Blood-Horse

SILENT WITNESS OFFICIALLY SCRATCHED

Silent Witness (Aus) (El Moxie), the dual Hong Kong Horse of the Year and two-time defending champion of the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint, will not get the chance to make it three in a row after connections officially scratched the six-year-old from Sunday's race. Undefeated at distances up to 1400 meters, the gelding

missed narrowly in a pair of one-mile events last spring, but returned this past October to take the Sprinters S. at Nakayama Racecourse Oct. 2. Silent Witness suffered a rare defeat in a Nov. 1 barrier trial back at Sha Tin. He failed to impress in his morning trials thereafter and was subsequently pulled from the International Sprint Trial Nov. 20, still suffering from the lingering effects of a virus. Silent Witness turned in a poor fifth-place

effort in a Nov. 29 barrier trial, after which he was pronounced an unlikely starter in the Sprint, but owner Archie da Silva was persuaded to allow trainer Tony Cruz to see how the horse progressed over the next week. The final decision was made after he galloped unsatisfactorily yesterday morning over the Sha Tin all-weather surface with regular rider Felix Coetzee in the saddle. A winner of 18 of his 20 career starts, Silent Witness has earned in excess of \$7.4 million.

BITTERSWEET END TO DEAUVILLE SALE

Deauville's December Mixed Sale ended slightly up on 2004, with management reflecting on what might have been. Despite the aggregate oustripping last year's equivalent and the average showing a marginal decrease, l'Agence Francaise President Philippe Augier was downcast about a sale that had started brightly. "We can only regret that we did not have more quality lots to offer and especially good quality foals," he said. Heading the final session of the Mixed Sale was Haras de la Reboursiere et de Montaigu's hip **559**, the four-year-old national hunt broodmare **Lady Cadia (Fr)** (Cadoudal {Fr}), knocked down to Emerald Bloodstock for €65,000. Accompanying the culmination of the Mixed auction was a yearling session, which was better received than 12 months ago as the clearance rate rose markedly from 44 per cent to 74 percent. The highlight was hip **666**, an Anabaa colt offered by Elevage de Tourgeville. Out of a half to two stakes winners, he was purchased by Agence Equus for €38,000. While the gross of the 78 yearlings sold stood at €453,500, which was up on last year, the average of €5,814 dipped by six per cent on its 2004 equivalent. Finally, 25 horses in training were sold in a separate session, grossing €316,000 and averaging €12,640, which represented an increase of 46 percent from last year. Topping that auction was hip **788**, the three-year-old colt **Vanishing Causeway (Ire)** (Giant's Causeway) consigned by trainer Nic Clement. The half to the dual group one winner Vespone (Ire) and smart group scorer La Sylphide (Fr) is from the family of top-class racemares Vallee Enchantee (Ire) and Maids Causeway (Ire) and was knocked down to the MAB Agency for €65,000. MAJORS CAST OUT OF MILE The Hong Kong Jockey Club has pulled the plug on the participation in the G1 Hong Kong Mile of **Majors Cast (Ire)** (Victory Note). The four-year-old, third to Starcraft (NZ) in the G1 Prix du Moulin two starts back, did not board a scheduled flight to Hong Kong over the weekend after pulling up lame following a workout Friday. Trainer Jeremy Nosedo sought an additional day before making a decision. "We do not want horses in our international races who are just making up the numbers and have some unsoundness," Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, executive director of racing for the HKJC told *South China Morning Post*. "Majors Cast has had his problem for several days now, and if it was still not good enough to travel, it is better for our betting customers that we make the decision we did." Local galloper **Town of Fionn (Aus)** (Snippets {Aus}), second to Silent Witness (Aus) in last season's G2 Queen's Silver Jubilee Cup, takes his place in the field.

Delta Blues closed from the middle of the pack to earn his first victory in 14 months. The winner of the Japanese St Leger and third in the G1 Japan Cup last season, the four-year-old was coming off a fifth-place finish in the Copa Republica Argentina in November. He was sent off the crowd's choice in this marathon event. "I gave him his head three furlongs from home and he moved up very strongly," jockey Olivier Peslier said. "Still, I didn't know I had it won until a few meters from the finish." Delta Blues goes next in the Dec. 25 G1 Grand Prix Arima, where he will face top Japanese three-year-old Deep Impact (Jpn).

Cast your mind back, if you can, to the summer of 2000 and you may recall that the first-crop sire Hennessy was struggling to fulfil the very high hopes held of him.

Those hopes, based on the considerable talent that the precocious Hennessy had shown on his way to victories in the Hollywood Juvenile Championship, Sapling S. and Hopeful S., had stimulated some impressive auction figures for the son of Storm Cat. Hennessy's weanlings had sold for up to \$450,000; his first yearlings had averaged nearly \$250,000, with a top price of \$1,200,000; and his first two-year-olds had made up to \$1,650,000. All of which represented pretty good going off a \$30,000 fee.

