WHAT CAN BROWN DO FOR YOU?

South African trainer Herman Brown has made a splash at the Dubai International Racing Carnival over the past few seasons. He has a chance to continue his run of success with **Indochine (Brz)** (Special Nash {Ire}) in today's \$250,000 UAE 1000 Guineas. The chestnut filly showed a great deal of promise in three starts in her native country, landing the G1 Grande Premio Joao Cecilio Ferraz at Cidade Jardim last April. She made her Nad Al Sheba debut on opening night of this year's Carnival, coming from just off the pace to take a 7 1/2-furlong conditions event over the turf. She makes the switch to the main track this evening, but has the full confidence of her conditioner. "It looks a tough race and this will be her first start on dirt, but if she

handles it, I think she will very hard to beat," Brown commented. The main track seems the strong suit for **Greetings (Brz)** (Choctaw Ridge), who is perfect in four tries over the surface. A Group 3 winner in Brazil, she too made a successful desert debut, winning a seven-furlong conditions event by 3 3/4 lengths Jan. 25.

STORMELLO HEADED EAST

G1 Hollywood Futurity hero **Stormello** (Stormy Atlantic) will make his three-year-old debut in the Mar. 3 GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park, the *Daily Racing Form* reports. The chestnut has not been out since his game neck score at Hollywood Dec. 16. "Mt first inclination was to take the low road, but the Fountain of Youth looks good in the stallion book, the purse is higher, and it is a mile and an eighth," owner/trainer Bill Currin told *DRF*. "I want that added distance--we have to creep up to a mile and a quarter." If the colt runs lights out at Gulfstream, he could head halfway across the world for the Mar. 31 G2 UAE Derby at Nad Al Sheba. "It's something that's on the plate," Currin continued, but added, "he'd have to win [the Fountain of Youth] laughingly."

COMPROMISE TABLES LEGISLATION BACKED BY JACKSON

Proposed Kentucky legislation that sparked controversy in the Thoroughbred auction community was tabled Feb. 14 after a compromise was reached between the bill's backers and several entities related to the commonwealth's signature industry. The compromise on House Bill 388, which sought the creation of laws that would require both disclosure of ownership and production of a veterinary history on horses offered for sale in Kentucky, was accepted by the House Committee on Licensing and Occupation during the group's session at the Capitol Annex in Frankfort. The bill will be tabled for at least the remainder of the 2007 legislative session so that principals taking stands on both sides of the key issues raised in the legislation can work toward an industry-wide consensus, officials said. Negotiations will be conducted under the umbrella of a revised version of the Sales Integrity Task Force, which was formed in 2004 by the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association in response to similar concerns raised then by horsemen regarding the auction industry. "We are satisfied with the compromise," said Jess Jackson, the billionaire winemaker and horseman who backed the bill under the guise of the Horse Owners' Protective Association he helped form last year. "And we have all agreed that we need to meet a consensus for the betterment of the industry. Kentucky needs to take the lead in how this industry needs to be run." Those who argued that the bill was vague and would be difficult to implement also endorsed the compromise, which was primarily hammered out in a quickly called meeting held at Keeneland Feb. 13--the day before the scheduled committee hearing, and just five days after the bill was filed with the Kentucky legislature. "I think there was a realization that these are complex issues that need perspective and study, and shouldn't be in a bill that is introduced on a Friday and decided on the following Wednesday," said Keeneland President Nick Nicholson. 'ROMAN' DEAL CANCELLED Lawrence Roman had sold a half interest to IEAH Stables and Sanford Robbins in his three-year-old **Lawrence the Roman** (Point Given) last week, but, following a poor showing by the colt in the Whirlaway S., cancelled the deal, according to published reports. The original purchase price was not disclosed. The bay colt had captured his first three starts in New York-bred company in good

style, but never factored as the 1-2 chalk in Saturday's Whirlaway and wound up a distant fifth. "I was very disappointed the way the horse ran," Roman told *Daily Racing Form*. "I thought he was going to win; [trainer] Rick Dutrow [Jr.] thought

the horse was going to win easily. Fortunately, in my life, I don't need money that badly. I didn't want sour partners...I called them and said, 'Let me wire the money back.' They were very, very appreciative. The whole thing happened so fast. I don't like to even be in that situation. I would always prefer to sell my horse after the race." Dutrow indicated that Lawrence the Roman emerged unscathed from the Whirlaway. "When they run like that, something ain't right, but I don't see it," he told *DRF*. "I'll train him and see how things are. I'll look for the safest, easiest spot."

Turfway Cancels Thursday, Adds Monday:

Due to a forecast of subzero windchill temperatures, Turfway has announced that today's live racing card has been cancelled. Wintry conditions had already forced the cancellation of Wednesday's card. Turfway will remain open for simulcasting. The Florence, Kentucky, oval will conduct live racing on Presidents' Day, Monday, Feb. 19. Post time will be 1:10 p.m. for the 10-race card.

