FOLK HEADLINES THE OAKS

Sheikh Hamdan's **Folk** (Quiet American), who romped home a 10 1/4-length maiden winner in her third start at Aqueduct last November, made an impressive local debut when taking the listed UAE 1000 Guineas at Nad al Sheba Feb. 15 and looks to double up in tonight's

featured \$250,000 UAE Oaks at Nad al Sheba. Second that evening was South American invader **Greetings (Brz)** (Choctaw Ridge), trained by Brazilian conditioner Pedro Nickel Filho. "Folk beat us fair and square in the 1000 Guineas and I think she is the one to beat," admitted Nickel Filho.

"But I'm confident that my filly's race experience over this distance will play in her favor and move her up several lengths." Greetings, who races for owner-breeder Michael Perlman's Haras Interlagos, won three of her five starts in Brazil and was unbeaten on the dirt. In her last Brazilian start, the filly was an authoritative five-length winner of the G3 Grande Premio Paulo Jose da Costa last September.

DUBAI TRIP ON FOR VENGEANCE OF RAIN


Vengeance of Rain (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), impressive winner of the G1-HK Hong Kong Gold Cup at Sha Tin this past Sunday, has been given the green light for a start in the \$5-million G1 Dubai Sheema Classic on the World Cup undercard Mar. 31. Some doubt had been cast on his participation after HKJC vets indicated that a strict quarantine protocol would be instituted due to a virus which recently struck the stable of John Moore. Vengeance of Rain's trainer David Ferraris had expressed some concern that the quarantine requirements would alter his training of the six-year-old in the days leading up to his departure from Hong Kong. However, Ferraris learned yesterday that those requirements had been altered, allowing for a more normal training regimen. "There will be very little disruption to the training of the horse and I have to thank Dr. Brian Stewart and everyone who was involved in negotiating to get things right for us. We are all systems go," Ferraris told *South China Morning Post*. Vengeance of Rain, winner of the G1 Hong Kong Mile in 2005 and the G1 Queen Elizabeth II Cup in April 2006, will do two weeks of quarantine before shipping to Dubai. **Bullish Luck** (Royal Academy) has also been pronounced on track for the G1 Dubai World Cup, but Hong Kong's other possible representative, last year's Hong Kong Derby hero **Viva Pataca (GB)** (Marju {Ire}), has not yet officially been invited for the Sheema Classic. "It's getting very late in the day to organise it all, considering we need to do this quarantine and the deadline for that is Friday," trainer John Moore told *SCMP*. "If we don't hear something soon, I'll inform [owner] Dr. Stanley Ho [Hung-sun] that we'll stay home."

EL SEGUNDO STILL POSSIBLE FOR DUTY FREE

El Segundo (NZ) (Pins {Aus}) drew the outside barrier number 13 for Saturday's G1 Darley Australian Cup at Caulfield, and is a likely starter provided he passes a racecourse gallop this morning. A listless third to Aqua d'Amore (Aus) as the odds-on favorite in last week-end's G1 Futurity S., the New Zealand-bred has lengthened in ante-post wagering for Saturday's 2000-meter event. "I just need to see him work well [today]," trainer Colin Little told *Australian Associated Press*. "He'll have a light gallop and it's full steam ahead for Saturday," he added. Little also indicated that El Segundo remains a possibility for the G1 Dubai Duty Free S. Mar. 31, despite first suggesting that the gelding would not contest both the Australia Cup and the Duty Free. "The owners are still very keen to take him," Little said.

BAZE WINS 11TH MURPHY AWARD

Thoroughbred racing's all-time leading jockey Russell Baze will receive the Isaac Murphy Award for the second consecutive year and the 11th time overall, it was announced yesterday. The award is given annually by the National Turf Writers Association to the North American jockey with the highest overall winning percentage. Baze, winner of the Murphy Award the first nine times it was awarded (1995-2003), finished the 2006 season with 378 winners from 1,294 mounts, a winning percentage of 29.2 percent. Second the standings was jockey John Davila Jr., who won with 28.5 percent of his mounts in 2006. The Isaac Murphy Award is named in honor of the 19th century African-American jockey who won with 44 percent of his career mounts. Jockeys need to have ridden a minimum of 500 races to be eligible for the award. Baze will receive his honor from the NTWA later this year.

