Blood-Horse

YOUTH TO BE SERVED

Both coasts will host Grade II events for three-year-olds today, the GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream and the GII Robert B. Lewis S. at Santa Anita. The headline act will be **Nobiz Like Shobiz** (Albert the Great) in the Fountain of Youth. Elizabeth Valando's homebred did some looking around in the lane in winning the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 3, but he figures to be a bit more serious this time. Trainer Barclay Tagg, who won the GI Kentucky Derby in 2003 with Funny Cide, is confident that his sophomore has the right stuff for the Classics. "Michael Matz had reason to be confident with Barbaro last year," Tagg said. "He had one of the most fabulous horses anyone had seen in a long

time and he had him in great position for the Triple Crown. I think my horse could be on that same level." Although it's only the beginning of March, there will be a bi-coastal clash between established names. **Stormello** (Stormy Atlantic), hero of the GI Hollywood Futurity and GII Norfolk S. out west, has travelled cross country to Florida. "I have a little of this East Coast-West Coast bias, and the only way to get rid of it is put my star on the road and bring him here and beat the best," trainer Bill Currin told *Daily Racing Form*. John Murphy's swift **Adore the Gold** (Formal Gold) has four wins in five career starts, but is at a disadvantage here with the outside post in a field of nine. "Drawing outside will force our hand a little bit, but I think he'll run a good race," trainer Mike Gorham told *DRF*. "This is a big test for him, and he'll certainly have to show something to move on." The three-year-old homebred, a stakes winner at two turns last year, kicked off 2007 with a game victory in the 6 1/2-furlong GII Swale S. Feb. 3 on the Holy Bull undercard. **Field p2**

L.A. Story...

Santa Anita, which renamed the Santa Catalina S. in honor of the popular late owner/breeder Robert Lewis, will host the return of **Great Hunter** (Aptitude). J. Paul Reddam's colt defeated Street Sense in the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity in October, but settled for third behind that colt in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Nov. 4 and lost any shot at an Eclipse Award. "He had a good campaign as a two-year-old and, you know, the goal with him is the first Saturday in May," trainer Doug O'Neill explained. "We needed to give him a breather after that campaign and, so far, every thing's kind of coming together well. Hopefully, we'll see a good effort from him on Saturday." **Cont. p4**

MAN OF THE MOMENT

Lava Man (Slew City Slew) is seeking to become only the third horse to successfully defend his title in the storied history of the GI Santa Anita H. The six-year-old has been unstoppable in his native California, where he hasn't lost since the summer of 2005. In addition to last year's Big 'Cap, the gelding has trophies from the GI Hollywood Gold Cup and GI Pacific Classic on dirt as well as the GI Charles Whittingham H. on grass. A victory today would make him just the second back-to-back winner since the fabled two-surface standout John Henry captured his Big 'Caps in 1981-82. "His versatility is truly amazing," said trainer Doug O'Neill. "I'm honored that he is even talked about in the same sentence with the likes of John Henry." The 124-pound highweight, who will be giving away seven to 10 pounds to his rivals, will break from post seven, a good spot, according to O'Neill. "It should give him ample time before the first turn to either get a position and sit back, or take it to them if they decide to go slow," he said. **Cont. p2**

Seven-year-old **McCann's Mojave** was a graded-stakes winning sprinter early in his career before tailing off in 2006. Transferred to Steve Specht in Northern California, the bay regained his confidence and most recently captured the nine-furlong Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Jan. 27. Specht is willing to take a chance that his charge can handle today's extra distance, as well as Lava Man. "I don't think [Lava Man]'s that big of a cinch in the race," Specht said. "I think we have a chance of beating him if we get a good trip. It's worth taking a shot...He's not a horse like Secretariat or Spectacular Bid, horses that were so monstrous. He's not in that league. He's beaten some of the same horses that we've beaten." Lightly raced **Boboman** captured the GI Hollywood Turf Cup Dec. 9 before faltering at 6-5 in the GII San Marcos H. Jan. 21, after which he underwent throat surgery. Trainer Richard Mandella has opted for the six-year-old to make his dirt debut here. Boboman breezed five-eighths in :58.80 over Santa Anita's main track Sunday. "It was pretty nice," Mandella said. "It excited me."

He's certainly fast, but can he get the distance? Four-year-old **Fast Parade** has been nearly unstoppable at sprint distances: in eight starts at 6 1/2 furlongs, he has six wins and two seconds. His only try at a route was a tired seventh to Showing Up on dirt in the GII Coolmore Lexington S. last April. The Washington-bred handled his elders in the six-furlong GII Nearctic H. over the Woodbine turf Oct. 22 and, in his lone outing since, he was the 2-5 winner of the Impressive Luck H. down the Santa Anita hill Jan. 10. With a host of proven closers in the field, the Kilroe will almost certainly resemble last year's renewal, when four horses--led by **Milk It Mick**--were within a neck of one another at the finish. **Three Valleys** and **Silent Name**, both graded-stakes winners in 2006, are seeking to restore their reputations. The former hasn't been out since running a close third in the GI Citation H. Nov. 24, while Silent Name's stud plans were put on hold after he finished sixth in the same race. An intriguing newcomer to this division is **After Market**, who makes his first start for John Shirreffs. The Wygod homebred captured a pair of graded stakes for trainer Bill Mott last summer, but was put away after losing his unbeaten record in the GIII Kent BC S. Sept. 9. He returned to action with a tired eighth in an optional claimer at Gulfstream Jan. 31 for Mott before boarding a plane to Los Angeles.

