LATE TRIPLE CROWN NOMS SET RECORD

Ten three-year-olds were late nominees for the 2007 Triple Crown, bringing the total to a record 460 nominees. The previous total record was 454. The late nomination period, with a fee of \$6,000, ended last Saturday. There were 450 nominees made for \$600 during the first nomination period, which ended Jan. 20. The Triple Crown begins with the 133rd GI Kentucky Derby May 5 at Churchill Downs, continues with the 132nd GI Preakness S. May 19 at Pimlico Race Course and concludes with the 139th GI Belmont S. at Belmont Park. The list is headlined by Maryland-based **Etude** (Include), who has swept through his three starts this year by an average of 5.8 lengths. Two of the other new nominees are ex-Europeans **Love Dubai** (E Dubai) and **Medici Code** (GB) (Medicean {GB}), who are slated to make their U.S. bows this weekend in the GI Illinois Derby and GI Santa Anita Derby, respectively.

BOUTROUS TO ADD BLINKERS FOR SA DERBY

Mike Shustek's **Boutrous** (Tiznow), who is coming off a fourth-place effort to Great Hunter in the Mar. 3 GI Robert B. Lewis S., will be equipped with blinkers for the first time in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby. "We recently added blinkers and he's really trained well with them," conditioner Craig Dollase said yesterday during a national teleconference. A late closer who made up 12 lengths to break his maiden at Hollywood last November, Boutrous followed that up with a rallying win against Hollywood allowance foes in mid-December. He couldn't overcome a troubled trip when second by five lengths in the California Derby at Golden Gate Jan. 28 and most recently failed to make much of an impact in the Robert Lewis after tracking sensible fractions. "He's a horse that is at the mercy of the pace sometimes," said Dollase. "Our objective is to have him a little closer, and I'm confident he'll run well. It looks like a pretty wide open race. I think he's going to like the nine furlongs." Dollase also revealed the horse's namesake. Fans of Boutrous Boutrous-Ghali will be disappointed to learn that the colt is not named after the former United Nations Secretary General. Instead, owner Mike Shustek named him after a friend, Ted Boutrous.

FOUR SUBMIT NEW YORK RACING BIDS The four companies which remain in contention for the franchise to run racing at Belmont Park, Aqueduct and Saratoga have all submitted bids to the state. Excelsior Racing, Empire Racing Associates and Capital Play handed in bids at Monday's deadline, joining the current franchise holder New York Racing Association which submitted its proposal Friday. The Australian-based Capital Play outlined its plan in a statement released yesterday. The bid includes three different proposals "depending on whether New York State prefers more payments annually, more money up front or more VLT-based revenues," Capital Play CEO Karl O'Farrell said in the statement. He added, "Capital Play remains fully committed to its original bid proposal, which guarantees an investment of \$1.8 billion consisting of annual lease payments of \$50 million adjusted for inflation [worth \$1 billion], plus \$500 million in track investments, \$200 million for VLT facilities and \$110 million to pay off NYRA pension liabilities." The second option guarantees an investment of \$1.5 billion, with a \$250 million up-front lease payment, annual lease payments of \$22 million for 20 years adjusted for inflation (worth \$440 million), plus \$500 million track investments, \$200 million for VLT facilities and \$110 million to pay off NYRA pension liabilities. This proposal assumes approval for VLTs at both Aqueduct and Belmont. The company's third alternative guarantees an investment of \$730 million if the VLTs are allowed only at Aqueduct. This proposal includes a \$100 million up-front lease payment, annual lease payments of \$10 million adjusted for inflation (worth \$200 million), plus \$220 million in track investments, \$100 million for VLTs facilities and \$110 million to pay off NYRA pension liabilities. "[While] Capital Play is very confident in its bid proposal, it is equally confident in its ability to bring the best marketing and racing model in the world to New York State, restoring the Thoroughbred racing industry--including breeding and integrity--to the stature it deserves," O'Farrell said. "We know our experience in Australia will translate well here in New York and we understand what it will take to reinvigorate this sport." All four organizations will present their bids publicly before a state committee in Albany Apr. 10 and 11.

