ANOTHER WIN FOR THE HOME TEAM?

They have kept the trophy at home six times in the last seven years, but the home team will be up against in this year's edition of the G1 Japan Cup. A third of the 18-horse field set to line up at Tokyo Race Course

this afternoon have flown in from overseas to take on the local runners, and it is a strong foreign contingent. Five of six have won Group 1 or Grade I races this year, and the sixth is none other than superstar **Ouija Board (GB)** (Cape Cross {Ire}),

who comes off a second-place finish in the Oct. 29 GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. Trainer Ed Dunlop reports that she exited that race in fine fettle. "Amazingly, she still has her summer coat and her condition appears to be the equal of what it was when she went to New York for the Filly and Mare Turf," Dunlop told *Racing Post*. The four-year-old filly was unable to catch the speedy Intercontinental (GB) going a mile and a quarter at Belmont, but Dunlop is optimistic about her chances today.

"What that race told me is, nowadays, she really does need a mile and a half, and so we have to be hopeful as she always travels well off a strong pace, looks to be in the right position in the gate and has a great turn of foot," he said. Representing the U.S. are **Better Talk Now** (Talkin Man), who annexed the GI United Nations H. and GI Man o'War S. this term, but failed to fire in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf, finishing seventh; and **King's Drama (Ire)** (King's Theatre {Ire}), winner of the Aug. 13 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. and Nov. 12 GI Red Smith H. and runner-up by a neck in the Man o'War. The Japanese send out defending champ **Zenno Rob Roy (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence). The five-year-old followed his Japan Cup score with a victory in the Dec. 26 Arima Kinen, then disappeared for six months. Third in the June 26 G1 Tarakazuka Kinen, he shipped to Britain for his second start of the season and was second by a neck in the Aug. 16 G1 Juddmonte International S. The dark bay was second, beaten a head by **Heavenly Romance (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence), in the Oct. 30 Tenno Sho. Japan Cup field, p5

LIGHT IT UP

A rare outsider from the Todd Pletcher barn, **Purge** (Pulpit) was sent off at 25-1 in the GI Hill 'n' Dale Cigar Mile H. at Aqueduct yesterday, but lit up the tote board as he beat **Mass Media** (Touch Gold) by 3 3/4 lengths. It was the first stakes win for the four-year-old since he captured the GI Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga in 2004. "Last year...I felt he could be as good as any older horse in the country," Pletcher said. "Things just didn't gel early this year." Purge finished off the board in his first two tries this term, then disappeared for nearly five months. He returned to post a 12-length triumph in an optional claimer at Monmouth Park Aug. 7, but had to settle for third as the 6-5 chalk in the GIII Philip H. Iselin H. three weeks later and filled the show spot once again in his latest, the Oct. 7 GIII Meadowlands Cup.

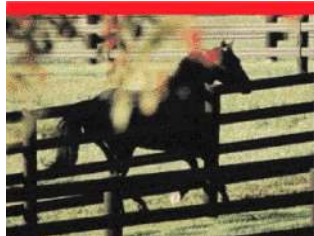

Purge was with the pace early before tiring in the final drive in the nine-furlong Meadowlands Cup. Dropping back to a mile yesterday, he found himself at the back of the pack as stablemate Value Plus (Unbridled's Song) led through a half in :45.08. He moved closer as the fellow Pletcher trainee dashed off six panels in 1:09.11 and came flying down the lane to win going away. "He went into overdrive," jockey Garrett Gomez said. "He acted like he had been doing that all his life." Purge capped off his career on a high note and now heads to Vinery Stud in Kentucky. Runner-up Mass Media was also making his final start, and will begin his stud career at Hill 'n' Dale Farm in Lexington. Badge of Silver, making his first appearance since finishing sixth in the June 18 GI Stephen Foster H., pressed the pace before tiring to be eighth. "At no time did my horse have any run," jockey Jerry Bailey said.

Bluegrass Cat might yet be undefeated if he hadn't had such a rough trip in his debut. The bay was bumped at the start and had to be steadied in his career opener at Churchill Downs June 4, finishing eighth. He went to the shelf after that effort, but came back to break his maiden by 6 1/2 lengths at Belmont Park Sept. 24 and made it two in a row with a 1 1/4-length tally in the Oct. 28 GIII Nashua S. Odds-on the add to his winning streak in his first try at two turns, the WinStar homebred went right to the front under jockey John Velazquez. He was hounded by Flashy Bull to the stretch, but pulled away from that rival in the final yards to win handily. "He's quite a fighter," Velazquez said. "He was a little spooked at the end of the race when he saw a tire track, but he's a nice horse and I look forward to next year." As for what's next, trainer Todd Pletcher said, "We'll give him a few days and then head south. He has come a long way in a short period of time." The longest shot on the board, she settled in third as Wait a While led them along through easy early fractions, then joined the leaders at the top of the lane and outfinished Cinderella's Dream to win handily. Private Vow broke his maiden by 2 1/4 lengths at Saratoga July 30, came back to take an allowance test at that track by 5 1/2 lengths Aug. 29 and made it three in a row with a nine-length romp in the GII Futurity S. at Belmont Sept. 17. Sent off at odds of 10-1 to continue the streak in the Oct. 29 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, the dark bay was prompting the pace down the backstretch when his rein broke; he ended up out past the middle of the racetrack before crossing the finish line last. The two-year-old had trained sharply since that experience and was the odds-on favorite to put it behind him here. He pressed second choice High Cotton for six furlongs, took over at the top of the stretch and drew away to a popular victory.

