ROCK HARD TEN TO LANE'S END

Multiple Grade I winner **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.--Tersa, by Mr. Prospector) will enter stud in 2006 at William S. Farish's Lane's End Farm for a fee of \$50,000, live foal. Retired last month, the four-year-old is scheduled to arrive at the Versailles, Kentucky nursery Dec. 12. Bred by Madeleine Pickens and raced by the partnership of Pickens and Mercedes Stables.

The big colt captured the seven-furlong GI Malibu S. and the nine-furlong GII Swaps Breeders' Cup S. at three, and also ran second to champion Smarty Jones in the GI Preakness S. At four, Rock Hard Ten was perfect in three starts, winning the 10-furlong GI Santa Anita H., the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. and the GII Strub S. He was produced by French champion two-year-old filly Tersa, a half sister to GI Kentucky Derby hero Gato del Sol.

NOTHING TO LOSE RETIRED

Grade I winner **Nothing to Lose** (Sky Classic--Cherlindrea, by Clever Trick) has been retired from racing. No stud plans have been announced yet for the five-year-old, who raced in the red and white colors of breeders Ken and Sarah Ramsey. Winner of the GIII Tropical Park Derby and the GIII Palm Beach S. in his only two starts as a three-year-old, the bay was sidelined for 11 months, but became a force in the turf division as a four-year-old in 2004. He set a course record at Saratoga in the GII Fourstardave H. before romping by 4 1/2 lengths in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile at Keeneland. He was unplaced in both the GI Breeders' Cup Mile and the GI Citation H., and was scheduled to return to the races this year, but came up with some minor problems. Nothing to Lose retires with a record of 15-6-3-1 and earnings of \$809,210.

'LUCK' AND 'MISSILE' WITHDRAW FROM HK

U.S.-based **Designed for Luck** (Rahy) and Great Britain-based **Majestic Missile (Ire)** (Royal Applause {GB}) have been withdrawn from their respective races in the Cathay Pacific Hong Kong International Sunday. Designed for Luck, winner of the 2004 GI Shoemaker Breeders' Cup Mile, developed lameness in his right hind fetlock and will miss a start in the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile. MGSW Majestic Missile, entered in the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint, contracted a fever and blood abnormality after shipping to Hong Kong and has been scratched.

Rakti Puts in Final Move...

Rakti (GB) (Polish Precedent), winner of this year's G1 Juddmonte Lockinge S., worked a strong 400 meters in :22.8 yesterday with jockey Philip Robinson aboard in preparation for a start in Sunday's G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile. "He has a lot of speed, this horse, even though he has a pedigree for middle distances," trainer Michael Jarvis commented.

A total of 27 colts and geldings--25 juveniles and a pair of three-year-olds--are set to go under the hammer at this afternoon's Hong Kong International Sale, to be held in the parade ring at Sha Tin Racecourse. The late, great Danehill has left his mark at racetracks and sales venues all over the world, and Hong Kong is no exception. As the sire of over 300 worldwide black-type winners and counting, the stallion is responsible for six champions in the SAR and a pair of winners on International Day--Fairy King Prawn (Aus) and Lucky Owners (NZ). [17](#), the Oct. 15 foal is a brother to the Hong Kong Derby ticketed Ample Gains (Aus) and MSP Danalaga (Aus). The bay colt has additional appeal down the page as his dam, Tamarino (Ire) (Caerleon), is a half-sister to GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero

Northern Spur (Ire) and to Oenothera (Ire), the dam of MGSW and MG1SP Sundrop (Jpn). He was purchased for NZ\$475,000 at the Karaka Premier Yearling Sale in 2004. "He's progressed very well since he got here," commented Mark Player, the manager of international races, sales and development for the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "He breezed very well and looks a gem of a horse, like his brother. He should give buyers a good bit of confidence." For those who can't get to the Danehill, there are five horses available by his increasingly popular sons. Redoute's Choice (Aus), the sire of no fewer than 15 black-type winners from his first two crops, including three at Group 1 level, is represented by one offering in the sale. There are also juveniles by Danehill Desert King (Ire), sire of the great Makybe Diva (GB), Danzero (Aus) and 2004 champion Australian juvenile Dance Hero (Aus). Also available are two-year-olds by Acatenango (Ger), Anabaa, Cape Cross (Ire), Encosta de Lago (Aus), Fantastic Light and Montjeu (Ire). There are two American-bred horses in the catalogue. Hip [8](#) is a son of King's Best--Joop (Zilzal), a \$60,000 Keeneland September grad, while hip [18](#) is a colt by Bahri--Secret (Secreto), purchased for \$140,000 at the same sale. Last year's HKIS proved successful, with 19 horses selling for a total of HK\$43 million, an average of HK\$2.2 million. There are three scratches from the sale: hips 12, 27 and 29.

