**WORTH THE WAIT**

After spending in excess of \$9 million on six horses during Monday's opening session of the Keeneland November Mixed Sale, it would have been perfectly understandable if Ernie Retamoza Jr., the manager of Don Adam's Courtlandt Farm in Ocala, Florida, had packed up and left the Bluegrass. But **Sweet Talker** (Stormin Fever), recent winner of the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland, kept him in town, and Retamoza achieved his goal yesterday, taking home the three-year-old filly for a session-topping bid of \$1.15 million. "We'll try to give her another year or two of racing," he said. "We race Film Maker, who won the Queen Elizabeth [in 2003]; this filly did the same and we figured she'd be a nice addition to the race program. She looks like she's a relatively sound filly and these Grade I winners aren't available all the time, so we thought we'd take a chance." Retamoza indicated that the filly, previously trained by Helen Pitts, would be sent immediately to Adam's farm, receive about a month off, then begin preparations for 2006, when she will be trained by Graham Motion.

**An Operation on the Rise...**

Mr. and Mrs. Kenneth Luke, the owners of Virginia's Eldon Farm, have made great strides since arriving on the Thoroughbred scene several years ago. The Lukes continued their trend of purchasing young horses yesterday at Keeneland. The team, including bloodstock advisor Debbie Easter, was effectively shut out during Book 1 due to the strength of the market over the first two days of the sale, but landed a pair of offerings yesterday, including hip **660**, the session's top-selling foal. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales as agent, the Feb. 24 foal is a son of Elusive Quality--Mermaid's Tale (Boston Harbor) and was purchased for \$620,000. "He had a lot of quality," Easter commented. "He's a big, rangy, nice colt. He looks like he's going to grow up into a real quality individual. I can't say for sure, but he's one you might see back here next year." Indeed, Eldon Farm has delved into nearly every niche of the business and have pinhooked successfully in the recent past. During last year's November sale, they went to \$440,000 for a colt by Mr. Greeley--Hard Knocker and resold the three-parts brother to Chimichurri (Elusive Quality) to John Ferguson for \$950,000 at the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale this past August. But they are not averse to hanging on to their purchases. One of four yearlings they bought during the 2004 Keeneland September sale is starting to make a name for herself at the races. Now known as Capote's Crown (Capote), the half sister to champion sprinter Smoke Glacken, purchased for \$170,000, broke her maiden at first asking Oct. 2 and returned to be a good second to Better Now in the Gill Tempted S. at Belmont Oct. 30. The Kiaran McLaughlin trainee has been sent to Florida to prepare for her three-year-old campaign. Eldon added to their collection later in the session, going to \$390,000 for hip **731**, a Lane's End-consigned colt by Tale of the Cat from Reflect the Music (A.P. Indy). Easter was breathing a sigh of relief after finally getting to sign some tickets. "We're just happy. It's been tough to get all the things you want around here," she offered. "The ones we tried [Monday and Tuesday], we struck out on. I don't know that we ever come in here swinging a lot, so we're very happy."

**The Price Is Right...**

Sweet Talker was originally led out of the 2004 OBS March sale unsold at \$115,000, but owner Elish Kahn, through his trainer Ken McPeck, approached consignor Gabriel Dixon, offered the RNA price and left with the goods. The dark bay filly flashed talent at two, but raised her game when switched to the turf. She has posted five wins from seven starts on the grass, capped by her thrilling nose victory over European invaders Karen's Caper and Gorella (Fr) in the QE II. Kahn was satisfied with yesterday's outcome. "We were hoping she would bring a little bit more, but she brought a fair price," he said. When asked how close they came to retaining her, Kahn said, "She wasn't far past [her reserve]. She was actually barely past, but we priced her for the market and we are very happy with the result. We wish Mr. Adam all the best with her."

