The bay has started twice since his Nad Al Sheba triumph, finishing third in the GIII El Conejo H. Jan. 1 and second in the Jan. 27 in the Sunshine Millions Sprint S. "He's set now," Proud Tower Too's regular rider David Cohen said. "He came out of the Sunshine Millions real well, real strong, just like always. He definitely seems much sharper since his last race."

NEW F/M SPRINTER ECLIPSE FOR '07

An Eclipse Award for Champion Filly or Mare Sprinter has been established, officials of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, *Daily Racing Form* and the National Turf Writers Association announced yesterday. "Creating an Eclipse Award for female sprinters meshes logically and properly with the gender balances already in place in other Eclipse Award racing categories," said Steven Crist, Chairman and Publisher of *DRF*. "While five females have won the Eclipse Award for Champion Sprinter over the years, there have been none since 1989, and in that time a great many outstanding filly and mare sprinters have unfortunately gone unrecognized." The new Eclipse Award is one of 12 equine Eclipse Awards. There are also five human Eclipse Awards. The 2007 Breeders' Cup at Monmouth Park marks the first running of the \$1-million G1 Breeders' Cup Filly & Mare Sprint.

PREMIUM TAP TAKES KING'S CUP

Carrying the colors of Saudi King Abdullah bin Abdul Aziz and his sons for the first time, **Premium Tap** (Pleasant Tap) drove to a 2 3/4-length victory over six-year-old **Obay** (GB) (Kingmambo) in yesterday's 1 1/2-mile King's Cup at King Abdulaziz Racecourse. Jockey Kent Desormeaux was in the irons as the bay stopped the timer in 2:28.08. German group winner **Omikron** (Ire) (Germany) was another half-length back in third, and Argentine Horse of the Year **Forty Licks** (Arg) (Not For Sale {Arg}) was fourth. The race, formally known as the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Cup, will serve as the Premium Tap's prep for the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba, according to Jean-Pierre de Gaste of International Thoroughbred Consultants, the bloodstock agent who, along with Tony Cobitz, brokered the deal to send the five-year-old to Saudi Arabia. "Premium Tap is aiming now for the World Cup," de Gaste said, adding, "After what he has shown in the [G1] Clark H. and now in the King's Cup over a mile and a half, he has proven that he can be a very strong contender." King's Cup runner-up Obay, a half to GSW Untouched Talent out of MGSW Parade Queen (A.P. Indy), had registered one win from 16 starts, on the flat and over fences, in Britain. He was purchased for 5,000gns as a 2005 Tattersalls horse in training, and had won four of his seven outings in Saudi Arabia.

"She is as prepared as she has been for the last several starts. I am confident in her and she is as ready as I can get her. I think seven-eighths is her best distance right now and I look forward to a big effort out of her [today]."

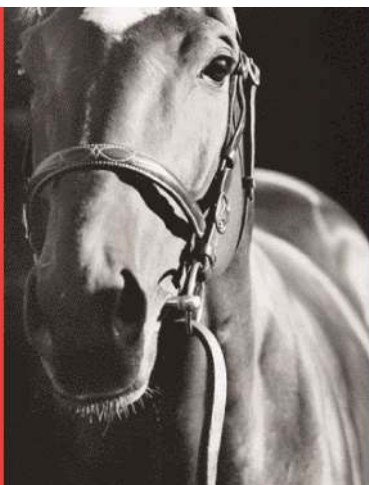

TWO BC WINNING MARGINS CHANGED

Equibase has changed the margin of victory of the 2006 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff and the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, according to published reports. Distaff heroine **Round Pond** (Awesome Again)'s winning margin was increased from 4 1/4 lengths to 5 1/2 lengths while Mile victor **Miesque's Approval** (Miesque's Son) margin of victory was upped by 1 1/4 lengths to four lengths. According to Equibase vice president Chuck Scaravilli, the company received an inquiry in early January asking for a review. "Like we usually do, we went through and researched the races and decided a couple of the margins were in fact incorrect," Scaravilli told *the Blood-Horse*. "If we receive an inquiry we always research it and if we feel it is wrong, then we correct it."