BUSINESS AS USUAL FOR CRUZ

Trainer Tony Cruz has every reason to be downcast, given the unfortunate circumstances surrounding his superstar pupil Silent Witness (Aus). But the legendary Hong Kong jockey, well on his way to an equally successful career as a conditioner, is anything but down as the International Race meeting approaches. Although the big horse will be back in his stall, Cruz will have a busy afternoon, saddling horses in two of the Group 1 events. He reflected on his recent fortunes during Friday morning trackwork. "You set a program for these horses and sometimes it works and sometimes you are disappointed," the trainer explained. "Sure, it's disappointing that my big horse doesn't run, but at the same time, I have to concentrate on my other horses and make sure they perform to the best of their ability." Cruz has live horses in each of the events in which he will be represented. He looks to get the day off on the right foot with **Very Fit (Aus)** (Woodman), a half-brother to Silent Witness, in the opening race, the Tokyo H. **Bullish Luck** (Royal Academy), second to Alexander Goldrun (Ire) in last year's G1 Hong Kong Cup, this time lines up for the G1 Hong Kong Mile. "I fancy Bullish Luck," Cruz stated. "He has an awesome finish and this is the race he has been prepped for along." The six-year-old comes in off a narrow defeat in the International Mile Trial Nov. 20. The stable is also represented in the 1600-meter event by **Perfect Partner (Aus)** (Quest For Fame {GB}), runner-up in last year's Mile. The 48-year-old gives **Russian Pearl (NZ)** (Soviet Star) an upsetter's chance in the G1 Hong Kong Cup. "He is right on target now and he is best after a layoff like he has had," Cruz said. "He will be saved for a late charge home and he could surprise a few people." Second to Vengeance of Rain (NZ) in the Hong Kong Derby in March, the five-year-old is unraced since finishing third to that rival in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup here at Sha Tin Apr. 24.

Cat on the Warpath....

Some 40 miles to the west of Hong Kong across the mouth of the Pearl River lies Macau. Encompassing just 8.6 square miles, the island is home to about a half-million people and to **Warcat (NZ)** (Felix the Cat), the tiny nation's representative in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint. While the rest of the foreign contingent was forced to travel to Hong Kong by plane while shipping in from as far away as London and Los Angeles, he enjoyed a leisurely boat ride. Not surprisingly, the trip seems to have taken very little out of the four-year-old gelding, who has made a favorable impression during his morning gallops over the Sha Tin all-weather surface. A winner of eight of his 13 career starts, Warcat will clearly need to draw upon all of his talent to have a say in Sunday's outcome. But before dismissing him completely, it is worth taking a look at the results of the 2004 Hong Kong Sprint, which reveals that Natural Blitz (Aus), a fellow Macau invader, cut out the early pace and stayed on for third, beaten just over four lengths by Silent Witness. Trained by one-time North American jockey Alex Choy on behalf of owner Choy Yu Yee, Warcat will carry his regular rider, 31-year-old Peter Ho.

Thoro-Graph Race of the Week

1 Coronado's Pride	Coronado's Quest	30-1

Has been very solid, and has moved up since trainer Knapp claimed him back in May, but even on his best is a few lengths short of competitive here. There is no reason to believe a new top is coming, and bearing out (bo) in his last two is not a plus.

2 Bully Hayes	Sultry Song	6-1
----------------------	--------------------	------------

Presumably had soundness issues, since he didn't start until age five, but he's been solid since, with every race but one matching or exceeding his previous top. With an inside post, this one might be able to avoid the three-wide (3w) trips he's been getting, and he's probably going to run a new top some time soon.

3 Spellbinder	Tale of the Cat	8-1
----------------------	------------------------	------------

Showed ability at two, but hasn't developed much since, which is typical for sire Tale Of The Cat; his TGI (Thoro-Graph Index) is very strong for juveniles, but shows only four points of development for his runners from ages two to four, much less than average. This colt's recent figures are around the 4 level, which leaves him in a logjam with several others that will be fighting for a check.

4 Keep On Punching	Silver Deputy	30-1
---------------------------	----------------------	-------------

Is out of a mare that throws nothing but late developers, and didn't start racing himself until the summer of his three-year-old year. He developed very nicely to run two big numbers this spring that would make him strong here, but has tailed off badly since.