### A Matter of Soul...

Charles Fipke knows the value of a rare commodity. As a geologist, Fipke has been to the jungles of Africa and South America, and to the sub-Arctic regions of his native Canada, in search of copper, opals, gold and diamonds. The 59-year-old's single-mindedness led to his discovery of what is Canada's first and only diamond mine, the Ekati, of which Fipke owns 10 percent, and it extends to his Thoroughbred ventures. A lifelong fan of racing, Fipke became involved in the sport in Canada and has since shifted his focus to the U.S. He made waves in 2003 when he paid a then-world record \$2.7 million for Diamond Fury (Sea of Secrets) at the Barretts March Sale, the same year homebred Perfect Soul (Ire) provided him with his first Grade I win. Named Canada's champion turf horse after taking the GI Shadwell Turf Mile in 2003, Perfect Soul was retired to Darby Dan Farm for the 2005 season and will stand for \$15,000 next year. Now Fipke is looking to support his young stallion. Through advisor Jack Werk, he has been busy mining the Keeneland November sale for suitable mates, coming up with the dams of no fewer than three Grade I winners. Yesterday, Werk went to \$485,000 for the 18-year-old **Lady Shirl** (hip [631](#)), the dam of GI Joe Hirsch Turf Classic Invitational S. hero Shakespeare (Theatrical {Ire}). She is carrying a full to Shakespeare, and Werk said Fipke plans to sell the foal at auction. "He figures he's got a Shakespeare full that he can recover part of--and maybe all of--the money on, and if he can even get one foal out of Lady Shirl, he'll be happy," explained Werk. On day one of the sale, Fipke purchased **Sweet as Honey** (hip [141](#)), dam of MGISW Borrego, for \$850,000; **Groove** (hip [290](#)), the Mr. Prospector half sister to American Chance, for \$450,000; and MGISW Peace Rules' dam **Hold to Fashion** (hip [298](#)) for \$230,000. He will be supporting Perfect Soul with about 40 mares next spring, and "they would take your breath away," said Werk. John Phillips, managing partner of Darby Dan, agrees. "It's spectacular to have someone who's so utterly enthusiastic about buying those types of mares for a stallion," he said. "Perfect Soul had a great first book, and he'll have an even better second book."

### Golden Arches...

**Arch Lady** (Arch), consigned by Brookdale Sales on behalf of Mr. and Mrs. Gordon Schuster of Minnesota, was purchased for \$260,000 by David Greathouse, who signed the ticket in the name of Greathouse Bloodstock. "It's for a pinhooking partnership," Greathouse commented. "It's a lot of money for what she's done. She's a big, beautiful mare conformation-wise and Arch is becoming a well-recognized stallion. We were hoping to get her in the low-twos, but if you pay 15 or 20 percent more in this market it's not too bad. She's got an active half sister and hopefully we'll get some more help out of her next year." The relation to which Greathouse refers is Healthy Addiction (Boston Harbor), who punched her ticket to the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff with a game victory in the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 1. He added that they may breed and foal the mare, or return her to a mixed sale in foal. Arch Lady, a \$30,000 Keeneland September graduate, earned \$167,029 while winning nine races from 35 starts, including five stakes. The Schusters, who maintain a small racing operation, are based at Canterbury Park in their home state and winter at Turf Paradise in Phoenix.

### Speightstown Talk of the Town...

Last year's champion sprinter **Speightstown** (Gone West--Silken Cat, by Storm Cat) was off to an excellent start during the first three days at Keeneland, as 14 mares in foal to the WinStar/Taylor Made stallion (from 16 through the ring) realized gross receipts of \$5,447,000. The average of \$389,071 is nearly 10 times his published first-year stud fee of \$40,000. Mares in foal to the stallion proved popular among the most important players in town, including Jess Jackson, who bought two--Venetian Glass, [hip 449](#), for \$700,000 and Salty Farma, [hip 746](#), for \$510,000; Briggs and Cromartie, who went to \$575,000 to get Winter Garden, [hip 171](#), Monday; and Buzz Chace, who purchased Pass Me The Salt, [hip 698](#), for \$32,000 when bidding for Aaron and Marie Jones during Tuesday's second session.

