LAVA MAN CONFIRMED FOR DUBAI

Jason Wood and STD Racing Stable's **Lava Man** (Slew City Slew), who became just the third horse in history to capture two runnings of the GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 3, has been confirmed for the \$5-million G1 Dubai Duty Free. The 1,777-meter (about nine furlongs) turf race is part of the Dubai World Cup card Mar. 31. "He's doing great," said STD Stable's Steve Kenly. "We wouldn't be going otherwise. We wanted to see how he came out of the last race and if he would be ready to

run in four weeks, and everything looks good." Kenly said the horse is scheduled to work Sunday and will ship to Dubai on Tuesday. He added that the human connections of Lava Man would likely head to Dubai on Tuesday, Mar. 27.

THE GREEN MONKEY NEARING RETURN

The world-record \$16-million **The Green Monkey** (Forestry) is nearing a return to training. A Coolmore spokesman yesterday confirmed that the colt, who became the highest-priced horse ever to sell at auction when knocked down to Coolmore's Demi O'Byrne at last year's Fasig-Tipton Calder sale, is still at Ashford Stud in Kentucky, but said the three-year-old was slated to rejoin trainer Todd Pletcher's stable in the coming weeks. Last August, Pletcher reported that the colt had pulled a gluteal muscle and gave him a few weeks off. He came back to record four works last October before returning to the sidelines.

Yesterday, my colleague Andrew Caulfield considered the pedigree of Rags to Riches. Winner of the GI Santa Anita Oaks, Rags to Riches has about as rich a background as one could contemplate, being an A.P. Indy half-sister to a GI Belmont Stakes winner, out of a Deputy Minister mare from a fabulous family.

Today, we are going to look at another three-year-old filly who took a major stakes at the weekend--the GII Fair Grounds Oaks victress Mistical Plan--but who has a pedigree from the opposite end of the fashion spectrum. Incidentally, the Fair Grounds Oaks victory, which came over a very accomplished field, represented a big performance step forward for the Cal-bred. Purchased privately by J. Paul Reddam after a maiden win at Santa Rosa, Mistical Plan did win the state-bred Cover Gal S. last year, and take the six-furlong Sunshine Millions Oaks this term, but she had been beaten in four graded events, doing best when second in the GIII Pocahontas S., and third in the GIII Santa Ysabel S.

Mistical Plan's sire, Game Plan, never ran and now stands in California, at a fee most recently advertised at \$3,500. Still, while he lacked performance, Game Plan did take to stud a top-class pedigree. A son of Danzig,

he was out of Cadillacing, herself winner of the GI Ballerina S. and a sister to Champion Easy Goer, and half-sister to Grade I winner Easy Now (by Danzig, and so a three-parts sister to Game Plan). Cadillacing's dam was champion Relaxing, a daughter of Buckpasser and the

Acorn S. winner Marking Time, this being a very successful branch of the La Troienne family. Game Plan himself is a brother to the short-lived GI Futurity S. victor Strolling Along, and to The Jogger, a minor winner who has sired graded stakes winners in New Zealand, and half-brother to multiple graded winner Cat Cay and to graded-placed Lion Hearted, now a sire in Maryland.

Mistical Plan is Game Plan's first graded scorer, but he has sired a total of 12 stakes winners from his first seven crops, which have totaled 313 foals, and have supplied 204 starters and 154 winners (for approximately 6 percent stakes winners to runners, and 75 percent winners to runners). Those 12 stakes winners also include Bedlam Bertie, a black-type winner this year at four who placed third in the 2006 GIII Bay Meadows Derby, and Melanyhasthepapers, a stakes winner of over \$300,000 who also ran second in the GIII All American H.

Mistical Plan is the only winner from the first three starters produced by her dam, Mistical Bel. She was a daughter of the Bold Bidder horse Bel Bolide, a Group 2 winner in England at two, and third in the G1 2000 Guineas the following year, and subsequently a four-time graded stakes winner in California. He also appears as broodmare sire of the Grade I-winning sprinter Richter Scale.