**TWO NEW GROUPS JOIN NEW YORK
FRANCHISE QUEST**

Two new groups, including a mystery entity, have joined the process to try to win the state Thoroughbred racetrack franchise now held by the New York Racing Association. The Spitzer administration in New York on March 7 released the names of six groups--four that previously bid on the franchise and two new companies-- that will be part of the next phase of the ongoing battle among some of the industry's elite players to become the new operator of Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga racetracks. The two new companies interested in the franchise are Catskill Off-Track Betting Corp., which is considered a long-shot by industry insiders but could merge with one of the other bidding groups, and Thoroughbred Racing NY, whose members were not yet revealed. Sid Davidoff, an influential lobbyist in New York, is involved in representing the group. He was not immediately available for comment. "The fact that additional companies have come forward demonstrates the great appeal and potential of Thoroughbred racing in New York," Governor Eliot Spitzer said in a written statement. The governor recently said he did not feel obligated to follow a non-binding recommendation by a state panel created before he became governor. That panel recently tapped Excelsior Racing Associates as its choice to run racing in the state. The group's partners include New York Yankees executive Steve Swindal and casino developer Richard Fields. Also vying is Empire Racing Associates, which placed second behind Excelsior in the recent bidding competition.

FEDERAL COURT FREES BALA The U.S. Court of Appeals for the eighth district has overruled the U.S. District Court of North Dakota and freed Susan Bala. The former head of Racing Services was sentenced to 27 months in prison and charged with 12 counts of operating an illegal gambling business. Bala, who has served 18 months of the sentence in a minimum security prison in Pekin, Illinois, was scheduled to be released on probation in the next month. The three-judge appeals court also overturned a ruling which required Bala to forfeit \$99 million in illegal gambling proceeds, *Daily Racing Form* reports. "Obviously, we're delighted," Elizabeth McKibben, Bala's attorney, told the *Form*. "Justice has finally served Susan. She thought all along that she would be exonerated." The U.S. attorney who prosecuted Bala was said to have been exploring his appeal options, but Mark Beauchene, the lawyer who represented Bala at trial, said it was unlikely she'd face further charges, saying that she was protected under double jeopardy.

Swap Fliparoo Stretches Out for Rampart:

Hobeau Farm's **Swap Fliparoo** (Exchange Rate), better known for her exploits as a sprinter/miler, will stretch out to two turns when she tackles reigning Breeders' Cup Distaff winner **Round Pond** (Awesome Again) in Sunday's GII Rampart H. at Gulfstream. Last year's GI Test S. winner could hardly have been more impressive in her latest, waltzing to a 6 1/4-length victory in the GIII Sabin H. going this track's one-turn mile Feb. 17. With an emphasis on stamina, Swap Fliparoo worked seven-eighths of a mile in 1:26 1/5 Monday morning at Gulfstream, and trainer Allen Jerkens is hoping the four-year-old filly is able to relax going Sunday's distance of nine furlongs. "She's getting over chasing a lot quicker paces in her races," the Hall of Famer commented. "They're liable to go 24 [seconds] for the first quarter [Sunday]. If she doesn't relax and goes chasing after that pace, she won't make it."

Blue Bullet in Near Bullet:

Blue Bullet (Red Bullet), perfect in his two career starts to date, worked a half-mile in :46.20 at Gulfstream yesterday morning, the fourth-fastest of 27 moves at the distance. The Hobeau colorbearer, a half-brother to crack sprinter Kelly Kip, is likely to try stakes competition in his next outing. "We might go in the [seven-furlong GIII] Bay Shore S. [at Aqueduct Apr. 7] or the Aventura [7f, Gulfstream, Mar. 31]," trainer Allen Jerkens stated. "The kind of competition he'll face will be like night and day."

