A BULL MARKET AT OBS MARCH

The stock in the OBS March Selected Two-Year-Old in Training Sale is on the rise. The two-day auction gets underway today at 11 a.m., with officials optimistic that the upward trend enjoyed over the last four years will continue. Since 2003, the average has jumped nearly 63 percent, from \$66,654 to \$108,545; and the median has risen 50 percent, from \$50,000 to \$75,000. "The catalogue hasn't grown, but the quality has certainly improved," said OBS General Manager Tom Ventura. "The average is going up, and the upper end of the sale is getting deeper. Over the years, the sale has been very productive, and the consignors have become more and more comfortable that they can get top dollar for their horses right here. Our major consignors are local, and they don't feel forced to go out of town to get top dollar." Two juveniles hit the seven-figure mark last year, and the sales topper, a \$1.8 million colt by *Belong to Me*, became the most expensive OBS purchase in history. Consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables for the Dapple Bloodstock partnership, he was purchased by Buzz Chace, agent for *Al Gold*. The colt, named *Garifine*, has yet to race, but worked a bullet three furlongs in :36 at Palm Meadows Sunday. Recent OBS March graduates include champions *Fleet Indian* and *Lost in the Fog*, and 2006 Grade I winners *Meadow Breeze*, *Premium Tap* and *Swap Fliparoo*. "Buyers are pleased with what they have bought in the past, and their confidence has helped the sale to get stronger," Ventura said.

SIR PERCY LOOKS TO GET BACK ON TRACK

English champion **Sir Percy (GB)** (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) will look to start his 2007 season with a bang when he breaks from post seven in Saturday's G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba. The four-year-old won five of his first six starts, including the G1

Epsom Derby last June, but he has not been out since suffering the first off-the-board finish of his career when seventh in the G1 Champion S. last October.

"Basically he had niggling problems after the Derby, and an interrupted preparation going into the Champion S. at Newmarket last year, when he was a bit disappointing," explained trainer Marcus Tregoning. But those problems appear behind Sir Percy, who was England's highweighted juvenile after an unbeaten 2005 campaign. "He's had a much better run going into this race, he's travelled well over here, and settled in well," Tregoning said at Nad al Sheba yesterday. "[Jockey] Martin [Dwyer] is happy with him. EL PRADO TOPS ADENA SPRINGS SALE

A colt by *El Prado* (Ire) attracted a final bid of \$220,000 to top yesterday's Adena Springs Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Williston, Florida. The juvenile is a registered Canadian-bred out of graded-stakes placed *Saint Bernadette* (*Saint Ballado*). The bay was purchased by Eric Fein, who sees similarities between his primary business in title insurance and racing. "That business is like this business," Fein said smiling. "Risky." Fein was accompanied by his bloodstock advisor Gene Perrotta. "We started this about four years ago," explained Perrotta. "We claimed [Rogue Agent] for \$35,000 and he's made about \$400,000 and change." Fein, who uses several trainers, including Gary Contessa, Rick Dutrow and Steve Margolis, has not chosen a conditioner for his newest acquisition. "He'll go to Vinery and we'll decide then," Fein said.

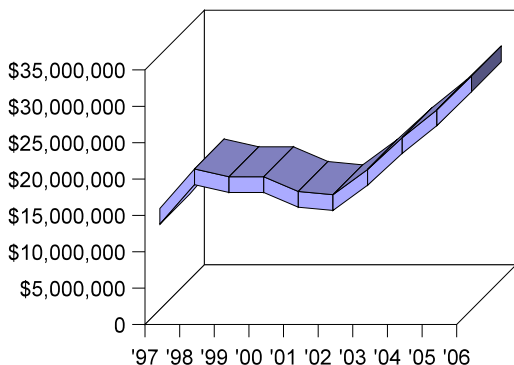

Strength in the Middle Market...

Garifine and the Indian Charlie filly Imperial Reign--sold to Darley by Leprechaun Racing for \$1 million last year--were just the second and third horses to break the seven-figure barrier at OBS March. The first was Warners, a Dehere colt bought by Eugene Melnyk for \$1.05 million in 2001. But while consignors are aware they can get the big bucks at OBS March, they also know there will be plenty of action on the middle-market juveniles. "One thing that happens at the high-end sales is that buyers focus on a handful of horses, and the horses below that level suffer," Tom Ventura remarked. "The market is pretty polarized. The buyers with a specific budget don't feel they will have the opportunity to pick from enough horses at those sales. Our horses are going to fit the budgets of a lot more buyers." He added, "I think this sale will be a true test of that middle market--I don't think we've seen it fully tested at the earlier sales. We've seen strength at the top, and it has been a little soft below that. But we've put together a catalogue that I believe is even better than last year, and we are looking forward to a good sale."

Hip 121 is from the first crop of Zavata, a speedy son of Phone Trick whose victories included the GII Amsterdam S. and GII Saratoga Special S.

