LAKE, LEPAROUX, MOSS LEAD NATION IN '06 WINS by Claire Novak, courtesy of www.bloodhorse.com

Trainer Scott Lake and jockey Julien Leparoux concluded the 2006 racing season at the top of the North American charts for races won, while Maggi Moss was the leading owner. Lake, based on the East Coast, won with 528 out of 2,158 starters this year for a success rate of 24 percent. His runners finished in the money 56 percent of the time, bringing in \$9,565,656 to put the 41-year-old trainer fourth in the nation by earnings. However, Lake's season was marred by multiple clenbuterol positives found in his starters in New York and Delaware, and he was forced to turn his horses over to assistants as he ended the year by serving two

30-day suspensions. Leparoux, who rode first-call for trainer Patrick Biancone at tracks from Saratoga to Santa Anita this year, began 2006 as an apprentice based in Kentucky. His 403 winners among 1,740 starters earned \$12,485,527 in purses to put him eighth in the nation by earnings. The Frenchman won five riding titles between Turfway Park, Keeneland, and Churchill Downs. After losing his apprentice status in September, Leparoux maintained a 23-percent win rate and finished in the money 52 percent of the time. His top mounts included Gorella (Fr), winner of the GI Beverly D. H., Asi Siembre, winner of the GI Juddmonte Spinster, and GII Fleur de Lis H. winner Happy Ticket. Steve Bass, the 23-year-old jockey's agent, said Leparoux will travel between Turfway Park and Santa Anita this winter. "It's been an unbelievable year, and we want to thank every trainer and owner who put us on their horses," Bass said. "Obviously, Patrick Biancone played a big influence, but every single person who supported us is appreciated. Julien accomplished a lot this year, and he's been riding some really nice two-year-olds, so we're looking forward to another great racing season." Moss, based in Des Moines, Iowa, races her horses at tracks throughout the U. S. and has risen through the ranks by claiming horses while teaming up with trainer Randy Morse. **For the complete story, click [here](#).**

JAZIL RETURNS FRIDAY

Jazil (Seeking the Gold) will make his first start since winning the GI Belmont S. in June Friday at Aqueduct. The newly turned four-year-old will break from the outside in a field of eight going postward in the eighth race, a \$48,000 second-level allowance going a mile and a sixteenth. Jazil and stable-mate **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes) had been wintering in Florida until an equine herpesvirus outbreak in the state prompted trainer Kieran McLaughlin to ship his stars north to New York on Christmas Eve. Jazil worked four furlongs over Belmont's training track in :48 3/5 on Saturday. "We wanted to get him started,"

McLaughlin said of the decision to enter Jazil on Friday. "He's doing very well, but I don't know if he has to win. If he runs well, I'll be happy." Jazil broke his maiden over Aqueduct's inner track last December. After winning the Belmont, the Shadwell Stable colorbearer was sidelined by a bruised hind cannon bone. Friday's allowance will likely serve as a prep for either the Feb. 3 GII Strub S. at Santa Anita or the Mar. 3 GII Gulfstream Park H. "He could run in either of those races," McLaughlin confirmed. "Or he could be a back-up for Invasor in the [Feb. 3 GI] Donn H."

HARVARD AVENUE WINS EL CONEJO

Harvard Avenue (You and I) outfinished **Areyoutalkintome** (Smokester) to give trainer Doug O'Neill a one-two finish in yesterday's GIII El Conejo H. at Santa Anita. "I love this," O'Neill said after watching his runners duke it out to the finish of the 5 1/2-furlong contest. "I had such a horrible start this meet [one win in 25 starts going into Monday]. It's a good way to bust out of a little slump." Favored **Proud Tower Too** (Proud Irish), making his first start since winning the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen at Nad al Sheba last March, was third. Also at Santa Anita yesterday, **Society Hostess** (Seeking the Gold) charged from last to first to capture the GIII Monrovia H., giving Garrett Gomez a stakes double.