5 Trotamondo (Chi)	Hussonet	3-1
---------------------------	-----------------	------------

Is a Southern Hemisphere-bred, meaning he's six months younger than our four-year-olds. He did win the Triple Crown in Chile, but those races were for "spring" three-year-olds, and probably would not come up as big figures relative to these older stakes horses. His only local try also looks much better than it is--he was 1w1w, and earned a figure not close to that of the winner, who raced outside. This colt obviously could move forward, but he'll need to, to contend. Note that trainer De Seroux is 6 and 7 percent first and second off a layoff, but jumps to 29 percent third off a layoff, which is unusual.

6 McCann's Mohave Memo (Chi)		7-2
-------------------------------------	--	------------

Has a history of long layoffs following big efforts, but surprisingly held it together following two really good ones this summer, although he hasn't approached that level since. On his best he would have a very big shot here, but he may not be that good again until he's freshened and, facing lots of early speed, he's unlikely to clear and get the 1w1w trip he did last time.

8 Courtly Jazz	Dixieland Band	15-1
-----------------------	-----------------------	-------------

Has gotten rail trips in his last two, which has made him appear to be a stakes horse. He's not--he's never run fast enough to hit the board here.

9 No Giveaway	He's Tops	15-1
----------------------	------------------	-------------

Picked the right time to run the race of his life, winning the Longacres Mile at 60-1. If he can get back to that level now second off a layoff, he's a contender, but none of his other tries are good enough.

10 Preachinathebar	Silver Charm	5-2
---------------------------	---------------------	------------

Was very similar to Spellbinder at age two, but this colt is by Silver Charm, whose runners tend to develop quite a bit (see sire profile, specifically TGI, and compare to Tale Of The Cat). Not surprisingly, this guy has become a nice horse at age four, with three figures out of his last five that give him a big shot here. The timing is good into this, and he's the most likely winner, but he has to avoid the 3w4w trip he has gotten so frequently.

11 Saint Buddy	Saint Ballado	12-1
-----------------------	----------------------	-------------

Has the erratic pattern of a horse dealing with physical issues, and his only recent big one came after he was freshened. It's very tough to tell when this one will fire, but he doesn't do it that often these days.

Overview: Trotamondo will be overbet. Preachinathebar is solid, and Bully Hayes could be used at a price.

FLORIDA SLOT BILL IS PASSED The bill which will establish the regulations necessary for installing slot machines at Gulfstream Park and three other pari-mutuel facilities in Broward County, Florida, was passed by both the House and the Senate of the state's legislature during a special session Thursday. The House passed the bill by a vote of 110 to 8, while the vote in the Senate was 33 to 7. According to the legislation, Magna Entertainment Corporation, owner of Gulfstream, will be required to sign contracts with the Florida Thoroughbred Breeders' and Owners' Association regarding the payment of breeders', stallion and special racing awards; and with the Florida Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association Inc. regarding daily purse distribution at the track. The bill also calls for a tax rate of 50 percent and a payout rate of no less than 85 percent, and allows for up to 1,500 slot machines at Gulfstream, Dania Jai Alai, Hollywood Greyhound Track and Pompano Park. "When Gulfstream announces their plans, we'll be in a position to put together an outline for our Breeders' Awards program that will be more than competitive with Kentucky and New York," FTBOA Executive Vice President Richard Hancock said. "We will await Magna's determination on whether they want to operate under the terms this special legislative session has approved." He added, "We are pleased we have a bill. The tax rate and the number of machines are not what Magna or the FTBOA were hoping for, but it is important to get started. We worked very hard to get the tax rate down and number of machines increased. The number of machines and tax rate can be addressed at the next session. We don't want to give opponents an opportunity to place a recall on Amendment 4 on the next ballot. We have been working at this for seven years. Passage of this legislation gives the Thoroughbred industry an excellent chance to grow and prosper."

NYRA CO-CHAIR PETER KARCHES RESIGNS

Peter Karches resigned from his position as co-chairman of the New York Racing Association during a meeting Wednesday. Karches cited personal reasons when announcing his resignation, but added that he will remain a member of the NYRA Board of Trustees. "I regret having to abandon my role at this crucial time, but I have no choice," he said. "My time working with [co-chairman C. Steven Duncker], [NYRA President Charlie Hayward] and members of this board, as well as [former NYRA federal monitor] Neil Getnick, makes this announcement even tougher." Said Duncker, "Peter's daily hands-on involvement, his tremendous integrity and incredible business sense helped NYRA emerge successfully from the federal indictment. NYRA, the Thoroughbred racing industry, and the State of New York each owe Peter a tremendous debt of gratitude for his selfless efforts on their behalf." Hayward added, "What ultimately enticed me to join NYRA as president and CEO last year was the opportunity to work closely with our two dedicated and skilled co-chairs who impressed me with their unwavering commitment to fixing NYRA pursuant to the principles of integrity and transparency.
