JUVENILE CHAMPS TOP EXPERIMENTAL

Recently crowned two-year-old champions **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) and **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy) earned top billing in their respective divisions in the 2006 Experimental Free Handicap, released by The Jockey Club yesterday. Campaigned by James Tafel, Street Sense received the high weight assignment of 127 pounds, while Frank Calabrese-owned Dreaming of Anna headed her division with a 123-pound impost. Street Sense weighed in four pounds ahead of GI Champagne S. winner **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg) and Dreaming of Anna was weighted three pounds higher than

Octave (Unbridled's Song), victorious in the GI Adirondack Breeders' Cup S. The committee weighted a total of 92 colts and 85 fillies, all of which finished among the top four in graded or otherwise unrestricted races with an added value of at least \$75,000, run in the continental United States. cont. p2

PIMLICO SPECIAL CANCELLED FOR 2007

The Maryland Jockey Club announced yesterday that the GI Pimlico Special, first run in 1937, has been cancelled for 2007. "We have limited purse monies available, are facing increasing competition from growing slot-fueled purses in West Virginia and Delaware, and are about to face an entirely new wave of competition this year when Pennsylvania's racetracks begin their slot operations," said Lou Rafetto, president and CEO of the MJC. Last year, the Pimlico Special was run May 19, the day before the Preakness S. "This is terribly disappointing," said Joe De Francis, CEO of the MJC and Executive Vice President of Magna, majority owner of the MJC. "It is unfortunate that circumstances are forcing us to take this action just days after Invasor, the winner of the 2006 Pimlico Special, was named thoroughbred racing's Horse of the Year for 2006."

Street Sense's 127-pound assignment is one pound above last year's high weight, Stevie Wonderboy, and is the highest assignment for a colt since Favorite Trick received 128 pounds on the 1997 Experimental Free Handicap. In the filly division, the 123-pound impost assigned to Dreaming of Anna is the standard weight for the top Experimental fillies and is equivalent to last year's high weight, Folklore. Both champions culminated their campaigns with a victory on Breeders' Cup day at Churchill Downs Nov. 4. Third in consecutive starts in the GIII Arlington Washington Breeders' Cup Futurity and Keeneland's GI Breeders' Futurity, Street Sense closed out the season with an eye-catching 10-length score in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Undefeated in four starts, the versatile Dreaming of Anna won on both the dirt and turf, running against colts and fillies. An easy 3 1/4-length winner against the colts in the GIII Summer S. at Woodbine, the chestnut proved equally adept on the dirt, winning the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile for Fillies.

Barbaro Update

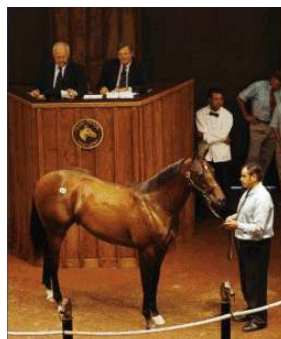
BARBARO STABLE, COMFORTABLE WITH FOOT CAST

KENNETT SQUARE, PA - Kentucky Derby winner Barbaro is doing well after a planned procedure yesterday. "Barbaro was placed under anesthesia yesterday to have his left hind foot cast replaced," said Dr. Dean W. Richardson, Chief of Surgery. "We also removed the cast on his right hind leg and replaced it with a custom-fabricated plastic and steel orthotic brace to give his foot additional support." An abscess near the lateral heel of his right hind foot was drained, and the brace that was applied will allow more regular treatment of that foot. "Barbaro had another smooth pool-recovery and has been comfortable with an excellent attitude and appetite since then," said Dr. Richardson. "We will probably replace his left hind foot cast under anesthesia again at least two or three times at roughly two-week intervals if his comfort is maintained. We were very pleased with the progress of his left hind foot since the last cast was applied." In addition, new shoes were placed on both front feet for additional support. Barbaro remains in the Intensive Care Unit of Penn's George D. Widener Hospital at New Bolton Center. The next update will be posted on Wednesday, January 31, unless there is a significant change in Barbaro's condition. *For more info on Barbaro, please see www.vet.upenn.edu.*

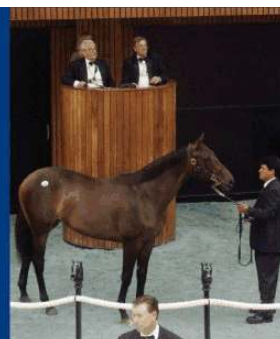

Under Royston Ffrench here making the quick turn-around and cutting back in distance, Tropical Star looked to be struggling for much of the journey, but Ffrench kept after the veteran and the pair came flying late to nip Thajja. GIII Holy Bull S. with a solid six furlong drill at Gulfstream Park Thursday morning. The three-year-old, winner of the Nov. 25 Gil Rensen S. at Aqueduct in his latest start, was caught in 1:11 4/5. "He's doing pretty well," said trainer Barclay Tagg. "He galloped out [seven furlongs] in 1:26 2/5 and my assistant says she

might have caught him a little bit quicker for the work, but that's fine. He might have an easy breeze next week, but we're pretty much ready to run next Saturday." Also working at Gulfstream, **Boca Grande** (A.P. Indy) worked three furlongs in :36 4/5, the 3 fastest of 11 moves at the distance. Winner of the Gil Demoiselle S. at Aqueduct Nov. 25, the Phipps homebred is being pointed toward the Gil Davona Dale S. Feb. 10. "She worked fine and she's moving along," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "I'm hoping to get her ready for the Davona Dale, but if she's not ready, she's not ready. I'm not in a hurry. We'll just watch her and see. It's still early and there's plenty of time."