Fair Grounds Moves Forward With Slot Plans:

Churchill Downs Incorporated has confirmed that plans to build a slot machine gaming facility adjacent to Fair Grounds Race Course will move forward. Construction was originally scheduled to begin in September of 2005, but was delayed by the destruction caused by Hurricane Katrina that August. "Following the hurricane, our priorities were to locate our employees and help them with their immediate needs, and then repair and reopen our pari-mutuel and video poker facilities," said Steve Sexton, executive vice president for CDI. "With our repairs completed and this season's race meet well underway, we can now focus fully on plans to implement slot machine gaming at Fair Grounds." Construction for the proposed 30,000-square foot facility, which will house a maximum of 700 slot machines, is now set to begin this summer, with completion scheduled for late fall of 2008. In the interim, CDI is requesting permission from New Orleans officials to renovate the first floor of the Fair Grounds simulcasting parlor, installing 225 slot machines until the permanent facility is completed. "We think it makes good sense to operate out of a temporary facility while the permanent building is under construction so we can start the flow of tax revenues to the City of New Orleans and State of Louisiana--and generate additional money for horsemen's purses--as soon as possible," said Fair Grounds President and General Manager Randy Soth. "By starting in a smaller facility, we can also fine-tune operational and customer service issues well before we open the permanent facility."

Hawthorne Opens Doors to Suspended Riders:

Hawthorne Race Course officials announced yesterday that jockeys Terry Houghton and Derek Bell, who have been banned at Tampa Bay Downs due to an ongoing investigation by the Thoroughbred Racing Protective Bureau, will be allowed to ride at the Hawthorne spring meet that opens Feb. 23. "We at Hawthorne Race Course are firm believers in the concept of innocent until proven guilty," track president Tim Carey said in a statement. "We have been in contact with each of these riders, along with members of the TRPB. While we understand an investigation is ongoing concerning these riders and others, until a time comes that they are indicted, if that is the case, we are not going to prevent them from riding based on speculation." Carey added, "We treat every situation on an individual basis and will do the same with both Terry and Derek. We have spoken to each of them and made it very clear that if we feel there is any suspicion concerning their riding at Hawthorne, they will be asked to leave. Also, they have been informed that if they are indicted, they will be asked to leave as well. In speaking with each of them, we have no reason to believe that they won't give their best effort every time they are on our race-track."

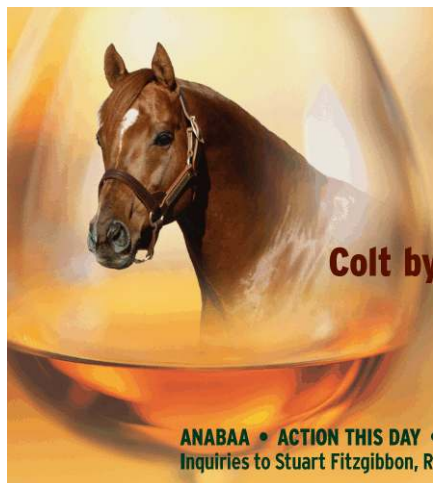

PERTH SALE POSTS RECORDS The first section (sessions one and two) of the 2007 BMW Magic Millions Perth Yearling Sale, held Tuesday and Wednesday, easily eclipsed the previous statistical records set just last year. After two days of bidding, the turnover of A\$13.5 million was well ahead of the corresponding 2006 figure of A\$11.2 million, while this year's average of A\$46,080 represented an 18.5-percent leap against the previous year. The clearance rate also remained strong, with four of every five horses offered finding homes. "It's been a record-breaking last couple of days in Perth and we couldn't be any happier," Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester reported. "To have the average and aggregate for the first two sessions rise at least 15 percent is fantastic." Yesterday's activity was headlined by the sale of hip 355, a filly by El Moxie--Miiharo (NZ) (Bletchingly {Aus}). By the sire of the now-retired Silent Witness (Aus), the bay is a half-sister to Natural Blitz (Aus), who not only won a pair of races and was Group 2-placed in Perth, but also excelled once exported, winning the 2005 running of the G1 Hong Kong Sprint. "She's a really beautiful filly," said winning bidder Dan Morton. "She's a really athletic filly and she has a good pedigree to go along with it." He added, "You have to pay big money for fillies like her and I think she was priced fairly on the market."

NTRA REPORT FROM Capitol Hill

Congress Debates Expensing Allowance Increase

On February 9, House Ways and Means Committee Chairman Charles Rangel (D-NY) and Ranking Member Jim McCrery (R-LA) introduced the Small Business Tax Relief Act of 2007 (HR 976). The bill would increase the expense allowance for depreciable business assets and extend the effective period by one year, through 2010. The expensing allowance would increase from \$100,000 to \$125,000 subject to the limit on total purchases of depreciable property, which would increase from \$400,000 to \$500,000. The extenders would apply to purchases made between January 1, 2007 and December 31, 2010. The House is expected to debate the bill this week, with the Senate considering similar legislation as part of a broader package on the minimum wage increase.