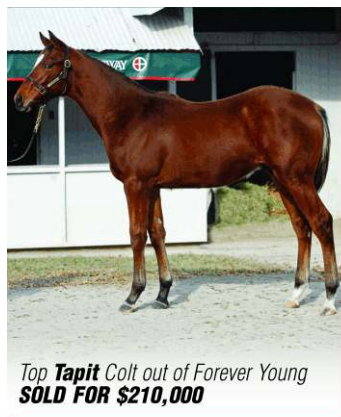

Society Hostess, a listed winner in Germany, won stakes at Belmont and Keeneland last fall before running a close-up fifth in the Nov. 26 GI Matriarch H. last time out. Settled last of 12 behind fast early fractions of :21.49, :43.28 and 1:06.34, the consistent mare closed powerfully for an easy win. "She's got a lot of class," jockey Garrett Gomez said of the winner. "Everything I ask her to do, she does. Today, she broke good, but we weren't in a hurry. She wasn't pulling, so I knew they were going fast up front. She doesn't do anything wrong and she just does everything I ask her to do. She's just a nice filly." Christophe Clement assistant Nicholas Bachalard was surprised with Society Hostess's tactics, but not her results. "We thought she would be mid-flight," Bachalard explained. "They went very fast if the fractions are right, and I think there's a bit of give in the ground, too. She's a very good filly. She only lost twice [in 2006] and she never lost by more than a length in the two races she lost." Cambiocorsa (Avenue of Flags), looking for her ninth win in 10 trips down the Santa Anita hill, battled on the front end before tiring to seventh. **Click for the [brisnet.com](http://www.brisnet.com) chart.**

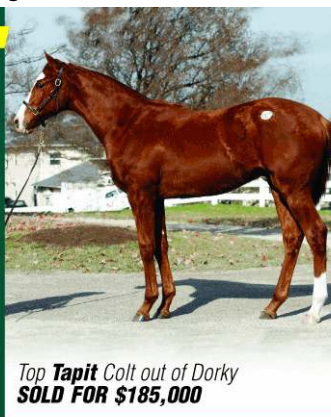

Harvard Avenue, winner of the GII Potrero Grande Breeders' Cup H. over this track last April, was off over a year before resurfacing with a third-place effort over the all-weather track at Hollywood Nov. 1 and the dark bay gelding returned to the winner's circle in his most recent start, defeating Buckland Manor by 3/4 lengths at Hollywood Nov. 15. Last early, Harvard Avenue angled to the outside for the drive and finished with determination to just nail stablemate Areyoutalkintome on the wire. "He kept himself a little more in the race today going five and a half than normal," said winning rider Garrett Gomez. "When we came off the turn, I really couldn't ask for a horse to be running any better than he was today. I thought I won it, but I thought I was going to win by a half-length the way he was rolling." Winning trainer Doug O'Neill also thought Harvard Avenue had edged Areyoutalkintome. "I thought Harvard got up," O'Neill said. "Areyoutalkintome is always like that. Like [jockey] Victor [Espinoza] said, when he makes the lead, he kind of waits a little bit, but he ran dynamite." Proud Tower Too, who contested the early fractions and held on for third, did not disappoint trainer Sal Gonzalez with his third-place effort in his first start since March. "He ran great for being off nine months," Gonzalez said. "He's pretty fast and he's fresh, so I figured he'd be on the lead, but we just came up a little short. Soldier's Dancer won two of his first six starts before stretching out to 1 1/16 miles and cruising home to a 6 3/4-length victory in his first try over the grass in the Nov. 11 Appleton Juvenile Turf.

He missed by just a head over course and trip in the Dec. 9 Kris S. S. last time out and took his turf record to two wins in three starts with this come-from-behind victory. Favored against eight foes, the gray gelding rated off the pace before moving into contention with a four-wide move into the lane. He angled out further in the stretch

and wore down Sedgefield and Storm in May to win going away. "This is a very good horse because he got into some trouble and overcame it nicely," said winning rider Cornelio Velasquez. "He showed me today that, even without any pace up front to run at, he could still finish and give whatever you needed to get the job done." Soldier's Dancer also impressed his trainer, Dave Vivian. "After this performance today, I might have to say he's the best horse I've ever trained," Vivian said. "I still think he'll run on dirt. The morning after New Year's Eve perhaps isn't the wisest or safest time to start quoting statistics, but the decisive victory of Downthedustyroad prompts a few. Unless I'm mistaken, her sire Storm and a Half is no less than the 31st son of Storm Cat to have sired a group/graded winner in one of the major racing countries in the northern hemisphere.

