HOW SWEET IT IS

Sweetnorthernsaint (Sweetsouthernsaint) will have his work cut out for him after getting stuck with post 12 for today's \$1 million Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Park, but the four-year-old is still the 9-5 morning-line favorite to overcome the draw. With a short run to the first turn in the nine-panel test, trainer Michael Trombetta is hoping jockey Ramon Dominguez will be able to use the colt's speed to get position early. "We're at a disadvantage, but we've just got to roll with the punches,"

Trombetta told *Daily Racing Form*. "This is going to make things a little tougher on the rider. My horse has some speed and he usually likes to be forwardly placed, and I have every confidence that Ramon will be able to find a spot." Seventh as the favorite in the GI Kentucky Derby, GI Illinois Derby hero Sweetnorthernsaint was sidelined after finishing second in the GI Preakness. He came back to take an optional claimer at Laurel Oct. 19 and the Odessa S. at Delaware Park Nov. 11, but weakened late in the Jan. 6 GIII Hal's Hope H. at Gulfstream and ran third. **Cont. p2**

LAVA MAN'S MARCH ON THE MILLIONS

The winner of the \$1 million Sunshine Millions Classic last year, **Lava Man** (Slew City Slew) looks for new worlds to conquer in the \$500,000 Sunshine Millions Turf at Santa Anita today. The gelding kicked off a seven-race skein in last year's Classic and went on to take the GI Santa Anita H., Khaled S., GI Charlie Whittingham H., GI Hollywood Gold Cup, GI Pacific Classic and GII Goodwood BC H. The streak was snapped when he finished seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, but he is odds-on to get back on track here. "We plan to start a new streak,"

jockey Corey Nakatani said. The dark bay will break from post 10 in the 12-horse field, a fact that trainer Doug O'Neill feels will be an advantage. "That should give Corey ample time to dissect what's going on pace-wise, and either take it to 'em or sit just off it," O'Neill said. "We hope we're outside of any crazy speed." The likely pacesetters will break from the inside. **Railroad** (Double Honor) led nearly every step in the Dec. 31 GII San Gabriel H. before settling for second. **Wild Buddy** (Line in the Sand), runner-up in the Oct. 7 GII Oak Tree BC Mile, needs to rebound from three off-the-board efforts, including a sixth in the Dec. 16 Val Royal S.

Texcess (In Excess {Ire}). Armerian Summer was let go at 14-1 in the Jan. 6 GII San Pasqual H. last time out, but came flying in the stretch to be second, beaten just a nose. Get Funky, winner of the GII Del Mar Derby on the grass, returned after nearly four months on the shelf to be sixth in the Dec. 26 GIII Sir Beaufort S. at Santa Anita. He last tried the main track in a maiden claimer back in April, winning by 2 3/4 lengths and getting haltered by his current connections. Texcess makes his first appearance since capturing the Oct. 28 Cal Cup Classic.

Take d'Tour, the lone Grade I winner in the field, ships in from Florida as a deserving favorite. After a four-race winning streak in the spring and summer capped by victories in the GII Shuvee H. and GI Ogden Phipps H., both at Belmont, the front-running mare lost in three successive Grade I events, and trainer David Fawkes brought her back to the Sunshine State. She regained her confidence by defeating Florida-breds in the Elmer C. Heubeck H. at Calder Nov. 11, then steamrolled the competition with a 14-length stroll in the GIII Stage Door Betty H. at the same track Dec. 30. Fawkes flirted with the idea of keeping the six-year-old at home to take on males in the \$1-million Classic, but opted to put her on a plane to Santa Anita instead. "That race was significantly tougher," Fawkes told *Daily Racing Form*. The big mare will have a full field to deal with in the Distaff, and **Somethinaboutlaura** may have her say in the outcome. Heroine of the seven-furlong GII A Gleam H. last July at Hollywood, the chestnut went on a tear of her own later in the year. She captured the Cal Cup Matron over track and trip Oct. 28 in the middle of a three-race skein, and tuned up for this contest with a half-length loss as the runner-up in the 6 1/2-furlong Kalookan Queen H. on Santa Anita's opening day.

