**MAKING THE RIGHT CHOICE**

Redoute's Choice (Aus) dominated Australia's majors in 2006 and the all-conquering son of Danehill continued the theme at the four-day select section of the Conrad Jupiter Magic Millions Yearlings Sale. Topping the fourth and final select session yesterday was hip 560, a colt by that stallion out of Candid Camera (Aus) (Victory Prince {Aus}), which was sold to Demi O'Byrne on behalf of Coolmore Australia for A\$900,000. Since 1997, O'Byrne has purchased 38 yearlings in Australia and New Zealand for a total of A\$16.7 million, with Danehill colts such as Churchill

Downs (Aus) and The Golden Dane (Aus) among his most successful buys. But this is the first time O'Byrne has given his stamp of approval to a yearling by Arrowfield's boom sire. Candid Camera is a half-sister to G1 Epsom H. winner Nick's Joy (Aus), and she has already produced the multiple stakes-winning juvenile On Focus (Aus) (Keltrice {Aus}). The sale of the bay, offered by Reavill Farm, contributed to an average of A\$471,286 for 35 sold by Redoute's Choice, who earlier had a A\$1.5 million colt and a sale-record filly at A\$1.4 million. "I take it as a tremendous compliment that Coolmore has invested in a colt by our top sire in the hope he may, in time, become a stallion prospect," Arrowfield's John Messara beamed. "And it was also pleasing for us at Arrowfield that Darley Stud, the other giant in the Hunter Valley, saw the value to pay A\$1.4 million for a filly by Redoute's Choice." **MM cont. p2**

**SUGAR SHAKES UP THE EL ENCINO**

Making her first start of 2007, Stronach Stables' **Sugar Shake** (Awesome Again) led nearly every step of the way to take Sunday's GII El Encino S. by a hard-fought one-length victory over **Kris' Sis** (Forestry) at Santa Anita. On the board in eight of her previous nine trips to the post, the homebred filly's most forgettable performance came in her lone other graded-stakes appearance when she was a distant seventh to **Wonder Lady Anne L** (Real Quiet) in the GI Coaching Club American Oaks at Belmont Park last summer. Nicely into stride, Sugar Shake flashed her typical early speed to argue the pace outside of **Preciousness** (Exchange Rate). She was joined by Kris' Sis on the far turn, who got a head in front at the eighth pole, but Sugar Shake fought back gamely and was going just the better of the two at the wire. **Cont. p2**

**Sugar Shake** kicked off her career with third-place finishes in Gulfstream maidens Jan. 6 and Feb. 19, respectively, and rounded out yet another triple in her two-turn bow at Keeneland Apr. 6. Runner-up in a seven-furlong maiden at Churchill May 3, she graduated at Belmont 22 days later and made it two straight with a 6 1/2-length allowance score June 29. Allowed some time to recover from her CCA Oaks effort, the daughter of 1999 GII Cotillion H. winner **Skipping Around** finished second in a Sept. 13 allowance back at Belmont, but ended the season on a higher note, taking a Nov. 17 event at Churchill in front-running fashion. The victory, already the fifth of the meet for trainer Bobby Frankel, was juxtaposed against the performance of 11-10 favorite **Cantabria (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), who was in contention for the opening five furlongs, but gave way readily and beat just one home. "She ran well," he commented. "She waits on horses, so when the other horse [Kris' Sis] ran by her, I wasn't sure she was going to come back at her, but she showed a lot of game-ness." Frankel suggested that Cantabria, an impressive winner over Hollywood's synthetic surface, failed to handle the conventional main track at Santa Anita.

## Conrad Jupiters Magic Millions

### Is In The Black...

Vinery Australia's Red Ransom is not expected to shuttle again to the Hunter Valley, but he is enjoying a purple patch at present with the highly regarded stakes-winning juvenile Cinq Rouge (Aus), and trainer John O'Shea had no hesitation going to A\$620,000 for a son of the proven Roberto stallion from the Marauding (NZ) mare Glammis (Aus). Sold as hip 716, the bay colt is from the family of GSP Primrose Sands (NZ). Sydney-based O'Shea, who conditions four-time Group 1 winner Racing to Win (Aus), contributed to a vibrant trainer-led buying bench with 11 purchases totalling A\$3,410,000. Also having a successful session was Encosta de Lago (Aus). Selling off a fee of A\$120,000, the Coolmore sire has averaged A\$336,852. The stallion's top lot yesterday was hip 653, a filly out of Dreaming of You (Ire) (Spectrum {Ire}) that attracted a final bid of A\$575,000 from trainer David Payne. The bay's third dam is MG1SW Gaily (Sir Gaylord), from the family of champion Pilsudski (Ire) and Japanese Group 1 winner Fine Motion (Ire).