Mistical Bel's dam Mistical Mist was only a minor winner, and she never produced a black-type winner, although her Distinctive Cat colt Mysterious Cat took third in the GII San Bernardino H. and is still racing in 2007 at the age of nine. Mistical Mist was half-sister to the minor stakes winners Salem Ho and M. A.'s Date, but she is also a sister to Princess Met, a stakes producer who also features as granddam of the three-time graded scorer Windsor Castle. Another half-sister to Mistical Mist, Kay Ho, has also made her name as a producer, and is ancestress of eight stakes winners, including the GI Vanity International H. heroine Private Persuasion.

Mistical Plan's dam, Mistical Bel, has an intriguing pedigree with the brothers Graustark/His Majesty appearing 3x3 and, although it didn't help Mistical Bel develop into a runner of note, the inbreeding may be the key to the upgrading in Mistical Plan's ability. What is important to note here is that Graustark and His Majesty play very strongly into the background of both Danzig (grandsire of Mistical Plan) and his sire Northern Dancer. Northern Dancer is by Nearctic (by Nearco, a Pharos/Havresac II cross), out of Lady Angela (by Hyperion, out of a mare by a son of Tracery), and has a second dam by Mahmoud. Graustark is by Ribot (reverse Havresac II/Pharos cross to Nearco) out of a mare by Alibhai (by Hyperion out of a mare by Tracery) and has a second dam by Mahmoud. Danzig adds to the mix as his granddam is by Petition, who a grandson of Fairway (brother to Pharos), out of a mare by Artist's Proof, a Gainsborough (sire of Hyperion)/Tracery cross, so again reinforcing the strains shared by Northern Dancer and Graustark/His Majesty. We can note that crossing stallions carrying Danzig with mares carry either Graustark or His Majesty has also produced group and Grade 1 winners Danehill, Les Arcs, Military, Pine Island, Tribulation, Keeper, Sea Hero, Influent, Adoradation and Danni Martine. **Alan Porter may be contacted at portrpedigree@msn.com. OUIJA BOARD CONFIRMED IN FOAL *Ouija Board (GB)* (Cape Cross {Ire}), one of the most accomplished racemares in recent years, has been confirmed in foal to Kingmambo, according to *Racing Post*. She was covered Feb. 26. "I am glad to say that *Ouija Board* is confirmed in foal," owner Lord Derby told *Racing Post*. "She has taken first time, which is really great news as we were concerned because she is a six-year-old mare." She is scheduled to remain at Lane's End Farm for the next 80 days before returning to England. Bred by Lord Derby's Stanley House, the popular dark bay captured seven Group 1 races over a career spanning four seasons, including the G1 Epsom Oaks, G1 Irish Oaks and G1 Breeders' Cup F/M Turf at three, when she was honored as the Cartier Horse of the Year in Europe as well as champion turf female in the U.S. A splint injury led to an abbreviated four-year-old campaign capped by a triumph in the G1 Hong Kong Vase, but she returned at five to take the Breeders' Cup as well as another Cartier and Eclipse again under the guidance of Ed Dunlop. Her other top-level wins were the G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Nassau S. *Ouija Board* shipped to Hong Kong in December to defend her title in the Vase, but a minor splint injury on the eve of the race led to her retirement. She amassed £3,510,682 in earnings.

EARLY RETURNS

A.P. Indy led the North American General Sire List for the second time in 2006 (and topped all sires by 'A Runner' Index for the fourth time), and after last weekend, he might be a short-priced favorite to win it for the third time in 2007. He kicked off the weekend with a 1-2 in the GII New Orleans H. on Saturday, compliments of Master Command and Patriot Act, and followed up with Rags to Riches, who positively dripped class in an easy 5 1/2-length cruise in the Sunday's GI Santa Anita Oaks, her second straight Grade I. He really is the number one sire in North America right now.