OMISSION: Sunday's *TDN* failed to note a sale for G2 UAE Derby runner-up **Jack Junior** (Songandaprayer). In addition to being a \$52,000 KEENOV weanling in 2004, the three-year-old colt sold for \$180,000 at the 2006 Fasig-Tipton Calder juvenile sale. Newmarket Merry Meehan purchased Jack Junior, who now runs for Roldvale Ltd & Gold Group International.

NAISSANCE ROYALE RETIRED Multiple graded-stakes winner **Naissance Royale (Ire)** (Giant's Causeway--Net Worth, by Forty Niner) has been retired from racing and will be bred to Kingmambo, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The five-year-old mare will reside at Oak Tree Stud. Bred in Ireland by Dr. Tony Ryan, the chestnut sold as a yearling for 310,000gns at Tattersalls Houghton to Quesnay Bloodstock. She began her career in France for Monceaux Stables and Criquette Head-Maarek, breaking her maiden at two and finishing second in the G3 Prix Vanteaux in May of her three-year-old season. Shipped to Christophe Clement that summer, Naissance Royale captured a thrilling renewal of the GII Lake Placid S. at Saratoga in her U.S. opener, then ran a close fourth in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Challenge Cup at Keeneland. She added Woodbine's GII Nassau S. last year and the GIII Suwanee River H. Feb. 3 before concluding her career with a good third versus males in the GII Mervin H. Muniz Jr. Memorial H. Mar. 10. Naissance Royale, a half-sister to the multiple group-placed **Spinnette (Ire)** (Spinning World), heads to the breeding shed with a record of 17-5-5-2 and earnings of \$637,968.

ROCK AROUND THE CLOCK

Up until last weekend, I used to say Ireland was the place that changed the most since I started going there (which in Ireland's case was over 30 years ago). But Europe's greatest success story of the last 15 years, with its attendant nightmare traffic problems, has now been supplanted as 'most changed country' by the U.A.E. Dubai currently houses somewhere around one-third of the world's cranes--and I don't mean the feathered variety. No, I mean the kind that sit on the top of the skeletons of 30-floor buildings. In one stretch near the Dubai World Trade Center and the new Burj Dubai Tower (115 floors and counting, on its way to 160 stories and recognition as the world's tallest building), I counted 15 other buildings under construction, each of which had one or two cranes on top of it, awaiting further orders.

Admittedly, there's rarely been a year when I haven't been in Ireland at least for Goffs, and it had been 14 years since I had been in Dubai, but even regular Dubai-goers assert the change is dramatic from one year to the next. It's way beyond dramatic--practically epic--in the Emirate ruled by (to quote his full title, used every time he is mentioned in the local papers) His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai--or, as we in the horse business know him, Sheikh Mohammed. When you see the huge changes taking place in the Emirate, one thing you simply have to realize is how fortunate our business is to enjoy the patronage of a man who is without any shadow of a doubt one of the most imaginative, innovative, and visionary thinkers any of us is ever likely to meet. I say that not to curry favor with a Titan. I don't do 'currying favor,' but really as a statement of fact about the transformation of a desert oasis to a city-state of 2-million people which is well on its way to being certainly the most important business center and tourist destination in the Arab world, and a model for the direction of development through Asia as well as the Middle East.

Of course, annual double-digit increases in a country's GNP don't come without a few attendant hiccups and problems, notably traffic, and even pollution, in the case of Dubai. It is fair to say, I think, that the picture is far rosier for the 20 percent of the population who are 'locals' than for the hundreds of thousands of 'guest' and other workers who are manning construction sites, sometimes in three shifts, 24 hours a day. There is almost a frenetic energy to build and expand. Dubai might disprove the maxim, 'Rome wasn't built in a day.'