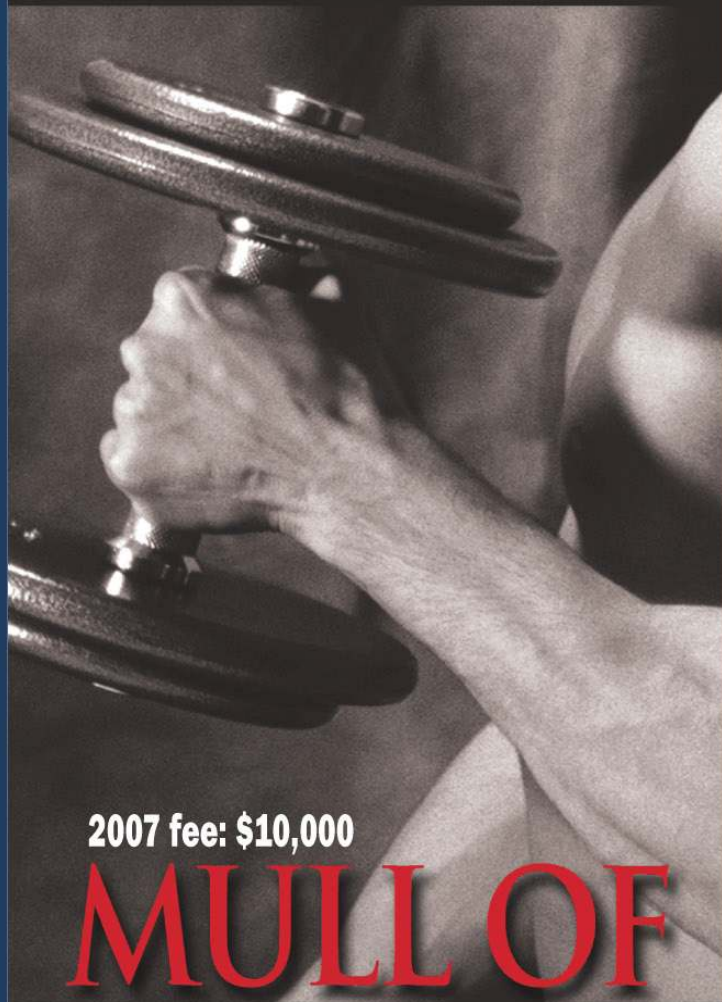
However, Storm and a Half has the distinction of being the first unraced son of Storm Cat to have sired a graded winner. This rather surprised me, given the large number of Storm Cat colts who have been given their chance as stallions (the latest *Blood-Horse Stallion Register* lists more than 110 sons). Storm and a Half is also the only non-stakes winner among the 13 sons of Storm Cat to have sired a Grade I winner.

That said, Storm and a Half isn't the first non-stakes-winning son of Storm Cat to have drawn attention to himself. Storm Boot has carved out a niche as an inexpensive yet reliable sire of stakes winners, while the once-raced Quick Cut, the minor winner Level Sands and the non-winning Tiger Ridge have each sired a graded winner.

Bearing in mind the number of unraced or modestly performed fillies who make excellent broodmares, one might have expected more stallions like Storm and a Half to come through. The downtrodden male is at a big disadvantage, though. Whereas an unraced broodmare can have access to the finest stallions, provided her owner is prepared to pay the price, an unraced stallion is almost inevitably going to struggle to attract mares either in sufficient numbers or of sufficient quality. In the past, potential stallions with more pedigree than performance used to be very attractive to southern hemisphere breeders who couldn't afford to buy pedigree *and* performance, but the emergence of the shuttle stallion has probably denied these horses even that slim chance of fulfilling the promise of their bloodlines.

One notable exception to the rule was Alibhai, a son of Hyperion and the high-class English stayer Tracery. Imported to the U.S., Alibhai was prevented from racing by bowed tendons, but he sired the Kentucky Derby winner Determine and regularly ranked among America's leading sires.

Another example I can think of is Immortality, who sired the 1,000 Guineas winner Fleet and her high-class sister Democratie from an exceptional broodmare called Review. As you might expect, that great sire of sires Northern Dancer had a few unraced sons who sired graded winners, including Staff Writer, Pas Seul, Yukon, Northern Score and Fire Dancer. Better than any of these was Fairy King, a Northern Dancer colt who finished in the rear on his only racecourse appearance, but Fairy King had the advantage of having a sensational older brother in Sadler's Wells.

Staff Writer, who sired the Grade I winners Timely Writer and Fact Finder, plied his trade in Washington State, while Pas Seul, who sired the Grade I winner Pass the Line, was based in Virginia. It is a similar story with Storm and a Half, who has spent his stallion career in Arkansas.