From early returns through the first 10 weekends of 2007, five sires have edged over the \$1 million in progeny earnings for the year-to-date, according to *bloodhorse.com*. Number two is Royal Academy, a horse I have thought is perennially underrated. He has six 'Northern' stakes winners this year; his big earner, though, is Brazilian-bred Molengao, winner of the GII San Antonio and second to Lava Man (by current number-three sire, Slew City Slew) in the GI Santa Anita H. In fourth spot is Thunder Gulch, who matched A.P. Indy with a Grade II winner and a Grade I winner over the weekend. The Grade I winner was the four-year-old filly Balance, in the Santa Margarita, but of even more significance was Circular Quay, impressive winner of the GII Louisiana Derby, running a Beyer 102. That probably made him the leading Kentucky Derby candidate seen out so far this year. They've been there before, too. Thunder Gulch won the 1995 Kentucky Derby for Michael Tabor, and his wife, Doreen, is registered as the breeder of Circular Quay. In partnership with Derrick Smith, Tabor also owns Rags to Riches and Ravel, winner of the GIII Sham S. So they're all having a good spring, so far.

Some new perennial household names appear next: Distorted Humor, number five now, with 2007 progeny earnings just over the \$1-million mark, including two Classic contenders all of a sudden: Cowtown Cat, winner of the GIII Gotham S. last weekend, and Any Given Saturday, winner of the Sam F. Davis S. at Tampa Bay. The latter is due to clash with Street Sense in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby this Saturday. Except for California sires Memo and Bertrando, the remainder of the top 20 are all Kentucky sires with current form.

They are: Awesome Again; Giant's Causeway; Tale of the Cat (leading sire in number of 2007 winners, with 30); Unbridled's Song; Quiet American; Grand Slam; Maria's Mon; Stormy Atlantic; Lemon Drop Kid; Silver Deputy and his sire, Deputy Minister; Yes It's True; and Holy Bull.

Wide-margin leading second-crop sire so far is Johannesburg, runner-up to Street Sense's sire, Street Cry, as Leading Freshman Sire last year. Already sire of three stakes winners this year--GII Fountain of Youth winner Scat Daddy, Southwest S. winner Teuflesberg, and GIII Santa Ysabel S. winner Baroness Thatcher--it's not surprising Johannesburg has galloped clear of the opposition. Whatever else does or doesn't eventually make the grade at stud, Johannesburg is looking very good. Though we won't know for a few weeks if Street Sense and Summer Doldrums are going to keep Street Cry right alongside Johannesburg--Darley vs. Coolmore--the nursery formerly known as Jonabell has a second string to their bow in E Dubai.

By Mr. P out of \$683,832-earner Words of War, by Lord at War from a great Elmendorf family, it's not like he hasn't got the pedigree. He won the Gil Dwyer (nine furlongs) at three and the Gil Suburban (10 furlongs) at four, and also ran second to Point Given in the Gil

Travers. But, like a true son of Mr. Prospector, they are showing a lot of speed. He might be quite a good bet at \$15,000 right now. The non-Titan (Coolmore or Maktoum) sires among the current second-crop top five are: Jump Start (nine winners, one stakes winner this year); Officer (11 winners, two stakes winners); and Yonaguska (crop leader with 15 winners in 2007, also one stakes winner). Number six, Include, is the only other sire with over \$300,000 in progeny earnings so far this year.

Johannesburg has higher earnings than the top third-crop sire so far this year, but on the other hand the first nine in that group have progeny earnings over \$400,000, and are ahead of the number two second-crop sire, Jump Start. Maybe the surprise leader is Brahms, but not only does he have Gil Strub winner Arson Squad this year, he's also the crop leader, with 20 winners in 2007. Second is Put It Back, from Bridlewood Farm in Florida, which developed Stormy Atlantic before he became The Next Big Thing. A very fast son of Honour and Glory, APEX uncovered Put It Back as the leading second-crop sire of 2006 (4.03 A Runner Index), and that rating has been confirmed by Smokey Stover, who followed up a decisive win over top sprinters in the Sunshine Millions Sprint at Santa Anita with a facile win, last weekend, in the Gill Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup Sprint.

