WHIMSICAL MISS TOPS KEENELAND FINALE

Whimsical Miss (Distorted Humor) topped yesterday's final session of the Keeneland January Horses of All Ages Sale in Lexington. The three-year-old racing or broodmare prospect, consigned by Warrendale Sales, agent, was purchased for \$160,000 by Three Chimneys Farm, agent. Whimsical Miss broke her maiden at Turfway Park Jan. 1. During the eight-day auction, Keeneland sold 1,862 horses for a record gross of \$72,868,200. The cumulative average of \$39,134 fell 11.9 percent from last year's figure of \$44,443. The median fell 6.3 percent to \$15,000. "We are very

pleased with this year's record performance," Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell said at the conclusion of business yesterday. "The record sales, realized despite a somewhat lighter catalog, reflect the strength of the market, particularly for young mares and broodmare prospects." Taylor Made Sales Agency led all consignors at the Keeneland January sale, with 152 head selling for \$7,550,800. Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock was the leading buyer with 11 purchased for \$2,939,000. Two fillies sold by Ahmed Zayat as broodmare or racing prospects attracted seven-figure price tags. Leading the way was 2006 Eclipse finalist **Point Ashley** (Point Given), who was purchased for \$1.8 million by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Bloodstock. Recent GI La Brea S. winner **Downthedustystroad** (Storm and a Half) was purchased for \$1.5 million by Tim McMurry's Fleetwood Bloodstock. The highest-priced yearling at the sale was a Distorted Humor colt purchased for \$500,000 by Jess Jackson's Stonestreet Stable.

JUMP, JIVE, YNEZ

Just five races after connections unveiled a possible star in the making with impressive maiden winner **Exhale** (Millennium Wind), CRK Stable, trainer John Sadler and jockey Corey Nakatani were back in the winner's circle with **Jump On In** (Jump Start), authoritative winner of yesterday's GI Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita. Jump On In wired a field of maidens by 5 1/4 lengths in her debut at Del Mar in August, but tired to fifth behind Point Ashley in the Sept. 4 GI Del Mar Debutante in just her second outing. Second to **Quick Little Miss** (Freud) in the Nov. 19 Moccasin S., the bay filly was coming off a five-length triumph in a Dec. 28 Santa Anita allowance contest. The 4-5 favorite was content to track the early leaders after bobbling at the break. She moved into contention turning for home, forged to the lead at midstretch and spurred clear to a 3 3/4-length victory. "At the top of the lane, I wasn't worried at all," said Nakatani. "I knew she was going to go by those two leaders. I just gave her a couple of reminders to keep her focused. I'm looking forward to going two turns."

BARBARO HAS 'IMPROVED SIGNIFICANTLY' AFTER LATEST SURGERY

The chief of surgery at University of Pennsylvania's New Bolton Center said Jan. 15 that Barbaro had "improved significantly" after undergoing surgery two days earlier to remove more of the left rear hoof that has been impacted by a bout of laminitis. "He is doing much better, but he has a long way to go," Dr. Dean Richardson said of the GI Kentucky Derby winner who had been dealt a serious setback in his effort to recover from a broken right rear leg and the laminitis. "He is eating well and we have not had him in his sling for the last 24 hours." Richardson said the Dynaformer colt, who has been at New Bolton since sustaining his broken leg in the May 20 Preakness S., has a good appetite and his vital signs are normal. He is, however, confined to his stall in the intensive care unit at New Bolton. If necessary to make him more comfortable, the colt will be placed in the protective sling at some point during the day. That is a radical departure from the scene two weeks ago, when Barbaro had made such dramatic improvement from his injuries that he was allowed outside to exercise and had the casts removed from both his right rear leg and his left rear hoof.

When a stallion comes up with three Breeders' Cup winners in his first three crops--as Awesome Again has done--he's clearly capable of just about anything. We therefore shouldn't be too surprised when he completes a Grade II double, as the Adena Springs star did over the weekend, with Awesome Gem and Sugar Shake.

Of course Awesome Again isn't just the sire of three Breeders' Cup winners. He also triumphed on Breeders' Cup day, when he narrowly defeated a powerful collection in the Classic, and he's a half-brother to a Breeders' Cup winner in Macho Uno, hero of the 2000 Juvenile. In the circumstances, one could be forgiven for thinking that Awesome Again must be one of the world's highest-priced stallions. However, there are as many as eight stallions in the U.S. which command higher fees than Awesome Again's \$125,000.

So what is the explanation?

The quick answer is that the 18 stakes winners in Awesome Again's first five crops equate to only five percent of his 355 named foals. Compare this to the statistics of most of the proven higher-priced stallions, such as Storm Cat (nearly 14 percent stakes winners), A.P. Indy (12 percent), Distorted Humor (11 percent), Kingmambo (nine percent), Dynaformer (nine percent) and Unbridled's Song (seven percent). Only Giant's Causeway has a strike rate similar to Awesome Again's.

