RETURN OF THE DON

Less than two weeks after being crowned Horse of the Year, GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes) gets back to work in today's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. The Shadwell Stable colorbearer worked five furlongs in 1:00 4/5 at Palm Meadows Jan. 27. Regular rider Fernando Jara will be in the irons. "It doesn't feel like there's a lot of pressure," Jara commented. "It's a very tough race, but I just have to go into the race trying to be as

patient as I can be. From the one hole I should be able to get a good position. There doesn't seem to be a whole lot of pace, so if I have to, I can go close to the front. That might change. He usually lets me do what I want." The lightly raced **Chatain** (Forest Wildcat) owns two wins over the Gulfstream main oval, including a game tally in the GIII Hal's Hope H. last out Jan. 6. The bay's only career defeat came to Showing Up in a Gulfstream allowance last March. **Magna Graduate** (Honor Grades), fourth in last year's Donn, enters off a 6 1/2-length victory in Aqueeduct's GIII Queen's County H. Dec. 9.

BACK TO 'BIZ'NESS

Nobiz Like Shobiz (Albert the Great), one of the most exciting juveniles of 2006, makes his sophomore debut in the GIII Holy Bull S. on the Donn undercard. He opened his career with a dazzling 10 3/4-length maiden win at Belmont Park Sept. 9, then finished second behind **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg) as the 7-5 chalk in the GI Champagne S. Oct. 14. Trying two turns for the first time in the GII Remsen S. at the Big A Nov. 25, the Elizabeth Valando homebred couldn't have been more impressive, scoring by 6 1/2 lengths. He has been working sharply at Gulfstream since the beginning of the year for his return. "If he had come back in the Breeders' Cup, I couldn't have done some of the things I wanted with him," Barclay Tagg told *Daily Racing Form*. "It was a tough race. I doubt he could have beaten Street Sense, and all running him there would have done is screwed him up for this." Scat Daddy also makes his first start this season. He followed his victory in the Champagne with a well-beaten fourth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 4. Field, p3

TURF CHAMP FACES SEVEN

With Invasor and Nobiz Like Shobiz receiving most of the hype today, defending turf champion **Miesque's Approval** (Miesque's Son) comes in a bit under the radar in the GIII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream. The Live Oak homebred, who outran his 10-1 odds to place second behind English Channel in last year's running, went on to add victories in the GII Maker's Mark Mile S. Apr. 14, the GII Firecracker Breeders' Cup H. July 1, the GIII Red Bank S. Sept. 9 and the GI Breeders' Cup Mile Nov. 4. "I haven't done a lot with him since the Breeders' Cup," trainer Marty Wolfson told *Daily Racing Form*. "He's eight years old and happy, but hopefully his class will overcome that fact, especially over this turf course, where closers really seem to do well." Field, p4

Winner of the G1 Manikato S. at this venue in September, the five-year-old mare took Caulfield's G2 Schillaci S. over the minimum trip Oct. 14, but was most recently third in the G1 Salinger S. at Flemington Nov. 4. **Virage de Fortune**, victorious in the G1 Australia S. at this track last February, makes her first start since finishing seventh in the G1 Doomben 10,000 S. May 27.

Awesome Gem, first or second in six of seven starts, came from out of the clouds to post his first stakes score last time out. He picks up five pounds off that effort. Midnight Lute captured the GIII Perryville S. going seven panels on the Keeneland all-weather in October and was third at the same trip in the Malibu. He was beaten just a nose in the San Fernando, but was caught in the final furlong, and will have an extra sixteenth to negotiate here.

Forefathers, a \$680,000 FTSAUG yearling, bids for his third straight victory. After an educational seventh on the grass in England, the son of the swift Star of Goshen graduated in his first try on dirt at Calder on Thanksgiving. The Zayat colorbearer added a wire-to-wire allowance tally over the same surface Dec. 26 and has been training smartly in the interim. **Adore the Gold** aired by 10 3/4 lengths in his career opener, a sprint at Delaware Sept. 11. He followed that with a two-turn win in the Dover S. at the same track Oct. 21, but his perfect record came to an end when he ran fifth in the GIII Nashua S. Nov. 3 at Aqueduct. John Murphy's homebred rebounded with a win in Laurel's H.S. Mitchell S. Dec. 6, after which he shipped to Florida. The dark bay has posted back-to-back bullet works at Gulfstream, including five furlongs in :59 1/5 Jan. 25. "He's doing really good and working really well for this race," said trainer Mike Gorham.