These two surprise packages are followed by the five stallions who have rated as this group's leaders at one point or another so far: Aptitude, El Corredor, Tiznow, Point Given, and Broken Vow from Kentucky, and Trippi and Exchange Rate, from Florida. It will be interesting to follow how this 'sire crop' progresses: they have maybe not been as consistent at producing good horses as one might like, but the top sires in this group do seem to be capable of siring top horses. 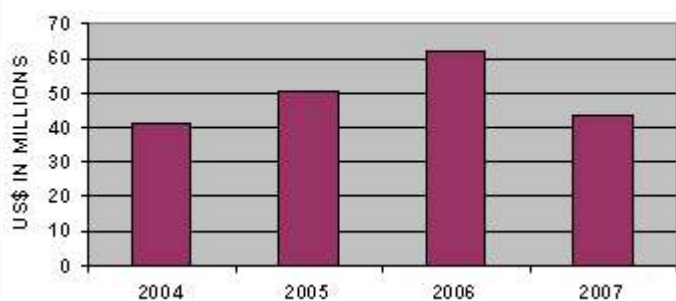

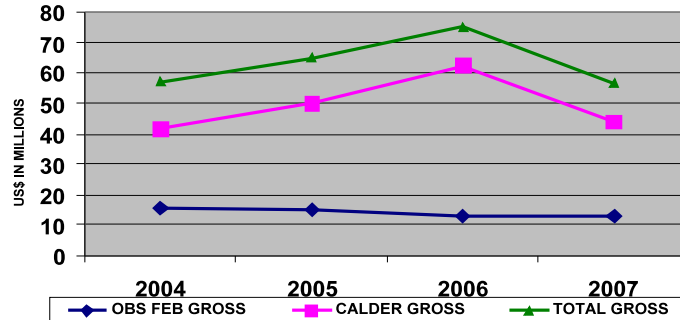

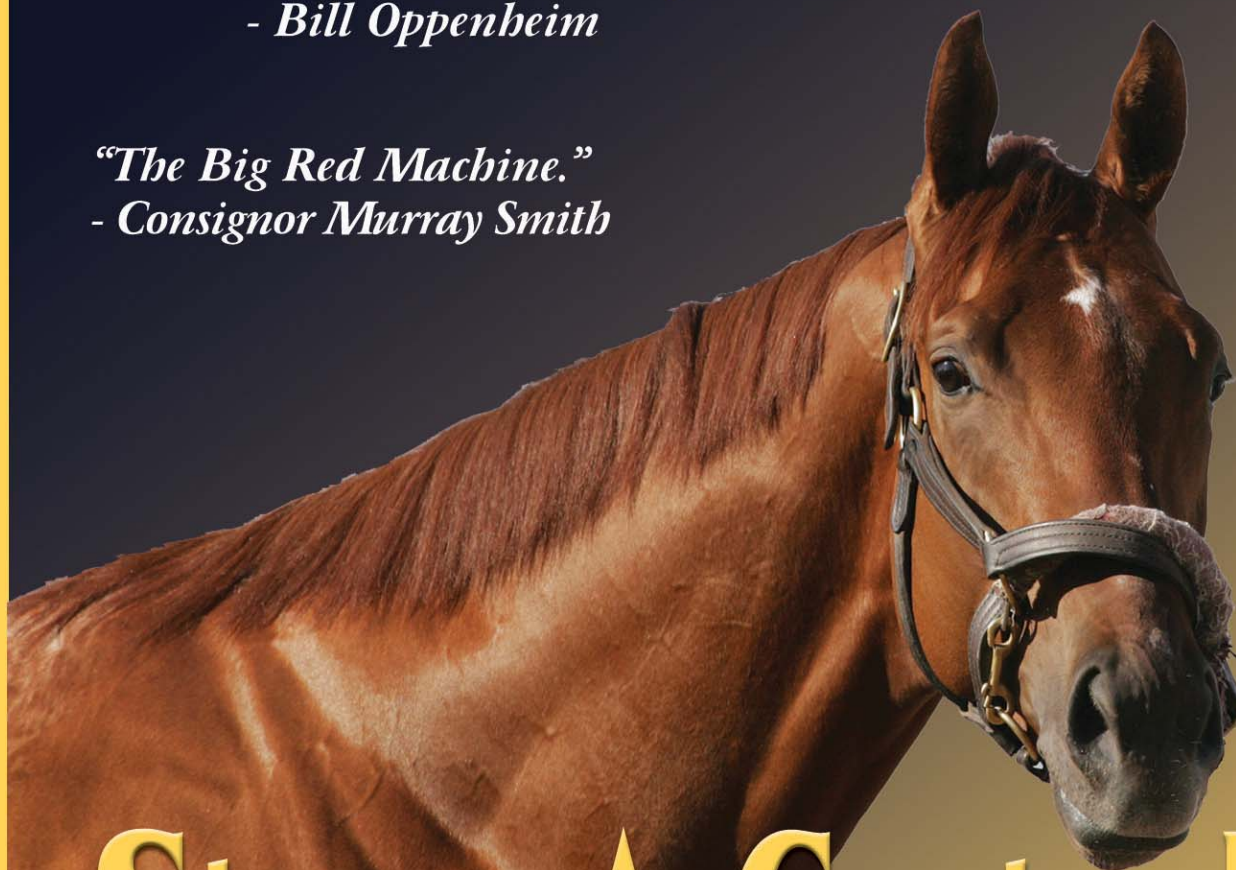

MCINGVALE ASKS COURT TO DROP EATON SALES FROM LAWSUIT

Attorneys for James McIngvale have asked a Texas judge to drop Kentucky-based agency Eaton Sales from the list of named defendants in the horse owner's fraud lawsuit. Eaton Sales was one of seven individuals or entities added in January to a lawsuit that previously included trainer Bob Baffert and bloodstock agents and brothers J.B. and Kevin McKathan, a legal action that claims at least 19 purchases made on behalf of McIngvale in 2001-2004 involved fraudulent dealings. "Newly obtained information and documentation" suggests Eaton Sales had no part in fraudulent transactions allegedly involving Baffert and the McKathan brothers, according to documents filed in U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Texas in Galveston. "We should have never been named in the lawsuit to begin with," said Reiley McDonald, who operates Eaton Sales along with business partner Tom VanMeter. "Eaton Sales never paid any commissions to the McKathan Brothers; Eaton Sales was never approached by the McKathan Brothers to pay them a commission. "We have been dropped, but we haven't received an apology from McIngvale's attorneys, or from Mr. McIngvale, despite the fact they have mistakenly imputed our integrity publicly." Neither McIngvale nor his attorneys immediately returned calls seeking comment. U.S. District Judge Samuel B. Kent would have to sign the proposed motion to make the dismissal effective. In addition to Baffert and the McKathan brothers, others still named in the lawsuit are Celebrity Farms, Highclere Sales, Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, Donato Lanni, David McKathan, and Murray Smith.

