American import **Folk** (Quiet American) posted her second stylish victory last night in Dubai, taking the \$250,000 Listed UAE Oaks by five lengths to go with a success in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas Feb. 15. She'll try to make it a triple of sorts against the boys Mar. 31 in the \$2-million G2 UAE Derby. "She was very impressive and had a lot left in the locker," said

winning trainer Ismail Mohammed. "We will make history now and go for the UAE Derby." The start of the race was delayed when **Desert Fight (Chi)** (Hussonet) flipped behind the gate and was scratched, and Folk was very eager to get going after breaking from the rail. PROUD TOWER TOO SIDELINED

Proud Tower Too (Proud Irish), winner of last year's G1 Golden Shaheen, will not be able to defend his title in the Mar. 31 renewal of the race after suffering a tendon tear earlier this week, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "On Monday I noticed heat in that tendon," trainer Sal Gonzalez said. "We scanned it and he has a very small tear on a tendon. He's been so good to us, that it's best not to run." Gonzalez said Proud Tower Too would get five to six months off and then his condition would be reassessed. The five-year-old, winner of the 2005 GI Malibu S., has won seven times and earned \$1,735,572.

INVASOR IN 'FABULOUS FORM'

Horse of the Year **Invasor (Arg)** (Candy Stripes) is slated to breeze today at Palm Meadows, his penultimate workout before getting on a Dubai-bound plane. The five-year-old has drawn rave reviews from trainer

Kieran McLaughlin. "He loves his work and he does it effortlessly," said McLaughlin. "He's very fit and he puts a lot into his gallops, so we decided he didn't need to work every week." A Triple Crown winner in Uruguay prior to his championship U.S. season, the bay's lone career loss came last year at Nad al Sheba when he ran fourth in the G2 UAE Derby to none other than Discreet

Cat, who is slated to be in the starting gate as well for the G1 Dubai World Cup Mar. 31. "Last time we met, we gave Discreet Cat nine pounds," McLaughlin said, adding that they will run at equal weights in the World Cup. "He's filled out--he's put on quite a bit of weight--and he's matured mentally," the conditioner added. "He's in fabulous form." Invasor's regular rider, 19-year-old Fernando Jara, was flown to Dubai by the Shadwell team in order to familiarize himself with Nad al Sheba. Jara rode there yesterday, finishing second aboard Mutasallil in a 2000-meter handicap over the sand. "The aim was for me to meet some people and get used to the track, so I have some experience before the Dubai World Cup," Jara said.

Bred by Darley and campaigned by Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed Al Maktoum, Folk began her career in New York with Tom Albertrani. She showed some speed in her Oct. 1 career opener at Belmont, but bore out on the turn and trailed home last of eight fillies. The bay came back to run a much-improved second to Boca Grande--subsequent winner of the GII Demoiselle S.-- Oct. 18 at Belmont, then graduated by 10 1/4 lengths after a front-running performance going a mile at Aqueduct Nov. 26 ([video](#)). Folk used that speed to make her local bow a winning one, defeating more seasoned fillies by 4 3/4 lengths in the Listed UAE 1000 Guineas Feb. 15. Yesterday's victory was the third for trainer Ismail Mohammed on the night and 16th of the Dubai International Racing Carnival, allowing him to take home the Trainer's Reward prize of \$120,000. Folk's jockey, Kerrin McEvoy, was the DIRC's top jockey with nine wins, while Sheikh Hamdan led all owners with 10 victories. Folk's second dam is Family Style, the U.S. champion two-year-old filly in 1985. During that year, she amassed victories in the GI Frizette S., GI Spinaway S., and GI Arlington-Washington Lassie for owner Eugene Klein and trainer D. Wayne Lukas. She also ran second that season in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, GI Demoiselle S. and GI Matron S. After selling to Brushwood Stables for \$1.55 million at the 1987 'Night of the Stars' Fasig-Tipton Sale, the chestnut produced Polish Style as her first foal in 1989. That bay, a \$1.3-million FTSAUG yearling, was a listed winner in France. In 2000, she produced the Sunday Silence filly Danuta, who captured the UAE Oaks in 2003 before that race achieved listed status.

Others to note include Edges Farm Stables' hip [18](#), a Noverre half-brother to the 2001 G1 Phoenix S. runner-up Miss Beabea (Ire), herself the dam of last year's G1 Moyglare Stud S. and Goffs Million heroine Miss Beatrix (Ire); and another son of that Darley stallion in hip [25](#), a half to this year's listed-winning and group-placed filly Bahama Mama (Ire) consigned by Mark Dywer's Oaks Farm Stables. There's also Suirview Stables' hip [19](#), a colt by last year's leading sire of juveniles Invincible Spirit (Ire) out of a listed-winning half to Catchascatchcan (GB); and Malcolm Bastard's hip [71](#), a colt by Oasis Dream (GB) from the immediate

The 18-year-old broodmare, a two-time graded stakes winner on the track, produced English group winner and leading 2005 European freshman sire Bertolini (Danzig) as well as stakes winners Amelia (Dixieland Band) and Alchemilla (Deputy Minister). Bred in partnership by Alexander, David Aykroyd and Helen Groves, Aquilegia was a full sister to champion Althea. She was buried at Middlebrook.

'07 Fact Book On-Line:

Record national purses and auction sale prices, as well as a reversal of a two-year decline in national handle are among the statistical highlights in The Jockey Club's 2007 On-Line Fact Book, which was released yesterday on the organization's website at www.jockeyclub.com. Available 2006 purse money in the U.S. increased 3.3 percent to a record \$1,120,350,012, buoyed by the significant contributions to purses from alternative gaming at racetracks in a number of states. Total handle on U.S. Thoroughbred races in 2006 increased 1.5 percent to \$14,785,222,550, snapping a two-year decline. The Fact Book also shows the expanding breeding industries in the racino states of New Mexico, Louisiana and Pennsylvania. The national registered foal crop increased 5.4 percent from 1995 to 2005, but the number of registered foals born in New Mexico and Louisiana increased 61.4 percent and 52.0 percent, respectively. During the same time, the number of Thoroughbreds born in Pennsylvania increased 54.7 percent. Statistics in the sales section of the Fact Book show that total Thoroughbred auction sales increased 11.2 percent to \$1,266,684,292. The average price per horse sold in each of the four major categories of sales all reached record levels, led by a 14.8-percent increase in the average juvenile price tag. The average price per weanling and broodmare gained 13.9 percent and 12.2 percent, respectively, while the yearling average advanced four percent.

"There are so many caring people in this industry who love horses and understand that we must care for them upon their retirements," said TRF Executive Director. "This is an excellent way to involve them and raise money. One of the many good things about the program is that a trainer only has to contribute after a win, an occasion when many are more than happy to share in their good fortune."