Corinthian made an eye-catching return from a 6 1/2-month layoff, repulsing a bid from Jazil before drawing off to a 9 1/2-length victory in a local allowance Feb. 8 ([video](#)). Can he sustain that form in his second start back? "I like the fact that he doesn't have to run against Invasor (Arg)," trainer Jimmy Jerkens told *Daily Racing Form*. Facing Corinthian today are a pair of fellow four-year-olds who took their shots against the Horse of the Year last out in the GI Donn H. Feb. 3: **Hesanoldsalt** and **A.P. Arrow**. They ran second and third, respectively, that day. Hesanoldsalt bested Corinthian in a Saratoga allowance last summer. "But Hesanoldsalt is tough," Jerkens continued. "He already beat Corinthian, and you could say, 'Well, Corinthian wasn't as good as he was now.' You could say the same thing about Hesanoldsalt. He's gritty, he's running great down here, he's in good shape, he's going to be tough." While Nick Zito, who trains Hesanoldsalt for owner/breeder Live Oak, is happy that Invasor has his sights on Dubai, he knows it won't be simple getting to the winner's circle in this spot. "They're never easy in Florida," Zito told *Daily Racing Form*. "You hate to say this is spring training, but it's probably the toughest spring training of any place any time of year. If you look at the stars that run at Gulfstream, it's mind boggling." The stretch-running A.P. Arrow, an Allen Paulson homebred half-brother to GISW Geri, will appreciate the added distance here.

Trainer Doug O'Neill has a quartet of three-year-olds currently on the Triple Crown trail: Cobalt Blue, **Great Hunter**, Liquidity and Notional. Great Hunter was the most accomplished of those as a juvenile, and will make his seasonal bow here as the lone stakes winner in the field. "He's doing great, but we're definitely not going to have him super involved early in the race," O'Neill said. "That's not his style anyway, so you know, it'll be one where we'll probably be at the mercy of the pace, a little bit, if they're not going overly quick, he might not be able to get there...when you give a horse breather, you want him to build and build and build as the year goes on, and that's what we're hoping to do." Provided Great Hunter comes out of today's race in good order, he'll head to Keeneland for the GI Toyota Blue Grass S. Apr. 14, and "just stay there for the big one," O'Neill added. At the other end of the career spectrum is **Saint Paul**, who hasn't been out since galloping home 8 1/4 lengths clear in a one-mile Calder maiden Dec. 29 ([video](#)). The chestnut had blinkers added for that contest, his first time at a route on dirt, and he was purchased privately afterwards and turned over to trainer Bob Baffert. The Florida-bred gelding has posted several sharp works in recent weeks, and will be ridden by Alex Solis, who is 0-14 in the Kentucky Derby. "I want to put Solis on his first Derby winner," Baffert said.

A \$680,000 FTSAUG yearling purchase, **Forefathers** started his career in England, but showed little when seventh at Lingfield in August. Repatriated after that effort, he overcame a rough start in his U.S. bow to break his maiden at Calder Nov. 23 and made it two in a row with a front-running score in an optional claimer at that track Dec. 26. The bay stepped right into stakes company for his three-year-old bow and, after battling through a half in :44 3/5, held on to finish second to Adore the Gold in the Feb. 3 GII Swale S. He stretches out an additional furlong here, and trainer Nick Zito hopes he can go even farther. "He's got good tactical speed, and if he can learn to go a distance, he's a possibility to make the Derby," Zito told *Daily Racing Form*. **Spin Master**, a \$500,000 FTFFEB juvenile, debuted a winner at Turfway Park on New Year's Eve. Facing the talented Soaring By in his second start, a Gulfstream allowance test Feb. 3, the bay colt was let go at 16-1, but outgamed his more highly regarded rival to go two-for-two. **Out of Gwedda**, a six-length winner in his career opener at Belmont Park last May, was sidelined after taking the July 4 Tremont S. He made his return in the Jan. 7 Spectacular Bid S. and closed ground late to be second behind Buffalo Man, but had an excuse for his first loss. "He stumbled out of the gate and grabbed himself a bit...which not only cost him the race, but cost us some time," trainer Todd Pletcher told *DRF*. "But he's training extremely well. We've been pointing for this one for a while, and I expect him to run a big race."