SUBLIMITY SUBLIME

Sir Michael Stoute, who bagged a famous National Hunt success when sending out Kribensis (Ire) to land the 1990 G1 Champion Hurdle, maintained his connection with Cheltenham's traditional opening-day feature, the £360,000 renewal at the Prestbury Park track yesterday. Stoute's former incumbent **Sublimity (Fr)** (Selkirk) transferred his abundant flat speed to jumping's smaller obstacles in securing victory. Now based with John Carr in Ireland, the seven-year-old former dual Listed winner provided the County Kildare trainer with a career high by producing an impressive display in the 2 1/16-miles event to claim the Emerald Isle's fourth straight championship. Settled at the back of the 10-runner field by jockey Phillip Carberry, Sublimity edged ever closer from halfway and arrived on the scene as the leaders turned into the straight. Continuing his smooth progress to lead upon touchdown after the final flight, the well-backed 16-1 chance was driven clear up the final climb to defeat reigning champion **Brave Inca (Ire)** (Good Thyne) by a decisive three lengths. "I didn't know if he would win as I have never had a Champion Hurdle horse, but I wouldn't mind a few more like him," Carr told *PA Sport*. "I was leaning for [Friday's] County Hurdle because he would have been a certainty off his weight in that and we could have gone to the Champion Hurdle next year, but by this time next year the horse could have been injured, or I could have been dead. There's only one Champion Hurdle and, with top-class horses, disaster is always round the corner. I have thought big all along with this horse and he has delivered. He goes so well fresh and has won so many races first time out, so I'm not complaining."

