn't think we'd get her for that price," Akers admitted. "This market's a little on and off. We thought she'd be in the \$750,000 to \$1-million range, so I'm quite happy with the final price." Akers had not yet had a chance to decide whether the winner of this year's GII Molly Pitcher Breeders' Cup H. would stay in training or be retired to stud. "We'll give her a little time, check the X-rays and let

her tell us," he commented. In addition to her Monmouth victory, Capeside Lady added to her value this fall, finishing a very game third in the GI Juddmonte Spinster S. at Keeneland. Formerly trained by Todd Pletcher, the four-year-old sports a record of 17-7-1-3 with earnings of \$694,760. Akers has also been busy purchasing mares for several clients whose broodmare bands he manages.

**Pedigree Power...**

A weanling filly by Giant's Causeway from the family of Tale of the Cat and Johannesburg elicited a \$750,000 offer from wine magnate Jess Jackson. Bidding front and center in the sales pavilion and with bloodstock advisor John Moynihan sitting to his left, Jackson landed hip 524, a daughter of the unraced Castanea (Horse Chestnut {SAf}). Castanea is a half sister to top young sire Tale of the Cat and freshman Minardi, and to Myth, the dam of European all-star Johannesburg. "If you look at that female side, there's more sires in there than most any dam I know," acknowledged Jackson. "Her pedigree's immaculate. And on the sire side, he's the hottest sire in the sophomore ranks. There are a lot of Cats out there, but he's one of the best." Jackson said it wasn't merely pedigree that made the chestnut an attractive offering. "Her conformation was great," said Jackson, who added, "We'll rest her and let her grow, then put her into training." Hip 524 was consigned by Indian Creek, which also bred the filly.


**Blue Collar to Blue Blood?...**

**Puxa Saco** (Dehere) didn't attract much attention in her first two visit to the Keeneland sales, selling for just \$7,500 as a weanling in 2000 and for \$8,500 to Richard Rowan of Florida in September 2001. The five-year-old mare, fresh off the track, has come a long way since then and sold for \$875,000 during Monday's opening day of trade. The winning bidder was the Northwest Farms of Jerry Paxton. "I'm elated," said Rowan, who credited consignor Hinkle Farms with an excellent job of preparing the mare for the sale. "We were very happy with what we got. I'm most happy because [trainer] Janine Sahadi did a great job with the horse and now she'll be bred to a really nice horse. If I'd kept her, I'd have bred her to \$35,000 stallions--this way somebody's going to breed her to A.P. Indy or Storm Cat and maybe produce a champion." Despite her bargain-basement price tag, the attractive chestnut became a dual stakes winner at two, and celebrated her best season at the races this year, winning the Gill Desert Stormer H. and finishing third by 3/4 of a length in the GI Humana Distaff H. Ben Kessinger, director of sales and marketing for Hinkle Farms, added, "She's a beautiful filly, she's got a great top line and obviously her race record speaks for itself. I think she's going to be a really top broodmare. She really has an athletic look to her." Puxa Saco retires with six wins from 24 starts and earnings of \$400,575.

**Sales Officials Hardly Dismayed By Off Session...**

Despite a dip in all three statistical categories during yesterday's session, officials at Keeneland were hardly downtrodden. "We knew going in that [yesterday] was not as strong as [Monday]," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "The composition of the [November] catalogue varies from year to year and consignors on Monday had a stronger hand Monday than they did on Tuesday," he added, pointing out that last year's second session was highlighted by a draft of mares from Denali Stud for Bob and Beverly Lewis. Overall figures remain strong. Despite a three-percent decrease in overall gross receipts, the two-session average is up by 10.5 percent and the median is ahead by a robust 35 percent.

