STRONG CONTENDER TO STONEWALL

Strong Contender (Maria's Mon--Kopenhagen, by Dynaformer), winner of last season's GII Dwyer S. and GII Super Derby, will enter stud at Stonewall Farm in Versailles, Ky. He will stand for a \$10,000 fee. "Strong Contender certainly lived up to his name," said Stonewall's Director of Stallion Operations Ken Wilkins. "There was a buzz about this horse from the time he broke his maiden in his two-year-old debut and both his sire and broodmare sire were among the top five on America's list of leading sires last year." Purchased for \$800,000 by John Oxley at Keeneland's April Two Year Olds in Training Sale in 2005, the chestnut won four of eight career starts and bankrolled \$618,000.

PA DERBY PURSE NOW \$1 MILLION

This year's running of Philadelphia Park's GII Pennsylvania Derby will carry a \$1-million purse, it was announced yesterday. This marks the first race to be run at the Bensalem racetrack that will carry a seven-figure purse. "There's something special about that million-dollar plateau," Philly Park CEO Hal Handel commented. "We're excited that we can now offer our fans a race like this." Following a year's hiatus, this season's Derby returns on Labor Day, Sept. 3. Tracy Farmer's Sun King won the 2005 edition by 4 1/2 lengths over Southern Africa.

'PEGASUS' MAKES IT A HAPPY NEW YEAR

Following his victory in the G1-HK Hong Kong Classic Mile Jan. 28, there remained some doubt as to whether **Floral Pegasus** (Fusaichi Pegasus) could handle the added distance required to make him a Derby contender. Before 85,000 racegoers on the Chinese New Year program yesterday, the chestnut son of the 2000 Kentucky Derby winner answered in emphatic fashion, defeating **Viva Macau (Fr)** (Sendawar {Ire}), who also finished runner-up in the Classic Mile. Camped in fourth and never far from a sedate pace, Floral Pegasus pounced on the frontrunners nearing the midstretch marker and sprinted home an easy winner. Viva Macau sat a wide trip off the deliberate tempo and ran with credit to be second. "He's a super horse," commented winning trainer Tony Cruz. "He has the conformation of a sprinter, but he has the stamina too. He's out of a Mill Reef mare and his father won a Kentucky Derby. He travels great in the run and I'm looking forward to the Derby with him." The HK\$16 million (\$2.1 million) Hong Kong Derby over 2000 meters is set for Mar. 18. SIRES ON ALL-WEATHER TRACKS

In today's racing environment, there can hardly be a more timely line of inquiry than whether certain stallions are proving more proficient at siring runners on the new 21st-century all-weather racing surfaces. Through the efforts of Hank Zeitlin at Equibase, and Carl Hamilton and Mark Adkins at The Jockey Club Information Systems (TJCIS), we are able to bring you some results of these inquiries, covering racing on all-weather surfaces in North America and Great Britain through the end of 2006. We'd also like to recognize the encouragement, especially, of Keeneland president Nick Nicholson, and the very able assistance of Darley Flying Start graduate Gary Hadden.

The North American information can be explained quite straightforwardly: these statistics cover racing on all recognized 'all-weather' surfaces in North America, beginning with the Turfway meet Sept. 7, 2005, and including Keeneland, Woodbine, and Hollywood Park, as well as Turfway in 2006. This includes racing on whichever all-weather surface is in use at the particular racetrack--Polytrack, Cushion Track, Tapeta, or whatever (Hollywood has installed Cushion Track; Keeneland, Turfway and Woodbine all have Polytrack). So that includes about 16 months of racing, during which 9,368 individual starters by 1,388 sires included 2,086 winners, 94 of them stakes winners. There were 22.3-percent winners to starters, and almost exactly one-percent stakes winners to starters. The 9,368 runners earned a total of \$67,370,777, an average of \$7,192 per starter. Since each racetrack simply replaces dirt with all-weather, the statistics will therefore reflect the class of horse that runs on that surface at that meeting: so far, generally better horses at Keeneland, Woodbine, and Hollywood; generally lower-class horses at Turfway.