Earlier on the six-race card, **My Way de Solzen (Fr)** (Assessor {Ire}) added to last term's G1 Stayers' Hurdle heroics with an emphatic five-length score in the G1 Arkle Trophy Chase, while the meeting kicked off with a batting victory for **Ebaziyan (Ire)** (Daylami {Ire}), who was bred by His Highness The Aga Khan, in the G1 Supreme Novices' Hurdle.

MOON OUT OF DERBY

Juddmonte Farms' **Spanish Moon** (El Prado {Ire}), a once-out maiden winner at Newmarket Oct. 28, will bypass the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby after meeting with an injury during training, *Racing Post* has revealed. "Spanish Moon has had a training setback which will prevent him from having a Derby preparation," trainer Sir Michael Stoute told the trade daily. "He was found to be lame behind and will be off for probably about 12 weeks before he's cantering again. It is a setback, but fortunately it is not career-threatening."

GRAND NATIONAL CHARITY BALL

The inaugural "Sport Celebrates the Grand National" charity ball will be held Apr. 19, five days after the historic John Smith's Grand National will be conducted. The event, to be staged at the Landmark Hotel in London, will benefit two charities: the Spinal Injuries Association and Retraining of Racehorses. Among the items to be auctioned off is a Philip Blacker bronze replica of the famous Seagram Grand National perpetual trophy. The list of items will be published ahead of the event for bidding from those not able to attend. Tables are still available at £2,500 for a table of 10. The Spinal Injuries Association is the national charity which offers vital support to people paralysed through spinal cord injury, while Retraining of Racehorses promotes the welfare of horses once their racing days are over by supporting charitable rehabilitation centres. BIRDS OF A FEATHER

They name their clients after football stars, have celebrities like Jay-Z, Tom Brady and Kenny Mayne as partners, and will be featured on an episode of the HBO hit show *Entourage* next year.

If it sounds like a well-known management agency or a chic advertising company, it's not.

It's Little Red Feather, the coolest and most happening horse racing partnership to hit the sport in some time.

And with horse racing about to hit the big time in Philadelphia, the California-based ownership group is ready to make a very big splash in the City of Brotherly Love--and they want you to join them.

Little Red Feather is run by its general manager, Billy Koch, the 37-year old grandson of a legendary Hollywood producer. Koch started his racing group in 2001 with the intention of having some fun. An avid horse fan from the time he was five years old, Koch soon realized that racing was his passion--and so he decided that he was going to make a career out of it.

"I've been around horses my whole life," said Koch. "My grandfather [Howard W. Koch, who produced mega-movie hits *Airplane* and *Ghost*] had a popular horse called Telly's Pop [named after partner Telly Savalas]. I used to hang around the barn with him and that got me hooked. I enjoyed it more than anything else. I knew I wanted to be involved with horses from that point on.

"After college I got some investors together and bought some horses. We had all kinds, good and bad. We ran the gamut, but with every one I learned something new."

Koch's big break came in 2002 when he, with the help of an investor and trainer Don Chatlos, bought a horse at an Ocala, Florida farm. They named it Singletary, for Chicago Bears middle linebacker Mike Singletary, one of Koch's favorite players.

"We bought three horses, Singletary was about \$30,000 of the investment," Koch recalled. "I asked everyone I knew if they wanted to get in on it. I tried to get people to just put up \$5,000, but nobody would do it. Finally I got enough guys together and that's how it started."