Charmisil, an allowance winner at Keeneland in April and at Belmont in May, took a long vacation before returning to be a close-up sixth in the Dec. 2 GIII My Charmer H. at Calder. The dark bay prepped for this test in a course-and-distance optional claimer Jan. 7, posting a decisive two-length tally. **Howboutrightnow** bids for her fourth consecutive victory. The four-year-old filly wired the field in an allowance test at Woodbine last September and in an optional claimer the following month. She held on gamely to take the Nov. 11 Maple Leaf S. by a nose in her latest.

Defending champion **Bordonaro** gets to stay home this time. The lightly raced six-year-old captured the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. at Oaklawn in April and, upon his reappearance in the GI Bing Crosby H. July 30 at Del Mar, was hit in the face by the whip of the winner's jockey and finished second by a half-length. He rebounded to defeat Eclipse winner Thor's Echo in the GI Ancient Title Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 7 at Oak Tree, but succumbed to a speed duel and settled for fourth to that rival in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint Nov. 4. Directly to his outside is **Proud Tower Too**, whose trophy case includes the GI Malibu S. and G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. Sidelined after that overseas triumph Mar. 25, the bay didn't race again until New Year's Day, when he lost the lead late to be second in the GIII El Conejo H. On paper, Bordonaro and Proud Tower Too are the swiftest horses in the race, and the draw may give the tactical edge to the latter. "I'd rather have [Proud Tower Too] inside," said Bordonaro's trainer, Bill Spawr. "Now we have to do the dirty work. I don't know if we'll be long gone. I think he'll lay on us. He always goes :43 [for the half-mile] and we do, too. I just hope he has enough air to the finish."

The gray has bullets in the holster for her return, but is winless in five attempts at this distance. **May Day Vow** capped a three-race winning streak with a sharp tally in Aqueduct's Nov. 12 Top Secret S. last time. The speedy **Shaggy Mane** won five straight in Northern California in 2006 and ships in off a fifth in Hollywood's Cat's Cradle H. Nov. 24.

Sekira looms the horse to beat off her third-place finish in the Jan. 15 GII Santa Ynez S. The chestnut filly, a maiden winner on the Hollywood all-weather and successful in an allowance test on the turf at that track, drops back a furlong off her graded effort.

Mistical Plan has also been facing tougher, finishing second in the Oct. 29 GIII Pocahontas S. at Churchill and third in the Jan. 6 GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita. She returns to sprinting for the first time since romping by 7 1/4 lengths in the Oct. 8 Cover Gal S. at this track. **Toll Road** comes off an impressive seven-length maiden tally against Cal-breds Jan. 6.

Texas Voyager stamped himself as one to watch following his Jan. 13 Santa Anita debut against open company and takes the class hike off quick rest. Trained by Bob Baffert, he went on to score by 7 1/4 lengths after contesting fast fractions of :21 3/5 and :44. The bay, who earned a 103 Beyer for that effort, was subsequently purchased by Stonerside Stable from Murray Smith. He has drawn the 14 post here. "I knew he was a fast horse," Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's a good-looking horse. But I thought he might need one. Once he got to the three-eighths pole, I realized he was a lot fitter than I thought he was. Coming back in two weeks is a little bit soon, but when he worked on Monday [three furlongs at Santa Anita in :34 4/5], he worked really well. Now he looks like he's ready to roll. I'm comfortable bringing him right back. He's extremely, extremely talented."

Also drawn to the outside is **Leonardo**. The gray enjoyed a solid juvenile season, winning two of three starts by a combined 20 lengths. He makes his first start since beating up on Laurel allowance foes by 10 3/4 lengths Dec. 6. **Ididn'tdoanything** and **Another Kris** both ship in from California after notching their first two starts.

