SOLVIG TOPS DAY TWO KEEJAN

The horses from the complete estate dispersal of the late F. Eugene "Fitz" Dixon took the stage during yesterday's second session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington, and it was the star of

that consignment, the talented racemare **Solvig** (Caerleon), who stole the show. Sitting alongside Margaux Farm's Steve Johnson, Adrian Munro, owner with his father David of Highfield Stock Farm in Okotoks, Alberta, Canada, signed the winning ticket on the multiple graded stakes winner at \$750,000. Solvig is in foal to dual Classic winner Afleet Alex. "She's got everything going for her," commented Johnson, who boards about five mares for the Munros at Margaux. They also maintain a farm and board mares

in Alberta. Johnson added, "She's in foal to the right horse and she's in foal at the right time. She's got the race record, she's a lovely mare and she's got it all." Johnson admitted that he thought Solvig would bring a bit more money, but that his clients, who are trying to buy "one big mare a year" were right on the number. Adrian Munro indicated that Solvig's foal by Afleet Alex would definitely be returned to auction. "There's no debate about that," he affirmed. Among the Munros other bloodstock holdings are Crazy Ensign (Arg), a \$925,000 purchase from the 2005 Keeneland November sale; and the Canadian stakes winner Marisa Go. They are also partners with Team Valor in South African stakes winner Stratos (SAf) and in Fairbanks, the sales-topper at the 2004 Fasig Tipton Saratoga sale.

MAGIC DOWN UNDER

Financial analysts are prone to making bold predictions in the New Year, but while it would take a brave soul indeed to forecast the bloodstock market this term, the Conrad Jupiters Magic Millions' Yearling Sale has long set the barometer as the first of seven Australasian majors. There are 730 catalogued in four select sessions from Thursday through Sunday, and what has traditionally been a "type" sale now offers a catalogue that is discernably heavier on black type than ever before as Magic Millions continues its none-too-stealthy march on rival sale company Inglis. Last year, Magic Millions' receipts rose from A\$65 million to A\$80 million with three A\$1-million horses among the 572 sold at an average of A\$140,083--up from A\$117,262 in 2005, and it is not difficult to imagine a similar increase again. As always, by Easter, horses at the Gold Coast looked cheap: the Inglis Easter sale averaged A\$288,498, with Redoute's Choice (Aus) contributing considerably to a 39-percent increase. Notably, last year at Magic Millions, Redoute's Choice yearlings were thin on the ground with only four sold; this year he has 42 catalogued. Buyers are likely to clamor for yearlings by second-crop sires Hussonet, Rock of Gibraltar (Ire)--the sire of boom colt Murtajill (Aus)--and Johannesburg, whose first-crop efforts in the U.S. cannot have gone unnoticed here.

Deja Vu All Over Again...

It was the second consecutive year that Solvig made headlines at Keeneland. Bidding on behalf of Dixon at last year's January sale, Rick Abbott of Charlton Bloodstock secured the mare, who was carrying a foal by Pennsylvania darling Smarty Jones, for \$950,000, explaining that Mr. Dixon was keen on foaling a Keystone State-bred by the Kentucky Derby winner. Solvig, winner of the GIII Regret S. and GIII Pucker Up S., was consigned to the 2006 January Sale by

Gainesway, agent for Bentley Smith. Charlton was charged with consigning Solvig back to the sale yesterday. Abbott was satisfied, if not overwhelmed with the hammer price. "She's a year older and she's in foal to a \$40,000 horse as opposed to a \$100,000 horse," he offered. "Mr. Dixon was a motivated buyer last year. I thought she sold just fine." Abbott was pleased with the overall results of the dispersal. "I thought all the mares sold great," he said, adding that all of the horses were sold without reserve. "Some of the yearlings were a little disappointing, but they weren't bred to be commercial horses. I also thought the racehorses sold really well. It's amazing how thirsty [the buyers] are for horses close to running. I think we're probably right around where we thought we would be." With the dispersal behind him, Abbott reflected on the legacy of his friend and colleague. "I sat on the racing commission with him for 10 years and I really admired his dedication to the industry," he commented. "We really miss those people when they're gone--the people that give back to the industry as well as taking from it. He was a huge benefactor of so many things. It's the end of an era."

Numbers Decline at Keeneland...

Book 1 of the Keeneland January Sale saw a drop in gross, average and median, but the declining figures were not a major concern to Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "I would say this is a typical January Sale," Russell said. "This sale has a higher variable from year to year than any other--it doesn't have the consistency from year to year as other sales. But I don't see any great problem. The catalogue was slightly off from last year, and when you have a complete dispersal, that means everything sells. That had an effect on the average as well." He added, "It's too early to read anything into it. Come the end of business on Friday will be a better time for philosophical quotes. We have to go through the week and see exactly where we are." The average for Tuesday's second session was down 13.5 percent from last year, and the median was off 14.5 percent. Over the first two days, the average dropped 7.2 percent and the median was down 3.8 percent.

