### ACTION SHIFTS TO THE BLUE GRASS

Historic Keeneland kicks off its 2007 spring meet this afternoon with the first post at 1:15 p.m. The feature on the card is the \$150,000 GIII Transylvania S., a one-mile turf event for three-year-olds. Returning to the grass this afternoon is Silverton Hill LLC's **Sedgefield**



(Smart Strike), who uses the race as a possible prep for the GI Kentucky Derby. Runner-up in the GIII Tropical Park Derby Jan. 1 and in the Hallandale Beach S. Feb. 24, the full to the turf star English Channel returned to the site of his maiden win last December to complete the exacta in the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Mar. 24. Plans were briefly up in the air after his dull fourth-place effort in last Saturday's GI Florida Derby at Gulfstream Park, but it looks as though **Stormello**

(Stormy Atlantic) will indeed be heading to the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby. Trainer and co-owner Bill Currin had said the morning of the Florida Derby that Stormello would line up on the first Saturday in May, but after Stormello failed to see out the nine furlongs of the race, Currin was less definite in his plans. Yesterday, however, Currin said that he was training Stormello "to run in the Kentucky Derby." Currin added that jockey Kent Desormeaux was booked to ride. A very game second to Scat

Daddy in the GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream in early March, Stormello returned to his base at Santa Anita, then shipped back for the Florida Derby. Currin said the wear and tear of the trips may have affected his charge. "I think he got more tired flying than he did running," he said. "On the trips to California to Florida, he probably spent 40 hours on the planes, and I know I got jet lag. I think horses do, too."

**Summer Doldrums Schools; Luzzi Confident...**

**Summer Doldrums** (Street Cry {Ire}), who is looking to rebound in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial S. at Aqueduct after running third as the chalk in the Mar. 10 GIII Gotham S., school yesterday in the paddock at the New York track. The Rick Violette Jr.-trained colt has drawn post five for the nine-furlong Wood, which suits jockey Mike Luzzi just fine. "The post is cool," he said. "I can do what I want from there." Luzzi said he and Violette have not yet discussed strategy. "We'll sit down and come up with a plan," Luzzi said. "The colt's pretty handy. I've definitely got options with him. After looking at the race, we might decide we want him on the lead. We'll figure it out." Summer Doldrums emerged on the Triple Crown scene with a smart daylight victory in the Whirlaway S. at Aqueduct, but was one-paced in the stretch of the Gotham and, according to Violette, scoped dirty after the race. "Comparing his Whirlaway and Gotham, I had two different horses under me," Luzzi said. "We all know what went wrong in the Gotham. I think he's going to make some noise Saturday."

**'Spun' Still Possible for Blue Grass...**



Despite published reports to the contrary, trainer Larry Jones said that Fox Hill Farm's **Hard Spun** (Danzig) may still start in next Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. "We really won't know until after [his work on] Tuesday. We'll see," said Jones. "The horse is doing very well, so it's making the Blue Grass look more like a possibility than it was at one time. Not that he wasn't doing well, but he's really getting into the bit right now and I don't know if we can set on him for a long, long time without having to do something real serious with him. Believe me, we're a long ways from ruling the Blue Grass out. We'll know more after Tuesday." The last-out winner of the GII Lane's End S. galloped 1 7/8 miles yesterday morning. In other Blue Grass developments, trainer Jamie Sanders put **Teuflesberg** (Johannesburg) through his paces yesterday morning and the upset winner of the Southwest S. is also on the fence for next Saturday's race. He is scheduled to work six furlongs this morning at about 8:30 a.m.

