Former jockey and *ESPN* horse racing analyst Jerry Bailey as well as *NBC* each received nominations for the 28th annual Sports Emmy Awards, it was announced yesterday.

Bailey was nominated in the category of Outstanding Sports Personality-Sports Event Analyst, while *NBC* was nominated for its coverage of the 2006 GI Preakness S. in the Outstanding Live Sports Special category. "I'm flattered to be nominated," said Bailey. "It's a tribute to the people I work with, particularly Randy Moss, Chris Fowler, Kenny Mayne, Terry Gannon and the different producers who taught me a lot and made me feel very comfortable. A lot of credit also goes to my wife Suzee. Her background is in TV and she helped me, not just on the journalistic side, but with every piece that I did. I had a great coach." The Sports Emmy Awards will be announced in New York at the Frederick P. Rose Hall, Home of Jazz at Lincoln Center Apr. 30.

INUJURED FOOT FOR 'NAVARONE'

Song of Navarone (Sultry Song) overstepped and cut himself on his left fore when he left the gate en route to his win in last Sunday's WinStar Derby, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "He never did level off, he was running green, but he still had a little bit more left," trainer Henry Dominguez told *DRF*. "Once we dress it up, we'll know how long it's going to take to heal. He just came out of a battle." Song of Navarone previously finished third behind **Ravel** (Fusaichi Pegasus) in the GIII Sham S. Feb. 3.

'GOLD' READY FOR FLORIDA DERBY

Adore the Gold (Formal Gold), last seen finishing a good fourth behind **Scat Daddy** (Johannesburg) in the Mar. 3 GII Fountain of Youth S., will take on that foe again in the Mar. 31 GI Florida Derby. "Everything is good," trainer Michael Gorham said. "We just need to improve a length. Hopefully that race helped him. He keeps getting a little fitter and that race helped. He's training good and coming into this race really good. Having a race at a mile-and-an-eighth already should help as well." Adore the Gold, winner of the 1 1/16-mile Dover S. at Delaware as a juvenile, notched Gulfstream's 6 1/2-furlong GII Swale S. in his sophomore bow Feb. 3.

FANTASY NEXT FOR 'COTTON'

Dogwood Stable's **Cotton Blossom** (Broken Vow), who finished third in last year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, will start next in the GII Fantasy S. at Oaklawn Apr. 6. She was last seen notching Tampa's Florida Oaks Mar. 17 in her sophomore debut. "Her Florida Oaks victory was most impressive--coming off a four and a half month layoff and winning smartly on a racetrack that is not kind to horses who have not trained or run on it," said Dogwood Stable President Cot Campbell. "She will need one more race before the [GI, Kentucky] Oaks [May 4], and [trainer] Todd Pletcher and I thought the Oaklawn race was clearly indicated. One good reason is that her regular rider John Velazquez will be available that day. He would not be for the [GI] Ashland S. at Keeneland [Apr. 7]."

MCPEEK CALLS AUDIBLE Trainer Ken McPeek will send GII Hutcheson S. runner-up **Bold Start** (Jump Start) for the GI Florida Derby after originally planning to run GIII Delta Jackpot S. winner **Birdbirdistheword** (Pure Prize). "I just think 'Birdbird' needs some more time," McPeek said of Birdbirdistheword, who most recently finished fifth in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 10. Bold Start rebounded nicely from a well-beaten sixth-place finish in the GIII Holy Bull S. Feb. 3 to complete the exacta after a troubled trip in the Hutcheson. "Bold Start has been doing great," said McPeek. "He's coming up to the race great and he's ready to stretch out."

CHURCHILL DOWNS, GUILD SETTLE SUITS OVER WALKOUT *courtesy, www.bloodhorse.com*
Churchill Downs Inc. and the Jockeys' Guild announced settlement of legal claims filed against each other in U.S. District Court related to jockey boycotts of races at two Churchill Downs-owned racetracks in November 2004. The settlement, filed in Louisville on March 21, is subject to the approval of Chief Judge John G. Heyburn. It bars the Guild from walking out or going on strike until 2011 and forbids the track from taking further disciplinary action against the riders. In exchange, Churchill Downs-owned racetracks will resume making contributions to the Jockeys' Guild in the form of "per starter" and "per race day" fees that help support the Guild's programming and operations. Additional terms of the settlement were not disclosed. The case stemmed from a jockey walkout at both Churchill Downs in Louisville, Ky., and Hoosier Park in Anderson, Ind., in a dispute over health insurance and safety issues. The walkout in Indiana prompted cancellation of a 12-race card. CDI sued the Jockeys' Guild, claiming it violated antitrust laws by ordering the walkout. The Jockeys' Guild, based in Monrovia, Calif., counter-claimed, saying Churchill Downs trampled the riders' rights with the ban. Jockeys in Kentucky and Indiana are not covered through workers' compensation. Hoosier Park and Churchill Downs had been offering up to \$100,000 in medical insurance for jockeys. The Tin Man Back in Action:

The Tin Man (Affirmed) posted his first workout of the year at Hollywood Mar. 20, working three furlongs over the Cushion Track in :37.20. Her assistant Jeff Ford has taken over as trainer for her string of horses. The 55-year-old plans to work as a bloodstock agent with her husband, Emmanuel de Seroux. "Over the last year, I've decided to play out the stable we have left," De Seroux told *DRF*. "We haven't gone to the sales and replenished. I thought this was the best way to do it. I never intended to train horses forever. I set up because we had clients that we were partners with instead of just managing their horses."
