JOHN BELL DIES

John Arner Bell III, founder of Jonabell Farm, died Wednesday at St. Joseph Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky after battling pulmonary fibrosis. He was 88. Born in Pittsburgh on Dec. 11, 1918, he graduated from Princeton University, where he studied geology, and later attended Harvard School of Business, but a 1946 trip to Kentucky after his military service created an interest in the horse business. He financed the purchase of his first Thoroughbred mare through the sale of a litter of pigs and by 1954 he had leased a portion of Hamburg Place to launch the original Jonabell Farm. On that property, he cared for mares owned by Robert

Sterling Clark, and on Clark's behalf raised Never Say Die, who in 1954 became the first American-bred to win the Epsom Derby. Bell later purchased property on Bowman's Mill Road where he established a larger Jonabell Farm which he and his family owned until it was sold in 2001 to Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum. Bell was a partner and then owner of Cromwell Bloodstock Agency and established a reputation for integrity and wisdom in the purchase, sale, and management of horses and horse insurance for a wide range of clients. He bred 50 stakes winners, including Epitome, who carried the Bell colors to win the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and two-year-old filly championship of 1987. In addition to Never Say Die, horses foaled and raised at Jonabell Farm for clients included Damascus, Horse of the Year in 1967; and Summing, winner of the Belmont S. in 1981. Bell was a mainstay as a consignor to yearling sales at Keeneland, and he set records both as seller and buyer at the Saratoga yearling sales. Louis Wolfson, owner of Affirmed, entrusted the stallion's final years at stud to the management of Jonabell, and the 1978 Triple Crown winner is buried on the property, where a statue commemorates him. In 1949, Bell was elected president of the Kentucky Thoroughbred Farm Managers Club, and through the next half-century he lent his leadership and energy to many other associations. He served as president of the Thoroughbred Club of America and of The Blood-Horse, Inc. **Cont. p2**

THE RE-INVASION STARTS SATURDAY

The 2006 Horse of the Year **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes) will begin his championship defense facing eight rivals in Saturday's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. The once-beaten five-year-old shoulders top weight of 123 pounds and has been made the 6-5 morning-line favorite in his first start since solidifying year-end honors with a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. He will break from the rail under Fernando Jara.

Also in the field is six-year-old **Magna Graduate** (Honor Grades). Fourth in last year's G1 Dubai World Cup and most recently a 6 1/2-length winner of the Dec. 9 GIII Queens County H., Magna Graduate will break from post seven. The Donn is one of six graded stakes on Saturday's card at Gulfstream Park. The day's races also feature the return of last year's turf champion

Miesque's Approval (Miesque's Son). The eight-year-old, winner of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Mile, goes postward in the GIII Canadian Turf H. The GIII Holy Bull S. marks the sophomore debut of graded stakes winners **Nobiz Like Shobiz** (Albert the Great) and **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg). The Barclay Tagg-trained Nobiz Like Shobiz, off since winning the GII Remsen S. last November, was installed the 8-5 morning-line favorite and will break from the outside in the field of eight. GI Champagne S. winner Scat Daddy breaks from post two.

John Bell Dies (cont from p1)

During John Bell's long service to the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association, he was among its representatives influential in the creation of the American Horse Council, Kentucky Horse Park, and the initiation of the Graded Stakes Committee. He also chaired the Horse Council's committee which guided the creation of the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978, paving the way for the proliferation of simulcasting. Bell served on the Kentucky State Racing Commission during the disqualification of Dancer's Image from his first-place finish in the 1968 Kentucky Derby, and he served as vice president of the National Association of State Racing Commissioners. He also was a long-time director and a member of the executive committee of Keeneland, a member and steward of The Jockey Club, and a trustee of the Grayson Foundation. Bell received one of racing's highest honors when named honored guest of the Thoroughbred Club of America in 1971, and he was presented the University of Louisville's 1990 John W. Galbreath Award, which recognizes entrepreneurial vision and integrity within the horse industry. Bell also received the Kentucky Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders' William Coman Award for humanitarian efforts.

