HURRICANE RUN SHINES AT CARTIER

Michael Tabor's **Hurricane Run (Ire)** (Montjeu {Ire}) took home top honors at the 15th annual Cartier Awards, which were presented at London's Four Seasons Hotel in the West End last night. The G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe and G1 Irish Derby hero landed the three-year-old colt title as well as Horse of the Year. Trained by Andre Fabre for breeder Gestut Ammerland, the bay colt missed by a neck to Shamardal in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club in June. He was purchased privately by Tabor afterwards, but was leased back to his breeder for his run in the Irish Derby. Hurricane Run collected the G2 Prix Niel in September before defeating an outstanding field in the Arc at Longchamp Oct. 2. He is slated to remain in training as a four-year-old.

Ballydoyle Babies...

Trainer Aidan O'Brien, who had an enviable team of two-year-olds in 2005, swept the division with **George Washington (Ire)** (Danehill) topping stablemate Horatio Nelson (Ire) for the two-year-old colt title, while **Rumplestiltskin (Ire)** (Danehill) proved to be the best filly in her division. A 1.15-million guineas yearling purchase, George Washington earned his first pattern victory in the G2 Railway S. in June. The half brother to MG1SW Grandera (Ire) went on to take both the G1 Phoenix S. in August and the G1 National S. in September to cap his championship season. He races for the partnership of Sue Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith. Fellow Ballydoyle representative Rumplestiltskin was bred and owned by the Niarchos Family, Sue Magnier and Michael Tabor. The bay filly rebounded from a Royal Ascot defeat to capture the G2 Debutante S. at The Curragh in August. She went on to land the G1 Moyglare Stud S. in September before producing a strong finish in winning the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp Oct. 2 in her season finale.

Back for More...

A pair of 2004 award winners, **Divine Proportions** (Kingmambo) and **Westerner (GB)** (Danehill), earned more accolades. Divine Proportions was the top two-year-old filly of 2004 after an unbeaten season. The Niarchos Family homebred picked up where she left off with a pair of Classic victories in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches in May and the G1 Prix de Diane in June, then defeated her elders in the G1 Prix d'Astarte in July. She lost her perfect record when fourth in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois in August, but sustained a tendon injury and was subsequently retired. She will be bred to Giant's Causeway. Last year's top stayer **Westerner** added to his laurels this season, capturing the G1 Ascot Gold Cup as well as finishing second in the Arc.

Consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent, the dark bay, in foal to Mizzen Mast on a May 25 cover, was purchased by Winchell Thoroughbreds LLC, owned by Joan Winchell and her son Ron. The stable, which was started by Joan's late husband, Verne Winchell, has raced top horses such as Cuvee, Tapit and this year's GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Summerly. Summer Scene sold as [hip 3582](#). The top-selling weanling yesterday was [hip 3709](#), a filly by D'Wildcat out of Enchanted Spell (Devil's Bag). A half-sister to stakes winner Galadriel (Ascot Knight), the Canadian-bred bay was consigned by Elm Tree Farm LLC, Agent III and purchased by BCB Farms.

BLACKDOWN RETIRED MGSW **Blackdown (Fr)** (Verglas {Ire}--Rade {Fr}, by Kaldoun {Fr}), unraced since finishing ninth as the 9-5 favorite in the GI Hollywood Derby last November, has been retired, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The four-year-old, owned by Marsha Naify and Woodside Farms and trained by Julio Canani, was a stakes winner and Group 3 placed while racing in France. Imported to the U.S. last summer, he won his first three stateside starts, taking the Ocean-side S., GII La Jolla H. and GII Del Mar Derby in the space of seven weeks. Blackdown was seventh in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile before ending his career in the Hollywood Derby. He retires with a record of 16-6-4-2 and earnings of \$477,641.