### Do You Believe In Magic?

In 2003, Magic Millions' recorded an aggregate of A\$52.2 million and average of A\$92,008; in the ensuing four years, the figures have doubled, and the innovative sale company shows no signs of slowing its rapid progress. The sale closed Sunday afternoon with an aggregate of A\$108,403,500, up 35 percent, and a 30-percent average increase to A\$182,191. Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester said the results were in line with an estimated 20-percent increase in the quality of the catalogue. The second-tier fifth session of the sale kicks off at 11 a.m. Monday. The three-day third-tier sale beginning Wednesday.

## RINGSIDE... with Bronwyn Farr

*TDN's Australian correspondent Bronwyn Farr sat down for a one-on-one with Magic Millions principal Gerry Harvey, who owns the sales company in partnership with Robert Ferguson and John Singleton.*

### Has the sale met your expectations?

**GH:** I am extremely happy, because I thought if we got to A\$100 million turnover on the first four days it would be a wonderful result, and we are well over that at A\$108 million. We couldn't be happier with it.

### Will Magic Millions catch up to Inglis Easter?

**GH:** We can hold a two-day sale here and get an average as high as Inglis, that is not a problem. I am not into averages so much, I am more into how many dollars I get. So this year I think we will turnover between A\$250-\$300 million and no [Australasian] auction company has ever done that. The likelihood of Inglis doing that will be remote, I'd say. I don't see how they can go past us this year.

### There is a perception among many at the sale that the single bid of A\$2 million bid for John Singleton's Sadler's Wells colt appeared to be a bit of a 'set-up.' Was it?

**GH:** It looked like it, but it wasn't. As I understand it, there was another trainer that had exactly the same amount of money. Gai Waterhouse had syndicated that horse before it went into the ring [and] John Singleton had agreed to keep a quarter. So it was no different to a heap of other horses that sell for A\$100,000, A\$200,000, A\$300,000, A\$400,000 exactly the same way. It is a ploy used by people: Rob McAnulty's done it, John Singleton's done it...Gai's father Tommy Smith used to do it. It had a reserve of at least a million and I thought it would make a million and half--if a horse is worth A\$1.5m, is it worth A\$2m? I don't know. Probably no horse is worth it, but at the end of the day if it produces, it will have been a cheap [buy].

**Do you believe Magic Millions has outgrown its current complex?**

**GH:** There is an opportunity at the moment where we can sell all this, and the [Gold Coast] Turf Club can sell, and we can create something that is better than any racing centre in Australia. It would be a multi-purpose centre; not just racetracks, but sales, conventions, equestrian, entertainment, all sorts of things. We could do something truly outstanding if they all agree, and it has a reasonably good chance of coming off. Most of the people I am talking to say it is a good idea. I think there's a 70-percent chance to pull it off. If we don't, we will probably be here forever and that's not bad, but it could be a lot better, and we've lost an opportunity.

**Do you worry that the yearling sale will get lost in all the events around the Magic Millions Carnival?**

**GH:** I think that what we have done is to put a new spin on it. You go to the races and there are lots of old blokes in suits, dying. The big thing is to get all the young people to the races. People are not going to go to watch a horse race. You need more than that; you have got to have events. Glamour and pizzazz and people wanting to be part of something. We brought out Tara Reid and we took Magic Millions right across the whole of Australia. What is that worth in terms of your brand? I can't put a dollar figure on it, but Queensland Events can, and will.

**Is Tara Reid the right image to have connected to MM?**

**GH:** She's fantastic because she brought all these new people out--we got people who would never have come here and they bought a share in a horse and they are happy. The kids love it and the intelligent women hate it. Tell me the name of one Australian woman who could do the job! I think one day you will wake up and say, 'that bugger was right.' We've taken it to new people [and] we need new people, a bigger community thing; if we increase it just a small amount it is still worth doing it.