### Gill Begins Dispersal...


Owner Michael Gill consigned five fillies and mares to yesterday's session through the Taylor Made Agency. Of the five horses, just one of them had not raced in 2005. Hip [693](#), the five-year-old MSP **Our Mariah** (Mt. Livermore), was retired last year and was offered not-in-foal. She was purchased by Lance Robinson's Gulf Coast Farm LLC for \$180,000. Hip [700](#), **Pawyne Princess** (Saint Ballado), made a splash last season when running a close second versus males in the Federico Tesio S. and finishing runner-up to Yearly Report in the GII Black-Eyed Susan S. A four-time winner of \$137,630, she was knocked down to Robinson's team for \$200,000. Gill claimed **Umpateedle** (Suave Prospect), hip [825](#), for \$32,000 in 2003 and she posted her best season in 2005, adding to her value with upset victories in the GIII Endine H. at Delaware Park and the GII Gallant Bloom H. at Belmont Park. Tom Bozarth's Arch Bloodstock LLC was the winning bidder at \$300,000. **Ambition Unbridled** (Unbridled's Song), a \$130,000 OBSFEB juvenile purchase, earned over twice that at the races while notching a pair of 2005 stakes successes. She finished third in the Kattegat's Pride S. at Laurel Park last Saturday. Catalogued as hip [858](#), the four-year-old was purchased by Cloverleaf Farms for \$400,000. Gulf Coast also secured the last of the quintet, going to \$220,000 for hip [911](#), the five-year-old **City Fire** (Carson City). The five-time stakes winner heads to the breeding shed with nine wins in 37 starts and earnings of \$377,717.

### It's a Wonder...

For breeder John Gunther, it was hard to imagine a better way to spend one minute and 41 seconds. In that span on Oct. 29, a colt named Stevie Wonderboy (Stephen Got Even) that Gunther had bred in partnership won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, and another, bred in whole by Gunther--favored First Samurai--finished a good third. To top it off, Superfly, the son of a mare he'd bought in November of 2003, came home fifth in the Juvenile. Not too bad for a breeder that keeps only about 15 mares at his Kentucky-based Glennwood Farm. Sometime this evening, Gunther will hope for another good minute or two when his consignee **Heat Lightning** (Summer Squall) goes under the hammer. Selling as hip [1386](#), the 12-year-old is the dam Stevie Wonderboy, the odds-on favorite for divisional honors. There has been a steady stream of visitors to barn 37 at Keeneland to inspect the mare, and that has Gunther feeling optimistic. "She should sell for seven figures. I think all the right people are on her, but it's a question of whether they've spent all their money by Thursday," laughed Gunther, who purchased Heat Lightning with Tony Holmes and Walter Zent for \$62,000 at this sale in 2002. At the time, the mare was carrying Stevie Wonderboy in utero. She sells here in foal to GI Belmont S. and GI Travers S. winner Birdstone. "We weren't going to sell her unless Stevie Wonderboy hit the board in the Breeders' Cup," said Gunther. "With him winning, it seemed like an optimum time to sell her." Stevie Wonderboy's performance in the Breeders' Cup didn't surprise Gunther, who watched him run second to MGSW What a Song in his June 18 debut at Hollywood. "I first saw him in his first race in California, and he closed a lot of ground," said Gunther. "I phoned Tony and said, 'You know what, this is a good horse.' Then he ran third to What a Song [in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S.], and he was closing a lot of ground, and just past the wire he was in front."

**Blue Chip Investments...**

**Ashado** (Saint Ballado), the \$9 million sales topper, has made the most noise, but she is not the only mare once trained by Todd Pletcher to sell well at Keeneland November. In addition to the Eclipse winner, who figured to be the star of the show, several former Pletcher trainees brought many times what they originally cost. Of course, only the best bred or most accomplished distaffers make it into Keeneland's Book 1, but a cursory glance at the numbers is still impressive. Ashado was purchased for \$170,000 as a KEESEP yearling and resold, minus earnings, for an \$8,830,000 profit. **Capeside Lady** (Cape Town) was bought for \$65,000 as a two-year-old and yesterday made \$700,000. Others include **Krasnaya** (Red Ransom), a \$125,000 yearling who sold yesterday for \$450,000; **Summer Raven** (Summer Squall), a \$200,000 yearling who went for \$750,000; and the broodmare **Jersey Girl** (Belong to Me), who already has foals to race. A \$220,000 two-year-old, she sold Monday for \$700,000. The total cost for the above fillies: \$800,000. The total they brought at Keeneland November: \$11.6 million. Minus Ashado, who obviously skews the numbers, the four others cost \$630,000 and resold for \$2,500,000. It should be noted Jersey Girl sold in foal to Speightstown; the rest are maiden mares.

**Hip 1015, K.D.'s Shady Lady, 3, Maria's Mon--Annie's Apple, by Shawklit Won**

*Consigned by Hidden Brook, Agent XIII*

On offer as a racing or broodmare prospect, K.D.'s Shady Lady, while still a maiden, finished second in last October's Salem Co. S. and in the GIII Tempted S. The gray broke her maiden at the end of the season and is stakes-placed in 2005. She's out of the stakes-winning Annie's Apple, a half to stakes-winner Dashing Lesley and stakes-placed A's an B's.

