SEEING RED IN THE HAL'S HOPE

All eyes were on the duo of **Sweetnorthernsaint** (Sweetsouthernsaint) and **Strong Contender** (Maria's Mon) in the GIII Hal's Hope H. at Gulfstream Park yesterday, but it was **Chatain** (Forest Wildcat--Roujoleur, by Red Ransom) who stole the show in track-record time. The four-year-old, cleverly named for a shade of red, had been beaten just once in his short career, finishing second to Showing Up in a Gulfstream allowance test in March before being sidelined for six months. "After his first two races down here last winter he had a lot of things go wrong," trainer Angel Penna Jr. explained. "Quarter cracks or running a temperature--it was one thing after another. Hopefully we're past that now." **Cont. p2**

THREE DEGREES OF SEPARATION

The only thing separating **Three Degrees (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}) from victory in the Nov. 26 GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood Park was the half-length that Price Tag (GB) had on her at the finish line. The gray mare is now 0-for-eight since carrying Gary Stevens to a win in the 2005 GII Honeymoon BC H., but she has been close, and her losing streak could come to an end in today's GII San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita. Three Degrees was also runner-up in the GI Del Mar Oaks two years ago, and in the Aug. 9 Osunitas H. and Sept. 2 GII Palomar BC H. in 2006. Third after a tough trip in the Sept. 30 GI Yellow Ribbon S., she closed like a rocket in the Matriarch, but came up just a little short. "Her style is best suited if she has a good pace to run at," trainer Paddy Gallagher said. "There's not a lot we can do about changing her tactics, but if there's speed to run at, it would help. We'll just make the most of it." There are no confirmed frontrunners in the nine-panel San Gorgonio. **Grande Melody (Ire)** (Grand Lodge), who posted a nose tally in the Dec. 18 GII Dahlia H. at Hollywood to run her U.S. account to two-for-three, does her best when coming from just off the pace. **Citronnade** (Lemon Drop Kid) did wire the field in an optional claimer on the Belmont dirt last July, but has reserved her speed since switching to the turf. The bay closed to take the Sept. 21 Graceful Darby S. and, after a disappointing ninth in the Oct. 14 GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup Challenge Cup, rallied from just off glacial fractions to win the Nov. 12 Audrey Skirball S., with Grande Melody back in third. **Field, p5**

Worth the Wait...

Chatain (Forest Wildcat) returned to romp by 10 lengths in an allowance at the Meadowlands Oct. 19, and was making his stakes debut yesterday. Allowed to settle in fourth as **Rexson's Hope** (Suave Prospect) cut out the early fractions, he angled wide as 6-5 favorite **Sweetnorthern**saint (Sweet southern saint) took over at the top of the lane, then fought his way to the front at the eighth pole. **Sir Greeley** (Mr. Greeley) came at him, but Chatain held on to set a track record of 1:33.87. Looking ahead, Angel Penna Jr. said, "The goal all along has been the [GI Donn H., Feb. 3]. Now we'll have to see if he can bounce back well enough from this one to take that step up." The crowd's choice weakened in the final furlong to be third. "We had a big chance at the top of the stretch, but we're on the comeback trail here and I'm all right with this," trainer Michael Trombetta said. "It was a big race for my horse. I look forward to coming back in three weeks [for the \$1 million Sunshine Millions Classic, Jan. 27]." **Click for the [brisnet.com](http://www.brisnet.com) chart. Dixie Meister finished second as a 32-1 outsider in the GII New Orleans H. at Fair Grounds in his 2006 debut, but joined the Julio Canani stable after a seventh-place performance in the Feb. 4 GII Strub S. The dark bay came back to be runner-up in the Mar. 12 Santana Mile H. and third in the May 13 GII Mervyn Leroy H. before joining the ranks of graded winners after a one-length tally in the June 17 GII Californian S. Sidelined thereafter, he faced the venerable Discreet Cat in his comeback attempt, the Nov. 25 GI Cigar Mile H., and ended up distant fourth. That race turned the screws just a little tighter, and Dixie Meister was on top of his game here. Rated in sixth as Cheroot (Smokester) led them through six panels, he hit the gas in the stretch, took control at the eighth pole and outgamed Armenian Summer to get the nod. Former champion Declan's Moon (Malibu Moon), the 5-2 chalk, loomed boldly on the far turn, but faded to last. Kelly's Landing had never missed the board at Gulfstream Park, and yesterday was no exception. The gelding opened his 2006 campaign with an optional-claiming score in Hallandale last March, then bounced back from a last-place effort in the Apr. 15 GII Commonwealth BC S. to be second in a May 4 allowance and in the June 3 GIII Aristides BC H. at Churchill. Out of the money in his next two, he turned it around with a rallying victory in the Oct. 7 GIII Phoenix BC S. The dark was overmatched when 10th in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, but handled Grade III foes with aplomb here. He pressed Weigelia (Safely's Mark) through a half in :44.19, took over as they straightened for home and drew clear. "I knew he'd be right up on the pace...he's been training super," trainer Eddie Kenneally said, adding, "We'll consider the options here [Feb. 3 GIII Deputy Minister H.] and the race in Dubai [Mar. 31 G1 Golden Shaheen]. There aren't many opportunities for sprinters to run for the kind of money, so we'll give that a serious look." [Click for the brisnet.com chart.](#)

