TRAINER JOHNNY CAMPO DEAD

Trainer Johnny Campo Sr., who guided Buckland Farm's Pleasant Colony to victories in the 1981 Kentucky Derby and Preakness, died Monday after a prolonged illness. He was 67. Born in East Harlem and raised near Aqueduct, Campo quit high school to work at the track. After apprenticing with top trainers such as Sunny Jim Fitzsimmons, John Nerud and Lucien Laurin, he went out on his own in 1968 and, just five years later, conditioned the champion two-year-old, Protagonist, and champion two-year-old filly, Talking Picture, in the same season. Pleasant Colony joined the Campo barn after

finishing out of the money in the Florida Derby, and won two-thirds of the Triple Crown under his tutelage, but missed out on the sweep when third behind Summing in the Belmont S. Known as "The Fat Man" on the backstretch, Campo also handled stakes winners Cherokee Colony, Jackknife, Jim French, Island Sultan and Road Princess, but was forced to retire after suffering a stroke in the early '90s. Overall, he saddled 1,431 winners and earned \$25,766,390 in purses. He is survived by his wife, Peggy, and sons Johnny Jr. and Paul, who is the racing secretary for the New York Racing Association. Visitation will be held today and tomorrow at the Cassese Funeral Home in Ozone Park, New York, from 2-4 p.m. and 7-9 p.m. The funeral is scheduled for Friday at 10:15 a.m. at the Blessed Virgin Mary in Ozone Park.

WINSTAR OFFERING TOPS KEENELAND

Will He Shine (Silver Deputy), a three-year-old colt offered by WinStar Racing, agent, brought a final bid of \$290,000 from Saverio Pugliese to top Tuesday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale in Lexington. The chestnut was one of 13 horses in training that WinStar put through the ring yesterday; the consignment brought \$1,131,000.

ON "BOARD" FOR JAPAN CUP

Lord Derby's **Ouija Board** (GB) (Cape Cross {Ire}) will tackle the Nov. 27 G1 Japan Cup in Tokyo, connections announced yesterday. Last year's G1 English and Irish Oaks and GI Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Turf winner was reported in good shape after a runner-up finish in defense of her Breeders' Cup title at Belmont Oct. 29. "We're off to Japan," trainer Ed Dunlop said. "She's very well and did her last piece of work this morning. She's come out of the race fantastically well and, fingers crossed, she travels well." Dunlop was satisfied by the four-year-old's effort at Belmont. "I was as satisfied as you can be without winning considering the problems we had during the season," he continued. "The fractions were very slow and [jockey] Mr. [Jerry] Bailey did nothing wrong. From going over to coming back, she only lost eight kilos, so she took the whole experience very well and we're keeping her ticking over."

In addition to the equine awards, the annual Daily Telegraph Award of Merit will go to the person deemed to have done most for European racing and/or breeding either over his or her lifetime or in the last 12 months.

The "Stars" of the Show...


A half-brother to GISW Cuvee from the family of GISW Olympio and GSW Call Now, **Will He Shine**, [hip 3194](#), was second at Churchill Downs in May in his only start to date. WinStar also scored with three-year-old **Warrior Song** (Unbridled's Song), who brought \$280,000; and **At The Knees** (Anees), an unraced three-year-old colt who attracted a final bid of \$265,000. A winning half-brother to MGSW and sire Lasting Approval (With Approval), Warrior Song sold as [hip 3185](#) to California trainer Mike Machowsky, agent. At The Knees, [hip 3227](#), was purchased by Naveed Chowhan. The WinStar connections were not surprised by the success of the offering. "The goal was to raise \$1 million and we felt confident we could do it," WinStar Racing Manager Elliott Walden said. "We want to sell at every venue, offering weanlings and yearlings and now establishing a market for horses in training. You can sell good horses at any point in their career--horses come of age at different times. Now, with the money we raised, we will go back in, pay more stud fees and produce more horses to sell." Walden endorsed the plan of selling some of WinStar's racing stock because, when he was training, he knew how hard it was to find good horses for his stable. "I got the idea from when [Bob] 'Country' Roberts had his dispersal [at Keeneland November in 1999]," he explained. "I was trying to buy horses at the time, and I saw how well those horses sold. It's a good time to sell--we're at the end of the year, off the meets at Keeneland and Churchill and Belmont, and people are restructuring. By putting all of our horses on one day, a dark day, it allowed the trainers to come here and have the opportunity to see the horses and watch the videos. A lot of people want to buy horses privately, but we decided to offer them here and let the market set the price." He added, "The hard part was deciding which horses to sell so far ahead of time. We had to decide by Aug. 1, but it worked out very well. The horses raced well over the last couple of months and established their value."