**Hip 1035, Lovely Amanda, 8, Belong to Me--Love Alleged, by Alleged**

*Consigned by Warrendale Sales, Agent XVII*

The New York-bred Lovely Amanda amassed a record of eight wins, five seconds and four thirds in 25 career starts, earning \$376,450 during three seasons at the track. Her second dam, GSW Me and Connie, produced two stakes winners and two stakes-placed runners. Lovely Amanda is believed to be carrying a Tale of the Cat foal on a Mar. 21 cover.

**Hip 1043, c, Forestry--Majesty's Crown, by Magesterial**  
*Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig & Holly Bandoroff), agent for Avalon Farms B-Avalon Farms (Ky)*

Dam Majesty's Crown has thus far thrown very speedy offspring and this fellow could fit the bill as well. A Jan. 25 colt, he is a half to champion sprinter Smoke Glacken (Two Punch), and a full brother to GSW Smokey Glacken, who was third in the GII First Flight H. at Belmont Oct. 30 in her most recent start.

**Hip 1103, Pure Charm, 7, Storm Cat--Testy Trestle, by Private Account**

*Consigned by Denali Stud (Craig & Holly Bandoroff), agent for Bob & Beverly Lewis*

A \$925,000 FTKOCT yearling acquisition for Bob and Beverly Lewis in 1998, Pure Charm went unplaced on the track before being retired to the breeding shed. She produced a Thunder Gulch colt in 2003 and a Silver Charm filly last year, and is back in foal to Unbridled's Song on a Feb. 23 cover. From the family of GI Florida Derby runner-up Noble Causeway, Pure Charm is out of the game SW Testy Trestle (nine wins in 11 starts), herself a full to MGISW Classy Cathy and three other stakes winners.

**Hip 1203, Valid Acquisition, 4, Valid Expectations--American Flier, by Quiet American**

*Consigned by Elm Tree Farm LLC (Mr & Mrs Jody Huckabay), agent*

Catalogued as a broodmare prospect only, the four-year-old filly hit the board in half of her 14 career starts and hails from an active family. The bay is a half sister to Flying Glitter (Glitterman), the GII Monmouth Breeders' Cup Oaks winner who has since tacked on a victory in the GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks and a runner-up finish in the GII Lexus Raven Run S. at Keeneland. She now has updated earnings of \$546,111.

**Hip 1205, Vevina, 4, Rahy--Lovely Keri, by Eastern Echo**

*Consigned by Indian Creek (David C Parrish), agent*

A two-time winner from four career starts, this four-year-old filly was produced by a daughter of Imagining, making Vevina a three-parts relative to Serena's Song. The \$500,000 KEESEP yearling is carrying a foal by Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat), and the resultant offspring will be bred similarly to G1SW Sophisticat and GSW Grand Reward.

**STARCRAFT TO CHEVELEY PARK** Starcraft (NZ) (Soviet Star--Flying Floozie {NZ}, by Pompeii Court), who is scheduled to shuttle to Arrowfield Stud in New South Wales, Australia for the Southern Hemisphere season, will take up Northern Hemisphere stud duties at Cheveley Park Stud in Newmarket next season, it was announced yesterday.

The five-year-old's fee has been set at £10,000, Oct. 1 terms. "We are truly delighted that we will be standing such a tough and genuine international champion miler as Starcraft with us at Cheveley Park Stud, a horse who possessed such an impressive turn of foot," said Cheveley Park Stud Managing Director Chris Richardson. "Starcraft, defeated the best in both hemispheres and I am sure he will be well received and supported by European breeders." The G1 Australian Derby hero became famous in the Northern Hemisphere this season when winning the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Newmarket. Successful at the top level from seven furlongs to a mile and a half in Australia last year while taking the Partsworld S. at Hastings, the Chipping Norton S. at Warwick and the Australian Derby at Randwick, the five-year-old ran third on his European bow for Luca Cumani in the June 14 G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot at York before disappointing when down the field in the July 2 G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown. Diagnosed with a pelvic injury, he rebounded to collect the Prix du Moulin Sept. 4 before besting Dubawi (Ire) in the QEII at Newmarket 20 days later. Supplemented at a cost of \$800,000 for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont on his final start Oct. 29, he failed to transfer his formidable turf form and finished seventh. He retires as the winner of 11 of his 22 starts with total earnings of £1,288,061.