**One for the Books...**

The action at the Keeneland Sales pavilion could get off to a fast start today when hip [631](#) strides into the ring. That's when Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency consigns GISW **Lady Shirl** (That's a Nice), the dam of this year's GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. winner Shakespeare. "She's a unique offering, being the dam of a current Grade I winner," said Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. "She was a great racemare and is a proven producer--she's pretty special." A model of consistency, Lady Shirl won 19 of 41 starts and was second another nine times. Her biggest victory came in the 1991 GI Flower Bowl H., and she had nine other stakes victories to her credit while earning just over \$950,000. After being retired in 1994 as a seven-year-old, she was entered in the 1995 Keeneland January, but she failed to meet her reserve and was led out of the ring unsold at \$190,000. Finding a buyer three years later at Keeneland November, she was knocked down for \$110,000, but again found herself at this sale in 2000, where she was purchased, in foal to Theatrical (Ire), for just \$90,000 by Triple J. Fast forward five years and that \$90,000 looks like a pretty good deal. The foal she was carrying by Theatrical turned out to be Shakespeare, who returned from injury this year to win the GI Belmont Breeders' Cup H. and the Turf Classic in consecutive starts before losing his unbeaten record in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Lady Shirl is carrying a full sibling to Shakespeare, and her weanling filly by Smart Strike follows her into the ring. "She's a beautiful walker and very correct," Sikura said of hip [632](#). "She's a very nice filly."

**Grade I Winner on Day 3....**

It doesn't happen too often, but today's third day of bidding features a recent Grade I winner. Lane's End Farm consigns the three-year-old filly **Sweet Talker** (Stormin Fever) this afternoon on behalf of owners Eliah

and Lisa Kahn. Now under the care of trainer Helen Pitts, the dark bay filly has proven to be one of the best of her generation on the turf, with five victories, a second and a third in seven tries over that surface. A stakes winner at two, Sweet Talker took this year's Edgewood S. May 6 and, two starts back, posted a 1 1/4-length success in the Mar-

tha Washington Breeders' Cup S. at Laurel Sept. 24. Extended an invitation to the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland Oct. 15, she made the most of the opportunity to take a blanket finish by a nose. Pitts is hoping to run her charge in Saturday's GI Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill if the filly does not meet her reserve. "The thing about her right now is that she has never been doing so well," said Pitts. "I've never seen her like this. She's happy and moving unbelievable. She's just on top of her game right now."

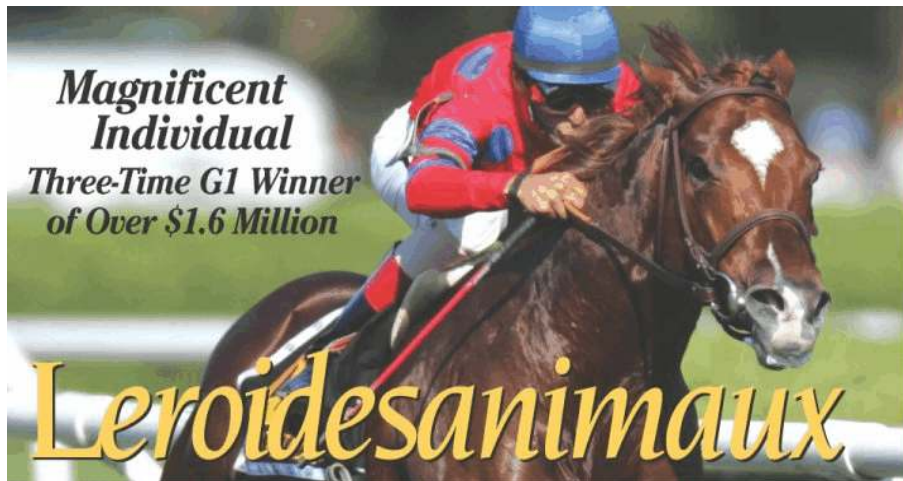

**BEST AVAILABLE**

After what was undeniably a blockbuster sale at Fasig-Tipton Sunday night--the gross was up 56 percent--the tone for Keeneland Monday was really, probably, set by the very first horse, Hip 1, Ifyouprefersilver. Her name aside, she had been offered as a maiden mare last November, but was bought back for \$175,000. She came back this year, in foal to the \$75,000 stallion Forestry, and sold for \$500,000. Even allowing for expenses, the cost of money, etc., it's at least an 80-percent jump in value from last year.

Another example is Chimichurri, a Grand Slam mare who won a Grade III race as a two-year-old, placed in four other graded stakes at two and three, and earned \$269,000. She sold in the Keeneland November sale in 2003, late in her three-year-old year, for \$675,000--plenty of money, but she was a real knockout, like some of those Grand Slams are.