WinStar President Doug Cauthen expects the sale of racing stock to become a yearly part of the Keeneland November catalogue. "We are hoping to create an annual offering of a good solid group of very nice horses that likely won't end up in our stallion barn," Cauthen said. "This is a good opportunity to present a product that people are really enthusiastic about--everybody is looking for a proven or made racehorse."

A Holiday Mood...

A 2005 colt from the first crop by MGSW **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan) out of Milagra (Maria's Mon) reached \$220,000 to top the weanlings Tuesday. Consigned by Eaton Sales, agent, the gray was purchased by Caswell/Massy. Sold as [hip 3030](#), he is out of a half to GISP Rhiana (Runaway Groom). The other six-figure weanling yesterday was [hip 3171](#), a Forest Camp colt from the Lakland LLC consignment that brought \$105,000. Out of Unbridled Dream (Unbridled's Song), the bay was purchased by Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock.

Full Brother to Tiznow Sells at Keeneland...

Tizbud (Cee's Tizzy), a full brother to Horse of the Year and two-time Breeders' Cup Classic winner Tiznow, brought a \$120,000 final bid from NW Management at yesterday's ninth session of Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, the six-year-old stallion prospect is also a full brother to multiple graded stakes winner and GISP Budroyale and GII Sorrento S. heroine Tizdubai. Unraced at two, Tizbud won once at three and came back the following season to take the California Cup Classic H. and finish third in the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. Sold as [Hip 3161](#), Tizbud entered stud in 2004 with \$230,266 in earnings and is currently represented by his first crop of weanlings. The top-priced mare of yesterday's session was [hip 3359](#), the eight-year-old **Golf Girl** (Kingmambo). Consigned by Stonereath Farms, Inc., as agent for Gary Player, the unraced bay mare was purchased for \$150,000 by Tom Biederman, agent. In foal to Malibu Moon, Golf Girl is the dam of stakes winner Stoneway (Storm Boot).

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner.

A proven top-class performer on the turf, King's Drama is also winner of the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. in the U.S. and the G3 Prix de la Jonchere in France, and has further Grade I credits with a second and a third in consecutive renewals of the GI Man o'War S.

No doubt, when King's Theatre retired to stud, it was expected, or at least hoped, that he would get horses of the caliber of King's Drama with some degree of frequency. By the all-conquering Sadler's Wells, he was half-brother to High Estate, a champion English two-year-old who subsequently sired G1 English Derby winner High-Rise.

King's Theatre lived up to his pedigree on the race track, too. At two, he won the last three of his four starts, stamping himself as a classic prospect with a win in the G1 Racing Post Trophy. King's Theatre opened his three-year-old career with a tally in the G3 Craven S., a trial for the G1 2000 Guineas, but despite going off as favorite, could do no better than 13th in the Classic itself. Better efforts followed, with King's Theatre finishing second to Erhaab in the G1 English Derby and second again, to the filly Balanchine, in the G1 Irish Derby. The improvement continued in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth S., where King's Theatre defeated his elders with a performance which earned him a ranking as England's leading middle-distance three-year-old of the year. He concluded his second season with a third to the five-year-olds Ezzoud and Muhtarram in the G1 Juddmonte International and an unplaced effort in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe.