Second in her career opener at Churchill Downs in July, Baroness Thatcher stumbled at the break in a maiden test at Saratoga Aug. 20 and never factored, finishing eighth. The chestnut was given a break after that effort, returning to post a five-length victory on the Keeneland all-weather Oct. 7, but she failed to fire once again in her latest. A 3-1 chance in the Oct. 29 GIII Pocahontas S. under the twin spires, she got bumped around at the break and tired in the stretch to be sixth. Transferred to trainer Patrick Biancone after that start, she was looking to get back on track as the second choice. Baroness Thatcher was on the heels of the leaders early after veering when the gate opened. She drove to the front in the stretch and held off the late surge of Runway Rosie for a narrow decision. KEENELAND JANUARY STARTS TOMORROW

The Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale, offering a record 2,933 lots, begins tomorrow in Lexington. The catalogue is 425 head larger than last year and is comprised of 1,152 broodmares, 361 broodmare prospects, 224 racing or broodmare prospects, 90 racing prospects, 1,011 short yearlings, 59 racing or stallion prospects, 27 stallion prospects, five stallions and four stallion shares. One of the highlights of the eight-day auction will be the complete dispersal of F. Eugene Dixon, Jr. The consign-

ment, handled by Claiborne Farm and Charlton, will be featured during Tuesday's session. There are mares in foal to top stallions such as Awesome Again, Dynaformer, El Prado (Ire), Elusive Quality, Forestry, Gone West, Johannesburg, Successful Appeal, Tale of the Cat, Theatrical (Ire) and Thunder Gulch, as well as up-and-coming young sires including Afleet Alex, Ghostzapper, Kitten's Joy, Leroidesanimaux (Brz), Medaglia d'Oro, Mineshaft, Pleasantly Perfect and Rock Hard Ten. Four mares carrying foals from the one and only crop by Saint Liam will also go through the ring. The short yearlings represent A-list stallions that include Belong to Me, Cherokee Run, Distorted Humor, Dynaformer, Elusive Quality, Empire Maker, Giant's Causeway, Gone West, Johannesburg, Mineshaft, Pleasantly Perfect, Rahy, Smarty Jones, Street Cry (Ire), Successful Appeal, Thunder Gulch and Vindication. "I think, as always, it's going to be a strong sale," said Pin Oak's Clifford Barry. "The bloodstock market is up at the present time, and the January Sale will be no different. Going through the catalogue, there are some nice well-bred young fillies out of training that are going to bring the money. Quality is always going to sell."



Road to Success...

