### ISLAND IN THE SUN

**Friendly Island** (Crafty Friend) may be enjoying the California sunshine this winter, but it will be a working holiday for the New York-bred six-year-old. Freshened after running second as a 56-1 outsider in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs Nov. 4, he returns to action against three rivals in the GII Palos Verdes H. at Santa Anita this afternoon. The Anstu Stables color-bearer won six of his first nine career starts, including the Hudson H. in October of

2005, and capped that season with a fourth in the GI De Francis Dash. He picked up checks in the GIII Mr. Prospector H. at Gulfstream last January and in the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. at Oaklawn in April before returning to the winner's circle in his fourth start of the year, the May 20 GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. On the pace in his early efforts last season, Friendly Island changed tactics after a lackluster seventh-place finish in the July 15 GII Smile Sprint H. at Calder. He came from off the pace to be third in the GI Forego H. at Saratoga and, after an unsuccessful foray into turf racing that produced a seventh in the Sept. 30 GII Kelso BC H. at Belmont, rallied to fill the runner-up spot behind Thor's Echo on Breeders' Cup day. "I think we've figured out that he's better if we take him back and make one run," Mike McCarthy, deputizing for trainer Todd Pletcher on the West Coast, told *Daily Racing Form*. Carrying co-highweight of 118 pounds in the Palos Verdes is another veteran, six-year-old **Harvard Avenue** (You and I). The dark bay was sidelined for more than 14 months after suffering a ligament injury and returned to be third in an optional claimer at Hollywood Nov. 1. He followed with an allowance score two weeks later and just got up to take the Jan. 1 GIII El Conejo H. by a nose last time out. He gets an extra sixteenth of a mile to work with today. "He's come back really strong from a lay-off," said jockey Victor Espinoza, who has been aboard for two of the gelding's three starts since the layoff. "Every race, he's running better and better." **Field**, p2

### SALES COMPANIES CALL FOR STEROID POLICY

The Keeneland Association Inc. and Fasig-Tipton Company, Inc., yesterday issued a statement advocating the development of a policy regarding the use of anabolic steroids in sales horses. The sales companies have formed a committee comprised of their own representatives, as well as authorities on steroids and drug testing, members of the Consignors and Commercial Breeders Association and veterinarians, to establish guidelines for appropriate steroid use and for testing. Nick Nicholson, president and CEO of Keeneland, and Walt Robertson, president of Fasig-Tipton, were jointly quoted in the statement, which read, "We both agree that the use of anabolic steroids in sale horses is an issue that needs to be addressed for the betterment of the entire Thoroughbred industry. This is a concern that impacts each and every one of us, and one that requires the scientific expertise of veterinary professionals." Added CCBA President Bayne Welker, "The development of a policy is critical to promoting a sense of fairness and credibility among buyers, sellers and racing fans. We look forward to working with Keeneland, Fasig-Tipton and the team of veterinarians on this important issue." Dr. Stuart Brown, Dr. Scott Pierce, and Dr. Craig Van Balen, three vets eager to serve on the committee, offered the following statement: "We are confident that we can accomplish a policy that is both effective and practical for buyers and sellers alike."

**MISS FINLAND BOUND FOR DUBAI?** A tilt at the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Duty Free at Nad al Sheba has not been ruled out for champion **Miss Finland (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}), the only filly ever to com-

plete the Group 1 treble of the Golden Slipper, 1000 Guineas and VRC Oaks. Miss Finland, raced by Arrowfield, John Leaver's Planette Thoroughbreds and broadcaster Alan Jones' Belford Productions, is set to resume in the G1 C.F. Orr S. over seven furlongs at Caulfield Feb. 10. "A lot will be determined by

how she performs in her first start this preparation in the Orr," Arrowfield's John Messara said Friday. "If she is able to show a level of dominance at weight-for-age, I think we would then consider an international campaign--she would have one more start in Australia in the Futurity S., which is part of the International Mile series." He continued, "On the other hand, if she returns well, but is not as compelling, then we might just continue with an Australian program which is challenging anyway with four or five Group 1 races. The answer is that the filly will tell us herself." An outstanding performance in the Orr could prove to be a steppingstone to World Cup night and the Duty Free, a race won by Australasian darling Sunline (NZ) in 2001. From there, Messara said, it could be off to Royal Ascot for the G1 Queen Anne S. Noting Miss Finland's international pedigree, Messara added, "You would think she would relish the conditions over there, the long open stretches of Newmarket and Longchamp." Miss Finland has earnings to date of A\$3,252,925.

**JANIAK FINED FOR TARGET DRUG POSITIVE**

Joe Janiak, the trainer of Global Sprint Challenge winner **Takeover Target (Aus)** (Celtic Swing {GB}), has been fined HK\$200,000 (\$25,000) for a drug positive responsible for the withdrawal of the multiple Group 1 winner on the morning of the G1 Hong Kong Sprint. The seven-year-old gelding repeatedly tested positive for the drug 17-alpha-hydroxyprogesterone hexanoate, a prohibited substance in Hong Kong. In additional testimony before Hong Kong Jockey Club stewards yesterday, Janiak argued that in his 34 years as a licensed trainer, that he had never violated a similar rule and that his disciplinary record was clean. Janiak, a former taxicab driver, was ultimately held liable for the drug positive. The stewards found that Janiak was well aware of the presence of the drug in Takeover Target and that the substance, administered in Japan while he was there to contest the Sprinters S. in October, was "highly unlikely" to clear his system. In ruling that the events leading up to the Hong Kong Sprint "could have the effect of tarnishing the image of horse racing in Hong Kong," stewards decided that the appropriate penalty was HK\$200,000.

brought a final bid of \$57,000 to top the first of two open sessions of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale yesterday. A half-sister to SW Honor the Flag, **Spencers Storm**, sold as [hip 635](#), was consigned by Three Roses Stables and purchased by Over The Top Farm. Her third dam is Grade I winner Miss Josh.