The records show, though, that if you get a stakes winner by Awesome Again, there's an excellent chance that the stakes winner will prove good enough to win at graded level. Thanks to Awesome Gem and Sugar Shake, he has now sired 14 graded winners, which represent a perfectly respectable four percent of his output. Reduce the sample to Grade I winners and his record looks even better, as his six winners at the highest level--Ghostzapper, Wilko, Round Pond, Toccet, Spun Sugar and Dubai Escapade--equate to 1.7 percent.

There's every chance that Awesome Again's figures will improve further, as his three- and four-year-olds of 2007 reach full maturity. Both of Awesome Again's recent Grade II winners were gaining their first stakes successes at the age of four, underlining the fact that the Awesome Agains tend to improve with age (Wilko and Toccet being notable exceptions to the rule).

Awesome Again himself didn't race at two, despite having a March birthday. And even though he won the Queen's Plate and Jim Dandy S. at three, he didn't reveal the full extent of his ability until he was four in 1998. That was the year his unbroken sequence of six victories culminated in his triumph in the Breeders' Cup Classic. Consequently, it isn't surprising that Ghostzapper, Round Pond, Spun Sugar, Dubai Escapade and Snorter all enjoyed their most rewarding seasons at the age of four, whereas Anew, Personal Legend and Hotstufanthensome had their best financial years at five. It looks as though Awesome Gem and Sugar Shake are also set to boost their earnings significantly at four.

There's another reason for thinking that Awesome Again's figures are likely to show steady improvement over the next few years. Although his fee remained constant at \$50,000 through the 2003 season, his second-place finish among the freshman sires of 2002 should have ensured that his current three-year-olds are a well-bred collection with plenty of potential. With his fee rising to \$75,000 in 2004 and then to \$125,000 in 2005, one must hope that his young crops build on the bright start made by their predecessors (although how Awesome Again is going to improve on three Breeders' Cup winners is hard to imagine).

If Awesome Again has yet to prove as dependable a source of stakes winners as some of his high-priced rivals, is there any way in which breeders can help him?

As an individual he probably takes more after his broodmare sire, the medium-sized, well-proportioned Blushing Groom, than his sire, the tall Deputy Minister, who stood more than 16.2 hands. Consequently, I find it interesting to note some pretty sizeable individuals among the broodmare sires of Awesome Again's graded winners.

Two are out of daughters of Turkoman, a rangy individual standing 16.2 hands. Snorter's broodmare sire Meadowlake stood 17 hands, while Dubai Escapade is out of a mare by the 16.3-hands Saratoga Six. Time For a Change, the broodmare sire of the stakes-winning Rumor Has It, was another big horse. Toccet, Spun Sugar and Awesome Gem are, respectively, out of granddaughters of Caro, Irish Tower and Fappiano, three stallions who stood around 16.3 hands.

Needless to say where horses are concerned, this isn't a hard-and-fast rule but it could be worth bearing in mind.

DAM OF INVASOR HEADED TO HILL 'N' DALE

Quendom (Arg) (Interprete {Arg}--Queen of Victory {Arg}, by Cipayo {Arg}), the dam of Horse of the Year candidate Invasor (Arg) (Candy Stripes), is moving to Hill 'n' Dale Farms in Lexington. The 10-year-old mare is owned by Sandro Mizeroqui, and is scheduled to be bred to Distorted Humor.

"We're delighted that Mr. Mizeroqui has elected to make Hill 'n' Dale Farms home for such an important mare," said Hill 'n' Dale

President John Sikura. Invasor was named Horse of the Year in Uruguay after taking that country's Triple Crown and is a finalist for the Eclipse Award as top older horse of 2006. The five-year-old was a perfect four-for-four last season, with victories in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, GI Whitney H., GI Suburban H. and GI Pimlico Special. Overall, he has nine wins from 10 starts and earnings of \$3,904,070. Unraced Quendom also has a 2004 filly by Southern Halo named Queen Halo (Arg), and a 2005 filly by Orpen named Queen Dahlia (Arg), both of whom have yet to start.

FIRST FOALS FOR GHOSTZAPPER Horse of the Year **Ghostzapper** (Awesome Again--Baby Zip, by Re-launch) was represented by his first two reported foals over the weekend. The first, a colt, foaled late in the evening Jan. 12 at Adena Springs North in Ontario, Canada. Owned and bred by Adena Springs, the bay is the first foal from his dam, graded stakes winner Dash for Money (General Meeting). Adena Springs's Mike Rogers described the colt as a "super foal--extremely alert, with excellent size and bone." Ghostzapper's second reported foal, a filly, was born Jan. 14 at ClassicStar in Versailles, Kentucky. Out of multiple stakes winner Wilzada (Meadowlake), the filly is bred and owned by ClassicStar Farm. "Awesome--she's great looking and we're very pleased with her," farm manager Matt Lyons said of the new arrival. Ghostzapper stands at Adena Springs Kentucky for \$150,000 as the property of Ghostzapper Syndicate.