SIXTEEN-RACE, \$30-MILLION BREEDERS' CUP IN 2010? News that the 2010 Breeders' Cup could consist of 16 races worth \$30 million in purses was revealed during the final session of the 31st Asian Racing Conference yesterday in Dubai. Speaking at the Marketing of Racing Carnivals Operational Session 5, Greg Avioli, CEO of Breeders' Cup Limited and chief executive of National Thoroughbred Racing Association, said that he was looking to take the event to new levels. The 2007 Breeders' Cup has already been expanded to two days and features three new races, the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile, Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint and Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf. "We want to make it the greatest meeting in the world," said Avioli. "We haven't outlined the extra races, but a turf sprint is an obvious one, especially having heard people's thoughts this week."

**ARC CONCLUDES IN DUBAI** The 31st Asian Racing Conference concluded yesterday in Dubai. Held at the Madinat Jumeirah Resort, the week-long event was the first ARC to be held in the Middle East. The theme of the conference was 'Racing Without Borders.' Among the highlights yesterday:

**'Star Wars' effect of Genetic Manipulation--**

The final day of the conference was governed by debate over the controversial growth of genetic manipulation, which could send the breeding sector into "disarray." Speaking at a Drug Control workshop, John McCaffrey, Director of Veterinary Services for Racing Victoria, said the rapid changes involving genetic development go to the very heart of breeding and could turn the industry upside down. "We're not there yet, but it's not that far away," said McCaffrey. "We're not prepared for it. I can see even more challenges on the horizon, and some of it is 'Star Wars' stuff. The Europeans seem to be moving to a pharmaceutical approach and we've been doing that method since 1964 and it doesn't work, whereas the Americans have a more clinical approach. We have to look to the technocrats and the administrators to sort it out, it would be a lost opportunity if that mechanism isn't started now."

**Darley, Coolmore & Breeding for Speed--**

In the breeding workshop, the competition between Darley Stud organisation and Irish-based Coolmore has opened up opportunities for smaller breeders, according to Mick Goss, owner of Summerhill Stud in KwaZulu Natal, South Africa. The competition gives mare owners more options, including being able to delay payments and cut costs. Small studs also can find a niche if they are agile and supply personalised customer service that breeders appreciate, Goss said. During the same workshop, Oliver Tait, general manager of Darley Australia, challenged conference delegates to consider ways to stem a tide of breeding and racing mostly for speed, which he defined as the emphasis on races of less than a mile in distance and two-year-old racing. This trend is detrimental to the Thoroughbred breed if it is detrimental to the sport of racing, he contended, adding that racing depends on "brave, sound horses" who compete over longer distances and for several seasons to "give it gravitas as a sport." Tait added, "By focusing on speed, we're moving away from horses that can possibly fulfill that criteria. We need more horses that are heroes; we need more Makybe Divas and more Deep Impacts."

**500-million Reasons to Focus on India--**

Charismatic racing owner and airline boss V.J Mallya urged the Subcontinent's industry to capitalise on the potential goldmine of new business. With 500 million people in booming India now under 20 years old, the Chairman and Managing Director of Kingfisher Airlines said, "There are a lot of youngsters finding well-paid jobs and living in the fast track."

**'Impact' is Helping to Make Strides--**

Meanwhile, the success of Japanese superstar Deep Impact (Jpn), an unremarkable-looking racehorse, is down to his incredible stride, extensive scientific data revealed. Dr. Hiroko Aida, from the Japan Racing Association, displayed the running form of Deep Impact in the veterinary science workshop. A host of measurements were taken from high-speed video data of the Kikuka Syo (Japanese St Leger) at a rate of 250 frames per second. Sophisticated analysis has revealed that the champion racehorse's ratio of overlap time to stride duration was 8.5 percent, compared to that of an average horse, which is 17.1 percent. It was postulated that this characteristic, which is also common to the great Secretariat, may be an essential feature of superior horses. Aida said that such video analysis could in the future identify the "next Deep Impact" before he hits the sale ring.

**New Club CEO elected ARF Chairman--**

Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, Chief Executive Officer-Designate of The Hong Kong Jockey Club, has been elected the new Chairman of the Asian Racing Federation (ARF), it was announced at the closing ceremony of the 31st Asian Racing Conference. Engelbrecht-Bresges has been a prominent figure in the German and Hong Kong horse racing industries for more than 20 years. "I am honoured to be elected as chairman and I believe that for Hong Kong to continue to head the ARF after four years of leadership already truly reflects our standing in world racing," Engelbrecht-Bresges said. "The ARF has come a long way as the key driver of major developments in the region's racing industry, and I have no doubt that our concerted efforts will further enhance our importance in the international racing arena."