Two years later Singletary put Koch and Little Red Feather on the map by winning the Breeders' Cup Mile in longshot fashion. The unbelievable victory not only gave the partnership enough money to get off the ground (they earned \$1.8 million for the victory), but it attracted a ton of investors.

"I can't tell you how many people came to me later and said, 'Was Singletary the horse you asked me to invest in?' And I'm like, 'Yeah, he was the one.'

"It was such a surreal and incredible feeling to win the Breeders' Cup. It was one of those things that you don't know how great it is until you experience it. It made me realize that this is what I want to do and this is my chance to do it. My philosophy is that you are much happier in life if you enjoy what you are doing."

After the telecast of the Breeders' Cup in 2004, TVG ran a feature on Koch and his partners. It showed a group of young businessmen who not only loved horse racing, but also looked to be having an extraordinary amount of fun. Coupled with the success of Singletary, it helped Little Red Feather take off. Koch realized that he now had a whole new way to market his partnership. He would sell the idea of horse racing ownership as being fun.

What a novel idea.

"We purchase horses and sell them to investors," said Koch, who lives in Hidden Hills, California with his wife and three sons. "Each individual horse is a separate LLC. Sometimes each partnership has multiple horses in it. We want to give each person multiple chances to win."

"The biggest thing is that people have fun with it. It doesn't matter if you own five, 50 or 100 percent of the horse. It's still a thrill to be a part of it. To see the horse train and race, to follow it, that's what it's all about.

"I'm the general partner, but I'm a hands-off guy. I trust the trainer to make all the decisions. No one knows the horse better than them."

While Chatlos trains many of Little Red Feather's horses on the West Coast, in the near future they will have another well-known trainer working for them--John Servis.

Servis got his break in 2004 when Smarty Jones captivated the sports world with his miraculous Kentucky Derby and Preakness victories.

The success of Smarty Jones, a Pennsylvania-bred, helped horse racing immensely in the Keystone state, increasing the sport's popularity, which in turn played a big part in helping the state legislatures pass a gambling bill that would allow slot machines at Pennsylvania racetracks. The bill was passed in July of 2004. Since then, Afleet Alex and Barbaro, two other Triple Crown race winners with ownership and breeding ties to the Philadelphia area, have come along to fuel the fire even more.

With \$3 billion per year projected in slot machine revenues, the horse racing industry in Pennsylvania will directly benefit, as it will reap about 18 percent of that profit, which will among other things, increase race purses at racetracks like Philadelphia Park and Penn National. Ownership groups are now going to be flocking to Pennsylvania racetracks, including Little Red Feather.

Servis and Koch recently agreed to join forces.

"Billy contacted me and asked if I'd be interested in buying some two-year olds," said Servis, who is based out of Philadelphia Park. "I didn't know much about their group, other than what I saw on TV. But after talking to him I was very impressed.

"I felt like he was genuine. I liked that he cared about the sport. I've had a lot of people approach me after Smarty and ask if I wanted to train their horses. But I felt like they were just jumping on the bandwagon, trying to use my name. They weren't really fans of the sport.

"Billy wants to have fun. He wants to win. That's his main focus. That's pretty refreshing to hear as a trainer.

"You can feel the excitement around here. The purses [at Philadelphia Park] are supposed to reach \$250,000 [per day] by next June and \$300,000 later in the year. It's going to be amazing to see the transformation of horse racing in this state. The sky is the limit around here."

Little Red Feather, which also has a base in New York, plans to start its Philadelphia venture early in 2007. They are in the process of recruiting investors in the area, which already includes Bob Brittingham, co-owner of 2005 Preakness and Belmont winner Afleet Alex. Brittingham says the experience of owning a horse with the right people can be a lot of fun.

"Billy and the group at LRF understand how hard the game really is and can be. That is why having fun is so important.

"At our LRF Philly Partnership meeting Billy showed a homemade movie on the experience at the [2004] Breeders' Cup, something I lived through with Afleet Alex. The movie showed everyone how horse racing isn't just race day.