Dubai is almost in the business of manufacturing prosperity, and it is succeeding on a scale certainly I have never seen. Everyone benefits from that. I hope, though, that its movers and shakers won't forget, in its rush to spearhead and model development on a global scale, that part of its charm has always been its Arabic characteristics. Hospitality is one of those characteristics, from the time you open your car door and someone asks if there is anything they can do to help, to the massive 'Arabian Nights' party in the desert, which Sheikh Mohammed threw for about 3,000 people. I'm a huge admirer of the Arab culture, and I hope that influence won't fade in the pursuit of tourism and development.

The theme of 'East Meets West and Everybody Prospers' was reflected in the Dubai Racing Carnival and World Cup night. Of the four dirt races for Thoroughbreds (the night's opening race was for Arabian horses), three were claimed by American-trained horses. Paul Reddam and WinStar Farm's Spring at Last (Silver Deputy) was a decisive winner of the G2 Godolphin Mile; the giant Kelly's Landing (Patton) provided Frankie Dettori with his only win of the night by leading home an American 1-2-4 in the G1 Golden Shaheen; and the Argentine-bred, Uruguayan-raced, American-trained Invasor cut down the Saudi-owned (formerly American-owned) Premium Tap (Pleasant Tap) to win the G1 Dubai World Cup, with Discreet Cat (Forestry) last of seven. **Cont.p4**



The night's most impressive winner was G2 UAE Derby winner Asiatic Boy (Not For Sale), bred in Argentina, owned by Dubai's Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum, and trained by South African Mike de Kock. He absolutely slaughtered his field, winning off by almost 10 lengths, and likely earned himself a trip to Royal Ascot for the G1 Queen Anne S. in the process. The two \$5-million grass races fell to Asian-trained horses: New Zealand-bred, Hong Kong-trained Vengeance of Rain (Zabeel) captured the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic (12 furlongs); while Japanese-bred, -owned, and -trained Admire Moon (End Sweep) was a decisive winner of the G1 Dubai Duty Free over the distance of 'about nine furlongs' (1777 meters).

The World Cup night results absolutely reflected the totally international nature of its surroundings. Unusually for a racecourse, there was a one-hour break between the third and fourth Thoroughbred races, during which a mainly French multimedia production celebrating the history of the horse, was staged. This was aptly described by U.S.-based Thoroughbred consultant Alan Briggs as "the greatest halftime show I have ever seen," though there was one element of the show which actually quite upset a lot of people, when one of the Lippizanner or Andalusians (big white horse, anyway) was walked around with what looked like his back half on fire. It was no doubt quite safe, but the producers are hereby advised their show was plenty spectacular enough without that particular trick.

Of all the innovations and contributions Sheikh Mohammed has made in our sport, one of his greatest ideas has been the Darley Flying Start program, which is turning out an elite corps of future industry leaders at a rate of 12 per annum. The quality of the graduates they've produced is a huge compliment to the program's supremos, Joe Osborne and Clodagh Kavanagh: these 'kids,' at least the ones I've been fortunate enough to come in contact with, come out of the program armed with a knowledge of the industry which I believe is unprecedented for graduates their age, yet are not the least bit stuck-up and seem totally willing to pitch in and do the work. Our latest find is Kentucky native and Flying Start Three's Conor Foley. He very kindly offered to drive Lou and me around last Friday, and spent the afternoon showing us the old Dubai as well as the new, before he had to suit up and go assist at the unveiling of the new Meydan racecourse project, which is 1-10 to be the world's most beautiful racecourse when it opens for World Cup night 2010. Thanks, Conor, and thanks, really, to (let me see if I can get this right) His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai and his entire team for giving all of us who work in this business the opportunity to experience Dubai and the UAE, and for enriching our experience far beyond the call of duty. 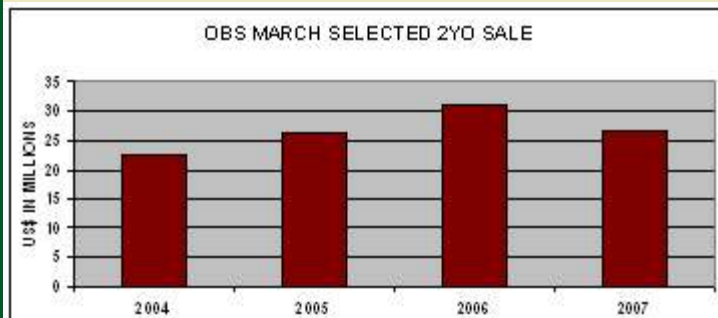