Hip 122, c, E Dubai--Private Applause, by Private Account

Sophomore sire E Dubai has enjoyed a strong spring with the likes of stakes winner Desert Code and GIII Gotham S. runner-up Wafi City, and consignor Eddie Woods said this colt has the tools to add to his sire's credentials. The Feb. 24 foal, bought for \$60,000 as a yearling, breezed a furlong in :10 2/5 on Mar. 17 ([video](#)). "He's a very good mover, a very fast colt," said Woods, who added that he thought the colt would stretch out. "The first show, he was kind of green out there, throwing his head all around, and went in :11," said consignor Bob Prater. "I knew he was a much better horse than that, so we worked him back and he ran great." Prater added, "He reminds me of Rocky Marciano. He's got a lot of heart and a lot of grit to him. Whoever buys him will have a real racehorse on their hands."

Gambolati Back at Adena Springs

Trainer Cam Gambolati struck gold at last year's Adena Springs Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale and he was back looking for more yesterday. Gambolati, acting on behalf of OI Memorial Stable, purchased subsequent GIII Spectacular Bid S. winner Buffalo Man (El Prado {Ire}) for a bargain \$30,000 last year, but had to go to \$210,000 to take home a filly from the first crop of Grade I winner Sky Mesa yesterday. "I think Sky Mesa is going to be great," Gambolati explained. "I saw some Sky Mesas at the other sale and I think he's going to be a great stallion." The two-year-old is out of Mary Goodnight (Grindstone), a half sister to MGISW Devil His Due. "I liked her physical," Gambolati said. "Honestly, I thought she'd go a little higher. At OBS, I think she would have brought more than that." Asked what brought him back to the Adena Springs sale this year, Gambolati commented, "The thing I like about this sale is that they're not abused. You don't have to stop on them, you can go right on. I think they do a great job." Gambolati added that the Sky Mesa filly will spend the next month at Vinery before joining the trainer's stable in New Jersey for the summer. Also spending time at Vinery is Buffalo Man, who is recuperating from surgery to repair a condylar fracture. "Buffalo Man is doing great," Gambolati said. "He should be back in the fall."


Stronach Satisfied with Sale

At the conclusion of business yesterday, Adena Springs's Frank Stronach declared himself satisfied with the auction. "I think the sale went pretty well," Stronach said. "When you're selling horses, you always think you should get a little bit more. And when you're buying, you think you're paying too much. But I'm happy. I think the freshman sires were received quite well. Sligo Bay had quite a few nice ones--his bloodlines are so great." Grade I winner Sligo Bay (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) had two juveniles sell for \$100,000; [hip 124](#) sold to Reade Baker, as agent for Craig Singer, and [hip 133](#) sold to Reata Thoroughbred Farm.

During the sale, Adena Springs sold 90 two-year-olds for a total of \$4,892,000 and an average of \$54,356. The buy-back rate was 31.8 percent. "We sold about 70 percent and that's fine," Stronach said. "We like to keep some to race." Stronach is already looking ahead to next year's sale. "You can always make some improvements," he said. "We'll sit down and reassess it and maybe change a few things."

The 10-year-old stallion, whose first foals are two-year-olds of 2007, was owned by a partnership between Edward P. Evans--who bred and campaigned the horse--and Windfields Farm. "We are all devastated over this," said Director of Farm Operations Simon Cassidy. "He was a strikingly handsome individual, and a true favorite among those who cared for him as well as farm visitors. His first crop came out running and we are hearing great reports from trainers about their Cat's at Home horses getting ready to run when Woodbine opens next week." Winner of the GIII Westchester H. and Excelsior BC H. in 2001, the bay accounted for the GII Phillip H. Iselin H. at Monmouth Park in 2002. Cat's at Home was retired following a third-place finish in the 2003 GIII Aqueduct H. with nine victories from 31 starts and earnings of \$708,575. "Cat's at Home was a great young sire with his whole career ahead of him," said Noreen Taylor, Windfields Vice President. "He is not the kind of horse you can easily replace, and he was just poised to become a key player in the Ontario sire ranks."

Breeders' Cup Estimated to Bring \$57.6 million for NJ:

The economic impact of Monmouth Park hosting this year's Breeders' Cup World Championships on Oct. 26 and 27 is estimated to be \$57.6 million, according to a study released yesterday by the Center for Urban Policy Research (CUPR) at Rutgers University in New Brunswick. "We knew the numbers would be big, but I don't think anyone thought they would be that big," said Dennis Dowd, senior vice president of racing at the New Jersey Sports & Exposition Authority, which owns and operates Monmouth Park. "What this study confirms is that New Jersey will benefit from the Breeders' Cup--either indirectly through increased tax revenues, or directly, through actual contact with the event." Monmouth Park will host four full days of racing that week beginning on Wednesday and culminating with the \$5-million Classic on Saturday. Friday's races were added after the study was commissioned and the additional impact of these events were therefore not included in the findings. "Adding those races on Friday will likely push the overall economic impact past the \$60-million mark," said Professor Michael L. Lahr of Rutgers' Edward J. Bloustein School of Planning and Public Policy, who along with his colleague, Paimaan Lodhi, conducted the study. "The reason the economic and fiscal effects loom so large for a one-time event is that Monmouth Park wouldn't otherwise be used since the racing season is over. Moreover, both the horsemen and fans who will attend the Breeders' Cup races will come largely from out of state--even from overseas. Local hoteliers and restaurateurs will be pleasantly pleased."