**BC HERO FRAISE DIES** Fraise (Strawberry Road {Fr}--Zalataia {Fr}, by Dictus {Fr}), hero of the 1992 GI Breeders' Cup Turf at Gulfstream Park, died Nov. 6 of a ruptured abdominal blood vessel, according to published reports. The 17-year-old had returned to Kentucky's Old Friends this summer after standing stud in Japan. He will be cremated and buried in the farm's cemetery. Racing in the colors of Madeleine Paulson, Fraise began his career for trainer Dick Lundy before transferring to Bill Mott. He won 10 of 34 career starts, including the GI Hollywood Turf Cup in 1993 and the GI Sword Dancer H. in 1992, and defeated champion Sky Classic in the Breeders' Cup Turf. The Paulson homebred set two course records for 12 furlongs on grass in 1992: going in 2:25 4/5 at Saratoga, and in 2:24 in the Breeders' Cup at Gulfstream. He retired with over \$2.6 million in earnings. Fraise, who sired just one stakes winner at stud in Japan, was gelded and sent to the Olympic Riding School. Old Friends purchased him for \$10,000 earlier this year, and Madeleine Pickens donated \$65,000 to arrange for his and former U.S. standout Ogygian's return to the U.S. Old Friends will have a tribute to Fraise at their Midway, Kentucky farm Nov. 25.

Darrell Haire, one of the more recognizable faces of the Jockeys' Guild as a national member representative who often appears at industry meetings on behalf of riders, on Nov. 9 called for the immediate resignation of Guild president Dr. Wayne Gertmenian. Meanwhile, the Guild board of directors has given treasurer Jeff Johnston authority to impose financial controls to monitor finances. With the exception of payments to disabled riders, no check can be drawn on Guild bank accounts in excess of \$200 without Johnston's approval, and Guild credit cards can't be used until further notice, according to a Nov. 8 letter to Gertmenian and Guild staff. Gertmenian and his company, Matrix Capital Associates, is under fire from Guild members in the wake of an Oct. 18 Congressional subcommittee hearing on jockey health and welfare issues. Lawmakers took Gertmenian and his management of the Guild to task, and since then, some members of the Guild senate have called for management changes. Eleven members of the 27-member senate scheduled a meeting Nov. 15 to discuss the situation.

### Silver Train to Target Met Mile:

Breeders' Cup Sprint champ **Silver Train** (Old Trieste) will be given the rest of the year off and will target the GI Met Mile Memorial Day at Belmont Park, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "If he wins one race next year and it's the Met Mile, that would make everybody happy," trainer Rick Dutrow, Jr. told the publication. "That's all were interested in. I see him as being a Belmont specialist and I want to have him ready for a couple of big races at Belmont." Dutrow added that the GII Tom Fool S. and the GI Vosburgh S. are other targets for the Buckram Oak colorbearer. Silver Train will be shipped to Palm Meadows Training Center in South Florida later this week.

### Cigar Mile Field Taking Shape:

Even without three-year-old superstar **Afleet Alex** (Northern Afleet), the GI Cigar Mile Nov. 26 is still shaping up to be a solid race. Trainer Bobby Frankel is pointing **Badge of Silver** (Silver Deputy) and **Mass Media** (Touch Gold) for the race, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Badge of Silver, last year's second-place finisher, has been off since placing sixth in the GI Stephen Foster H. in June, but worked six furlongs at Belmont Monday in 1:13.14. "Everything's 100 percent right now," Frankel told the *Form*. "We got two works for him." Mass Media, who will begin his career at stud at Hill 'n' Dale Farm in 2006, turned in a five-furlong workout in :59.87 at Belmont Monday. The GI Forego H. victor looks to make amends for a sixth-place finish behind **Taste of Paradise** (Conquistador Cielo) in the GI Vosburgh S. last time Oct. 1. The GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up is also expected for the Cigar, a race that can boost his chances for champion sprinter honors. "I think I have an advantage, because my horse got good back East," trainer Gary Mandella told *DRF*. "Like it or not, there is an East Coast bias to the vote." Last year's winner **Lion Tamer** (Will's Way) and **Silver Wagon** (Wagon Limit) are also possible for New York's final Grade I of the season.