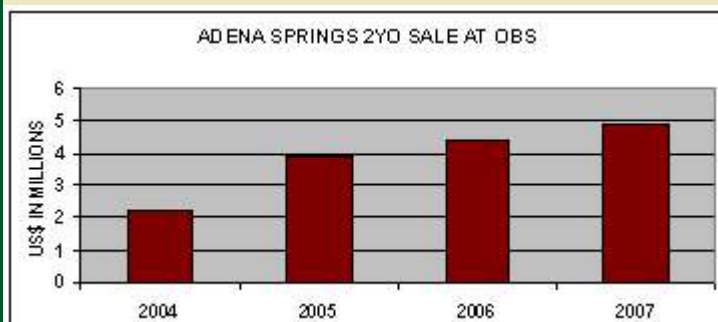

Last year's G2 UAE Derby saw Discreet Cat score impressively, with Invasor--suffering his only defeat to date--back in fourth. So, when we hear that the three official international handicappers in attendance rated the performance of Asiatic Boy in this year's G2 UAE Derby as being one pound superior to Discreet Cat's effort last year, we can be pretty sure that Asiatic Boy is a horse to be regarded with considerable respect.

Asiatic Boy ran only three times in his native Argentina, all as a Southern Hemisphere juvenile, and at that stage, his form was promising rather than outstanding. Second on his debut, he narrowly won a seven-furlong maiden on his second start. On his final outing, he went down by 3/4-of-a-length to Hussonet's good son Husson in the G1 Gran Premio Gran Criterium. Purchased by Sheikh Mohammed Bin Khalifa Al Maktoum and shipped to Dubai, Asiatic Boy returned from an eight-month break to take a seven-furlong condition race by 4 3/4 lengths from the More Than Ready colt Traffic Guard. The same pair were separated by an almost identical margin three weeks later as they ran first and second in the G3 UAE Guineas. On Mar. 1, Asiatic Boy romped home in the second leg of the UAE Triple Crown, the Al Bastakiya, and of course on Saturday, was even more impressive. Asiatic Boy is reportedly now going to England, but given the aplomb with which he has handled Nad al Sheba's sand surface, it will be no surprise to see him try U.S. dirt sometime in the future.

That Asiatic Boy should be suited by dirt/sand is not particularly surprising when one realizes that he has several U.S. dirt elements in his pedigree. His sire, Not for Sale, is by Parade Marshal, a Greentree-bred son of Caro who won the Governor's Cup H. and took third in the G1 Peter Pan S. Parade Marshal is best known in the U.S. as the sire of Star Parade, winner of four graded stakes on the West Coast, including the G1 Santa Maria H. and G1 Milady Breeders' Cup H.

Parade Marshal has also sired a number of good performers in Argentina, including Mare of the Year and champion three-year-old filly Star and Stripes; Last Parade, who captured the G1 Premio Joaquin V. Gonzalez-International; Marsiglia, who took the G1 Las Oaks in Chile; and Asiatic Boy's sire, Not for Sale. Out of a mare by the U.S.-bred Laramie Trail (a son of Swaps, and a half-brother to the dam of Cozzene, who interestingly is by Not for Sale's grandsire, Caro), Not for Sale earned his biggest triumph when capturing the 5 1/2-furlong G1 Gran Premio Ciudad de Buenos Aires Internationale as an older horse. Not for Sale is making a bright start to his stud career: Asiatic Boy is a member of his second crop, and his first crop includes Forty Licks, winner of the G1 Gran Premio Jockey Club and Gran Premio Nacional (and also fifth after disputing the early lead in Saturday's G1 Dubai World Cup); and the G1 Polla de Potrillos victor Gold for Sale.

