MOLENGAO CHARGES TO SAN ANTONIO WIN

Molengao (Brz) (Royal Academy) produced a dramatic late kick to just edge **Ball Four** (Grand Slam) on the wire to win the GII San Antonio H. by a head yesterday at Santa Anita. The six-year-old chestnut, looking for his first graded stakes victory, was runner-up over the turf in last summer's GII Sunset Breeders' Cup H. and was coming off a third-place finish over the main track in the Dec. 1 GIII Native Diver H. Sent off at 6-1 yesterday, Molengao fell back off the early pace, swept to the outside for the drive and finished powerfully. "He got some dirt in his face and we got shuffled back a little bit further," explained winning rider Garrett Gomez, who inherited the mount after Victor Espinoza was injured earlier on the card. "I was able to wait and try to regroup, because I know this horse has a solid one-eighth of a mile kick and we'd be in good shape if I could find daylight. I was able to find a spot at about the three-eighths pole and things worked out." The victory completed a big weekend for Gomez, who won two stakes races at Santa Anita Saturday. As for what is next for Molengao, winning trainer Paulo Lobo said, "We'll talk with the owner [Gonzalo Torrealba of TNT Stud]; he runs on dirt or grass and we have a lot of options." RECORD 450 EARLY TRIPLE CROWN NOMS

A record 450 horses, led by juvenile champions **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) and **Dreaming of Anna** (Rahy), have been nominated to the 2007 Triple Crown races. The 450 early nominations bests the previous record of 446, posted in 2003. The cost for each early nomination is \$600. The early nomination period ended Jan. 21. A late-nominating period, when each nomination costs \$6,000, closes on Mar. 31. Jim Tafel's **Street Sense** established himself as one of the early favorites for the GI Kentucky Derby off his dominating win in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last November. The winner of the filly counterpart to that race, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Frank Calabrese's **Dreaming of Anna** is one of only five fillies to have been nominated for the Triple Crown races, which include the May 5 Kentucky Derby at Churchill Downs, May 19 GI Preakness S. at Pimlico and the June 9 GI Belmont S. at Belmont Park. "We are highly impressed at the remarkable response we have received once again for racing's Triple Crown," said Edward P. Seigenfeld, executive vice president of Triple Crown Productions. "Each year we are hopeful of widespread participation and we continue to be rewarded with an amazing amount of enthusiasm from horsemen the world over."

SILENT WITNESS NINTH IN CAREER FINALE Archie da Silva's seven-year-old gelding **Silent Witness (Aus)** (El Moxie--Jade Tiara {Aus}, by Bureaucracy {NZ}), the most successful Hong Kong-based racehorse of all time, finished ninth of 10 runners in his career finale, yesterday's G1-HK Centenary Sprint Cup at Sha Tin. Silent Witness never really got into Sunday's 1000-meter Cup, a race he'd won twice before. Instead, it was the seven-year-old **Scintillation (Aus)** (Danehill) who shined, carrying jockey Eric Saint Martin to a 3/4-length victory over rival **Absolute Champion (Aus)** (Marauding {NZ}), the winner of the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint in December. Trained by Danny Shum, Scintillation is owned by Mr. and Mrs. Hui Sai-fun. Despite being denied the fairytale ending, the popular Silent Witness was recognized by the 27,000-strong crowd at Sha Tin for a brilliant career that saw the sprinter win nine of Hong Kong's Group 1 events and 18 races in all. His resume included a remarkable stretch of 17 straight victories from his debut in December 2002 until April 2005, a run which eclipsed the 16-straight victories established by American champs Citation and Cigar. Trained by A. S. Cruz and ridden by jockey Felix Coetzee in every one of his 29-race career, the Australian-bred registered consecutive victories in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint in 2003 and 2004 and swept the three legs of the Champion Sprint Series in both 2004 and 2005. Silent Witness was twice voted Horse of the Year at the Hong Kong Jockey Club Champion Awards, and earned the title of champion sprinter three times. He retires as the highest prize money earner ever in Hong Kong racing with a bankroll of HK\$62,496,396, or about \$6.55 million. "He began his career at a time when Hong Kong was in the midst of an economic depression and SARS," reflected an emotional da Silva. "He has that fighting spirit that took him through 18 wins, breaking so many records. That same spirit is in me; it's also in the Hong Kong people. He has made us all very proud." Supporters will be given one more chance to say goodbye to their hero when Silent Witness is paraded at a farewell party at Sha Tin Feb. 25. The gelding will then retire to 'Living Legends,' the international home of rest for champion horses outside Melbourne.

STRONG CONTENDER SUFFERS TENDON INJURY John Oxley's **Strong Contender** (Maria's Mon-Kopenhagen, by Dynaformer), scratched out of Saturday's GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park, has suffered what could be a career-ending tendon injury, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The four-year-old's trainer, John Ward, told the publication that the colt was lame in his stall Friday morning, and that an examination the following morning revealed a significant tendon tear. Ward added that Strong Contender may initially have been injured during his disappointing fifth-place effort in the Jan. 6 GIII Hal's Hope H., and could have further aggravated the problem when he worked four furlongs in :50 3/5 at Gulfstream last Tuesday. Third in last season's GI Blue Grass S., Strong Contender went on to capture the GII Dwyer S. by 7 3/4 lengths. He added his second Grade II win with a tally in the Super Derby in September. An \$800,000 KEEAPR juvenile purchase, he has won four of his eight starts and banked \$618,000.