Lyonses Leap for Liberty...

Bidding on behalf of the Summerwind Farm of Frank and Laura Jane Lyon, bloodstock agent Des Ryan went to \$550,000 to land **Hello Liberty** (Forest Camp). The four-year-old filly was purchased for \$75,000 out of the 2004 Keeneland September sale and was campaigned by a partnership including trainer Larry Jones, John Ferris, Mike Riley and David Gamble. A winner in two of three starts as a juvenile, the bay matured into one of the leading middle-distance performers of her generation, winning the GII Nassau Breeders' Cup S. over seven furlongs before running Bushfire to a neck in the one-mile GI Acorn S. Selling as a broodmare prospect only, Hello Liberty was retired with four wins from 10 starts and earnings of \$284,239.

The Daly Show...

Last year, Edward Daly Bloodstock signed the tickets on four Keeneland January purchases, including the \$575,000 broodmare prospect **Magnificent Honour** (A.P. Indy). Daly hasn't had to reach quite as deep into his pockets this year, but he has been spending. The agent picked up a pair of seven-year-old mares on opening day, going to \$45,000 for hip 137, Saintlike (Saint Ballado), in foal to Grand Reward; and ponying up \$150,000 for hip 337, **El Laoob** (Red Ransom), carrying a foal by Songandaprayer. Things got a bit pricier yesterday, as Daly went to \$400,000 to get hip 489, **Ramayna (Ire)** (Entrepreneur {GB}). Consigned by Lane's End, agent, the five-year-old is a half-sister to champion grass horse and GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Northern Spur (Ire) and group winners Great Marquess (GB) and Kneller (GB). The unraced mare is in foal to Peintre Celebre. Daly was also the winning bidder on hip 537, **Stormy Gal** (Storm Cat). The 13-year-old, consigned by Hopewell Farm LLC, Agent IV, is carrying a foal by Gone West. She brought \$375,000. "I am buying for my brother Michael, who is building up his broodmare band," Daly remarked. "As always, we are trying to find Grade I pedigrees. Ramayna has one of the best European pedigrees, and Stormy Gal is a Storm Cat mare in foal to one of the best producing sires in the world. They were, for us, the picks of the sale." Michael Daly's broodmares, boarded at Paul and Claire Reece's Rockwell Farm in Lexington, now number about a dozen. "He owns part of North Light, and some of the mares will go to him," his brother added. G1 English Derby hero and champion North Light (Ire) (Danehill) was first or second in six of his seven career starts and earned \$1,989,577. The six-year-old, who went to stud in 2006, will stand the 2007 season at Adena Springs Kentucky for a fee of \$30,000 live foal.

Getting Friendly at Keeneland January...

A pair of broodmares out of European Horse of the Year User Friendly (GB) (Slip Anchor {GB}) brought back-to-back bids of \$525,000 yesterday. The first through the ring was hip 574, nine-year-old **User Cat** (Storm Cat), in foal to Fusaichi Pegasus. The dam of Cumin (Fusaichi Pegasus), who placed in a Group 3 event as a two-year-old last year, was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent, and purchased by Gaines-Gentry, agent. The second, hip 575, was **User History** (Mr. Prospector), carrying a foal from the first crop by Horse of the Year Ghostzapper. The 11-year-old, also from the Mill Ridge consignment, was bought by Stonewall Farm. "She is a perfect match for one of our stallions, Medaglia d'Oro," said Stonewall principal Audrey Haisfield. "The pedigree, the physical, everything matched. I would have loved for the price to be lower, but it was around what I thought she would bring." Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}), a three-time Grade I winner of more than \$5.7 million, joined the Stonewall stallion roster in 2005. His first crop of weanlings hit the sales ring last year, averaging \$170,280 for 25 sold. Looking to support their stallions, Stonewall was active during Book 1 of the Keeneland January Sale. "I think there is good quality in the catalogue this year," Haisfield said.

REGISTERS FIRST WINNER 8 JAN 2007

Session-Best Yearling to Eldon...

Bloodstock advisor Rob Nelson, doing his work from just below the press box in the sales pavilion, went to \$295,000 to acquire hip 649, a filly by Dynaformer out of the Petionville mare Caught in the Rain. The dark bay, the highest-priced short yearling of the day, was consigned to the sale by Mill Ridge on behalf of Lochlow Farm, which purchased this foal in utero for \$400,000 at the 2005 Keeneland November sale. "Her physical and her page are just what we are looking for," commented Nelson, who was acting for the Eldon Farm Equine of Ken Luke. "We've bought a lot of Dynaformers. We like Dynaformers. She was nice and long-legged with a beautiful top line. Everybody on the team liked her and we bought her." The immediate plans for their new purchase are fluid, Nelson explained. "We'll probably see how she develops and take her to the next sale, Saratoga perhaps, but if we don't get what we need to get, if we don't get the right margin, we'll go ahead and race her. We're certainly not afraid to race a horse like that." The Feb. 2 foal is the first to be produced by her dam, winner of the GII Mrs. Revere S. over the Churchill turf course and the GIII Athenia H. at Aqueduct. She earned \$455,034.