Eaton Sales is no stranger to success in the Keeneland January sales ring. Eaton consigned then seven-year-old broodmare Mackie to the auction in 2000 and saw the bidding rise to a cool \$5 million, a Keeneland January record that still stands today. It might be difficult to eclipse that mark this year, but the 2007 offering does include a potential sales topper in **Downthedustyroad** (Storm and a Half--Fair Majesty, by Crafty Prospector). The four-year-old filly, selling as [hip 1425](#) has come a long way since breaking her maiden for a \$25,000 tag at Oaklawn last February. She was purchased privately by Ahmed Zayat's Zayat Stables after posting a seven-length allowance win at that track in April. Third in the G1 Hollywood Oaks and second in the Adoration H., G1 Lady's Secret BC H. and Pine Tree Lane S., the bay exploded to win the Dec. 30 G1 La Brea S. by 4 1/4 lengths in her sophomore finale. "She is absolutley gorgeous," said Eaton's Reiley McDonald. "She is 16 hands, has a huge shoulder, is very correct and has a big, big hip. In addition to her recent Grade I win, and her racing performance--she has been on the board in nine of her last nine starts--I think her physical will bump up her value a lot." Eaton will sell a total of three fillies for the Zayat operation at Keeneland January. "We haven't sold for Zayat Stables before--I'm not sure how much selling Mr. Zayat has done," McDonald said. "But his racing program has really taken off, and we are lucky that he asked us to sell some horses for him. Obviously, he has purchased a lot of horses and has been around the sales quite a bit. He has retained two or three consignors for the January Sale. I think he chose people he has watched and decided he would like to have represent him."

Downthedustyroad may be the star of Eaton Sale's Keeneland January consignment, but she is just one of 85 that the company will have on offer this year. Eaton's commitment to the venue has grown steadily in the 21st century, from the 32 that passed through the ring in 2001 and the 51 offered in 2005, to an impressive 99 lots in 2006 that brought an aggregate \$6,184,200. "I think that the January Sale used to be sort of an afterthought, a follow-up from November, but it has become a legitimate horse sale," Reiley McDonald said. "You can sell a top mare or a top foal, and you can sell medium-end or low-end horses. We have always been conservative about what markets we participate in, and as Keeneland January has become more legitimate, with good strength and depth, we have pushed more horses into it." How does the 2007 consignment stack up against last year's team? "On the whole, our consignment is as good if not better than last year," McDonald said. "We have a couple of Storm Cat fillies that are very nicely bred and should be attractive to the buyers." FIVE OF SIX EHV-1 CASES AT GOLDEN GATE TEST NEGATIVE by Jack Shinar, courtesy of www.bloodhorse.com.

Five of the six horses previously identified with equine herpesvirus type 1 at Golden Gate Fields tested negative in samples taken Jan. 5, the director of the large animal clinic at the University of California-Davis reported. "This strongly suggests that they are no longer shedding virus and therefore no longer contagious," the director, Dr. David Wilson, said in an e-mail sent the morning of Jan. 6. He said re-sampling of the horses, all of whom are segregated in the barn of trainer Lloyd Mason at the Albany, California, track, would be conducted Jan. 7. The remaining horse to test positive was the last one to become infected, Wilson said. "Our hope is that he will become negative next week," Wilson said in the message. "We will re-test him every couple of days so that we can find out as soon as possible when he becomes negative." He said a modification or lifting of quarantine restrictions would be based on continued clinical monitoring of horses at the track, including daily temperature taking. The California Horse Racing Board imposed travel restrictions on about 2,100 horses stabled at Golden Gate, Bay Meadows and the Alameda County Fairgrounds in Pleasanton after the first horse in Mason's barn tested positive for the highly contagious virus on Dec. 28. An update on the quarantine status is expected to be issued by Dr. Rick Arthur, the CHRHB's equine medical director. "The fact that we have had no new cases since the first horse was diagnosed... together with the follow-up results on the six horses we identified as shedding the virus during surveillance sampling, is very encouraging," Wilson said.