APPRENTICE DIES AT BEULAH PARK Sixteen-year-old apprentice jockey Josh Radosevich, who began riding races just last month, was killed in a spill at Beulah Park yesterday. Radosevich was on the lead in the third race when his mount, Nyoka, broke down and one of the trailing horses apparently stepped on him. The third generation horseman was transported to Grant Medical Center in Columbus, Ohio, where he was pronounced dead. "I have known Josh since he was two, and this is the happiest I had ever seen him," his former agent, Paul Heizer, told *The Blood-Horse*. "He was really coming into himself. There is just not words to describe how bad I feel." Radosevich had ridden 19 winners at Beulah and Mountaineer Park since taking out his license and was 10th in the Beulah standings. Nyoka was euthanized on the track. The last 10 races on the card were cancelled.

HIGH YIELD TO HILL 'N' DALE Sophomore sire **High Yield** (Storm Cat--Scoop the Gold, by Forty Niner) will relocate to Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington for 2006. The eight-year-old, a three-time Grade I winner that earned \$1,170,196, went to stud at Coolmore in 2001. From two crops to race, he has had 55 winners, including MSW Amazing Buy. He will stand his first season at Hill 'n' Dale for \$7,500 live foal. "We believe that High Yield will offer breeders a lot of quality at \$7,500 and are delighted to be standing him for the 2006 Breeding Season," said Hill 'n' Dale President John Sikura.

JOCKEYS BOOT GERTMENIAN; HAIRE TEMPORARILY IN CHARGE

Jockeys took back the reins of the Jockeys' Guild Tuesday when they voted to remove Guild president Dr. Wayne Gertmenian from his post, terminate the Guild's relationship with Gertmenian's consulting firm, Matrix Capital Associates, and appoint Guild national member representative Darrell Haire as temporary national manager of the organization. The overhaul, which includes the termination of vice president Albert Fiss and Lloyd Ownbey as the Guild's general counsel, comes nearly a month after a Congressional subcommittee hearing at which Gertmenian's management of the Guild was severely scrutinized and lawmakers labeled him a "disgrace." It came less than a week after more than 200 jockeys at 12 racetracks signed petitions calling for the removal of the Guild's chief executive, and Haire, a one-time staunch supporter of Gertmenian, issued a statement calling for his resignation. Eleven Guild senate members called for Tuesday's emergency meeting to consider the removal of the organization's current board of directors, elect a new board, and oust Gertmenian, in light of testimony given in the Oct. 18 hearing held by the House Energy and Commerce Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations in Washington, D.C. EVIL MINISTER TO MARGAUX FARM Three-year-old **Evil Minister** (Deputy Minister--Evil's Pic, by Piccolino) has been retired and will stand the 2006 breeding season at Margaux Farm in Midway, Kentucky. His stud fee has been set at \$5,000 live foal. A \$500,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling, the chestnut colt won his first two starts, including the Gill Sapling S. at Monmouth Park, and was third in the Gill Futurity at Belmont Park for owner Namcook Stables, LLC and trainer Erik Juvonen. He heads to the breeding shed with a record of 11-2-0-2 and earnings of \$126,000.

HILL 'N' DALE TO SPONSOR CIGAR MILE Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington has signed on as the sponsor for the GI Cigar Mile H., it was announced yesterday. The 17th edition of the \$350,000 event, once known as the NYRA Mile, will be run Saturday, Nov. 26. Hill 'n' Dale stands the 2000 Cigar Mile winner, successful freshman sire El Corredor. "Hill 'n' Dale is proud to be associated with such an important race as the Cigar Mile," said President John Sikura. "Great milers make great sires and past participants such as El Corredor and Distorted Humor are proving to be the next generation of important sires."

Schwartz Resigns from NYRA Board:

Barry K. Schwartz, the former chairman of the New York Racing Association, has resigned from the NYRA Board of Directors, according to *Daily Racing Form*. Schwartz had been on the NYRA Board for 11 years. He was the chairman from 2000 until 2004, when he stepped down. Charles Hayward assumed that position following Schwartz. "My views on racing in New York are very different from the views of the current management," the 63-year-old Schwartz told *DRF*. Schwartz indicated that he wished to focus more on his own breeding and racing operation, Stonewall Farm.