Eldon Equally Proficient as a Seller...

Eldon Farm has assumed a prominent role at the mid-level of the market, purchasing horses to pinhook or to race and resell. After acquiring the Dynaformer yearling session-topper yesterday, the Virginia-based operation took a turn on the selling end of things, returning to auction another filly by the Three Chimneys stallion. Eldon went to \$230,000 for the daughter of Arjunand (Diesis {GB}) at the 2004 Keeneland September sale and the filly, subsequently named Dyna's Destiny, upheld her end of the bargain. A 10 3/4-length maiden winner and third in Keeneland's Jessamine S. as a two-year-old, the bay made the most of two starts during her 2006 campaign, winning the Bedanken S. at Louisiana Downs before adding a victory in the Gaily Gaily S. at Gulfstream Park. Retired with those three wins from seven trips postward and earnings of \$124,695, Dyna's Destiny, offered yesterday as a broodmare prospect only, realized a final bid of \$550,000. Claiborne Farm's Bernie Sams signed the ticket on behalf of "a client of the farm." A full sister to SW Dynamist and a half to GSP Boyum (Valiant Nature), Dyna's Destiny hails from the extended female family of SW Binalong and GISP Kumari Continent.

Hopewell Goes Back-to-Back...

Rick Trontz's Hopewell Farm and Warren Rosenthal's Patchen Wilkes Farm teamed up yesterday on consecutive successful transactions at Keeneland. First through the ring was hip 631, the seven-year-old mare **Boston Lady** (Boston Harbor). Bred by Patchen Wilkes, the bay was offered as a yearling at the 2001 Keeneland September sale, but was bought back when bidding stalled at just \$11,000. She also struggled at the races, banking just \$140 in five starts and got off to an inauspicious start at stud when her first foal was born dead. The family's luck took a turn for the better yesterday when Boston Lady, carrying a foal by Silver Deputy, was hammered down to Needham and Betz for \$140,000. "They made a good buy on her," Trontz commented. "I think she was a really nice fit for Silver Deputy. I'm happy, Mr. Rosenthal is happy and, hopefully, the buyers will be happy." Following her dam into the ring was an attractive filly by Dixieland Band, which was purchased by Athens Woods LLC, a pinhooking operation, for \$260,000. "She was gorgeous, big and good looking," Trontz commented. "Not all the Dixieland Bands are big. It turned out to be a great mating."

TOBY KEITH HOLDS COURT AT KEEJAN

Country music superstar Toby Keith is on hiatus from touring, allowing him to sift through catalogue pages at Keeneland, both as a seller and a buyer this January. The owner of the Oklahoma-based Dream Walkin' Farm, whose best horse to date was the undefeated Cactus Ridge, generously took a few minutes yesterday to catch up with the TDN.

How did you get into the game?

About 10 years ago, my father had some friends that were into the business. We'd go out there to watch their horses run. We liked to go out there and just spend the evenings at the tracks sometimes, at Remington Park. Our friends had some and we partnered up with them on a couple and had a little success and I built my farm back there. We have 320 acres and 40 stalls, a seven-eighths mile track, starting gates and everything. We started breeding horses and we usually get a runner or two every year.

What's been your high point in the game?

Cactus Ridge is probably the best horse we've had so far. His two-year-olds are fixing to hit the track and there's a lot of hype on him. We're excited about that, but the stallion business is tough for everybody. But his horses certainly look the part.

What do you find most appealing about the Thoroughbred business?

It's really exciting. Especially when you're in the entertainment business, like me, or an athlete, you really have to find something to fall back on someday when your career is over. Fortunately mine is still rocking along, but I can't expect it to be this good forever. You'd miss going on that stage every night, but I get a real thrill out of going to watch a homebred. Buy you a good mare, create the mating, have the baby, raise it, train it, get it to the track and hit the winner's circle. It's real exciting. Honestly, I get as big a kick watching a claimer run as I do a stakes horse, I really like to watch them run.

How do you make time in your busy schedule to make it to Keeneland?

I can only come when we're off tour. We wrap up right before Thanksgiving and we don't go back out until February for two or three weeks and then we're off again and we don't go back until July. I only go when I'm not working. We start back in Albany, New York, the last week of January.

What are you trying to accomplish during this sale?

I've got a few we're selling. We're trading out some of our bottom mares and trying to buy a couple of nicer mares to add to the broodmare band.

Is this a lot of fun for you?

Yeah, I love it. It's a great hobby.