RANDOM DRUG TESTING TO BEGIN IN CA The California Horse Racing Board announced Thursday that Thoroughbreds stabled at licensed racetracks and training facilities in the Golden State will be subject to random drug testing designed to detect Epoetin and Darbepoetin, effective immediately. The testing will include horses that are not entered for races. "Most trainers want a level playing field, so they don't have a problem with this," Ed Halpern, the executive director of the California Thoroughbred Trainers, told *Daily Racing Form*. "The only complaints I do receive are by guys who say they fear they are going to be targeted. As long as it's completely random, I don't think anyone will object."

TVG, CDI HALT NEGOTIATIONS In an announcement made Thursday, officials at the Television Games Network have decided to discontinue negotiations with Churchill Downs Incorporated (CDI), casting doubt on the future broadcast of racing from the company's member tracks. The network simultaneously announced what it called a "significant reallocation" of its "programming, production and promotional resources," focusing more attention on the high-profile meetings at Keeneland, Belmont, Hollywood and Monmouth Park, home of the 2007 Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships. Said TVG General Manager David Nathanson, "Nearing the end of a 10-year relationship with CDI, we were seeing continued growth in our television distribution and account wagering handle as CDI continued to divest of racetrack properties, diminishing its importance to our business." He continued, "We respect our relationships with horsemen and racing fans at CDI tracks and sincerely regret that they may not be able to easily access CDI races on television, wager on CDI races on TVG's wagering platforms, or share in purse revenue generated from TVG's advance deposit wagering and source market fees following the expirations of our current agreements with CDI." TVG reportedly will honor its existing commitments with CDI tracks. Its contract with Churchill Downs and Fair Grounds expires in early 2007. Their exclusive contracts with Arlington Park and Calder Race Course expire in later 2007 and early 2008, respectively. In response, CDI Executive Vice President Bill Carstanjen said, "Churchill Downs Incorporated has been negotiating with TVG for many months. Our discussions occurred under a confidentiality agreement requested by TVG, and we have continued to honor that agreement. We are fully exploring our options going forward with regards to television and account-wagering rights. We will work diligently to ensure a seamless transition for our customers."


JOCKEYS BANNED Four British-based jockeys have received bans, ranging from one to three years, as the latest chapter in the ongoing race-fixing inquiry was concluded at the Horseracing Regulatory Authority's London headquarters yesterday. Robert Winston, the highest profile of the quartet, was handed a one-year ban for various rule breaches, but will be allowed to work in racing. Fellow riders Robbie Fitzpatrick and Luke Fletcher were given three-year penalties, while Fran Ferris received a two-year ban. All three are disqualified from entering licenced premises, which includes racetracks and racing stables, for the duration of their sentences. Five other unlicenced individuals were also banned. The heaviest punishment was handed to Ian Nicholl, who has been warned off indefinitely with

the proviso he cannot apply for reconsideration for 10 years. The jockeys were accused of providing or passing information that was used, by Nicholls and four other defendants, for corrupt gain in relation to 37 races between June 16, 2003 and Feb. 29, 2004. Winston's solicitor, Christopher Stewart-Moore, said in a statement issued to *PA Sport*, "Robert Winston is shocked and disappointed by the HRA disciplinary panel's finding that he was in breach of Rule 243 in giving information for reward. This disappointment is tempered to some degree by the panel finding that they accepted that it was no part of the information he gave that he would ride to lose if necessary, and their further finding that in no instance did he in fact ride to lose. The panel's finding

against Mr. Winston is based on their 'inference' that Mr. Winston received a reward from Mr. Nicholl for providing him with information. For the avoidance of doubt, Mr. Winston received no reward from Mr. Nicholl--or anyone else for that matter--in relation to the information that he is alleged to have given. No physical evidence of a reward was put to the panel and no such evidence exists."