MEDICAL CARE AT ROOT OF BIG A CANCELLATIONS ? According to a report on *Daily Racing Form*, the cancellation of a portion Saturday's program at Aqueduct and the entirety of Sunday's following a pair of nasty spills wasn't due to track conditions. Instead, jockeys at Aqueduct refused to ride the final four races Saturday because they were upset about treatment received at Jamaica Hospital, which, as the closest trauma center to the Ozone Park oval, is where jockeys injured at Aqueduct are sent. Track officials then decided to call off racing Sunday as well. On Thursday at Aqueduct, a three-horse spill sent jockeys Jose Santos and Ramon Dominguez to the hospital, while a third rider, Eddie Martin Jr., declined medical attention. Santos was first admitted to Jamaica Hospital, but, unhappy with the care, checked himself out on Friday evening and transferred to North Shore University Hospital in Manhasset, New York. At North Shore, Santos's injuries were judged to be more severe than originally diagnosed at Jamaica, according to *DRF*. Santos is expected to miss significant time after reportedly suffering two fractured vertebrae and a cracked breastbone. On Saturday jockey Norberto Arroyo Jr. was injured in a spill and, according to *DRF*, asked Aqueduct's Emergency Medical Services personnel to take him to North Shore, about 25 minutes away. The EMS workers refused, and instead he was taken to Jamaica, which is about 10 minutes away. Arroyo, who suffered a cut above his left eye, was released from Jamaica Hospital at approximately 7 p.m. Saturday and, according to his agent, Jose Amy, is unlikely to miss any time. Martin was also involved in the second spill, but again appeared to have escaped injury. Before racing began Saturday, riders had met with track management and track doctors to ask that North Shore be the preferred hospital, should jockeys require hospitalization. There was no immediate word on if the situation will affect Wednesday's card at Aqueduct.

CHAMPION MOM'S COMMAND EUTHANIZED

The 24-year-old **Mom's Command** (Top Command--Star Mommy, by Pia Star), named champion three-year-old filly in 1985 after winning New York's Filly Triple Crown, was euthanized Saturday at owner/breeder Peter Fuller's Runnymede Farm in New Hampshire due to infirmities of old age, reports *The Blood-Horse*. The chestnut won the GI Acorn S., GI Mother Goose S. and GI Coaching Club American Oaks in her championship season, which also included a victory in the GI Alabama S. As a two-year-old of 1984, she had won the GI Selima S. Mom's Command was trained by Ned Allard and ridden in nine of her 11 wins by Fuller's daughter Abigail. She retired with a record of 16-11-2-1 and earnings of \$902,972. As a broodmare, Mom's Command failed to scale the same heights she had on the racetrack. From 15 foals of racing age, she has produced 11 starters, 10 winners and one stakes winner, Jonesboro (Sefapiano), who recently was runner-up in the Jan. 6 Louisiana Breeders' Cup H. at Fair Grounds.

No Problems for Nobiz:

Nobiz Like Shobiz (Albert the Great) came out of his win in Saturday's GIII Holy Bull S. in fine shape, according to trainer Barclay Tagg's assistant Robin Smullin. "He ate up all his food and looks ready to go to the next step," Smullin said. The colt will likely make his next start in the Mar. 3 GII Fountain of Youth S. "That's the way Barclay is leaning right now," Smullin added. "If there are any glitches along the way, he can come back the next week in another race someplace else, but the plan is to point for the Fountain of Youth." Trainer Mike Gorham reported Saturday's GIII Swale S. winner **Adore the Gold** (Formal Gold) also came out of his race well. "He looks great," Gorham said. "We're weighing all the options about what is next and taking it one race at a time. Barclay seems to have a plan mapped all the way through the Triple Crown, but we're not quite there."

Meditations Drills Bullet for Davona Dale:

Meditations (Out of Place), 10 3/4-length winner of Calder's Three Ring S. last December, worked a bullet five furlongs at Gulfstream yesterday in :59 1/5. The Ralph Ziadie trainee is expected to make her sophomore debut in Saturday's GII Davona Dale S. Also possible for the Davona Dale is GII Demoiselle S. winner **Boca Grande** (A.P. Indy). "She's worked good and has been down here the whole time," trainer Shug McGaughey said of the Phipps filly, adding a decision on Boca Grande's participation in the Davona Dale would be made mid-week.

Impressive Debut for Curlin:

Among all the graded-stakes races Saturday at Gulfstream, Midnight Cry Stable's three-year-old **Curlin** (Smart Strike) made an impressive debut against maidens in the day's fourth race. Trained by Helen Pitts, the colt romped home by 12 3/4 lengths in the seven-furlong contest. "We were excited about what he might be able to do, but I didn't think we'd see him dominate the way he did," Pitts said. "We'll think about the [Feb. 17] Sam Davis at Tampa, although there's a horse going there I'm not sure he's ready for. An allowance [at Gulfstream] can always end up just as tough. But I also can't run from horses forever. He's got to take them on some time to see what he can do." The 1 1/16-miles Sam Davis is expected to attract GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. runner-up **Any Given Saturday** (Distorted Humor).