The bay colt has three half-sisters that sold well at Keeneland: La Crema (Kris S.), who brought \$420,000 as a KEESEP yearling; a yearling by Dynaformer that was a \$475,000 KEENOV weanling in 2005; and SP Andover Lady (Kris S.), who sold for \$425,000 as a KEESEP yearling. His dam was hammered down for \$370,000 during the opening session here.

Graduate Stars...

As well as stakes winners such as Cheeky Choice (Aus), Wonderful World (Aus), Divine Madonna (Aus), Permaiscuous (Aus) and rejuvenated sprinter Dance Hero (Aus), Magic Millions has enjoyed a dream run with graduates including two-year-olds Husson Lightning (Aus), Royal Asscher (NZ), Zizou (Aus), Cinq Rouge (Aus) and Hurried Choice (Aus). The Choisir filly Hurried Choice, a A\$150,000 purchase, won the Listed Gimcrack S. at Randwick for former South African trainer David Payne, and South African owner Markus Jooste. The Fusaichi Pegasus youngster Zizou, an A\$450,000 yearling who races in Coolmore's navy silks, won the Listed Maribrnong Trial S. at Flemington. Husson Lightning (Hussonet), purchased for A\$180,000 from the draft of Arrowfield Stud, and talented fillies Cinq Rouge (Red Ransom) and Royal Asscher (Stravinsky) have all both shown to advantage this spring, the former tasting stakes success in the Listed MVRC Arrow S., while the latter scored on Cup day in the Listed VRC Jayco Sprint. Cinq Rouge was a A\$120,000 purchase from the draft of Turangga Farm and Royal Asscher fetched A\$475,000, making her the most expensive yearling sold at Magic Millions 2006 by leading New Zealand nursery Cambridge Stud.

Coolmore Action...

Interestingly, Australia is the only country where the Coolmore conglomerate sells yearlings under its own banner, and it is among the leading consignors with 67 sold in 2006 for receipts of A\$18.2 million. Naturally, the majority of the yearlings sold by Coolmore are by Coolmore sires, but the Magic Millions draft is peppered with a few outside stallions. Among those, leading Australian sire Redoute's Choice, who is represented by Lot 83, a colt out of Liberty Rose colt; and Exceed and Excel (Aus), who is the sire of Lot 167, a filly from the immediate family of champion filly Tristanagerh. Coolmore stands the Fairy King horse Encosta de Lago (Aus), who is second only to Redoute's Choice in Australia. He has a mouth watering draft of 36, including a colt out of the Danehill mare The Golden Dane (Aus); a half-brother to champion mare Private Steer (Aus); as well as fillies from Melbourne Cup winner Jezabeel (NZ) and Golden Slipper winners Merlene (Aus) and Burst (Aus).

Making Their Own Page...

One of the most talked about yearlings is Coolmore's Hip 83--a Redoute's Choice colt from Liberty Rose. He will be offered by Coolmore on behalf of successful

breeder John Camilleri's Fairway Thoroughbreds. The colt's pedigree is modest. Despite bearing the Swettenham imprimatur through his second dam Cherry Garden (NZ) (Sir Tristram), one must look back to his fourth dam to find a Group 1 winner, the South Australian Oaks winner Lady Liberty. However, his second dam's half-sister Liberty Hall

was third in the AJC G1 Spring Champion S. The Magic Millions catalogue features the first progeny of 31 freshmen, including Dubai Destination, Exceed and Excel, Falbrav, Lonhro, Lucky Owners, Reset, Thorn Park and Untouchable. "Magic Millions is so much more than just a horse sale; it has a genuine carnival atmosphere and a wide variety of community events. Everyone at the Gold Coast is right behind us," asserted marketing manager Annie McDonald, who has the onerous task of coordinating 36 events. Herein is the key to Magic Millions: it is not traditionally a sale where one might expect to purchase a potential stallion prospect. But with a new generation of ebullient young trainers backed by a squadron of new investors, the idea that a horse can "make his own page" is gaining credence. Sires such as Exceed and Excel (A\$375,000), Lucky Owners (A\$350,000), Reset (A\$190,000), Thorn Park (A\$200,000) and Untouchable (A\$950,000) were all Inglis Easter graduates--and all have their first yearlings on offer at Magic Millions this week. Those seeking evidence that Magic Millions is the new territory for a savvy young buying bench need look no further than the charismatic Charge Forward, a A\$100,000 purchase who won the G1 Galaxy before going to Arrowfield Stud; and the immensely popular Stratum, a A\$320,000 Magic Millions purchase for trainer Paul Perry. Stratum won the Golden Slipper before going to Widden Stud in a deal believed to be worth around A\$7 million.

Upward Trend...