In Great Britain, the statistics are a little bit less straightforward. True, they reflect the class of racing at the racetrack covered, but all-weather racing in Britain has been geared towards lower-class and winter horses, as the original intent was to provide an alternative to jump racing (especially when frost, snow, or--in this era of global warming--waterlogging cancelled racing) so that punters and bookmakers could have action virtually every day of the year. Also, the British statistics cover racing on the Polytrack surface only; these include Lingfield, going all the way back to Nov. 13, 2001; Wolverhampton, beginning when that surface was relaid with Polytrack, beginning Oct. 2, 2004; and Kempton, which reopened with Polytrack instead of dirt Mar. 25, 2006.

As Equibase and TJCIS continue to develop these figures, we shall have to see whether Southwell, in Great Britain, and French tracks like Deauville and Cagnes-sur-Mer should be added. At the British tracks covered, there have been a total of 14,391 starters, of which 3,118 are winners (21.7 percent, almost exactly the same as North America's 22.3 percent), representing 1,053 sires. Reflecting the lower standard of Polytrack racing in Britain, as well as its lower purse-money structure, there have been only 32 stakes winners (0.22 percent of starters). Total Polytrack earnings in Britain were \$50,768,144, which is \$3,528 per starter--just under half the average for North American all-weather starters.

Cum AEI & Top 100...

With the assistance of TJCIS in what was essentially a research project, Gary and I first started spinning the dials on the North American sire information (broodmare sire statistics will follow next week), and came up with quite an interesting little index incorporating three categories: percentage of winners to starters; average earnings per starter; and percentage of stakes winners to starters. However, we realized that since so much of the racing was pretty low class, the percentage of winners to starters isn't that significant.

And the miniscule percentage of stakes winners in Britain means no comparison of that statistic with North American racing could be meaningful. Moreover, if you want to be able to look at a sire's combined runners, the gulf in average earnings means simply combining North American and British earnings would not give us a true picture.

Therefore, we turned to the time-honored average-earnings index, not annualized, but computed on a cumulative basis since September 2005 in North America, and for the Polytrack dates listed above in Britain. So if a sire had 10 all-weather starters in North America and total earnings of \$71,920, his runners' average earnings would be \$7,192, and his North American AW cumulative AEI would be 1.00. Similarly, if the same sire had 10 Polytrack starters in Britain which earned a total of \$35,280, his runners' average earnings there would be \$3,528, for a British Polytrack cumulative AEI of 1.00. You then essentially add the results of two sides together to get the combined AW Cumulative AEI. That's how the method, originated by Joe Estes at *The Blood-Horse* more than 50 years ago, works. Of course, as I point out every time we run APEX ratings, the one big flaw in an average-earnings index is that one great horse can create a rather misleading impression that a sire is more consistently better than maybe he is. In this case, the earnings of stakes winners may somewhat create that effect, especially with all-weather racing really in its infancy. When we add the figures from North America and Great Britain together, a total of 23,759 starters (by 2,158 individual sires) were included in our survey. In any single year, there are something like 70,000 starters between North America and Britain, so the entire study that we've been considering comprises less than a third of the runners in the U.S., Canada, and Great Britain just in one year. So it's really a relatively small sample size at this point.

Small sample size it may be, but there have still been 23,759 starters by 2,158 sires. Of these, we decided, on present evidence, that we would find the top 100 of what turned out to be 731 sires which had seven or more starters on all-weather in North America and Polytrack in Britain. The top 100, by cumulative AW average-earnings index, are listed in this issue. You can click through [here](#) for alphabetical lists (in excel format) of the 731 sires which were therefore eligible for this top 100; and [here](#) for all 2,158 sires which had one or more AW/Polytrack starters.

The influence of one big winner on a cumulative average-earnings index is perhaps illustrated by the overall leader, none other than Dubai Millennium, whose seven Polytrack starters in Britain included Echo of Light. He had a £56,780 payday when capturing the G3 Summer Mile S. at Lingfield last July, helping his sire realize a cumulative AW average-earnings index of 6.85.