New Stakes/Receiving Barn at Calder:

Calder Race Course yesterday unveiled its new stakes and receiving barn. Barn number 70, located just off the horse path leading to the main track, has undergone a complete renovation and will be used exclusively for horses shipping in to race at Calder. "We wanted to create a single barn for receiving the ship-ins and all the stakes horses and we wanted to make it extra special," said stable superintendent Steve Cross. "For our big events each year, such as the Summit of Speed, we have anywhere from 20 to 30 horses shipping in, so now they have one place to go and it's a very nice place to stay." Calder's 37th racing season begins Apr. 25.

NO GUINEAS FOR DBS

Doncaster Bloodstock Sales Ltd (DBS) has announced that there will be an alteration to commission rates and currency after the auction house moves to a new £6-million sales complex in November. DBS will dis-pense with the traditional guinea in favour of pound sterling, and will alter the commission structure as well. The new structure will mirror the approach adopted by Irish bloodstock auctioneers Goffs and Tattersalls (Ire-land), charging a vendor's commission of 1.5 percent, as opposed to the current 5 percent, with a buyer's premium of 6 percent added to the hammer price. There will no longer be the need to convert the price from guineas to pounds sterling, as has been the case to date. "We have proved we can achieve the very best results both in the sales ring and on the racetrack, and all from a sales complex that many have said was antiquated and which we had outgrown some time ago," commented DBS Managing Director Henry Beeby. "The new commission structure and currency change does increase our income to allow us to fund the huge debt we have incurred, but our clients will immediately see the benefits. Indeed, we are delivering up front rather than just promising to invest or improve over a period of time, as the new structure will only kick in when we have moved.

Some may think they are paying more for the DBS service, but we believe, and hope to illustrate, that it will be a small price to pay for the improvements that will be derived. We have taken soundings from both vendors and purchasers, as well as examining the habits of both groups and the market trends since the two Irish auctioneers made a similar change. Our research illustrates buyers will bid the same price for the horse of their choice regardless of the commission structure and currency, whilst vendors choose their sales venue on past performance and anticipated return. The changes will be for the better and I also guarantee that all our clients, old and new, will continue to enjoy the unrivalled personal service that has been the hallmark of DBS since our launch in 1962." DBS will contact purchasers and vendors in advance of the change to ensure all their clients are fully aware of its impact. Work on the project is scheduled to take 33 weeks and is on target for completion in November, with the 2008 January Sale slated to be the first at the new venue.

PREMIER SALE CONCLUDES The two-day Magic Millions Premier Yearling Sale closed yesterday after realizing a record gross of A\$5,409,500. "Quality yearlings were well sought out by buyers and attracted strong bidding," Magic Millions Managing Director David Chester said. The topper yesterday was hip 440, a filly by Sequalo (Aus) that brought a final bid of A\$84,000. Consigned by Oakwood Farm, she was purchased by Ron Maund on behalf of the Lauriston Thoroughbred Farm. She is out of a half-sister to G1SW Arkady (Aus). Kevin and Tanith O'Brien's Lauriston was the leading buyer at the sale, taking home seven lots for an aggregate A\$391,500. Overall, 310 yearlings were sold for an average of A\$17,450, off a fraction from the average of A\$17,645 in 2006. The clearance rate was a solid 79 percent.

BREEDERS TAKE ON COAL MINERS Leading Thoroughbred breeders in Australia's Hunter Valley have joined forces to take a stand against coal-mining in the region, saying expansion threatens the livelihood of 77 farms, and the viability of associated industries such as viticulture and tourism. "The scale of proposed expansion of new coal mines in the Upper Hunter threatens prime agricultural land, jeopardises hundreds of millions of dollars of investments, the jobs of thousands of people and the rural quality of the region," the breeders said in a statement attributed jointly to the Hunter Thoroughbred Breeders Association, Thoroughbred Breeders Australia and Aushorse. "Water and climate change are linked critical issues affecting the Thoroughbred industry. Some horse studs have direct access to water...but the coal and coal-fired power industry has the potential to suck the whole Hunter Valley dry." It continued, "There is a positive feedback loop of coal, global warming and drought, shown by CSIRO in its study of the dairy industry in the Hunter, as a potential cause of losses of stock due to heat stress as temperatures rise and the climate dries out. The horse breeding industry needs quality grazing land in a pleasant environment with reliable water and clean air." The breeders also stated that they would be "forced from the area" if the sustainability of the Thoroughbred industry was threatened by new mine proposals and extensions, adding, "The Hunter Valley Thoroughbred horse breeding industry calls for a moratorium on new mines in the Hunter, a cap on coal exports from the Hunter Region, an inquiry into the impacts of the coal industry on the long-term, environmental, economic and social sustainability of the Hunter and other industries." Studies consistently suggest that the Hunter region accounts for at least two-thirds of annual foal production and receipts from Thoroughbred sales, and farms such as Coolmore, Darley and Arrowfield are centred in the region. According to the statement, the Hunter Thoroughbred industry employs 1065 people.