Magic Millions co-owner Rob Ferguson noted that Darley's consistent private purchases of top-drawer broodmares has implications that will reverberate with positive consequences. "We've seen a lot of private activity in broodmares where Darley have been paying around A\$1 million for mares that a year ago were worth maybe A\$600,000 or A\$700,000," he explained. "So that market has moved extraordinarily fast in the last year, and I think that's going to show up in the fillies market at this sale, while the colts will benefit from the stronger economy and stock market. The other thing to consider is that we have a stronger catalogue, because we had such a good sale last year. We figure that our catalogue in terms of pedigree quality is up 25 percent, and that's going to be another factor that will push us toward a higher average."

Magic Millions has built a solid reputation for producing athletes, including Golden Slipper winners Belle du Jour (Aus), Stratum (Aus), Dance Hero (Aus), Polar Success (Aus) and Ha Ha (Aus). This year, Murtajill (Aus) and Husson Lightning (Aus) are dominating ante-post betting for the Slipper. "Magic Millions started out not as a pedigree sale, but as a sale about type, and over the last 10 to 15 years there has been a major move in our market towards type, and I suppose that's all to do with the Golden Slipper and our emphasis on two-year old racing and speed racing," Ferguson said. "What you often find now is that type tends to overwhelm pedigree, and other sales like the big Easter Sale, have become more of a pedigree sale," he added. "They have fantastic pedigrees, but quite often a lot less precocious horses, yet it's the precocious ones that seem to come through and be good horses as young horses and also good horses as older horses."

Golden Opportunity...

Five of the last six winners of Australia's greatest juvenile event have been purchased from Magic Millions. "Yearlings offered here in January are naturally forward, precocious horses that have been free of the problems which might hold a horse back and make it necessary to sell at a later sale," said Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester. "It makes sense that these natural athletes will then emerge as the best two-year olds." The Clarry Conners-trained filly Belle du Jour began the Golden Slipper stampede for Magic Millions, when she overcame a tardy start to score a miraculous win in 2000. Purchased for A\$200,000, the daughter of Dehere went on to win the G1 Newmarket H. as a four-year old before retiring to stud with earnings of A\$3.2 million. Dehere has eight yearlings catalogued this year, including Lot 381, a 3/4 brother to Belle du Jour, being from Palme D'Or, a Royal Academy half-sister to the swift filly.

Magic Millions and peak commercial breeders' body Aushorse have again combined to bring in new purchasers from the United Kingdom, Ireland, Europe, United States, Hong Kong, Macau, Singapore, Japan, Korea, Malaysia, United Arab Emirates (Dubai and Qatar), South Africa and New Zealand, and the shape of the sale will ultimately be determined once the intentions of this group are revealed.

by Royal Academy**

Consigned by Coolmore Stud as agent

This much-admired colt is among 42 catalogued by leading stallion Redoute's Choice (Aus), who accounted for four of the top five-priced yearlings in 2006 at the Australasian majors and is set to cover a book of mares on Northern Hemisphere time. The colt is the first foal from Listed winner Liberty Rose (Aus), who has since foaled a colt by Encosta de Lago (Aus). Her fourth dam Lady Liberty (NZ) (Noble Bijou) won the G1 South Australian Oaks. At Magic Millions last year, Redoute's Choice had just four sell at an average of A\$410,000: across all sales he had 45 sell at an average of \$630,288.

**Lot 376, c, Sadler's Wells--Sunday Joy (Aus), by
Sunday Silence**

The incomparable Sadler's Wells has only had 12 yearlings offered for sale in Australasia, including a colt out of G1 Golden Slipper winner Ha Ha (Aus) also offered by John Singleton's Strawberry Hill Stud last January and sold to Wadham Park for A\$1.3 million. This strapping fellow, with bold markings, is the first foal of Sunday Joy, bred by Singleton in partnership with Arrowfield, which sent a handful of celebrated mares to Sunday Silence for several years. Ultimately knocked down to Gai Waterhouse on behalf of Singleton as the first A\$1 million MM yearling--in 2001--Sunday Joy fulfilled her destiny winning the G1 Australian Oaks. Her family is as close to blue hen as you'll get in the Southern Hemisphere as she is out of Oaks winner and producer Joie Denise (Aus) (Danehill), from celebrated mare Denise's Joy (Aus) (Seventh Hussar {Aus}).

Placed in the G1 Flight S., The Golden Dane is a half-sister to Seto Flowerian (Aus) (Bellotto), a Group 3 winner trained by Paul Cave before being sent by her owners to Japan where she has produced SW Fusaichi Junk (Jpn) and stakes placed Tiger Cafe (Jpn).

Arthur and Harry Mitchell's Yarraman Park Stud has a knack of providing top-drawer racehorses of late and this filly has immense appeal as a full sister to Arrowfield stallion Snitzel (Aus). The A\$260,000 MM graduate, who sold to trainer Gerald Ryan for A\$260,000 in 2004, won the G1 Oakleigh Plate before beginning stud duties in 2006. His Royal Academy half-sister fetched \$775,000 here last year to the bid of Wadham Park. Snippets' Lass foaled a colt by Fastnet Rock (Aus) (Danehill) in October.