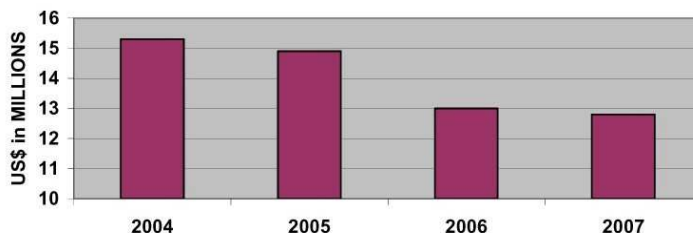

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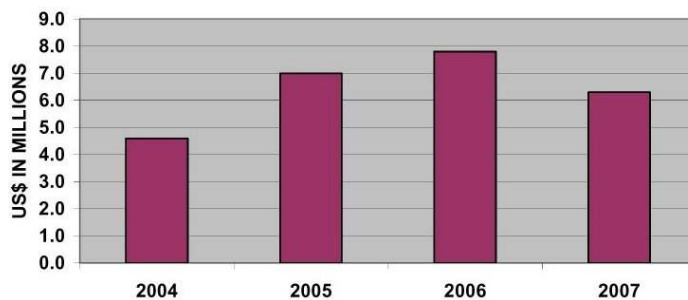

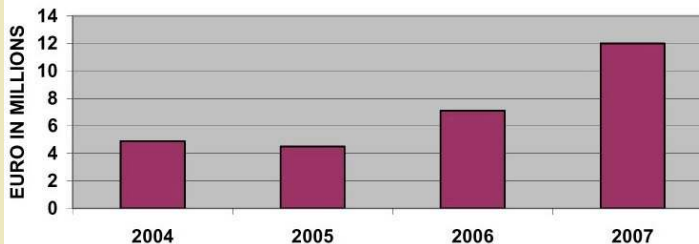
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FASIG MIXED FEB SALE



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As you see, the first four on the list all had 11 or fewer runners, all on the Polytrack in Great Britain. Of the five top North American sires, three are Canadian, which reflects the strength of the prize money and the length of the meet at Woodbine. Those three are: the sadly departed Archer's Bay (3.35), the son of Silver Deputy who also ranked so high on the APEX lists; Elajjud (3.24), a heretofore obscure son of Dayjur whose stock did seem to move up on the AW; and Bold Executive (3.19), a perennial leading Canadian sire by Bold Ruckus. The top American stallions were Stormy Atlantic (4.08), sire of GI Hollywood Futurity winner Stormello (\$264,900) and multiple Woodbine two-year-old SW Leonnatus Anteus; and Malibu Moon (3.28), sire of Keeneland Grade III winner Malibu Mint. You'd be pretty encouraged by both sires' all-weather performance: it certainly helped Stormy Atlantic secure his North American two-year-old sire championship; and, considering Malibu Moon's sire, A.P. Indy, himself has a 2.66 cumulative all-weather AEI, the (albeit limited) evidence hints that this line may be well suited to North American all-weather racing.

It's probably of limited significance that you have to click through to find the likes of Storm Cat (1.34), Distorted Humor (1.37), and Kingmambo (0.89); we are dealing with very small sample sizes, and most good horses by the top sires, even in North America, will not have even seen an all-weather racetrack yet. Rather than saying they don't work, what would be more accurate would be to speculate that probably the many moderate horses by top sires haven't yet shone on the all-weather. As with all these statistics, it will only take one top horse to alter the picture dramatically. Similarly, it would be dangerous to read too much into the statistics so far for Sadler's Wells (0.56) and his sons Montjeu (0.66) and Galileo (0.70), especially since his North American son, El Prado, has a 2.13 index--no doubt from better opportunity at the better tracks. In Britain even more than America so far, a sire's best runners seldom appear on the Polytrack. It is starting to change now. Better races will attract better runners, and the picture could look quite different for some of these top sires in another year or two. Three British sires which I did think had quite impressive numbers, as things now stand, are: Green Desert (89 runners, 2.51 cum all-weather AEI); Efisio (105 runners, 1.92); and Cadeaux Genereux (127 runners, 1.89). Rather than say conclusively that so-and-so doesn't work, all we can really say is that stallions like Green Desert, Efisio, and Cadeaux Genereux clearly do work for all-weather runners in the U.K.

We recognize that, far from being the final word on the performance of stallions as all-weather sires, this is only the beginning. I would be afraid of drawing any negative conclusions because most of the racing these statistics cover has been lower-class, plus it can take only one good horse to dramatically alter a sire's AEI.