NYRA REPORTS JANUARY LOSSES OF \$3.9 MILLION by Tom Precious, www.bloodhorse.com

Another tough month for the ailing New York Racing Association, which has notified a bankruptcy court it lost \$3.9 million in January. That comes on top of a \$7.1 million loss the previous month. NYRA officials were unavailable for comment. The red ink was reported to the U.S. Bankruptcy court in Manhattan, where NYRA's Chapter 11 case could be tossed out next month if the state of New York has its way. The state last year filed papers asking the judge to end NYRA's bankruptcy protection on grounds that it is a quasi-government organization not eligible for bankruptcy. NYRA, which must report its financial doings every month to the court, said it disbursed \$21.4 million during January, but lost \$3.9 million. Its largest expenses included about \$3.3 million apiece for on facilities and administration. It reported spending \$571,000 on racing and \$476,000 on "reorganization," which includes NYRA's bankruptcy lawyers. The NYRA franchise expires at the end of the year; Excelsior Racing Associates late last year beat out NYRA and Empire Racing Associates in a non-binding vote by a government panel to run the next 20-year franchise. Excelsior's partners include Steve Swindal, a partner with the New York Yankees and son-in-law of George Steinbrenner; Swindal, according to the *New York Daily News* and *New York Post*, was charged Feb. 15 with driving under the influence near the Yankees' spring training field in Tampa, Fla. A spokesman told the newspaper that Swindal "apologizes profusely." The Ad Hoc Committee on the Future of Racing, the New York government group that tapped Excelsior, has scheduled a Feb. 21 meeting in Albany and Manhattan to release its final report, which officials have been saying would contain no surprises, but would merely lay out the details on how its selection was made.

"Given the growing prevalence of synthetic surfaces, especially among tracks on such major racing circuits as Kentucky, California and Illinois, it's important that buyers have a chance to see horses perform on Polytrack," Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell remarked. "Polytrack is proving to be a very good training surface. Both Barbaro and Lemons Forever trained over Polytrack just prior to their wins in last year's Kentucky Derby and Kentucky Oaks, as did four of last fall's Breeders' Cup winners--Street Sense, Round Pond, Dreaming of Anna and Thor's Echo." The two previews are set for Monday, Apr. 9, and Monday, Apr. 16, beginning at 10:30 a.m.

GOFFS CONCLUDES ON A HIGH The heights of Thursday's penultimate session proved a hard act to follow, but Goffs' February Sale concluded yesterday at the company's Kill complex with four additional six-figure transactions added to the roll of honor. Leading the way was Castlefarm Stud's Sean Burke, who secured Moyglare Stud Farm's **Easy Sunshine (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) for €150,000. Offered as hip 1145, the G3 C L Weld Park S. third was sold in foal to Bahri. "I had her picked out before the start of the sale--she is a lovely mare and beautiful mover--and when I saw her Verglas (Fr) foal that clinched it for me," Burke explained. "Her unraced full-sister by Sadler's Wells made 160,000gns when she was sold at Newmarket last year, and this mare is Group 3-placed. It's not often that you get a chance to buy into a family like this." Peter Doyle, once again acting on behalf of Plantation Stud, paid the day's second highest price when going to €135,000 for hip 982, **To Grace (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}). Sent up by Ballyduane Stud, the five-year-old boasts an impressive page which includes multiple Group 1-winning darling Alexander Goldrun (Ire). The agent revealed this purchase, in addition to Thursday's €160,000 buy Puzzling (GB), is destined for a mating with the stud's resident stallion Araafa (Ire). "She's a very nice filly from a good family and is a winner too, which makes it all the better," Doyle said. The agent also went to €95,000 for hip 1032, Mountarmstrong Stud's four-year-old **Alexander Celebre (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre). Acting for Whitechurch Stud, he said, "She's a good-walking, good-looking filly--typical of her sire--and she is from a very good family." **Well Designed (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), consigned by Moyglare Stud Farm, also hit six figures when knocked down to Iona Park Stud for €120,000. Offered as hip 1007, she is a full sister to G1 Irish Oaks-winning champion Dance Design (Ire) and was sold in foal to Dalakhani (Ire). Rathbarry Stud was the only other vendor to attract a six-figure dividend and did so when Rathasker Stud's Maurice Burns came up with a final bid of €100,000 for hip 1050, **Ann's Annie (Ire)** (Alzao), who sold in foal to Barathea (Ire). "She has been bought to go to Mujadil and it's a family we know well," Burns explained. Full results can be viewed at www.goffs.com.