She is among 15 fillies and 15 colts from the much anticipated first yearling draft of Darley's high profile "colonial" stallion, the champion sprinter Exceed and Excel, who stood at a fee of A\$55,000 in his first year at stud.

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

When E Z Warrior took his record to two-for-two with an impressive win over Great Hunter in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship, he looked set to be a major player in the battle for two-year-old honors. Unfortunately, sore shins saw those ambitions put on the shelf, but on Sunday, E Z Warrior returned to stake his claim to be regarded as a potential force in the three-year-olds ranks, capturing the San Miguel S. in 1:08 4/5 after battling through fast fractions.

A \$1.2 million two-year-old-in-training purchase, E Z Warrior is trained by Bob Baffert, who also conditioned E Z Warrior's sire, Exploit. Like E Z Warrior, Exploit was undefeated at two, winning four times at that age, including victories in the GIII Iroquois S. and GII Kentucky Jockey Club. Exploit captured the GII San Vicente S. on his reappearance at three, but then suffered his first defeat in the GII San Felipe S., coming out of that race with a career-ending injury.

Exploit was a son of Storm Cat and half-brother to four other stakes winners, including the GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero Prized. However, he had some fairly obscure blood on the distaff side--his dam was by My Dad George (by Dark Star), and his second and third dams were daughters of Petare and Ambehaving respectively--and this may have served as something of an anchor on his stud career. The record shows that he's sired just nine stakes winners in his first four crops, and besides E Z Warrior, his only other graded winner is the 2005 Champion Canadian two-year-old filly Knights Templar. Exploit's final U.S. crop are two-year-olds of 2007, and he now stands in Korea.

Until his injury, Exploit was regarded as a GI Kentucky Derby candidate. It may well be that E Z Warrior's connections have the same hopes for him, but the pedigree sends some mixed messages in that regard. E Z Warrior's broodmare sire, Carson City, is also the broodmare sire of last year's GI Kentucky Derby winner, Barbaro, but has generally been an influence for speed and precocity. Barbaro's dam, La Ville Rouge, was a very untypical Carson City in that regard, having high-class form at up to 11 furlongs, but Carson Jen, the dam of E Z Warrior, is far more typical of her sire's get. She broke her maiden over seven furlongs at Saratoga, but subsequently did all her best work over six furlongs, winning three more times and taking seconds in the Listed Mae de Vol Sprint H. and the Elie Desrtuel H.

There is some much stouter blood in the distaff side of the pedigree. Carson Jen's dam, Calamitous Jen, is an unraced daughter of Deputy Minister, out of Robertina. Robertina won the Monty Levine Classic H. over 7 1/2 furlongs at the Fair Grounds, and was twice stakes-placed at 8 1/2 furlongs at the same track. She was bred to stay much farther than that, however, as she was a daughter of the G1 English Derby winner Roberto, out of Bring Out the Band, who won the GI Acorn S. over a mile at three, but who also took the GII Demoiselle S. at nine furlongs as a juvenile. We can also note that the previous best runner to descend from Robertina is Royal Fantasy, a Monsun filly who was a highweight in German at three and five, and whose successes included the G2 Geman St. Leger.

The cross which produced E Z Warrior, that of a Storm Cat son over a Carson City mare, is proving to be a most effective one. To date, it has already produced at least six stakes winners, including the very fast graded stakes winner Rojo Toro, and the recent GI Hollywood Futurity victor Stormello. The reverse cross, that of Carson City or a son out of a Storm Cat-line mare, recorded what we believe is its first stakes score at the weekend when Carnack's Choice (by Carson City out of a Tabasco Cat mare) won the Turfway Prevue S.

It's no great shock to see Storm Cat and Carson City enjoying a synergy. Apart from the fact that Storm Cat combines well with Carson City's sire, Mr. Prospector, in general, Carson City's granddam is a daughter of Nijinsky II. Storm Cat's sire, Storm Bird, and Nijinsky II, were both bred by E. P. Taylor's Windfields Farm and were products of a very similar cross. Storm Bird is by Northern Dancer out of a mare by a son of Bull Page, with a second dam by a son of Flares. **Porter cont.**

Not surprisingly, to those who understand the potency of inbreeding and linebreeding through high-class genetic relatives, Storm Bird and Nijinsky II have proved to be a potent combination. There are already around 100 stakes winners with Northern Dancer duplicated through Storm Bird and Nijinsky II, and they include Group/Grade I winners Black Minnaloushe, Circular Quay, Footstepsinthesand, Good Reward, High Yield, Madcap Escapade, Nebraska Tornado, Scat Daddy, Spain and Golden Ballet.