Monmouth, Meadowlands Announce 2006 Dates:

Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands have announced that they will run a combined 280 racing dates in 2006. The New Jersey Racing Commission approved the request of the two tracks at its monthly meeting Nov. 15 in Trenton. The Meadowlands will open the first of its two harness meets Jan. 4; that 160-day meet will run through Aug. 5, when the Hambletonian will be held. Monmouth will kick off its 2006 season May 13 and will continue racing through Sept. 24. Thoroughbreds will then run at the Meadowlands from Sept. 29 through Nov. 11. A harness meeting will follow at that track Nov. 17-Dec. 30. There will be no racing on Easter (Apr. 16) and Thanksgiving (Nov. 23).

Purse Increase for Fair Grounds at LA Downs:

Fair Grounds Race Course has announced a \$500,000 purse increase for its 134th racing season, which will begin Saturday at Harrah's Louisiana Downs. Fair Grounds was unable to host live racing as a result of flooding following Hurricane Katrina. Overnight purses will increase by \$1,000 per race. Four of the track's major stakes races--the GIII Risen Star S., the GIII Silverbulletday S., the GIII Bayou Breeders' Cup H. and the Duncan F. Keener Breeders' Cup H.--will see their purses increased from \$200,000 to \$250,000 each. Daily purses will total approximately \$315,000, the largest ever for a meeting held in Louisiana. Cancellations in Ohio, Illinois:

Three tracks were forced to call off racing after completing only part of their Wednesday cards. Hawthorne Park cancelled after the third due to wintry weather in the Chicago area. Both Ohio tracks, Beulah and Thistle-down, also ended early, with Beulah shutting it down after apprentice jockey Josh Radosevich was killed in the third race and Thistle-down cancelling after the fifth.

Election Results for the Kentucky Farm Managers:

The Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers' Club have announced the results of their election, held Tuesday. Adena Springs' Steven Nicholson has been named president of the organization. The other officers are: Davant Latham of Darby Dan, vice president; Analisa Wagoner of Bluewater Sales, secretary; Clifford Barry of Pin Oak Stud, treasurer; and Helen Walsh, sergeant-at-arms. Elected to second terms as directors are Barry Robinette of Glennwood Farm; Bayne Welker Jr. of Mill Ridge Farm; and Dr. Naoya Yoshida, DVM, of Winchester Farm. New directors joining the board are John Mulholland of Mulholland Springs; David Mullins of Doning; and Joe Seitz of Brookdale Farm.

Management Changes at Vinery:

Effective Jan. 1, 2006, Bates Newton will step down as general manager of Vinery, a position he has held since Dr. Tom Simon purchased the farm in September of 1999. Managing duties will then be split between Ben McElroy, Tom Ludt and Ken Wilkins, who will become director of stallion operations. "I was hired initially for one breeding season when Dr. Simon purchased the farm, and I ended up being here for six years," said Newton. "Dr. Simon is keen to give the next generation the opportunity to move up and take responsibility. This includes his daughter, Steffi Simon, who is becoming more and more involved." Newton will remain involved in the farm as a director and advisor.

KEEP Adopts Slogan for Expanded Gaming Campaign:

The Kentucky Equine Education Project, which is campaigning for expanded gaming in the state, has adopted the slogan "Keep It In Kentucky" to help get the message out. "Each year, some 566,000 Kentuckians travel out of state to riverboats and casinos," said Jim Navolio, executive director of KEEP. "When they do, those states collect tax revenues to spend on education, local development, healthcare services and so on. Last year alone, Indiana and Illinois gained \$236 million in tax revenues from Kentuckians. This is money that should stay in Kentucky." Under the KEEP proposal, all 120 Kentucky counties would share in the revenues, but the casinos would be built in limited areas. "Our plan calls for legislators to allow a constitutional amendment vote for casino gaming in Kentucky," said Navolio. "From the monies collected, dedicated revenues would go to education, healthcare, local government, economic development, fish and wildlife, the environment, agricultural research, and for addiction treatment. Under this plan, it is estimated that casino gaming revenues could generate up to \$437 million annually in tax revenues for the state." He added, "Our polling data tells us that people are supportive of this issue, but only if they are guaranteed of where the money will go." The plan should be finalized next month and presented to state legislators prior to the beginning of the 2006 session in January.