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But I do think we can pinpoint plenty of cases of stallions which are showing promise as all-weather sires. It's all going to get a lot more interesting as time goes on, and we're hoping we'll be able to periodically review the stats and keep you updated. Next week, as I say, we'll look at all-weather/Polytrack broodmare sires through the end of 2006.

The Southwest S. is beginning to evolve into in significant early step on the road to the Triple Crown. Three years ago it was captured by Pennsylvania-bred Smarty Jones, who went on to capture the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S. as well as the title of champion three-year-old colt. For this year's renewal, Smarty Jones's fellow PA-bred, Hard Spun started as 1-2 favorite to preserve his undefeated record, but in the event he could only check in fourth behind the front-running Teuflesberg.

Whether Teuflesberg is likely to develop the class or stamina to challenge for the Kentucky Derby remains to be seen. What can be said is that he has already shown himself to be a horse of admirable mental and physical toughness. Before breaking his maiden last October, Teuflesberg had already started six times.

Those outings include runs in the the GIII Bashford Manor S., the GII Sanford S. (where he was beaten only a half-length by subsequent GISW Scat Daddy) and the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity. What's more, in many of those races, he did things the hard way, battling on the lead.

After breaking his maiden--which he took from current major Kentucky Derby prospect Ravel--Teuflesberg ended his two-year-old season with a six-furlong allowance score at Churchill Downs and a black-type victory in the Sugar Bowl S. Following his 11-race juvenile season, Teuflesberg has already started twice in 2007, preceding his Southwest win with a third to Hard Spun in the GIII Lecomte S. Although Teuflesberg's career has been untypical for this day and age, one can't

knock the results. For one thing, Teuflesberg appears to be still improving--his Southwest effort resulted in a Beyer Speed Figure of 100 and a BRIS Speed Rating of 102, both lifetime bests--and for another, the \$9,000 yearling purchase has now already earned \$317,930, plus potential residual value as a future stallion.


That sales figure, which was achieved at the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky October Sale, made Teuflesberg the 64th most expensive of the 69 yearlings offered from the first crop of his sire. Incidentally, Johannesburg didn't start as many times as Teuflesberg at two, but his juvenile career was a pretty rigorous one. He started seven times, six in group or graded stakes, and won them all, including the G1

Prix Morny in France, the G1 Phoenix S. in Ireland, the G1 Middle Park S. in England, and the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. The feat of winning four Group/Grade 1 races in four different countries in the same season is still unmatched.

2 GRADE 2 WINNERS IN 2 WEEKS

OPRAH WINNEY won the **Barbara Fritchie Breeders' Cup H.-Gr.2** on 17th Feb.
MOLENGAO won the **San Antonio H.-Gr.2** on 4th Feb.

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Johannesburg made an electrifying start with his first crop of two-year-olds in 2006, getting a record-breaking seven juvenile stakes winners, headed by the GI Champagne and GII Sanford S. winner Scat Daddy, G2 Richmond S. hero Hamood and G3 Round Tower S. victor Rabatash. This year, in addition to Teuflesberg, he's already added the GIII Santa Ysabel S. heroine and GI Las Virgenes S. runner-up Baroness Thatcher.

Teuflesberg represents a return to form of what had appeared to be a dying branch of a tremendous family. His dam, St. Michele, is by Devil's Bag out of the Mr. Prospector mare Line, but the most recent black-type in the female line is Northcote Road, a Fair Grounds stalwart who took his third and final stakes win--in the Col. E. R. Bradley H.--at the age of seven in 2002. Things pick up dramatically in the next generation, however. Northcote Road's dam Border (by Spectacular Bid) is a sister to the graded-stakes winning turf horse Double Feint and also a half-sister to graded winners An-nounce, Region (by Teuflesberg's broodmare sire, Devil's Bag) and Narrate. The latter, a daughter of Honest Pleasure, won the GII Falls City H., but proved far more important as a producer. Her only stakes winner was GI Frizette S. heroine, Preach (by Mr. Prospector), who subsequently produced Pulpit.

That Claiborne colorbearer took the GII Blue Grass S. and GII Fountain of Youth S. and is now firmly established as the leading proven stallion son of A.P. Indy. Preach's sister, Yarn, was only a minor winner, but she is the dam of GII King's Bishop S. winner Tale of the Cat, the leading juvenile sire of 2003; and of champion English and Irish two-year-old Minardi. More importantly, as far as the upgrading over the immediate family which Teuflesberg represents, Yarn also appears as the third dam of Johannesburg.