In recent years, Bell, a recovering alcoholic who had been sober for 30 years, had devoted much of his time and energy to assisting those suffering from substance abuse. Following a lead gift of \$250,000 by Jessica Bell, an endowment of \$1.4 million was raised to establish the Bell Addictive Diseases Chair last year at the University of Kentucky with a goal of better educating doctors on how to help patients suffering from alcoholism and drug addiction. "You can search the world over and not find a more respected role model in the Thoroughbred industry than John Bell," said Keeneland's President and Chief Executive Officer Nick Nicholson. "Unmatched for his integrity and respectful of opposing points of view, he was an enlightened leader at the regional, state, national and international level who worked for the betterment of the industry while seeking no credit for himself.

A highly successful breeder and owner, John Bell had a major influence and impact on such important Thoroughbred industry initiatives and organizations as the Interstate Horseracing Act, North American Graded Stakes Committee, the Kentucky Racing Commission and *The Blood-Horse Magazine*. The Thoroughbred industry has lost a valued leader and I have lost a true friend and mentor." Bell is survived by his wife of 60 years, Jessica, and four children, all of whom followed their parents into the Thoroughbred industry--John A. Bell IV, Jessica Bell Nicholson, James Gatewood Bell, and Bennett Bell Williams; nine grandchildren and two great grandchildren. In lieu of flowers, the family suggests donations be made to the Bell Chair or to Hospice of the Bluegrass. Visitation will be at Keeneland today from 2-4 p.m. and from 6-8 p.m. A graveside service will be held at Lexington Cemetary Saturday at 11:30 a.m.

BARBARO CREMATED GI Kentucky Derby hero **Barbaro** (Dynaformer), euthanized Monday after a prolonged battle with laminitis, has been cremated, according to published reports. The final resting place for Gretchen and Roy Jackson's colt has yet to be determined. Both the Kentucky Derby Museum and the Kentucky Horse Park are considered options, but there is also discussion of creating a regional racing museum in Pennsylvania. Though the Jacksons considered burying Barbaro at their farm in West Grove, Pennsylvania, that option was dismissed. "We'd like to bring him home, but this wasn't really his home," Gretchen Jackson told *Philadelphia Inquirer*. The Jacksons are intrigued by the idea of a museum honoring the rich history of Thoroughbreds in Pennsylvania. "One of the first people I'd go to is Pat Chapman," Jackson continued. "I intend to talk to her." A longtime friend of the Jacksons, Chapman was the co-owner of 2004 Kentucky Derby hero and champion Smarty Jones. The 2005 champion three-year-old Afleet Alex, winner of the GI Preakness S. and GI Belmont S., was owned by the Pennsylvania-based Cash is King Stable.

Formal Decree progressed through the handicap ranks last year for trainer Alan Swinbank in Britain, concluding the year by defeating 32 rivals in the Cambridge-shire H. at Newmarket Sept. 30. Racing for new connections, he kicked off 2007 in the right way by taking a rich handicap over course and distance Jan. 18 under Mick Kinane. The brown gelding came away very slowly here and trailed the field for most of the race. Kinane got to work approaching the straight and Formal Decree responded by putting in a sustained run to nip world traveller Ace in the last jump. "I missed the break as he got a bit upset in the stalls and we were last in the straight," said Kinane. NTRA ESTABLISHES BARBARO FUND The National Thoroughbred Racing Association has established the NTRA Charities-Barbaro Memorial Fund to raise awareness and money for equine health and safety research in honor of the Kentucky Derby winner who was euthanized Monday. One specific target for the direction of monies raised by the fund will be research projects that focus on laminitis. The NTRA will organize fundraising initiatives at major racing events and venues in the spring and summer, including the lead-up to the spring Classics. "The outpouring of emotion and support from racing fans has been so amazing that we wanted to find a fitting way for those fans and our industry to honor Barbaro," said Alex Waldrop, CEO of the NTRA. "We consulted with [Barbaro's owners] the Jacksons and other industry organizations to see how we could bring our combined resources to bear in this endeavor. We anticipate a busy few months as we work together to assist projects that can have a great impact on the health and safety of Thoroughbreds and, through our focus on laminitis, horses of other breeds as well."