King's Theatre's reputation rather peaked with his King George win and, although he remained in training at four and five, he never won again, although he did manage thirds in the G1 Sword Dancer Invitational H. and G1 Gran Premio di Milano.

While his final two seasons at the track may have somewhat tarnished his image, King's Theatre appeared to have all the tools for sire success, given his top-level pedigree and his Group 1 wins at two and three. Unfortunately, for the most part, that success has proved elusive, and King's Drama apart, King's Theatre has sired a total of eight black-type winners from his first six Northern Hemisphere crops, with the filly Red Rioja, who took the G3 Park S. in Ireland and the GIII Brown Bess H. in the U.S., being his only other group or graded winner, although he does also have Australian graded winners Royal Code and I Rock My World from a Southern Hemisphere crop. For the most recently completed breeding season, King's Theatre's advertising was drawing attention to his potential as a sire of hurdlers as well as runners on the flat.

It's likely that much of the credit for King's Drama's ability should go to his dam, Last Drama, who is also the dam of the Lycius horse Self Feeder, winner of the Steinlen H. and placed in several other good West Coast events, including a second in the G1 Charles Whittingham H. Last Drama was a daughter of Last Tycoon, a horse who showed brilliant speed in Europe, but stretched that speed to upset the G1 Breeders' Cup Mile.

Out of a mare by Mill Reef, Last Tycoon sired a number of animals who stayed better than himself, with Last Drama, twice black-type placed at 10 furlongs, being an example. Last Drama had a talented sister who also made her presence felt in the U.S., this being Tycoon's Drama, who captured the nine-furlong GIII Selima S. as a two-year-old. Tycoon's Drama has also gone on to a successful career as a broodmare, producing the French listed winners Tycoon's Dolce, Sharpest Image and Desert Drama.

Where Last Drama was a middle-distance runner sired by a sprinter/miler, King's Drama's granddam Drama was a sprinter sired by a middle-distance runner. A daughter of Sir Ivor, Drama scored the only victory of a brief career when winning the G3 Greenlands S. over six furlongs in Ireland.

Drama had a three-parts sister, Taylor Park (by Sir Ivor's sire, Sir Gaylord) who campaigned in the U.S. and won five times as a juvenile, with her most important win coming in the Pocahontas S. She's since become ancestress of numerous stakes winners, including the 2005 G2 Prix Robert-Papin heroine New Girlfriend and the prolific black-type scorer Private Lap.

In tail-female line this is a family which goes back to a half-sister to 1939 English 2000 Guineas and Derby winner Blue Peter, and which also produced G1 English Derby winning half-brothers Blakeney and Morston.

The branch which has hitherto had the most impact in the U.S. is that which comes through Moment of Truth II, a half-sister to King's Drama's fourth dam, Drury Nell. She produced five black-type winners, headed by the top-class sprinter Indulto and the outstanding Californian filly Convenience, and is also ancestress of Star of the Crop, Scatter Buy, Concept Win and Major Impact.

We mentioned at the beginning of the article that King's Drama owns an interesting pedigree pattern. The key to this is that King's Drama's sire Sadler's Wells is by Northern Dancer out of a mare by Bold Reason, and King's Drama's maternal grandsire Last Tycoon is by a son of Northern Dancer out of a mare by a son of Never Bend (a half-brother to Bold Reason).

Thus, King's Drama's grandsires are the products of rather similar crosses. King's Drama isn't an isolated instance of the pattern working. Entrepreneur, a son of Sadler's Wells who hasn't come up to expectations as a stallion, has sired G1 Irish Oaks heroine Vintage Tiple out of a Last Tycoon mare. She is one of only two Group 1 winners he has produced. In Australia, the highly successful young sire Encosta de Lago, who is by Sadler's Wells' brother Fairy King, has the brilliant Alinghi, who is out of a daughter of Monde Bleu, himself a son of Last Tycoon. A multiple Group 1 winner in Australia, Alinghi also captured the GIII Ballston Spa Breeders' Cup H. at Saratoga.