Santos Possibly Facing Surgery:

Jockey Jose Santos, who sustained several fractured vertebrae in three-horse spill Feb. 11, may undergo surgery. Initially diagnosed with three damaged thoracic vertebrae, a fractured sternum and a broken nose, Santos was later found to have two additional damaged vertebrae. "Once the swelling went down, they discovered that I damaged five vertebrae instead of three," he explained. "The T-5, T-6 and T-9 vertebrae are compressed; the real problem are the T-7 and T-8 because they are pressing on the spinal cord." Santos added, "I have to go back to the doctor on Mar. 19, and we'll see where we're at. We've been trying to avoid surgery, but I don't know if that is still possible. I have to wear a brace, and I only take it off when I go to sleep. It is still painful. The swelling and pain in my chest is all gone, and my nose looks normal. You could only tell it was broken if you touched it." At the time of his accident, Santos had been aboard 96 mounts with a record of 11-15-13.

Equine Leptospirosis Cases on the Rise:

The University of Kentucky's Livestock Disease Diagnostic Center (LDDC) has confirmed 40 cases of equine leptospirosis in the Central Kentucky region for the period beginning July 2006 to the present. Most of the cases have resulted in foal loss by pregnant mares. Just two cases were observed during the same time period last year and scientists attribute that jump to a significant increase in rainfall; there were 14 more inches of precipitation in 2006 as compared to 2005. The disease is bacterial in nature and is found worldwide, affecting many species, including horses and people. The source of the bacteria is the urine of wild animals, including mice, squirrels, fox, skunks, opossums and deer. Horses can contract the disease by the absorption of the bacteria through mucosal membranes of the eye or the mouth by contact with blood, urine or tissues from infected animals. Symptoms of the disease include fever and listlessness and horses may also go off their feed. Owners may observe what appear to be painful eyes with swelling, squinting, blinking, cloudiness and tearing. Adult horses can die of liver and/or kidney failure and may become jaundiced in the latter stages of disease.

Churchill to Open Quarantine Facility:

When Churchill Downs begins accepting horses this coming Saturday for its upcoming spring meeting, foreign horsemen will have a new quarantine and isolation facility to make use of. Barn 45 on the Churchill backstretch was retrofitted last fall to serve as a quarantine barn for horses that competed in November's Breeders' Cup World Thoroughbred Championships. The barn contains a firewall which allows half the facility to be used for quarantine purposes while the other half will meet the needs of horses in isolation. "The establishment of a regular quarantine and isolation facility is an important step for Churchill Downs and its stakes program," said Don Richardson, senior vice president of racing for Churchill Downs. "Our stakes program has events that should be attractive to foreign-based horses not only during Kentucky Derby Week or visits by the Breeders' Cup, but throughout our racing year. We hope the availability of this facility will encourage owners and trainers from around the world to consider the option of bringing their horses to Churchill Downs to face some of the best competition American racing has to offer."

Bipartisan Efforts Under Way for Immigration Reform

Senator Ted Kennedy (D-MA), who chairs the Senate Judiciary Committee's Immigration Subcommittee, and Senator John McCain (R-AZ) continue to work with Reps. Jeff Flake (R-AZ) and Luis Gutierrez (D-IL) on drafting legislation that would provide undocumented immigrants a path to legal status. The group is expected to unveil House and Senate companion bills once agreement is reached on a final draft – possibly by the end of March. Under discussion are provisions for an employee verification system, wage requirements, guest worker certification rules and a “touchback” requirement for illegal immigrants seeking citizenship to leave the country briefly. The Senate Immigration Subcommittee's Democratic members include Kennedy, Joe Biden (DE), Dianne Feinstein (CA), Chuck Schumer (NY) and Richard Durbin (IL). Republican members include John Cornyn (TX), Charles Grassley (IA), Jon Kyl (AZ) and Jeff Sessions (AL). The House Immigration Subcommittee is chaired by Zoe Lofgren (D-CA), with Steve King (R-IA) the ranking member.