Asiatic Boy's dam S. S. Asiatic was foaled in the U.S. and raced here, winning two of 15 starts. After foaling a filly by Roar, she was consigned to the 2000 Keeneland January Sales (in foal to Indian Charlie) and was knocked down to Estancia Lалуica for \$35,000. By Polish Navy--winner of the G1 Champagne, G1 Cowdin and G1 Woodward S.--S. S. Asiatic was out of the Damascus mare Asian, winner of the My Juliet S. at Ak-Sar-Ben.

This made her quite closely related to the GII Breeders' Futurity winner and GI Florida Derby second Slavic, who was by Polish Number's sire Danzig, and was half-brother to Asian. Asiatic Boy's third dam is Bamesian, a stakes-placed daughter of Buckpasser. She is out of Amalesian, a half-sister to the Santa Anita Derby victor Boldnesian (grandsire of Seattle Slew) and to Princessnesian, a top-class mare who defeated males in the Hollywood Gold Cup. Amalesian herself produced the Senorita S. winner Shimmy and the Tremont S. victor Chauffeur. She is ancestress of numerous other stakes winners, including the graded scorers Fan Club's Mister, Mystery Giver, Ioya Two, Lauraфина and Master Christopher.

Asiatic Boy's pedigree is a complete outcross at six generations, but his sire and dam are both relatively closely inbred. Not for Sale has Swaps--the Kentucky Derby winner of 1955 and Horse of the Year for 1956--4x3, and S. S. Asiatic has Busanda--winner of the Suburban H. and Alabama S., and dam of Buckpasser--3x4.

It's not particularly surprising to see a horse inbred to Swaps do well with a mare inbred to Busanda. The strain of Swaps has quite often combined well with Busanda (and her granddam La Troienne). For example, champion Numbered Account is by Buckpasser out of a mare by Swaps, and Swaps sired one of his best runners, champion Affectionately, out of Searching, a 3/4-sister to Busanda. Even more interesting in the context of Asiatic Boy is to note that when Stepping High--the dam of Asiatic's Boy's grandsire Parade Marshal--was bred to Buckpasser, the result was Buckaroo, winner of the GIII Peter Pan S. and GII Saranac S. and sire of Spend a Buck and Montbrook. Parade Marshal's U.S. Grade I winner Star Parade is something of a reverse of the cross, as she is out of a mare by a grandson of Buckpasser. It's also worth noting that Stepping High's sire, No Robbery, is by Swaps out of a mare by Bimelech, a son of La Troienne and a half-brother to Busanda's dam, Businesslike.

**STORM PASSAGE COLT TOPS EARLY RETURNS
AT FASIG-TIPTON TEXAS**

A colt from the first crop by GSP Storm Passage (Storm Cat) out of unraced Sweep and Roll (End Sweep) brought a final bid of \$180,000 from Heiligbrodt Racing Stable to top the early returns at Fasig-Tipton's Texas Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale at Lone Star Park yesterday. Catalogued as [hip 217](#), the Louisiana-bred, named Righteous Brother, was consigned by Robert Brewer, Agent I. He had the bullet work at the under-tack show with an eighth in :10 flat Apr. 1. A full brother to GISW Tactical Cat, Storm Passage stands at Red River Farms in Louisiana for a fee of \$1,500. The top-selling filly after 75-percent of the horses had gone through the ring was [hip 260](#), a daughter of Officer--Woodypine (Pine Bluff). From the family of champion sprinter Eillo, the dark bay, named Officer Woody, was consigned by Pike Racing, agent, and purchased for \$82,000 by Maggie Moss. She clocked an eighth in :10 2/5 at the preview. The complete results of the one-day auction will be in tomorrow's *TDN*.

MULTIDIMENSIONAL OUT UNTIL THE FALL

"It's disappointing, as he was one of the main hopes for the season and it was intended he would go for race like the Prince of Wales's S., Eclipse and Juddmonte International. He is sound, but we will have to give him some time off and we hope to give him one run in September before going for the Champion S. at Newmarket."