AT THE SALES WITH...

BILLIONS AND BILLIONS SERVED

At the rate Keeneland is going, we'll eventually have to stop calling them the world's auction supermarket, we'll have to start calling them McKeeneland. They're not quite up to 'billions and billions served,' but they're certainly headed in that direction. Through the end of November Book 4 on Monday, just the September and November sales this year have receipts thus far of \$658,742,300. That's with 5,453 sold, so by the time Book 6 finishes Friday, it should be near 6,500 horses averaging a little over \$100,000 each. As we were saying at the end of the yearling sales, they're not simply the world leader, they actually constitute about half of the major North American and European yearling and mixed sale market.

Sometime last Saturday, as November Book 3 was drawing to a close, the major 2005 North American and European yearling and mixed auction marketplaces passed the \$1-billion milestone for the third time, and at the earliest point of the calendar year ever. The \$1-billion mark was reached for the first time in 2000, then again last year, but in both cases the final figures were just over the \$1-billion mark. We only use three mixed sales--Fasig and Keeneland November and Tattersalls' December, to calculate our figures, in addition to the nine major yearling sales previously tallied.

There is certainly a case for including Goffs November and Deauville December mixed sales as well, but we have not done so in the past, so we will leave that for our winter research. For the purposes of this discussion, the relevant point is that last year's December sale grossed right at \$100 million; 2003 had seen the record gross of right at \$120 million.

All horses in the *TDN* are bred in North America, unless otherwise indicated

It is a very good bet that this year's final bellwether (with apologies to those sheep farmers who corrected me that what I called 'bellwether' is actually 'bellwether,' meaning you put the bell on the wether), NA/EU yearling and mixed sales--nine yearling and three mixed sales--will total over \$1.1 billion for the first time. The horse market has reached new heights.

One of the features of each year's November sales is the introduction of new sires to the market, and to see how they are rated by the buyers. These fall into two categories: sires whose first weanlings are selling; and sires whose first mares in foal are selling. The 2004 North American stallion retirements included five horses whose first mares in foal achieved high averages last November, and who would therefore be expected to lead this November's table of first-year weanling sires.

So it proved generally, though 2003 Belmont winner Empire Maker didn't actually hit the board: he had only four weanlings catalogued, of which three were out, and the other was bought back for \$425,000. Mineshaft, Horse Of The Year in 2003, had just two foals sell, but topped the averages, at \$255,000. Vindication, champion two-year-old colt of 2002, had seven average \$213,857. Aldebaran, champion sprinter of 2003, had four sell, for an average of \$195,000; and Sky Mesa, also unbeaten at two in Vindication's year, had six average \$163,750. The five sires were only represented by 21 weanlings selling in total, but their numbers do look reliable; by comparison, last year's top four of Johannesburg, Came Home, Orientate and Street Cry had many more sell, but they all averaged around the \$100,000 mark, far below the numbers for this year's top five.

At least sires whose first weanlings sell have actual foals which the market can judge; sires whose first mares sell in foal do not. The market here is only assessing the value of mares bred to them and, in fact, only the mares bred to them which are sent through the ring. So, of all the unreliable pointers we can come up with, first-year in-foal mare average is about the most unreliable.

For example, Pleasantly Perfect was an absolutely top-class racehorse, but it would be a brave analyst who would predict he will be the top first-year weanling sire of 2006 because Contrive, the dam of Folklore, sold in foal to him for \$3 million at Fasig-Tipton. As a consequence, through the end of Book 3, Pleasantly Perfect led the first-year covering sires list with an average of \$603,333 for six mares sold in foal-- \$3 million for Contrive, and \$620,000 for the other five combined. Speightstown, last year's champion sprinter, proved predictably popular, with 15 in-foal mares averaging \$415,667, and even outpointed last year's champion three-year-old colt, Smarty Jones, who had 16 in-foal mares average \$335,000. Belmont winner Birdstone covered the dam of Stevie Wonderboy, so he averaged \$298,250 for four sold (\$1.1 million for Heat Lightning, \$93,000 for the other three combined).

