SADLER'S WELLS COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS

Tattersalls' marathon December Sale kicked off yesterday in Newmarket, England, with a single session of yearlings that produced records for turnover and average and a median that equaled the sale's best ever. A

260,000gns Sadler's Wells colt, the first foal out of G3 Princess Royal S. winner Love Everlasting (GB) (Pursuit of Love {GB}), topped the Yearling Sale when Charlie Gordon-Watson outlasted agent Luke Lillingston. "He's for an established client to be trained in Ireland," explained Gordon-Watson. "The mare was

very tough and, while this yearling will need a bit of time, he's got a lot going for him." The colt was bred by Gary and Lesley Middlebrook and consigned by Airlie Stud. An Usk Valley Stud-bred and consigned Fantastic Light colt out of Group 2-placed Croeso Cariad (GB) (Most Welcome {GB}) looks set to race for Godolphin next year after selling for 210,000gns to John Ferguson. "I saw him during the summer at the farm and really liked him then, but he injured himself in the paddock and couldn't come here in October," Ferguson said. "I've been looking forward to seeing him today. I'll speak to the boss [Sheikh Mohammed] to decide where he'll go, but there'd be a good chance he'll go to Godolphin."

David McGreavy was the underbidder on the colt. In all, the average jumped to a record 25,836gns, a 29-percent rise from last year's 20,086gns. The median's four-percent increase, from 13,500gns to 14,000gns, equaled a sale record, while the overall turnover soared 53 percent to 4,314,600gns, easily a new mark. Eight yearlings sold for 100,000gns or more, compared with two at last year's sale. The December Sales resume tomorrow with the first of four foal sessions, followed by four sessions of mares. Fusaichi Richard, from the first crop of Japanese
champion Kurofune (French Deputy), treated fans at
Tokyo Racecourse to a spectacular performance here,
winning gate-to-wire in track-record time. The gray
finished fourth in his unveiling Sept. 11, but has been
unbeatable since. He won a novice race two weeks
after his debut, captured the Oct. 29 Hagi S. last time
out and was slightly favored over On Fire to keep the
streak going. Sent to the fore under Yuichi Fukunaga,
Fusaichi Richard made every pole a winning one and
lowered the course record to 1:46.90 for the 1800
meters. "I had some chances to ride his mother,
Fusaichi Airedale, before, and I'm very happy to win
with her son, as well," said Fukunaga. "He raced bril-
liantly and answered quickly when I asked him for run.

Nearly four years ago, when Brereton C. Jones an-
nounced the purchase of Forest Camp for stallion du-
ties, the Airdrie Stud supreme had the following to say:

"I've been a big fan of this horse since he annihilated
a top field in the GII Del Mar Futurity. He won by 5 1/2
pulling away. It was an extremely brilliant race. He beat
Dixie Union, Captain Steve, Anees, Commendable. He
beat them all."

Jones also had this to say about the son of Deputy
Minister:

"This is no secret--the racehorses that are the brilliant
two-year-olds by the right sires have the right sire suc-
cess. He was a top two-year-old and Deputy Minister is
a sire of sires."

The former Governor of Kentucky clearly had no prob-
lems in persuading breeders to share his enthusiasm for
Forest Camp. Although the horse didn't arrive at Airdrie
until the last day of 2001, by which time plans for many
mares had already been finalised, 127 mares were soon
heading in Forest Camp's direction.

Forest Camp's fee had been set at only \$10,000 and
he proved excellent value at that figure. Eighteen
first-crop weanlings averaged \$67,417 and then 39
yearlings achieved an average of just under \$90,000,
with a high of \$450,000. The demand for his stock
continued at the two-year-old sales, with the highest
price the \$250,000 paid by Shawn Dugan on behalf of
Anthony Speelman for a colt out of Shes Got The Look.

That colt, Your Tent Or Mine, provided Forest Camp with his first major victory as a sire three days ago, when he quickened impressively between horses to take the Gill Hollywood Prevue S. by two and a half lengths. Another of Forest Camp's sons, The Pharaoh--who had previously chased home Stevie Wonderboy in the Del Mar Futurity--filled third place to turn the Prevue into something of a milestone for the Airdrie stallion.

The GI Hollywood Futurity is the likely next step for Your Tent Or Mine, now unbeaten in two starts. As that Grade I event carried a first-prize last year of over \$250,000, it could have a sizeable impact on the year-end first-crop sire standings. Forest Camp, though, looks to have too much ground to make up on the current leaders Tiznow (sire of the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Filly winner Folklore) and El Corredor (sire of the GI Frizette winner Adieu). Songandaprayer is by no means out of it, either, even though his strong team of stakes horses was severely depleted by the death of his best son What A Song.