Fast forward to November, 2005. Only two things have changed on the page: a new stakes-placed earner of \$109,938 by Skip Away under the first dam; and her own earnings had shown as \$251,000 in 2003, so her final earnings, shown in 2005, were \$18,000 higher. Other than that, she shows in the catalogue a 2005 filly by Vindication (not catalogued), and she sells in foal to Unbridled's Song on a February 28 cover. So she has cost \$675,000; two years in keep and insurance; \$50,000 for the Vindication stud fee; and \$125,000 for the Unbridled's Song. I know Unbridled's Song is hot as a pistol, but even he isn't this hot: Chimichurri, this time through, brought \$2.1 million. The buyer two years ago has to have more than doubled their investment, and they have the Vindication filly to boot. That's how hot this market looked Monday: a mare bought two years ago for \$675,000, carrying a \$125,000 stud fee, brought \$2.1-million, with no material change in the catalogue page.

But, then, what happened yesterday? Whereas the Monday gross had been up 21 percent from the corresponding session last year--after Fasig's gross Sunday was up 56 percent--yesterday's gross dropped 27 percent, from almost \$81.5 million to \$59.3 million. The average dropped 20 percent, from \$386,194, to \$308,943, having been up 43 percent on Monday.

In all, Keeneland Book 1 saw 372 horses sell (a 12-percent drop from the 424 sold in Book 1 last year) for a total of \$157,438,000, and an average of \$423,220. The Book 1 gross was actually down 3 percent, though the average was up 10 percent. But that doesn't tell the whole story, either: add in Fasig, and you have 484 sold in the November sales' first three days, for a total of \$189,621,000, and an average of \$391,779. Last year, Fasig's Sunday sale plus Keeneland Book 1 had 625 sold, for a total of \$183,149,300, and an average of \$293,039. We had 22 percent fewer horses sell this year, for a \$6.5-million increase in gross (4 percent), but a 34-percent rise in average. As I said in yesterday's column, I actually think that 30-percent increase in average is probably about right; certainly judging from the two Monday horses cited above, you'd think it was more than that, if anything, not less.

The explanation for these seemingly wild gyrations are actually dead simple: it's the catalogue. It's come to be known as the 'November Disclaimer', and it is simply that there can be much more dramatic variations in mixed sale catalogues, in terms of pedigree, than in yearling catalogues. It's rare that this phenomenon is demonstrated so dramatically as in this year's Book 1, but it is nothing more nor less than a far better catalogue on Monday than Tuesday. All the combatants we spoke to, jousting in the back chutes, said it was every bit as tough "for what was there" Tuesday as Monday, and I've no doubt that will continue. It's the 'Best Available' principle: people show up with money to spend, and they're going to spend it on the best available. **Cont. p9**

Sure, Ashado sets the standard, but the consensus is universal that the Tuesday session, this year, was far inferior to Monday on paper. That's why it was down so much: it wasn't the market, it was the catalogue. In fact, it does rather look like owning broodmares ranks right up there with owning boats and art these days. What's really been happening here is that people have been spending huge money and buying the best available; I think saying the market is up 30 percent might be underestimating it.

Unusually, the leading first-year sires of weanlings have not been heavily represented in Book 1. Mineshaft has only had one weanling sell so far (\$160,000), Empire Maker none. Hill 'n' Dale's unbeaten champion two-year-old, Vindication, has been the runaway leader among his sire group in terms of weanling sales: he had seven average \$213,857, in Book 1. Aldebaran, champion sprinter in 2003, also had a big boost when his first sale weanling, a colt out of filly/mare turf champion Soaring Softly, brought \$485,000.

Among sires with their first mares in-foal selling, Speightstown, with nine in-foal mares averaging \$450,000, and Smarty Jones, who had 16 average \$335,000, were most prominent. Pleasantly Perfect, to whom Folklore's dam, Contrive, sold in foal, did therefore have three in-foal mares average over \$1,150,000, but that is a bit of a 'false positive'. In-foal mare averages do really only tell you, though, what type of mares the stallion was bred to.

intended start in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. at Churchill Downs Nov. 26. The chip was detected following a sixth-place finish to Stevie Wonderboy in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Belmont Park Oct. 29. "We X-rayed him and have decided to stop on him and do a little ankle surgery on him," said trainer Patrick Byrne. "It's a very

simple procedure. It's just a little fragment." Byrne, who indicated that the colt will be out for 60 days before resuming training at Gulfstream Park, will target his charge toward next year's spring classics. "We thought it was best to stop on him now and do the right thing by him," Byrne added. "We'd have liked to have gone to the Jockey Club, but if you get later into the year you're kind of pushed going into the spring of next year. God willing, if he's good enough to be a Derby horse, we certainly want to give him the opportunity to get there."