A stallion career in Arkansas was no doubt not among the goals envisaged by Reynolds Bell when he paid \$1.2 million for Storm and a Half on behalf of Richard Santulli at Keeneland's 1998 September Sale. The colt's price was bettered by only five other yearlings.

It is easy to understand why the son of Storm Cat was in such demand. He represents the popular Storm Cat/Seeking the Gold cross which has produced five black-type winners from its first 24 foals. These include Good Reward (GI Manhattan H.), his brother Pure Prize (a Grade II winner who ranks third among the first-crop sires of 2006, with five stakes winners), Seeking the Sky (GIII), Old Deuteronomy (G1-placed), Magical Ride (GII-placed) and Seeking the Dia (a consistent Japanese Group 2 winner with considerable earnings).

Storm and a Half came on the market in the same year that his half-sister Lu Ravi won the GIII Fair Grounds Oaks and GII Cotillion H., before eventually retiring as a winner of more than \$1.8 million.

Their dam At the Half had helped Seeking the Gold make a spectacular start as a stallion in 1993, when she won five of her six juvenile starts, including the GIII Golden Rod S. Storm and a Half's next dam, the very durable Grade III winner Knitted Gloves, also produced the high-class turf horse Spruce Needles, so there is nothing wrong with his bloodlines.

The question was whether he would receive good enough mares to make his mark, especially as his fee was only \$1,000. The answer seems to be that he did, as his first three crops have done well enough to earn him books of over 100 mares in 2005 and 2006.

The bottom half of Downthedustyroad's pedigree contains a smattering of stakes winners, including her half-sister Princess Jen and her third dam Jet to Market, but the main feature of her pedigree is her 4x3 inbreeding to Mr. Prospector (with the second line coming through her broodmare sire Crafty Prospector).

This inbreeding could be well worth remembering. Of the 13 sons of Storm Cat who have a Grade I winner to their credit, three failed to win at graded level, yet two of the three--Storm and a Half and Catienus--have each sired a Grade I winner inbred to Mr. Prospector. The other exception--2006's champion juvenile sire Stormy Atlantic (who has no Mr. Prospector blood)--sired his Grade I winner Stormello from a granddaughter of Mr. Prospector.

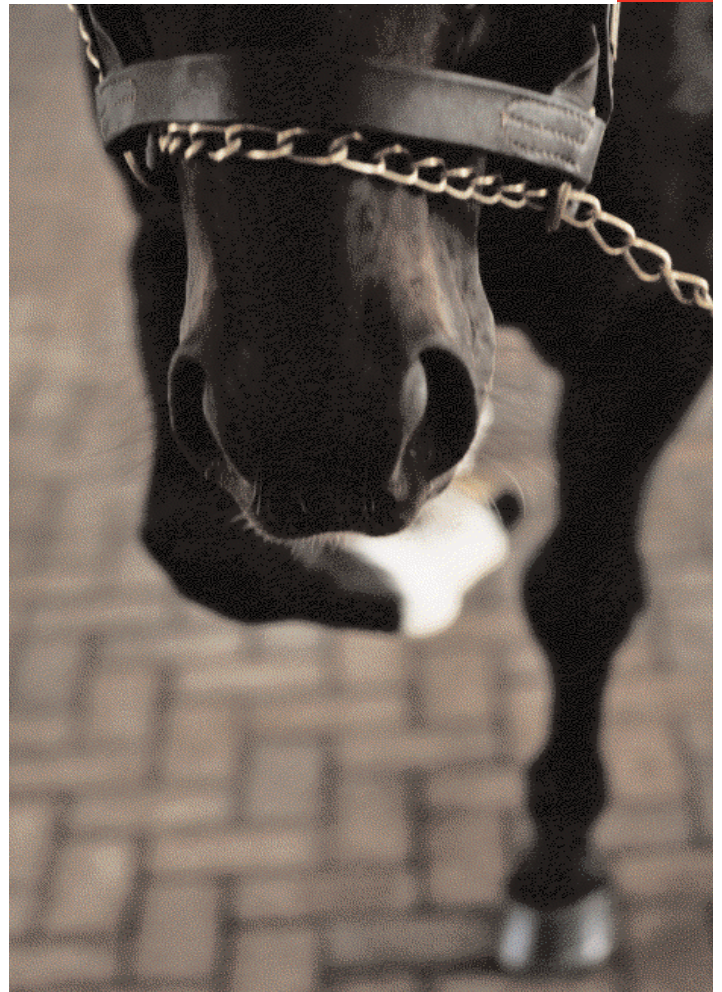