BARBARO HAS NEW CAST APPLIED TO HIS LEFT HIND FOOT

KENNETT SQUARE, PA--Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro had a foot cast applied to his left hind foot on Jan. 3, 2007 by Dr. Scott Morrison, an equine podiatry expert from Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky. "This cast was applied with the goal of starting to help re-align his coffin bone properly in that foot," said Dr. Dean W. Richardson, chief of surgery. "His comfort on that foot has been good since the procedure." According to Dr. Richardson, radiographs taken on Jan. 8, 2007 "show improved alignment of his coffin bone and continued healing of the fractured right hind pastern region." His condition is stable and a firm decision concerning his discharge from the hospital has not been made." The next update will be posted on Tuesday, January 16, unless there is a significant change in Barbaro's condition.

JANUARY BOOK 1

We're always saying that strength of the catalogue, especially at mixed sales, must have something to do with what they bring. And the spate of 84 withdrawals -- a whopping 23 percent of the catalogue -- must have something to do with this year's Book 1 being down from last year. It was much more back to normal in that regard on Tuesday, and there didn't seem to be any sinister reason for Monday's big increase in cancellations. So the likelihood is that Book 1's 10 percent drop in gross, and 7 percent drop in average, was a combination of more horses missing and a somewhat uninspiring catalogue for top fillies and mares. The number of \$500,000-plus fillies and mares dropped from six to two on Monday, and from 13 to seven -- almost half in the entire Book 1. The good short yearlings certainly seemed to sell well. It was just that the overall catalogue, the F. Eugene Dixon dispersal notwithstanding, was simply not that strong.

One could certainly argue that the market hadn't changed so much from the price of Tuesday's session topper Solvig from the Dixon dispersal. Dixon had bought her last January in foal to Smarty Jones for \$950,000. She brought \$750,000 yesterday in foal to Afleet Alex. A literal reading of the difference in stud fees (Smarty is \$100,000, Afleet Alex \$40,000) would say that difference only accounted for \$60,000 of the \$200,000 decline in price, so that her price was actually down \$140,000 (16 percent) from last year. But say each horse's yearlings average 3.5 times his stud fee. Smarty Jones would average \$350,000, and Afleet Alex would average \$140,000, which is a difference of \$210,000. It's a matter of opinion, but my guess is that \$950,000 last year and \$750,000 this year isn't actually much different.

The January Sale has grown by a day per year since 2004 -- five days in 2004, six days in 2005, seven days in 2006 and eight days this year. We all keep saying there are a lot of overbred mares out there, and that's probably why they, and quite a few of the yearlings, are barely, if at all, bringing the stud fee. And that's in Book 1. It's ironic though in a way that there is still so much emphasis on pedigree and quality of mare in the mixed sales, because increasingly the evidence at the yearling sales is that the buyers want good individuals by sires they like, almost irrespective of the dam's side. Thankfully, there are plenty of breeders who still want to own a nice page as well as a good-looking mare -- when they can get it.

TOP APEX SIRE

APEX (Annual Progeny Earnings index) ratings tabulate a sire's proficiency at hitting certain percentile earnings targets over the last seven years (2000-06). The top 2 percent of earners are designated 'A Runners'; the next 2 percent 'B Runners'; and the next 4 percent 'C Runners.' A sire with 2 percent A Runners/starters over a seven-year period thus has an 'A Runner Index' of 1.00; 4 percent A Runners/starters = 2.00, and so on. Every year since 1998, when his first foals were four-year-olds, and therefore old enough to compare with 'all sires' instead of just those in his age group, A.P. Indy, along with Storm Cat and Danzig, have been North America and Europe's top three sires, judged by 'A Runner Index'. In a seven-year span (2000-06), A.P. Indy had a total of 1,087 'year-starters' (these indices are calculated by using annual earnings, each horse is counted as one starter each year it starts, within the seven-year range. It can also be an 'A Runner' every year it starts). Of those, 109 were A Runners, which is just a hair over 10 percent, so his 2000-06 A Runner Index is 5.01. This is the fourth time in the last 10 years A.P. Indy has occupied the top spot, while Danzig and Storm Cat have led this list three times each. In other words, in the last 10 years, no other sire has led the list, or even in fact cracked the top three. **Oppenheim cont.**

The same is nearly true of fourth and fifth spot as well. The three-quarter brothers Sadler's Wells and Nureyev were fourth and fifth every year, until Nureyev finally ran out of three-year-olds (a sire must have had 10 or more three-year-olds of the last year covered in order to be rated). He was promptly replaced by Danehill, whose last crop are three-year-olds this year. You might note also that Danehill and Sadler's Wells blew everybody else away in number of year-starters, with 1,540 and 1,631, respectively. That alone probably accounts for them scoring slightly lower indices (though still in the 4.00+ range, 8 percent A Runners/starters) than the other three, but the fact that these top five have effectively been the top five since the turn of the century says plenty.