**Maryland Racing Commission Sets Deadline:**

Magna Entertainment Corp. has until Dec. 13 to work out an agreement with the Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and the Maryland Horse Breeders' Association, or the Maryland Racing Commission may step in with a proposal of its own. The two sides have been battling over the number of live racing dates to be held at the Magna-owned Laurel Park and Pimlico in 2006; whether the stable areas at the two tracks will be open during the summer months, when they do not offer live racing; and what horsemen will be expected to contribute to operating costs. The horsemen's groups have not contributed operating expenses since that contract expired in April of 2004; Magna has requested a new agreement, and wants the horsemen's contributions to be retroactive to the date that the original deal ended. The Racing Commission has demanded that this issue be solved by Dec. 1. "Hopefully we can behave like grown men and make a deal," Maryland Jockey Club Chief Operating Officer Lou Raffetto told *The Blood-Horse*. "If not, the commission will step in and make one for us."

**Ellis Park Starts Clean-up:**

The clean-up has started at Ellis Park. Structural engineers have certified that the track's clubhouse, main grandstand, Sky Theatre and the lower level of the jockeys' quarters are safe. The track's maintenance crew will now repair damage to the clubhouse roof, and replace doors and fencing that were damaged during the Nov. 6 tornado. The track is tentatively set to re-open for simulcasting on Wednesday, Nov. 16. "We are taking deliberate steps to make sure that the facility will be safe and secure for our patrons to return next week," said Ellis Park Vice President and General Manager Paul Kuerzi. "To hopefully be up and operating so soon after this amount of devastation is really a testament to the outpouring of support we've received and to all our employees who have worked so hard through all of this. Our reopening will be a big morale boost, not only to our staff, but to the whole community." During the first week after reopening, Ellis Park will be accepting donations for victims of the tornado and, for \$1, patrons will receive unlimited programs for the day's racing.

**Arkansas Voters OK Expanded Gaming at Oaklawn:**

The margin of victory was just 89 votes, but a bill that will allow Oaklawn Park to offer additional electronic games of skill was passed in Arkansas Tuesday. "We've had so many photo finishes here at the track, it's appropriate we won this one by a nose," Oaklawn General Manager Eric Jackson said during a press conference yesterday. It is projected that revenue from the added gaming could boost purses at the Hot Springs oval to \$400,000 a day. The Arkansas State Racing Commission is expected to issue a definition "electronic games of skill" in early January, but the term generally refers to video poker. The 2006 Oaklawn meet is scheduled to open Jan. 20.

**Magna Reports \$34.5 Million Third Quarter Loss:**

Magna Entertainment Corp, reported a loss of \$34.5 million during the third quarter of 2005. That figure was down from \$50.3 million during the third quarter of 2004, but overall losses for the first three quarters of the year were reported at \$65.5 million, up from '04 losses of \$54.6 million. "The third quarter has traditionally been our least profitable quarter, given the seasonality of our business, but we have been able to improve EBITDA [earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation, and amortization] and reduce our net loss compared to the third quarter of 2004," MEC Chief Executive Officer Thomas Hodgson said in a statement released yesterday. "These profit improvements reflect an improvement in both our continuing operations through cost reduction initiatives, as well as our discontinued operations where we realized a \$9.8 million gain on the sale of Maryland-Virginia Racing Circuit. Furthermore, we continue to execute on our recapitalization plan by selling non-strategic assets and reducing debt." MEC has announced that it will sell The Meadows harness track and its off-track betting facilities in Western Pennsylvania for \$225 million to Millennium Gaming and Oaktree Capital Management, but will continue to manage the racing operations. The sale will be finalized when the Pennsylvania Harness Racing Commission grants approval for a slots license for the track.

**Bluesthstandard Joins Millionaire's Row:**

Eight-year-old **Bluesthstandard** (American Standard) pushed his career earnings to \$1,014,218 after posting a three-length victory in the fifth race at Hollywood yesterday, a 1 1/16-mile test for \$40,000 claimers. Bred in Georgia, the gelding has won 17 of his 44 career starts, including victories in GII Potrero Grande BC H. and GIII Texas Mile in 2003 and the GII Palos Verdes H. in 2004. He was also second in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint and third in the GI Ancient Title BC H. in '03.