The widespread interest in Hennessy's youngsters had translated into a book of 166 mares at a fee of \$45,000 in 2000, so it was disappointing that Hennessy's figures in mid-August stood at seven winners from 21 runners, and the only black type had come through Keats' second in a Listed race in Ireland. He was only eighth on the freshman sires' table when Coolmore announced that Hennessy had been leased to spend the 2001 Northern Hemisphere season at the East Stud in Japan.

Choisir's first crop son is star of show

A COLT from the first crop of sensational Australian sprinter Choisir took all the plaudits at the second instalment of the Goffs November Sale yesterday after being bought by Jimmy Murphy for €95,000.

Leasing stallions to Japan when their immediate future looks none-too-rosy had previously been tried by Coolmore with Thunder Gulch, Spinning World, Danehill and Royal Academy, and subsequently with Peintre Celebre. While this policy makes excellent sense in the short-term, my view is that it can be quite a handicap for the stallion in the long run. Breeders' memories are notoriously short and it is almost asking too much for them to make allowances for that missing crop. Thunder Gulch had faded from the memory to such an extent that he attracted only 64 mares in 2000 on his return from Japan (with the exploits of Spain and Point Given quickly remedying the situation).

As Hennessy's sojourn in Japan coincided with the emergence of his spectacular son Johannesburg, he had no such problems on his return, when he covered 145 mares. However, his year in Japan meant that he was comparatively short-handed on the track in the West in 2004, with no two-year-old representatives. Even though his older representatives included Madcap Escapade, Harmony Lodge, Silver Tree and Toasted, Hennessy finished no higher than 36th among the leading sires. Consequently he covered "only" 85 mares at a fee of \$35,000 this year, when some of Ashford's other Storm Cat-line stallions were busily occupied with books of 233, 215, 190 and 179.

Expect it to be a different story in 2006, even though Hennessy's fee has been increased to \$60,000. Although he has had no three-year-olds this year, he has a strong team of juveniles featuring Henny Hughes, the French Group 3 winner Set Alight, the Grade I-placed Keeneland Kat, the promising English Listed winner Short Dance and the Grade III-placed India.

His four-year-olds have also done well, with Madcap Escapade adding three graded successes to her tally, Primary Suspect winning the GIII Toboggan H. and Silver Tree taking the GIII Tropical Turf H. to boost his earnings to nearly \$950,000.

The Juddmonte pair Set Alight and Short Dance have reaffirmed the suitability of Hennessy's progeny for racing on turf, following the example of Johannesburg and the Australian Group 1 winners Grand Armee and Half Hennessy. It's no wonder, then, that Silver Tree--out of a mare by the top turf runner With Approval--is very much at home on turf. The same applied to Silver Tree's brother Orchard Park, who collected the Virginia Derby and a couple of Grade III turf races during an excellent three-year-old campaign.

Orchard Park and Silver Tree were the first two of four foals produced by the short-lived Blue Begum, who showed useful ability up to 1 1/2 miles in Germany. Their broodmare sire With Approval is still awaiting his first Grade I winner in this role, but it is surely only a matter of time before he breaks through, as his daughters have produced four Grade II winners, including Revved Up, Ninebanks and The Daddy, and five Grade III scorers, including Songandaprayer's son He's Got Grit.

Incidentally, With Approval's sons have also been doing pretty well, with Talkin Man siring Better Talk Now and Lasting Approval's Grade I-winning Honey Ryder. It is going to be interesting to see what With Approval can achieve now that he is based in England at Lanwades Stud. There can be little doubt that he will be more at home covering exclusively turf mares, even though he handled dirt to win the Queen's Plate and Prince of Wales S. on his way to Triple Crown honors in Canada.

Silver Tree's third dam, the unfortunately named Chappaquiddick, was only a minor winner, but she was a sister to a top-class colt in Pieces of Eight, winner of the Eclipse S. and Champion S. over a mile and a quarter. Although Pieces of Eight was pretty much a disaster as a stallion, his sister did extremely well as a broodmare. The four stakes winners out of Chappaquiddick were led by the Group 1 winners Tiller and Endear, with the latter going on to become the dam of the dual Breeders' Cup Mile winner Lure.

Another top-class member of this family was Silver Tree's fifth dam, Bebe Grande. This champion filly won eight of her nine starts at two and then achieved the rare feat of being placed in both the 1000 and 2000 Guineas in 1953.

This is a tough family, and Silver Tree should have another rewarding season next year, even though he'll be six.

KAFWAIN FILLY TOPS FASIG FINALE A dark bay weanling filly from the first crop of multiple graded stakes winner Kafwain (Cherokee Run) out of the Allen's Prospect mare Dotsie's Doll realized the highest price at Monday's final session of Fasig-Tipton's Midlantic December Mixed Sale, held at the Timonium Sales Pavilion in Timonium, Maryland. Consigned by Francis and Barbara Vanlangendonck's Summerfield, [hip 404](http://hip404), the first foal produced by her eight-year-old dam, was secured by Winter Spree Farm for \$98,000. The New York-bred is from the family of Grade I stakes placed Naskra Colors, also the dam of GSW Sir Shackleton. Through two days of action, Fasig-Tipton Midlantic sold 375 horses for an aggregate of \$3,497,900.