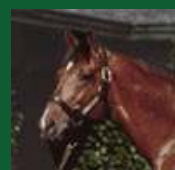

WRITERS UP

SLOT RACERS

They don't come any more utilitarian than Philly Park. It has been nothing more than a betting factory--a betting factory that never had particularly good horse racing. But the new and very improved Philadelphia Park is here. A once inconceivable scenario, Philly's ascendancy was assured the second slot machines were approved in Pennsylvania. Tuesday, the track opened its slots operation, with 2,100 machines there to welcome a horde of eager gamblers. Eventually, the

slots will move from the racetrack itself to a separate casino building to be built in the existing parking lot, which will contain as many as 5,000 machines.

There's hardly anything new about a racetrack adding slots machines to its gambling menu, but the Philadelphia Park story promises to be unlike anything seen in thoroughbred racing thus far.

Philly, which is located in the town of Bensalem, just a few miles from the Philadelphia border, is the first thoroughbred racino to open in a large metropolitan center. More than 5.1 million people live in the metropolitan Philadelphia area. Slots tracks like Charles Town, Delaware Park, Mountaineer Park and Delta Downs have been wildly successful despite being in remote locations.

When the Philly casino is fully operational, the profits from the slots figure to be astronomical. And a healthy chunk of that money will go toward purses. Pennsylvania horsemen and breeders were able to cut a terrific deal with the state's politicians and will get about 15 percent of the profits from the slots. By contrast, when slots finally come to Aqueduct, only 7.5 percent of the profits will go toward purses in the first five years of the operation. It will then go up to 10 percent. Philly Park will even get a cut of the profits from two stand-alone casinos set to open inside the Philadelphia city limits.

Pennsylvania's politicians took good care of horse racing and some of that had to do with the impact of Smarty Jones, the 2004 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner who was based at Philadelphia. Smarty mania swept the state and helped publicize the plight of an industry that was spinning its wheels without slots. With lousy purses and stiff competition from slots tracks in Delaware and West Virginia, a slot-less future was bleak for Pennsylvania racing.

"Smarty Jones was the whipped cream on top of the sundae," Philly Park C.E.O Hal Handel said. "If you go back over 10 or 12 years, the initial state work was done by (Philadelphia Park Chairman and President) Bob Green, but he was a voice in the wilderness for a lot of years. The issue then started to gain some traction and then Smarty and John Servis came along just at the right time."

Knowing that the money is about to start pouring in, Philly management has already announced a 40 percent purse increase for 2007. That will make the average daily purse payment \$175,000, a pittance of what they will become. Handel estimates that Philadelphia Park will eventually be paying out \$500,000 a day, which would put the track on par with Aqueduct and Belmont.

"I don't think we'll have as many glamorous events as places like NYRA and Churchill have and we don't have any intention of trying to compete with them in that area," Handelsaid. "But for a stand-alone racetrack that is going to be operating all year, if we have an overnight purse structure of \$450,000 or \$500,000, that's going to be a bellwether for the industry and we'll be a really great place to race meat-and-potato horses."

Handel said he has already heard from some of the top trainers in the sport, people wanting more information and inquiring about the availability of stalls. Philly might not get Todd Pletcher's first string, but it is likely to get divisions from trainers like Pletcher.

The handful of quality stakes at Philly will also get major purse increases. Tentative plans call for the Pennsylvania Derby purse to be bumped up to \$1 million, Handel said.

The biggest losers won't necessarily be the people blowing their pay and social security checks on the slots, but racing in Maryland and New Jersey.

With slots eventually on their way to Aqueduct, those two states will be the only ones in the Mid-Atlantic region without slots. For both, the fight to keep horses and trainers from fleeing to Pennsylvania is going to be a difficult one.

"I would think we're going to get a lot of New Jersey horsemen and I imagine New York will, as well, when they get slots," said Handel, who used to run racing at the Meadowlands and Monmouth. "That will put them in an untenable position. They're only seasonal to begin with and now they're going to have pressure on their borders. It's going to be very hard for them."

There was a time when lowly Philly Park paled in comparison to a track like Monmouth. Those days are gone. There's a new paradigm in horse racing, and it's all about who has slot machines. Having them, Philadelphia Park is about to become a major player.