Forest Camp notched his 13th winner from 26 starters when his daughter Yachats won a maiden at Aqueduct two days ago, with that win increasing his earnings to \$717,172. This filly's victory was yet another for a first-time starter by this hot young stallion.

Forest Camp's fee is beginning to climb, having risen first to \$15,000 in 2004 and now to \$20,000 for next year. It is going to be interesting to see how he fares in the long term. Robert and Beverly Lewis obviously have no doubts about his potential, as they happily paid \$1,000,000 for one of his yearling sons at Keeneland in September.

By my reckoning, Forest Camp is no less than the 18th son of Deputy Minister to sire a graded-stakes winner in North America and he will soon be bidding to become the 10th to sire a Group 1 winner, following Awesome Again, the soon-to-be repatriated Dehere, Deputy Commander, French Deputy, Salt Lake, Service Stripe, Silver Deputy, Touch Gold and Victory Speech. Looks like Jones was right to describe Deputy Minister as a sire of sires!

Deputy Minister was champion sire on two occasions in North America, where he has also been champion sire of broodmares, so he has left a rich legacy. Fortunately this legacy looks likely to prove long-lasting, now that his team of Grade I-winning grandsons available to breeders include Ghostzapper, Toccet, Ten Most Wanted, Midas Eyes and Mass Media.

The aspect of Forest Camp's story which interests me most is that he shares the same broodmare sire--Hold Your Peace--as French Deputy, with Forest Camp being out of the stakes-winning La Paz, while French Deputy's dam was the Grade I-winning Mitterand. Incidentally, Forest Camp's son The Pharaoh is inbred 3x3 to Hold Your Peace.

Hold Your Peace packed 39 races into his three years on the track and this durability extended to his daughters, with Mitterand and La Paz making 17 and 26 appearances, respectively. However, French Deputy and Forest Camp weren't as hard-wearing, as French Deputy managed only six starts in two seasons and Forest Camp never had more than four starts in any of his three years in training, racing a total of 11 times.

Speed was the main asset of both of these sons of Deputy Minister and the Airdrie team must be hoping that the similarities between Forest Camp and French Deputy continue to grow (but not in every respect).

You may remember that French Deputy was sold in December 2000 to the Shadai Corporation in Japan, his sale coming after he had been represented by only a pair of Grade III winners--one in England and one in the U.S.--from his first two crops. He had had only one minor stakes winner among his first runners in 1999.

The situation looked very different only a year after French Deputy's sale. When the International Classifications for the 2001 season were published, he was represented by the outstanding Japanese colt Kurofune (125), Left Bank (120), the Japanese-trained Grass Eiko O (111) and Queue (110).

Leaving aside his top Japanese runners, which also included the smart Nobo Jack, French Deputy's contribution to American breeding amounted to 11 graded winners, from five crops containing just over 300 foals. They included three Grade I winners and another three at Grade II level. It was a great shame that his best American son, Left Bank, succumbed to colic after his stunning victory over Street Cry and Lido Palace in the 2002 GI Whitney H. French Deputy's male line may well live on, though, as Kurofune eventually joined him at Shadai. *(Kurofune's son wins Japanese Group 3 p2)*

Forest Camp will do well to match his close relative's achievements, but he has a bright prospect in Your Tent Or Mine. The Prevue winner is out of Shes Got The Look, a stakes-placed mare by Mr. Prospector's non-winning son Prospector's Music. As Shes Got The Look was conceived at a fee of \$2,500, you could jump to the conclusion that this is a moderate family. However, the next three mares in Your Tent Or Mine's female line are daughters of Private Account, Spectacular Bid and Tom Rolfe, so his bloodlines carry the Claiborne hallmark.

BIRZER SUES GUILD, FORMER OFFICERS

Injured jockey Gary Birzer has filed a \$10-million lawsuit against the Jockeys' Guild and two former officers stemming from his accident at Mountaineer Race Track in 2004, according to the *Los Angeles Times*. Named as defendants in the suit, filed in U.S. District court in Los Angeles, are former guild president L. Wayne Gertmenian and former guild vice president Albert Fiss. Gertmenian and Fiss were removed from their posts with the guild by the organization's board of directors last Tuesday. According to the *Times*, Birzer thought he was insured for \$1 million by the guild when he was paralyzed from the waist down in the spill. However, Birzer later learned that the guild had allowed the insurance policy to lapse 3 1/2 months before his accident and he was not informed he was not insured, the newspaper reported. The lawsuit alleges fraud and breach of fiduciary duty on the part of the defendants, the *Times* reported. The newspaper said Gertmenian did not respond to a phone message seeking comment on the lawsuit and Darrell Haire, the interim guild president, declined comment.