At 18 this year, A.P. Indy is the youngest of this dominant top five, of which two others are dead, and Storm Cat and Sadler's Wells at 24 and 26, respectively. It goes without saying that a changing of the guard is inevitable, and the identities of the 'top sires in waiting' are included among the next ten sires on the list, of which eight had their first foals in 1997 or later (the two exceptions are Seeking the Gold and Kingmambo). Distorted Humor, who sired 20 stakes winners, including 10 Graded/Group stakes winners last year, continues to be the only sire with first foals 1997 or later (and a significant number of runners) with an A Index over 4.00. Smart Strike, Forestry, Germany's Monsun, Pivotal, Awesome Again, Wild Rush (exported to Japan), and Unbridled's Song round out the 15 horses on this list with an A Index of 3.00 or higher. Among sires with their first four-year-olds last year (first foals 2002), the Coolmore trio of Montjeu, Fusaichi Pegasus, and Giant's Causeway make that group's top five, along with Dixie Union and Yes It's True.

BRITISH BREEDERS' FREEDMAN CALLS FOR CHANGE IN REGISTRATION OF PREMATURE FOALS

British Thoroughbred Breeders' Association chairman Philip Freedman called for an end to discrimination against premature foals born before Jan. 1, during a keynote speech Jan. 9 to the TBA annual general meeting at the Hyatt Regency Churchill Hotel, London, England. Freedman's remarks follow the high-profile pre-Christmas birth of the Pivotal filly foal carried by world record-priced broodmare Magical Romance, who recently sold for 4.6-million guineas at Tattersalls December Sale. Magical Romance's first foal arrived 24 days prematurely and is consequently now regarded as a yearling according to the registration rules of British and other Northern Hemisphere jurisdictions, which dictate that all Thoroughbreds turn a new chronological age on Jan. 1. Should the filly race in the Northern Hemisphere as a 2-year-old and 3-year-old, she will face rivals older than herself. Freedman said: "It is of course a nonsense that premature foals of mares covered after the start of the covering season are discriminated against in this way." He called on the new British Horseracing Authority to consider change "in the near future" and lamented the "failure to gain any support from our colleagues in Ireland for a united approach" to the issue. Freedman asserted: "It is ultimately for the rules of racing, and not the stud book authority, who merely record when a foal was born, to regulate on how a horse's age should be determined." He will meet with BHA officials to discuss the issue. Freedman's comments come in the wake of announcement by U.S. Jockey Club the previous week that it had conducted numerous inspections of stud farms in nine states, to check on broodmares with early foaling dates after an increase in the number of foals registered as born in the first few days of January. Jockey Club registry staff discovered a small number of foals born prior to Jan. 1, which were subsequently registered as 2006 foals. Another episode involving premature foaling was only subsequently discovered in Britain. Endless Summer, winner of the G2 Richmond S. for juveniles in 2000, was subsequently determined as having been born on Dec. 26, 1997, rather than Jan. 2, 1998, as registered. SILVERTAND, BREEDER OF AFLEET ALEX, DIES John Martin Silvertand, who bred 2005 champion Afleet Alex, died Sunday after a lengthy battle with cancer, according to published reports. He was 61. Silvertand was born in England, where his family developed and owned Southwell Racetrack prior to its sale in the 1980s. He served in the Royal Air Force and, more recently, had been the private pilot for Fleetwood Mac. With John Devers, Silvertand co-owned the Hawkster mare Maggy Hawk when she was bred to Northern Afleet in 2001. Silvertand was her sole owner by the time she foaled a bay colt in 2002, but, by the terms of his agreement with Devers, that colt--later named Afleet Alex--was turned over to Devers, who sold the colt privately. Silvertand was diagnosed with terminal liver cancer in 2002, but credited the colt's performances with extending his life. Afleet Alex captured the GI Hopeful S. at two and ran a close third in the GI Kentucky Derby before his stunning triumphs in the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S. The bay retired to stud at Gainesway for the 2006 season. Silvertand is survived by his wife, Carolyn, and daughter Lauren.

JOCKEY WILLIAMS ACCEPTS BAN

Jockey Dean Williams, warned off for 18 months at last month's race-fixing enquiry, will not appeal the Horseracing Regulatory Authority (HRA)'s Dec. 11 decision, *Racing Post* revealed yesterday. Williams is currently based with Newmarket trainer Greg Chung and has asked the HRA for special dispensation which will allow him to continue to ride. "I couldn't afford £5,000 and, as there was also the risk of having to foot the bill for the HRA legal costs if I lost, I had to give up on the appeal although, as I have said all along, I didn't knowingly do anything wrong," Williams told the trade daily. "I will have a job with Greg if the HRA allow me to working in a racing stable. Hopefully they will look sympathetically at my request because I'm not qualified to do anything else and have a wife and young child to support." Fellow rider Brian Reilly, also banned for 18 months, has lodged an appeal against his ban.