Other sires with six-figure (or near) averages, with 4+ sold, included: Strong Hope (11 mares in foal, averaged \$212,273); Medaglia d'Oro (23, \$141,435); Lion Heart (21, \$133,254); and Congaree (seven, \$98,857).

Finally, a thought about all the staggering figures, about the 9,183 horses already sold for the \$1,027,528,856 (approximately) in revenues already accrued at the major sales we've been covering. It's still a very tough game: expenses, especially stud fees, are high, and the auction market is so demanding now that many top consignors feel you can lead a perfectly good horse over to the ring and still get drubbed. It's a great game when you have the right horse, but in breeding and selling, just like in owning them and gambling on them, you've got to make your infrequent scores cover all the losers and then some. It's not so easy as it maybe looks and sounds, as anybody who has ever bred or sold a horse will tell you. That's why those Book 1 horses are so scary and, particularly for a breeder, Book 1 sires. You can forget about finding a bargain in Book 1, because the stud fees people have in them are so high. That's a consequence of the new big-book boom.

One effect of this is to highlight the value in middle-range sires. It's not even a matter of picking out particular ones; everybody, including me, does that, and I will do so again, in print, before long. But today's mission is simply to present what we hope is a pretty comprehensive list of stallions standing in Kentucky for 2006 at fees between \$15,000-\$35,000 (see p8). We thank Margaret Layton and Three Chimneys for the long, two-sided plastic cards they give out at the sales with all Kentucky sires then available included, and we've tried to check and add to make this list as complete as possible (apologies in advance for omissions, let us know and we will correct). If you can afford to gamble with those big-money, Book 1 sires, great; if not, here are some sires to consider for the rest of us.

Naskra) will enter stud in 2006 at Cardiff Stud Farms in Creston, California, according to *The Blood-Horse*. His stud fee will be \$5,000. "We're ecstatic to have him," farm owner Steve Sahadi told *The Blood-Horse*. "We've had great success bringing Breeders' Cup winners Skywalker

and Prized here to stand, and we expect Singletary to follow." The five-year-old's career highlight came in the 2004 GI Breeders' Cup Mile at Lone Star Park, where he defeated an international field for owner Little Red Feather Racing Stable. He also captured the GIII La Jolla H. at three and the GII San Francisco Breeders' Cup Mile as a four-year-old. In 2005, Singletary landed the GII Arcadia H. and the GII Oak Tree Breeders' Cup Mile, and was third in the GI Eddie Read H. He finished eighth in this year's Breeders' Cup Mile in his final start for trainer Don Chatlos Jr. "As California owners, we're really pumped up to have the opportunity to get Cal-breds by him," Little Red Feather's Billy Koch added. "We think he has great upside potential." The bay's record stands at 22-8-5-3 with earnings of \$1,754,312.

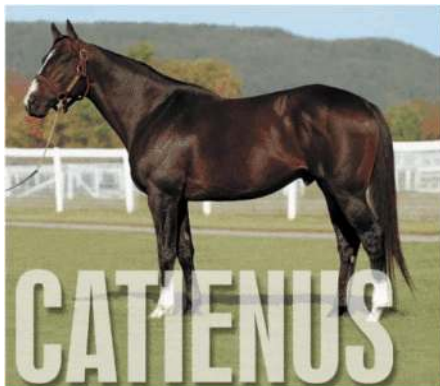

Plastered, who has earnings of \$1,548,340, raced three times during the Melbourne carnival, his best effort being a fifth in the G2 Turnbull S. "The vets are looking at him again today, but they say he's deteriorating and he won't be running in the carnival in Perth," trainer Lindsey Smith said. "If he has an operation to tie back the larynx, he'll have at least six months out, but if it's a bigger operation he won't race again for a year."