Kane Hekili, the leading dirt three-year-old in Japan, proved his mettle against older horses, taking this in a blanket finish. The chestnut was dispatched the clear favorite off six wins from eight starts this season, including the July 13 Japan Dirt Derby and the Sept. 19 Derby Grand Prix, but was most recently second in the G3 Musashino S. over 1600 meters Oct. 29. Stretching back out for this, Kane Hekili raced in midpack early before being asked for his run while wide into the stretch. He rallied outside of Seeking the Dia and got his nose ahead of that rival at the line as Star King Man charged up the inside. America's Lava Man (Slew City Slew) and Tap Day (Pleasant Tap) did not factor, finishing 11th and 13th, respectively. Lava Man returned bleeding from his left foot. "The horse scraped the frog of his left hoof on the backstretch," said jockey Corey Nakatani. The winner's dam, carrying a colt by Wild Again, sold to Katsumi Yoshida for \$270,000 at the 1999 Keeneland January Sale.

RECORDS FALL AT TATTERSALLS Tattersalls' December Foal Sale concluded last night with a record aggregate of 23,295,600gns--up 27 percent on 2004--and a record median of

18,000gns--up 24 percent. The average of 28,796gns, an 8.7-percent bump from 2004, was the second best in the sale's history. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony commented, "Strong yearling sales tend to produce strong foal sales and we have seen the feel-good



factor from our record-breaking yearling sales very much in play throughout the December Foal Sale this week. New records for turnover and median tell their own story, but the surge in the median is the real feature of the four days. The 24-percent rise in the median shows the amazing depth to the trade and it has been a pleasure not only to see the vendors richly rewarded, but also to see such sustained competition for the foals from start to finish."

REVAMPED ASIAN MILE CHALLENGE The Asian Mile Challenge, launched in 2005 with two races worth a total of \$3 million, has been revamped for 2006 to include two races outside of the Orient and will now carry combined purse money of \$8.6 million. Added to the series for next year are the \$527,000 G1 Futurity S. at Caulfield Racecourse in Melbourne Mar. 4 and the \$5 million G1 Dubai Duty Free S. over nine furlongs at Nad al Sheba Mar. 25. The sequence is completed by the original two legs, the \$1 million G1 Champions' Mile at Sha Tin in Hong Kong and the \$2 million G1 Yasuda Kinen at Tokyo Racecourse June 4. A bonus structure will be offered which awards \$4 million to any horse that sweeps the series, while taking three legs nets a \$2-million prize. There is also a \$1-million incentive to any horse that wins any two of the races. Masayuki Takahashi, president and chief executive of the Japan Racing Association, said, "I strongly believe that horse racing must have such international development in order to obtain a wider following and more support from our fans. Thoroughbred racing is no exception, and the Asian Mile Challenge will be a vehicle to share its spirit and excitement with fans by having the world's top horses across the borders and compete in great international events." Added Melbourne Racing Club Chief Executive Warran Brown, "One of our Club's key objectives under our strategic plan is to gain increased recognition, both nationally in Australia and on the international stage, for a commitment to, and the delivery of, quality Thoroughbred racing. For the past four years, our Club has enjoyed a successful racing alliance with the Dubai Racing Club, but the expanded Asian Mile Challenge series provides a wonderful platform on which to further build our international profile." To make the Challenge more enticing to overseas challengers, travel subsidies will be provided for participating horses and their owners, trainers and jockeys. 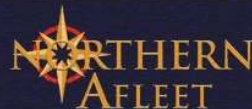

The horsewoman spent five months in Australia during the Flying Start program, and pointed to the two weeks spent with Arrowfield Yearling Manager Jess Hood as particularly valuable. "It was absolutely fantastic to work with Jess and that turned out to be the best preparation for my position now because I learned to appreciate subtle differences preparing yearlings in Australia, as opposed to the Northern Hemisphere," she explained. "At the end of the day they are all horses, no matter where you are, but I was able to learn small things that can make a big difference."



SILENT WITNESS WORKS FAST **Silent Witness (Aus)** (El Moxie), whose status for the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in two weeks' time was in some doubt due to a virus, appears to be well on the road to recovery after flashing home quickly in a Saturday breeze over the Sha Tin all-weather surface.