WILD FIT DEAD GISW Wild Fit (Wild Wonder), purchased by Susan Magnier, Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith for \$3 million at the 2005 Keeneland November sale, died last month after a bout of colic, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The Florida-bred filly won her first two starts as a juvenile of 2005, following a Del Mar maiden win with a two-length tally in the GI Del Mar Debutante. She added runner-up efforts in the GII Oak Leaf S. and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies for owners Murray Smith and Brewer Racing Stable and trainer Jeff Mullins before being sold. The gray opened her sophomore campaign with a second in the GI Las Viregenes S. and a third in the GI Santa Anita Oaks, but was off the board in her next four starts. She finished fourth in her final outing, the Nov. 2 GII Chilukki S. at Churchill Downs, and became ill after being shipped to trainer Patrick Biancone's barn at Hollywood Park. Wild Fit compiled a record of 10-2-3-1 and earnings of \$555,079.

DOUGLAS CLEARED TO RIDE According to his lawyer, jockey Rene Douglas has been cleared to ride at the current Gulfstream Park meet. Attorney Carl Lida issued a short statement yesterday in which he said that recently obtained information turned over to the TRPB helped clear the way for the reinstatement. When reached yesterday in his office, Lida declined to elaborate on the situation. Douglas was banned Dec. 15 by Calder management for unspecified reasons and Gulfstream originally upheld the ban. Late yesterday, Gulfstream officials were unavailable for comment. Lida said he did not know when Douglas was going to accept his first mount. "He's been given permission to be on the grounds again, so I guess he will ride as soon as his agent starts booking mounts for him," Lida said. It is not known if any of the other nine jockeys banned in December by Tampa Bay Downs, Calder and Philadelphia Park have also been cleared to return to riding. The TRPB has yet to make any comment on the on-going situation involving the jockeys.

NYRA REPORTS DECEMBER LOSS IN EXCESS OF \$7 MILLION by Tom Precious, www.bloodhorse.com

The New York Racing Association reported a one-month operating loss of \$7.1 million in December, one of its worst periods ever during a traditionally slow racing month for the financially ailing racetrack operator. The loss was recently reported by NYRA to a federal bankruptcy court in Manhattan, where NYRA's Chapter 11 bankruptcy case is being considered. NYRA's continuing fiscal woes come as Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver, a Manhattan Democrat, told a New York City newspaper that there might need to be a new "vetting process" to re-do the bidding for NYRA's franchise to operate Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga. Silver told the New York Sun he believes the new governor, Eliot Spitzer, "will have to create a new process" for the franchise, which a panel dominated by appointees of the former governor, George Pataki, late last year recommended be awarded to Excelsior Racing Associates. Spitzer has yet to telegraph his desires for the franchise, though last year he raised warnings about the process by which the integrity of the bidders was determined. The NYRA franchise expires at the end of the year; NYRA and Empire Racing Associates lost out in a recent non-binding recommendation made by a government panel. Excelsior includes partners Steve Swindal, a partner with the New York Yankees, and casino developer Richard Fields. The group's financial adviser, William Mulrow, is a friend of the new governor; Mulrow on Jan. 25 was tapped by a panel as one of the finalists to become the next state comptroller. Mulrow told state lawmakers he would resign his affiliation with Excelsior if he becomes comptroller, and would recuse himself from any racing matters that came before the comptroller's office if the legislature backs his candidacy to fill a vacancy in the chief fiscal watchdog's post. The red ink experienced by NYRA in December is nothing new. Typically, the racing group loses between \$5 million-\$6 million during most Decembers. This year, though, NYRA reported an additional \$1 million in expenses due to its bankruptcy reorganization efforts. NYRA chief operating officer Bill Nader said those costs involved payments to bankruptcy lawyers, accountants, and the creditor's committee NYRA must fund. "December is always a tough month for us," Nader said. "From a cash-flow standpoint, it is not a good month. That's where we depend on the summer months to carry us through." Nader said NYRA conducts only 18 days of racing during December. He could not immediately say how much NYRA lost during all of 2006. [Click here](#) for the complete article.