FIRST FOAL FOR SAINT LIAM The first foal for deceased Horse of the Year **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado--Quiet Dance, by Quiet American) was born Jan. 11 at ClassicStar near Versailles, Kentucky. The bay colt is out of **Slewzig** (Seattle Slew), the dam of stakes winners Sandia Slew (Marked Tree), Angelica Slew (Saint Ballado) and Chantilly Princess (Hadif). During his 2005 championship campaign, Saint Liam won the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, GI Stephen Foster H., GI Donn H., GI Woodward S. and GI Clark H. The six-year-old was euthanized last August after suffering a leg fracture. He covered 115 mares during his only season at stud at Lane's End in Versailles.

FIRST FOAL FOR WANDO Canadian Horse of the Year **Wando** (Langfuhr--Kathie's Colleen, by Woodman) was represented by his first reported foal when Tricky Vixen (Clever Trick) produced a colt Jan. 25 at Dr. Dede McGehee's Heaven Trees Farm near Lexington, Kentucky. Wando was named Canada's Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old after sweeping the country's Triple Crown races in 2003. The seven-year-old also won the 2002 GII Grey Breeders' Cup S. and the 2003 GIII Marine S., while earning over \$2 million. He stands at Lane's End for a 2007 stud fee of \$7,500.

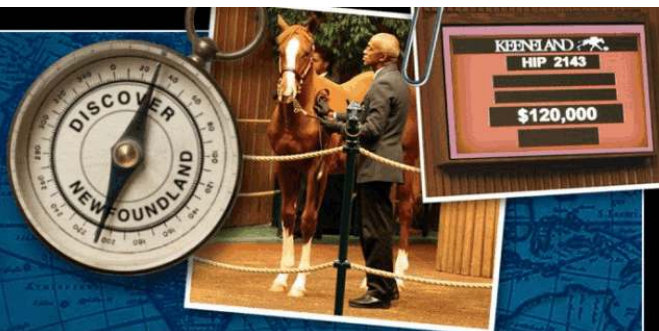

NYRA Signal Cut to Account Wagering Outlets:

The New York State Racing and Wagering Board has turned off the New York Racing Association's simulcast signal to an estimated two dozen account wagering outlets. Regulators criticized NYRA for delays in submitting contracts to the agency for review, a delay that cost the racing entity about \$25,000 in Aqueduct betting revenues Feb. 1, the first day of the signals being cut. NYRA in the past submitted over 100 agreements with wagering outlets to the board for a blanket approval. This year, it sent in the agreements for separate approvals. But Daniel Toomey, a spokesman for the racing board, said NYRA did not submit the contracts until only a week ago--despite a Jan. 31 deadline for the signals to be cut off. "NYRA would have done itself a huge favor by giving those contracts to us a month ago rather than just a week ago," Toomey said. Toomey estimated about two dozen signals were halted, while Bill Nader, a NYRA spokesman, said it was down to about 16 companies. Betting outlets that saw NYRA's signal go dark included Las Vegas Dissemination Co., AmericaTab, XpressBet, the Atlantis hotel in the Bahamas and Connecticut Off Track Betting and at least three companies in Canada.

Saylor Establishes Fleet Indian Scholarship:

Paul Saylor, who, in conjunction with Jack and Laurie Wolf, established the Ashado Scholarship in 2006, is funding a new scholarship in the name of his most recent Eclipse Award winner, New York-bred Fleet Indian. Saylor is a member of RFE's Board of Directors. Fasig-Tipton also made a contribution to the scholarship. "In recognition of the fact that The Race for Education would like to increase its support for students in New York, I felt this would be a great opportunity to utilize Fleet Indian's banner year in an effort to gain more awareness of the Race for Education in the state of New York, as well as show appreciation for the Big Apple Award and support New York-breds and New York racing."
