TURFWAY A GRAVEYARD FOR FAVORITES

A full field of 12 is set for this afternoon's running of the GII Lane's End S. over the Polytrack at Turfway Park--and the chalk eaters best beware. Not since Event of the Year took the race in 1998--when it was run as

the Jim Beam S.--has any favorite managed to win the \$500,000 event. In fact, bolstered by last year's upsetter, With a City (\$99.60), the average win mutuel in the last eight renewals of the race is nearly \$32. Rick Porter's **Hard Spun** (Danzig) is most likely to wear the bulls-eye this afternoon. The Pennsylvania-bred colt was perfect in his first four career starts, including his victory in the GIII Lecomte S. in January, but stubbed his toe in his latest, a

fourth-place effort in the Feb. 19 Southwest S. at Oaklawn Park. Having done his best work on or near the lead, Hard Spun is likely to stalk the pace this afternoon. "We won't try to be on the front," commented Cindy Jones, assistant to trainer Larry Jones. "We know he will stalk, so hopefully we can pick up the pieces late." Given the success that turf runners have had over synthetic surfaces, trainer Todd Pletcher has entered Peachtree Stable's **Twilight Meteor** (Smart Strike). The chestnut took last year's Bourbon S. at Keeneland after it was rained onto the Polytrack and comes into this off a half-length score over **Sedgefield** (Smart Strike) in the grassy Hallandale Beach S. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 24. The Lane's End is part of an ESPN live telecast beginning at 5 p.m. EDT.

last week. Trainer Marcus Tregoning revealed that the four-year-old enjoyed a straightforward journey to Dubai and has been on the main track for routine canters. "He seems to have taken the journey really well," Tregoning said. "He's been going on the track without his lead horse, but he's doing very well cantering on the dirt. I'm pretty pleased with him." Sir Percy will be making his first start since disappointing when seventh in Newmarket's G1 Champion S. in October, but his conditioner is hopeful he can banish that memory in next Saturday's 12-furlong event. "As long as he comes back to his very best form, then he's sure to run a very big race," Tregoning remarked. "Good horses get beat occasionally--Ouija Board got beaten from time to time--but kept coming back to win good races. I think the blip was because we'd had such an interrupted preparation with him last year and it caught up with him towards the end. Nad Al Sheba's turf track certainly rides extremely well and, although the noise and excitement beforehand sometimes gets to horses, he's four now and growing up."

Eight-year-old **Runaway Dancer** seems primed for a big effort in his second start off the layoff. A confirmed stayer, the one-time claimer was second by a length to Boboman in the GI Hollywood Turf Cup in his final start of 2006 and made up nearly 20 lengths in his latest to be fourth, beaten a half-length, to the Dubai Sheema Classic-bound Obrigado (Fr) in the GII San Luis Obispo H. over course and distance Feb. 25. **Fourty Niners Son**, a Grade I winner over this turf course, was desperately in need of the run when an even fourth in a Mar. 3 allowance over nine panels. He stretches out to a more suitable distance for this. **One Off** defeated Notable Guest by three-quarters of a length in the GII San Marcos H. going 10 furlongs of this lawn Jan. 21 and crossed the line second in the San Luis Obispo, only to be placed third via disqualification.

Victorina ships in for the Lost in the Fog connections as she seeks a victory over her sixth different surface. The impressive winner of last year's GIII Azalea Breeders' Cup S. last summer at Calder, the bay closed the year with a victory in the Ahwatukee Express S. at Turf Paradise in October. Second in the Muir Woods S. going two turns at Golden Gate Jan. 6, she most recently returned to Phoenix to take the Princess of Palms H. Feb. 10. The four-year-old has also won at Santa Rosa and Hawthorne. "I've never run a horse over the inner track," commented trainer Greg Gilchrist. "But she's not the kind of filly that needs to take her track with her. She's no stranger to mile tracks that are speed-favoring." **Oprah Winney** is two-for-four over the inner dirt, including a half-length score in the Interborough H. on New Year's Day. The New York-bred is coming off a wire-to-wire success in the GII Barbara Fritchie H. Feb. 17. Fellow Empire-bred **Magnolia Jackson**, beaten a neck into second in last year's Distaff BC H., was third in the Interborough, but rebounded to take the Feb. 11 Correction H.

GOULASH FOALS A STORM CAT COLT Goulash (Mari's Book--Wise Bride, by Blushing Groom {Fr}), the dam of champion Ashado (Saint Ballado) and her graded-stakes winning full brothers Sunriver and Saint Stephen, foaled a colt by Storm Cat Mar. 21. It marks the first time the mare has been bred to the Overbrook stallion. Now 14, Goulash is also the dam of the multiple stakes-placed duo of Ballado's Halo (Saint Ballado), her first foal, and Storm Creek Rising (Storm Creek). Ashado, a seven-time Grade I winner, was raced by Jack and Laurie Wolf's Starlight Stable, Paul Saylor and Johns Martin and was hammered down for \$9 million at the 2005 Keeneland November sale, at the time a world-record price for a broodmare at auction. The dam of a two-year-old colt of this year by Unbridled's Song, Goulash has a yearling filly by Forestry. She is scheduled to return to Unbridled's Song for the 2007 breeding season.