Half Ours puts his unbeaten record on the line. A perfect two-for-two as a juvenile, with a 4 1/4-length victory in the Three Chimneys Juvenile S., the gray disappeared for more than 19 months before picking up his third win in an optional claimer run in the fog at the Big A Dec. 14. The four-year-old proved he could handle a mile with a gate-to-wire win in an optional event at Gulfstream Feb. 4, and he has been working sharply at Palm Beach Downs since. "He's fast enough where he's going to be prominent early, but he doesn't have to be on the lead," trainer Todd Pletcher told *Daily Racing Form*. **Bright One** turns back to a sprint after six starts at a mile and over. The chestnut colt won three straight by daylight last summer, capping the streak with a 5 3/4-length tally in the Aug. 6 GIII West Virginia Derby. Sent off at 3-5 in his next outing, the Oct. 7 GII Indiana Derby, he faltered to be seventh, but rebounded with a 3 1/2-length allowance success at Churchill Nov. 2. He set the early pace in his latest, the Nov. 24 GI Clark H., but hit the brakes and was last. The four-year-old has been working bullets for his first appearance of 2007. **Diabolical** was a stakes winner going a mile and a sixteenth on the Delaware turf in August, but switched back to the dirt and dropped back to six panels after fading to ninth in the Sept. 9 GIII Kent BC S. at that track. The four-year-old came back to take the Oct. 7 Gallant Bob H. at Philly Park and ended the season in the Nov. 25 GI DeFrancis Mem. Dash, where he was close second behind champion Thor's Echo.

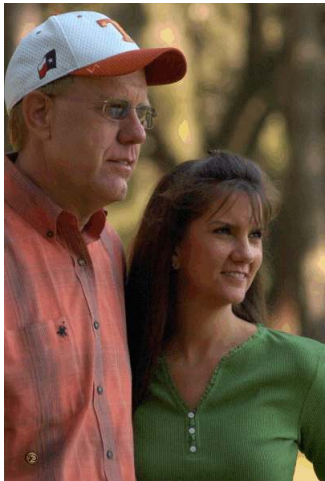

MUNCE GETS 30 MONTHS IN PRISON Australian rider Chris Munce was sentenced Thursday to 2 1/2 years in a Hong Kong prison after being found guilty of trading race tips with a businessman in return for bets, from which Munce netted a reported HK\$1 million in winnings. District Court Judge Kevin Brown found the jockey guilty on one count of "conspiracy to accept an advantage." In handing down his ruling, Judge Browne said that Munce had breached the "high degree of trust" that was required of him and that he had "severely undermined public confidence" in the integrity of horse racing in Hong Kong. For his part, Munce, barred under Hong Kong Jockey Club rules from placing any bets, had pleaded not guilty to the charges, denying that he had conspired with businessman Andy Lau between Dec. 3, 2005 and July 2, 2006. Munce was arrested outside a Kowloon hotel July 3. In his defense, Munce's attorney, John McNamara, argued that the jockey had ridden his horses to win, not to lose, and that the HKJC, despite its internal regulations, had taken no disciplinary action. Jockey Club stewards indicated in a release that their inquiry into the matter, adjourned while court proceedings were underway, would be continued "at a date and time to be fixed." The Club refused to make further comment. Reaction to the news in his native Australia was swift and largely supportive of Munce. "There wouldn't be a top jockey left on the globe if the same rules applied everywhere as Hong Kong," trainer Bart Cummings told *Australia Associated Press*. "Historically in Australia, a matter such as this would be dealt with by stewards." Racing NSW Chief Steward Ray Murrhiy added, "The more serious offences here have resulted in suspensions or disqualifications from riding."

RECORD BC FOAL NOMS Officials at Breeders' Cup Limited announced that a record 16,272 foals of 2006 were nominated to the program. Foals by Breeders' Cup, European Breeders' Fund and Common Fund-nominated stallions were eligible. The number is expected to rise when Southern Hemisphere foals, with an Apr. 15 deadline, are nominated. "The continued support of our nominators has allowed us to increase Breeders' Cup World Championships purses from \$14 million to \$20 million in 2006, and to create Breeders' Cup Friday with \$3.75 million in new purses for Breeders' Cup-nominated horses," said Greg Avioli, Breeders' Cup president and chief executive officer.

Arlington Park, U.S. Settle Lawsuit:

Officials at Arlington Park in suburban Chicago have announced a settlement of a federal lawsuit brought against the track by the United States and HOPE Fair Housing Center regarding backstretch housing at Arlington. The settlement is subject to approval by the federal court. The Consent Degree affirms Arlington's decision to restrict the placement of children in certain housing located adjacent to stables and related operations and the Federal Court for the Northern District of Illinois, has found that this policy does not constitute familial discrimination under the Fair Housing Act. "The terms of this settlement validate our concerns and policy," said Arlington Park President Roy Arnold in making the announcement. "The safety of the children living on the backstretch has always been our primary concern. Our housing policy takes into consideration that the proximity of certain housing in question to Thoroughbred race horses and various heavy agricultural and industrial operations poses significant risks and dangers for persons residing in those buildings." Illinois is the only racing jurisdiction that mandates its racetracks to provide housing to the families of backstretch workers. "The backstretch residents work directly for individual trainers and are not employees of Arlington Park," Arnold explained, adding that the costs of the housing are borne wholly by the track. An additional residential building with 48 units, constructed at a cost of \$2.6 million, will be ready for occupancy prior to the 2007 racing season.

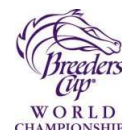