JOCKEY CLUB DISPUTES VELAZQUEZ RECORD

Reports that John Velazquez established a new single-season record Sunday for a North American jockey were being disputed yesterday by The Jockey Club and its record-keeping subsidiary, Equibase. After Velazquez finished third aboard India in Sunday's GIII Valley Stream S. at Aqueduct, it was widely reported that the \$10,792 he earned with the mount had increased his yearly total to \$23,356,456 in earnings. That would have broken the established record of \$23,354,960 set by Jerry Bailey in 2003. According to The Jockey Club spokesman Bob Curran Jr.,

Equibase, the official record-keeping body for the sport, does not include foreign races when compiling total wins or purse earnings for a North American jockey. Velazquez's reported record earnings include the \$3.6 million he earned for winning the \$6-million G1 Dubai World Cup aboard Roses in May. After subtracting those earnings from his total, Velazquez's 2005 figure is just \$19,756,456. In 2003, Bailey did not earn any money in foreign races. Curran said reporters were relying on figures provided by the Thoroughbred Racing Associations (TRA). "The numbers that you read about over the weekend were put out by the TRA," Curran said. "Equibase keeps records for North American racing only. The record that Bailey set did not include anything from Dubai or any place else. That makes this an apples-and-oranges situation." Ironically, Bailey said he believes Velazquez should be credited with the record. "[Velazquez] earned it," he said. "And he went a long way to earn it. Yes, I believe overseas earnings and wins should count."

Freefourinternet to Signature Stallions:

MGSW Freefourinternet (Tabasco Cat--Dixie Chimes, by Dixieland Band) has been retired and will head to Signature Stallions in Ocala, Florida to stand the 2006 breeding season. Twice a Listed stakes winner in England, the seven-year-old came to the U.S. in 2002. He captured the 2003 GII Kelso BC H. and bested Perfect Drift in the 2004 GII Hawthorne Gold Cup H. while carrying the colors of Equirace.com. Overall, the bay compiled a record of 44-8-5-6 and earned \$1,105,478. He will stand for a fee of \$4,000 live foal.

Congressionalhonor to Maui Meadow Farm:

Congressionalhonor (Forestry--Quiet Dance, by Quiet American), a half brother to likely Horse of the Year Saint Liam, will stand his first season at Maui Meadow Farm in West Chester, Pennsylvania. Bred by Edward Evans, the four-year-old won last year's GIII Bay Meadows Derby. Purchased for stud duty by Pewter Stable, the gray is being syndicated for \$15,000 per share, which includes a bonus season in 2006. "We were looking for just the right horse to enter the stallion market with," managing partner Greg Demasi commented. "He's by a superior son of Storm Cat out of a young graded-stakes mare and he's half brother to the pro tem U.S. Horse of the Year. There's nothing but upside potential here." On the board in nine of 15 starts, Congressionalhonor won twice and earned \$112,413. He will stand for \$3,500, live foal, with special consideration to mares foaling in Pennsylvania.

MTHA Announces '05 Award Winners:

The Maryland Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association announced its 2005 award winners yesterday. Audrey and Allen Murray were named outstanding owners, Michael Trombetta was top trainer and Ellis Pruce was honored with a special lifetime award. In addition, the MTHA honored three outstanding backstretch employees: Jessica Etter, Ramon Rodriguez and Tom Brightbill. Presentation of the awards will take place at the group's annual Christmas Party Nov. 28 at Laurel Park.

Private Vow Sizzles in KJC Work:

GI Belmont Futurity winner **Private Vow** (Broken Vow) turned in an impressive bullet work at Churchill yesterday in preparation for Saturday's GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. The juvenile colt covered four furlongs in :46.60, easily the fastest of 67 at the distance. The next fastest half-mile drill was the :47.80 turned in by GII Clark H. hopeful **Alumni Hall** (A.P. Indy). "He's an awesome horse," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "He's still the horse that won the Belmont Futurity, which, last time I checked, was a pretty good race." Private Vow has not started since finishing last after his rein broke on the turn in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. "I feel horrible for the horse more than anything over the Breeders' Cup," Asmussen said. "There are no [do]-overs in horse racing. It's weird, because you always get a feeling in the paddock about how you stack up and I thought he looked the best." Also working yesterday in preparation for the Kentucky Jockey Club, recent Churchill maiden winner **Carse** (Wekiva Springs) went a half-mile in :48.80 for trainer Dale Romans.