SHAKE YOU DOWN RETIRED TO TRF **Shake You Down** (Montbrook--Mauvin Gway, by Rajab), the third-place finisher in the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint who wound up running in \$14,000 claiming races earlier this year, has been retired by owner Robert Cole and donated to the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation. Cole also made a generous donation to the organization to help care for the nine-year-old gelding. He has asked that the amount of the donation not be revealed. "We were trying to find the right spot for him because Cole really wanted to retire him on a win," trainer Scott Lake said. "He doesn't train a whole lot. He just does a lot of jogging and light galloping. The last time I breezed him, his ankle filled up a little bit, so we X-rayed it. There was some little changes in there that weren't there before. We decided there was no reason to take another shot with him." Cole, who, as of Mar. 22 led the nation in wins with 31, first claimed Shake You Down for \$65,000 back in March of 2003. The gelding blossomed under Lake's care and won four stakes that year, including the GIII Bold Ruler H. and the GII True North Breeders' Cup H. But his best performance may have come in the Breeders' Cup, where he finished third behind Cajun Beat and Bluesthestandard. Shake You Down was claimed from Cole and Lake for \$25,000 Mar. 10, 2006. The pair claimed him back for \$18,000 last November and ran him twice this year for \$14,000 at Laurel. He made his last career start Jan. 18, finishing fifth. "We didn't think he could win any longer at a decent claiming level, so we thought it was best to retire him," Cole said. "We were looking out for the horse. I thought he could still win races, but Scott was uncomfortable running him again." Shake You Down arrived at the TRF's farm at the Marion Correctional Facility in Ocala, Florida Mar. 21. He won 22 of 65 career starts and earned \$1,442,014. Founded in 1982, the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation is a nonprofit organization that provides lifetime retirement for Thoroughbreds at farms and satellite facilities spread across the U.S. With the TRF increasing its efforts to save as many retirees as possible from an uncertain future, the group's horse population has more than doubled over the last three years and now includes more than 1,300 horses. The TRF is wholly dependent on outside donations.

WYNN-LED GROUP OUT OF NEW YORK FRANCHISE RACE

A joint venture led by Las Vegas casino developer Steve Wynn has dropped out of the running for the franchise to run Aqueduct, Belmont Park and Saratoga. The group cited the brief timetable given by the state of New York to offer plans for the franchise. Thoroughbred Racing-- NY Mar. 23 notified advisers to Gov. Eliot Spitzer they were withdrawing from the bidding competition. Racing insiders saw the Wynn group as a serious contender for the franchise, and word of the withdrawal came one day after New York Racing Association President Charles Hayward said the group had approached NYRA officials about the possibility of joining forces for the rights to operate the three tracks. The decision by Wynn and his partners--who included California developer Richard Bronson and Steve Roth, a major New York City developer--leaves five interested groups: Excelsior Racing Associates, Empire Racing Associates, NYRA, Capital Play and Catskill Regional Off-Track Betting Corp. **For the complete story, click [here](#).**

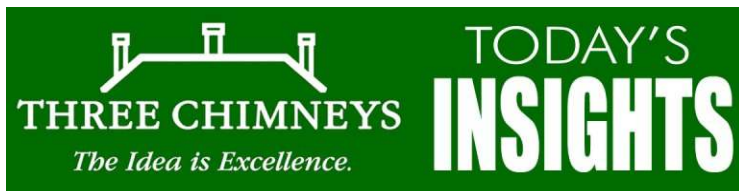

The intersection of Fourth Street and Central Avenue in Louisville isn't exactly a hop, skip and jump from the Four Corners region of Northwest New Mexico. But that's exactly where owner George Coleman hopes to spend the first Saturday in May with Song of Navarone, purchased for \$190,000 at last year's Ocala Breeders' Sales Company April Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training.

The 74-year-old gas and oil company owner from the small town of Farmington has been in the Thoroughbred business off and on for 20 years and maintains a racing stable of "eight or nine" horses with New Mexico-based trainer Henry Dominguez. So, what encouraged Coleman to jump back into the fray in the mid '90s?

"All of the New Mexico tracks have casinos and the purses got real big," he explained. "It's always been fun and, heck, I needed something to do other than work."

Coleman shops the juvenile market exclusively, acquiring a small number of horses from year to year. He offers the following rationale for his focus on two-year-olds in training, "We know that the horses can run and we watch the under-tack shows," Coleman said, adding that he is represented by his trainer at the sales. "We tend to focus on the pedigree and athletic ability. We went to last year's sale looking for a longer-running horse and this one fit the bill."

Indeed, Song of Navarone has improved markedly since being stretched to two turns this year. A hard-luck runner-up in the Riley Allison Futurity at Sunland Park, he was tested for class in the GIII Sham S. at Santa Anita Feb. 3 and acquitted himself well, finishing third to Ravel. Coleman reports that he has rejected offers in excess of \$2 million for the colt.

Song of Navarone grabbed a quarter at the start of the WinStar Derby and will not start again prior to the Derby, as previously planned. Coleman said he is readying the team for another trip to this year's Ocala April Sale to see if lightning really can strike twice.

Bay Meadows to Close:

After 73 years in operation, Bay Meadows Race Track in San Mateo, California, will close following the 2007 racing season. "For racing in California, this is a day of infamy," Bay Meadows President Jack Liebau told *Daily Racing Form* after the California Horse Racing Board denied a request from the track for a two-year waiver on installing a synthetic racing surface. "Racing in Northern California will never exist as in the past. You're going to have horses, owners and trainers leaving," Liebau added. The Bay Meadows Land Co., which owns Hollywood Park in addition to Bay Meadows, had previously announced its intentions to close the track in the next few years in favor of developing the land. Given that fact, Liebau explained that it did not make financial sense to spend the reported \$8 million to install the synthetic surface, as mandated by the CHRB. Bay Meadows opened Nov. 3, 1934, under the leadership of Bill Kyne. It was the place where legendary Bill Shoemaker began galloping horses and won his first stakes race, and was also the backdrop as Russell Baze became racing's all-time winningest jockey late last year.

"That's fairly indicative from a remarkable clearance of 92 percent, and vendors should be applauded for their willingness to meet the market and boost buyer confidence."