Liquidity has competed solely in stakes company since winning first time out at Oak Tree Sept. 27. The bay concluded his juvenile campaign with a valiant runner-up finish, beaten just a neck by Stormello, in the GI Hollywood Futurity Dec. 16. "He's doing so well," said trainer Doug O'Neill. "He's bred to run all day and he trains like it. As long as he continues to improve, he'll be very tough." O'Neill previously saddled another J. Paul Reddam three-year-old, Notional, to take the GII San Rafael S. **Kolo** tries the main track for the first time here after batting .500 in four turf outings. In his most recent start, the dark bay prevailed in a tight finish of the Eddie Logan S.

SILENT WITNESS TO BE RETIRED Silent Witness (Aus) (El Moxie--Jade Tiara {Aus}, by Bureaucracy {NZ}), who captured the imagination of the racing public in Hong Kong and beyond by winning his first 17 trips to the post, will make the final start of his career in Sunday's G1-HK Centenary Sprint Cup at Sha Tin Racecourse. The decision to retire the bay gelding was made by trainer Tony Cruz and owner Archie da Silva, who cited a degenerative condition in the seven-year-old's hind legs. "It will be an emotional saying goodbye to him after everything he has given us," da Silva commented. "All the memories will come flooding back, but it's best that he retires now and with honor. Anything else just wouldn't be right for a horse like him." After cruising to a debut victory at Sha Tin Dec. 26, 2002, Silent Witness was an unstoppable force on local soil, posting his record-breaking 17th consecutive success Apr. 24, 2005. He suffered his first loss at the hands of top local miler Bullish Luck in his next start and was a game third in that year's G1 Yasuda Kinen in Japan. After a short break, Silent Witness returned to the Land of the Rising Sun and did Hong Kong proud, taking the Sprinters' S. in October 2005, becoming the first representative of the SAR to win overseas since Fairy King Prawn (Aus) landed the 2000 Yasuda Kinen. A mystery illness contracted while preparing to return to Hong Kong ruled Silent Witness out of the 2005 G1 Hong Kong Sprint, a race he had won in the previous two seasons en route to being named Hong Kong Horse of the Year and Champion Sprinter. Clearly not the same horse after his return from Japan, Silent Witness has failed to win in eight subsequent tries, but was a gallant second in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint this past December. To date, Silent Witness has 18 wins from 28 career starts and earnings in excess of HK\$62 million (\$7.5 million). Connections say Silent Witness will spend his retirement at "Living Legends," the international home of rest for champion horses outside Melbourne, Australia.

DEL MAR BREAKS GROUND FOR POLYTRACK

Del Mar officially broke ground Jan. 31 for the installation of a Polytrack surface, which will replace the main dirt track of the Southern California oval. "Our objective is to be finished around April 1," said Craig Fravel, executive vice president of the Del Mar Thoroughbred Club. "We began taking rails out in December in preparation for the new track." Fravel said that the dirt surface would take less than a week to remove, which would be followed by installation of the drainage system. The track configuration will not change, though a hedge on the clubhouse turn is being removed, giving the track about seven feet of additional width on that turn. Because Del Mar is installing the same synthetic material Keeneland did in Kentucky, Fravel, DMTC Vice President of Racing Tom Robbins, and track foreman Steve Wood plan to spend time at the Lexington track during its spring meeting to help develop a maintenance program. Fravel and Robbins had joined Hollywood Park's Martin Panza, Del Mar director Rollin Baugh, and Thoroughbred Owners of California's Wilson Shirley on the initial visit to England to investigate synthetic surfaces in March of 2003. By April, Del Mar hopes to be able to bring in a few horses to test the surface. However, because the June 8-July 4 San Diego County Fair takes place at the track, horses will not be able to come in to train until just before the summer meeting. The surfaces of the track devoted to the fair, such as the stretch, where a large stage is installed, will be covered with HexaDeck, a temporary heavy-duty flooring/roadway, to protect the Polytrack surface. Last year, Del Mar had a higher incidence of breakdowns than normal. One of the difficulties, officials said, is the number of horses stabled at the seaside track, which does not have a large training oval. Though one of the Los Angeles-area tracks remains open during the Del Mar meeting, both Hollywood and Santa Anita are located about 100 miles north. "We're going to try to cut back on the numbers if we can," said Fravel. "We will be having talks with the horsemen to see what the optimum number is." The Polytrack surface may also help to increase morning training time because less maintenance is required.