Of course, this means that Teuflesberg is linebred to this family, having the Nijinsky II mare State (fifth dam of Johannesburg) 5x4. The whole story is far more complex, however. To start with, Johannesburg's granddam, Yarn, is by Mr. Prospector out of a daughter of State, and so is Teuflesberg's granddam, Line, so he is actually inbred/linebred to Mr. Prospector/State, with the 3/4-sisters Yarn and Line 3x2 (to date, five of Johannesburg's stakes winners have a double of Mr. Prospector). In addition, since State is by Niiinsky II out of Round Table's sister Monarchy, Teuflesberg has three crosses of Northern Dancer which appear through the genetic relatives Storm Bird and Nijinsky II (a feature, which oddly enough is shared by Teuflesberg's paternal half-brother and Sanford conqueror Scat Daddy).

In closing, we can't help but reflect that while its opponents blame inbreeding for all manner of frailties and weaknesses, Teuflesberg, undoubtedly the toughest top two-year-old of his crop, is a result of a close inbreeding pattern. **Alan Porter may be contacted at portrpedigree@msn.com. 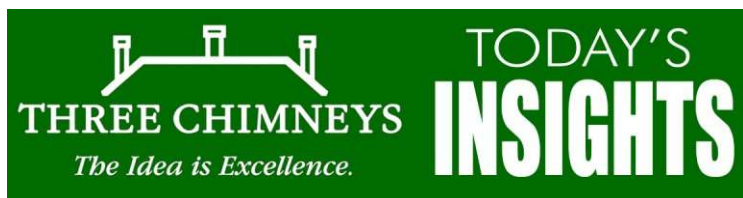

A track representative said the fire did not appear to cause any substantial damage and that it was contained to a restroom. He added that an evacuation of the facility was ordered as a "precautionary measure." It was not immediately clear if the \$75,000 Mardi Gras S., a 7 1/2-furlong turf sprint carded as yesterday's ninth race, would not be rescheduled. Fair Grounds is dark today and tomorrow and is slated to resume racing Friday with a first post of 12:35 CST.

BEULAH OWNER QUESTIONS TOC, CALLS FOR PURSE CUT by Tom LaMarra

The owner of Beulah Park is questioning why the Thoroughbred Owners of California has pulled the state's simulcast signal from the Ohio racetrack, and also said management has ordered a 20-percent purse cut because of the projected revenue hit. The TOC said it is acting in support of the Ohio Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association under the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978. The Ohio horsemen are challenging in federal court the Ohio State Racing Commission's decision to overrule the blocking of the signal by Beulah Park to Harrah's Chester Downs, a Standardbred track and slot-machine facility in Pennsylvania. The Ohio HBPA contends it has control of the interstate transmission of the signal and the racing commission acted beyond its scope. The Ohio horsemen seek a United States District Court for Southern Ohio decision overruling the racing commission, which found in favor of Beulah Park and River Downs in their effort to allow Harrah's Chester Downs to receive its signals in exchange for a 3-percent host fee. The Ohio HBPA wanted 5 percent and denied consent, which prompted the tracks to appeal to the commission. "How stupid can it be?" Beulah Park owner Charlie Ruma said Feb. 19. "Here's a real significant fact: The Ohio Revised Code says if somebody is being unreasonable, we can go to the racing commission to make the determination. We did that. We have an agreement with horsemen that we will abide by the Ohio Revised Code. Have they now forgotten that obligation? I'm not disputing federal law. Federal law applies, but we also have an agreement with horsemen that needs to be adhered to." [Click here to continue.](#)

"We still have the [GII] Black-Eyed Susan [S.] to top a wonderful card," said Lou Raffetto, MJC president and chief operating officer. "We are hopeful things fall into line and that the Special returns next year." Along with the Black-Eyed Susan, the May 18 card will feature the GII Allaire duPont Breeders' Cup Distaff H. and the GIII Adena Stallions' Miss Preakness S. There will be five graded stakes conducted on the Preakness undercard May 19: the GII Dixie S., GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup Sprint H., GIII William Donald Schaefer H., GIII Gallorette H. and GIII Hirsch Jacobs S.