The top-selling yearling on the day was [hip 784](#), a colt from the first crop by MGSW Alke (Grand Slam) out of Gorilla Mist (Saint Ballado). From the family of GSW and MGISP Important Business, the Florida-bred chestnut, named Boozer, was purchased for \$55,000 by Alton "Bud" Ison. He was consigned by Sue Vacek LLC, Agent II. Buybacks were down significantly from the two consignor-preferred sessions, but were up slightly from last year. The first open session last year saw 21.5 percent of the horses bought back, compared to 27.9 percent this year. The final session of the 2007 Winter Mixed Sale will be held today, with bidding beginning at 11 a.m.

**CLENBUTEROL, STEROIDS DOMINATE SOUTHERN CAL TALKS**

The use of clenbuterol and the potential elimination of anabolic steroids were the primary subjects of two meetings Thursday at Santa Anita. California Horse Racing Board Chairman Richard Shapiro, executive director Ingrid Fermin, and equine medical director Dr. Rick Arthur met with trainers in the morning and veterinarians in the afternoon to update them on the CHRB's plans and to listen to horsemen's concerns. "We've seen a marked decrease in respiratory diseases since we've been administering clenbuterol therapeutically," Dr. Karen Valko said at the trainers' meeting. "We're seeing far fewer incidences of pleural pneumonias and a significant decrease in lung X-rays." After hearing trainers complain of abusing clenbuterol at its Jan. 9 meeting, the CHRB medication committee had suggested a 28-day withdrawal period for the bronchodilator, effectively eliminating it from use for horses in training. However, after the Thursday meetings it appeared more likely that the committee would recommend a 72-hour withdrawal period and a switch to testing for the substance in blood rather than urine, a more precise means of testing. The veterinarian group endorsed those positions. There have been rumors that people have been administering clenbuterol within 90 minutes of post time, but Arthur said that blood tests can easily detect those types of administrations if they are occurring. He said at the trainers' meeting that recent blood tests the CHRB has been performing on horses racing in California indicate that only 14 percent of the horses showed any "measurable levels" of clenbuterol instead of the rampant overuse of the substance that has been alleged and none that would indicate race-day administration. "We look forward to welcoming several first-time consignors to Calder, but, for the most part, our regular long-term consignors are bringing the same high-class two-year-olds which have made our Calder Sale such a prolific source for quality runners," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "There are three Storm Cat colts in the opening two hours of the sale, so we're looking for a great start and a sustained run through the day. It's another very strong catalogue." The Magic Millions Yearling Sale came to a conclusion yesterday with cumulative gross receipts of A\$124,475,750, demolishing the previous record of A\$91.6 million. Magic Million Managing Director David Chester was especially impressed with the depth of trade over the course of the eight-day auction. "It really has been an outstanding sale," he commented. "Right from the first lot last Tuesday through the first five sessions and again this week with the sixth, seventh and eight session." Topping the last of the three open sessions was hip [1599](#), a filly by Oaklands Stud's ill-fated sire Iglesia (Aus). Consigned by Misty Downs Stud, agent, the daughter of Tres Rapide (NZ) (Paris House {Aus}) was purchased by Lauriston Thoroughbred Farm. "She's a pretty special filly," said Ron Maund, bidding on behalf of Lauriston. "We like to buy the good fillies and we thought she was one of the best here in [this part of] the sale. I had to go a bit higher than I thought, but with these quality yearlings you know other people are looking at them and there will be plenty of interest on them." The Friday clearance rate topped 80 percent to push the overall rate for sessions six through eight to a very healthy 78.3 percent. The overall saletopper was hip [376](#), a colt by Sadler's Wells --Sunday Joy (Aus), which fetched a bid of A\$2 million from trainer Gai Waterhouse.

**RECORD FILLY SIXTH ON DEBUT** Perfect Persuasion (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}), who set an Australian record for a yearling filly sold at auction when she made A\$2.6 million at the Inglis Easter sale, finished sixth of nine in a 1000-meter event yesterday at rain-soaked Ballarat. The full sister to the popular Alinghi (Aus) was sent off the \$2.30 favorite, but never reached contention, finishing 4 1/2 lengths adrift of the winner **Ana's Mail (Aus)** (Anabaa). The effort, while not a total surprise to trainer Lee Freedman, had the conditioner second-guessing himself nonetheless. "In hindsight I probably should have scratched her, but it is pretty hard when you are planning horses' programs around the middle of January and you are running into heavy tracks and biased tracks," he told *Australian Associated Press*. "This filly will probably need a couple of races to know exactly what she is doing. All in all I thought her run was quite satisfactory, and she will improve a lot on that."