**Are you surprised that the domestic bench remains very strong in spite of increasing competition from offshore buyers?**

**GH:** I got into Magic Millions honestly believing that 50 percent of our sale would come from overseas, and I said it would happen within five to 10 years. I have been wrong. It won't happen within that time frame. But it will happen. International buyers account for around 30 percent of our sales now, and it was about that 10 years ago. The other side of it is we used to have turnover of A\$25 million. Now we have turnover of A\$250 million, so they spend more than what the total turnover was when we came here. Also, I just sold one horse for A\$170,000 to a South African who wants to leave it here with [trainer] David Hayes. Is that a South African sale or a local sale? Broken-in here, trained here, that's the best possible result, it is add-on.

**What is your prediction for session five?**

**GH:** I believe will be better than it has ever been [because] vendors like Coolmore and Arrowfield that would not put horses in that session [in the past], we've got them to the table at least, so it will get stronger and stronger.

**Do you think the Magic Millions 2YO race will have its restricted Listed status revised?**

**GH:** I think it is very difficult to overcome some of the objections, and it would set a precedent. But if we are still around in 20 to 30 years, maybe it will be a sire-making race equally as good as the Golden Slipper. But the race has increasing status to the point where it doesn't matter that it doesn't have black-type. Five of the last six Golden Slipper winners have come from Magic Millions. When we took over this place there had never been one, there was never going to be one, and it was considered impossible to train a horse for our race and then go on to the Golden Slipper--every trainer would tell you that. Now it is a complete turnaround. It is like everyone used to pin-fire their horses legs, and now noone pin-fires. So you have things that accepted wisdom, but they are not necessarily right, and you always have to challenge accepted wisdom. The older you get the more you become conservative and the more you want things to stay the same. But it doesn't work like that. And I'm not done yet!



## What They're Saying At The Sales...

"I just think there are a lot of very solid horses in the middle area, and every year you just see that vendors understand the right horse to send. So you get horses with funny-looking pedigrees by strange stallions, from say New Zealand, and you say, 'what is that doing here?' and then it makes A\$200,000. The vendors know, they understand the sale, and that's really encouraging. We have hit [winning bids of] A\$1.5 million and now A\$2 million--we have shown we can get those prices and more, that we are competitive at the top end, but we have just got a fantastic thickness in the middle as well."

"On the back of the inspections, which were up 50 percent, prices generally followed suit. For horses over A\$100,000 it was amazing how many people you had on them. Under \$100,000 it was a little thinner, but I still consider it a very strong sale overall. The fifth session will go up greatly from last year, I believe the average will be in the A\$60,000 plus region, and I think it is a sale of the future. It is relatively new, this year it has by far the best catalogue they have produced, and it will grow from here."

"What we might look at this year is to increase the select sale from four to five sessions; there is room for another select session, because there are more and more better-bred horses and too many are still going into the Easter sale, and not our sale."

"The promotion of the Magic Millions sale is great. There is a great 'feel-good' factor, a terrific feeling of being made to feel welcome, and it is fun. I don't think any country in the world mixes the horses business and pleasure as well as Australia does, and, of course, everyone here is on holiday."

**MIESQUE'S APPROVAL TO AWAIT CANADIAN**

Eight-year-old **Miesque's Approval** (Miesque's Son), winner of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, is expected to make his 2007 debut in the Feb. 3 GIII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream Park. The veteran had been pointing for the Jan. 27 \$500,000 Sunshine Millions Turf at Santa Anita, a race he won last year, but it has now been decided to keep him at home for his season opener. "After the Breeders' Cup, we thought that he might be sold as a stud prospect," said trainer Marty Wolfson. "That would have meant the Sunshine Millions would likely be his last race, so it wouldn't really matter if he shipped for the race. But since then, it was decided to keep him another year, and I don't want to start him out with a 3,000-mile trip to run, because he'll be shipping around for races as the season goes on. Besides, right now, graded black-type is more important to his future than money." He added, "Also, I'd like to see him get another chance to run against English Channel." Miesque's Approval was second to English Channel in the Canadian last year, and both are finalists for the Eclipse Award as champion turf horse.

**NOTIONAL TO AIM FOR ARKANSAS DERBY**

Trainer Doug O'Neill reports that GII San Rafael S. winner **Notional** (In Excess {Ire}) has the Apr. 14 GII Arkansas Derby as his long-term objective. "We'll talk it over with [owner] Paul [Reddam], and Notional would likely have a race first, but the Arkansas Derby is a potential goal," the conditioner commented. The California-bred is one of three Reddam-owned and O'Neill-trained candidates for this year's Triple Crown series.