LAVA MAN LIKELY FOR BIG 'CAP Lava Man (Slew City Slew) appears to be headed toward a title defense in the Mar. 3 GI Santa Anita H., according to trainer Doug O'Neill. Only John Henry (1981-82) and Milwaukee Brew (2002-03) have won consecutive runnings of Santa Anita's premier race. "It's definitely where we're pointed," O'Neill said. "As long as he continues to do well, it's a very strong possibility that's where he'll run. I think it's the right move." Lava Man had his seven-race winning streak snapped when seventh in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic Nov. 4, but kicked off the new year on the right foot with a victory in Santa Anita's Sunshine Millions Turf S. last Saturday.

Dynatonia last visited the winner's circle after an allowance victory on the Gulfstream grass in February of 2006. He was third in a Keeneland allowance in April, but went to the shelf after finishing out of the money in three straight, including a seventh in an optional claimer at Belmont Park June 23. Making his return here, the bay closed from fourth to catch pace-setting favorite Baron Von Tap from the inside at the eighth pole and inched clear.

Making her 2007 debut in a Gulfstream allowance going a mile Jan. 13, she finished an even fourth and was 2-1 to move up off that effort. Cuaba stalked the pace from second and outgunned front-running Sophia's Reward (Petionville) to the wire to take it by a neck. Lifetime Record: 9-2-2-1, \$80,830.

IRELAND TAX EXEMPTION AXED Ireland's long-standing tax exemption on stallions will end next August, it was announced on Thursday. Introduced in 1969, the immunity has been the focus of a European Commission policy to abolish what it claims is "state aid" and this week's Finance Bill ruled that the corporation tax rate of 12.5 percent would be paid. As a counter to the new move, it was announced that the country's stallion owners can deduct "relevant expenses" and write off the purchase cost of a stallion against income over four years. Joe Hernon, chairman of the Irish Thoroughbred Breeders' Association, reacted positively to the announcement. "The new proposals are welcome and would indicate that the government is trying to help us compete in an exceptionally competitive, high risk and volatile industry, which is rural-based and very labour intensive," he told the *Racing Post*. "Most countries in Europe and internationally support their bloodstock industries through generous incentives as they recognise the economic benefits. Time will tell if the measures announced today are working--we will know the impact in three or four years, if the quality horses are still being retired in Ireland as everyone in the bloodstock industry very much hopes will be the case."

Having recorded 41.2 percent of the vote, the Sascha Smrczek-trained colt ousted Gestut Park Wiedingen's G2 Prix Dollar scorer **Soldier Hollow (GB)** (In the Wings {GB}) and Stall Blankenese's G1 Deutsches Derby winner **Schiaparelli (Ger)** (Monsun {Ger}) for the honor. Bred by Heinz Wacek, Prince Flori gave his syndicate of owners the ultimate highlight when recording a three-length defeat of Oriental Tiger (Ger) in the Baden-Baden feature in September. He had earlier captured the G3 Albert von Metzler-Rennen at Frankfurt in May before finishing fourth behind eventual G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Rail Link (GB) in Longchamp's G3 Prix du Lys the following month. Prince Flori's sire was awarded the Horse of the Year award in 1994 and 1995, while his grandsire Acatenango (Ger) earned the same acclaim in 1985, 1986 and 1987.

SELECT SALE SETS NEW RECORDS The 2007 Karaka Select Yearling Sale concluded yesterday with every previous record going down. The positive momentum generated during the Premier Sale carried over into this week's activity, as gross receipts exceeded NZ\$21 million, easily surpassing the previous record of NZ\$13.5 million established in 2000. The cumulative turnover from both sales (NZ\$78.4 million) also established a new mark for the National Yearling Sales Series, with the Festival and Carnival Sales still to come. Officials at New Zealand Bloodstock were understandably giddy over the results. "Particularly noticeable has been the considerable strength of the domestic buying bench with lots of new faces amongst the regular buyers, which reflects the revival of confidence in our racing and breeding industries since the recent tax changes," commented Petrea Vela, NZB marketing manager. "The promise of increased returns to owners has already had an effect on their investment activity which, for vendors, means more funds available for reinvestment marking the start of a very exciting period in our industry's history."