**FAITH IN ART** Peter Chapple-Hyam has issued an upbeat bulletin on Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) ahead of the unbeaten colt's tilt at the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5. Last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. winner has yet to tackle a trip in excess of six furlongs and his conditioner is hopeful he will see out the mile of the Classic. "I'm very pleased with Dutch Art--I couldn't be happier," he told *PA Sport*. "I have no doubts about the trip and if he gets it, he wins. He should get the trip the way he runs his races--he just lobs along. We have to try--only time will tell--but he has a good attitude. He's a natural and does exactly what it says on the tin." Chapple-Hyam is looking at the possibility of a prep race in the G3 Greenham S. at Newbury Apr. 21, but stressed that his participation in a trial is dependent on the ground. "It all depends on the weather," he added. "If it stays fine, he will go straight to the Guineas but if it goes funny and I can't work him so well, he would go to the Greenham."

**DIRECT STRATEGY FOR PRINCE** Sultan Ahmad Shah's **Strategic Prince (GB)** (Dansili {GB}) looks likely to head straight to the May 5 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, connections revealed yesterday. Trainer Paul Cole declared last year's G2 July S. and G2 Vintage S. winner as "on schedule" for the mile Classic, which will be his first outing since finishing third in the G1 Dewhurst S. on the Rowley Mile. "He put on an awful lot of weight during the winter, possibly a

little bit too much, but we're gradually working it off him and he's got his summer coat," he commented. "He's always been pretty straightforward to train, as he's got pretty good legs. He's on schedule, he looks great and he's moving very well. I've always felt, with a horse that will get further than a mile, that a prep race is not a good idea. We're hoping he will get the Derby distance as the whole family have stayed, but he has got devastating speed and that's at the back of my mind. Now the ground is drying out, I'll be pushing more buttons."

Trainer David Hayes will switch last start G1 Arrowfield S. winner **Miss Finland's** customary black blinkers for a pair of winkers--woolly cheekpieces that are presently in vogue among Australian trainers--ahead of her ambitious AJC Derby mission. The five-time Group 1 winner and Horse of the Year elect is aiming to become just the ninth filly in history to win the blue-riband event at Randwick, and the first since the Clarry Conners-trained Research in 1989. She would also become only the second Golden Slipper winner to win the AJC Derby after Skyline, who won the second running of the Slipper in 1958, and returned the next season to snare the Derby. Hayes adopted similar gear-change tactics last November before Miss Finland's runaway G1 VRC Oaks triumph, defeating Tuesday Joy. "[Jockey] Craig [Williams] feels that she's letting horses get to her, as she did on Saturday when she won the Arrowfield," Hayes explained. "She had blinkers on in the Cox Plate in the spring, then we put the winkers on for the VRC Oaks and she settled beautifully in that and won it easily." Hayes said spring ambitions for Miss Finland included a tilt at the G1 Cox Plate, a race in which she was controversially sixth last October, ahead of the Melbourne Cup.

**Rain Dance...**

Flamboyant owner John Singleton has been praying for rain for **Tuesday Joy** after the G2 Wakeful S. winner took out the G1 Coolmore Classic amid a summer downpour at Rosehill Mar. 24. His prayers were answered with a peculiar deluge of 46 millimetres Wednesday night that soaked Randwick and little else. Singleton's tongue-in-cheek winning strategy is: "Miss Finland to draw barrier 47, we start from between three and five, and it rains all week. Tuesday Joy is by Carnegie and they love wet tracks. The forecast is for rain."

### Funny Cide in Keeneland Debut:

Sacketoga Stable's **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), the 2003 Kentucky Derby winner, makes the first start of his seven-year-old campaign in this afternoon's eighth race at Keeneland. The popular chestnut gelding maintains his zest for racing, according to assistant trainer Robin Smullen. "We just decided to bring him back and run him on the Poly[track] and see if he wants to run this year," she commented. "He's not ready for retirement. He loves his job, he loves what he's doing, so we'll just see how he turns out this year." Smullen thinks Funny Cide will handle the synthetic surface. "You never know until they run, but he sure seemed to like it," she said. The 8 1/2-furlong allowance over the Polytrack has attracted a stakes-quality field of 12, including MGSW **Spellbinder** (Tale of the Cat), now owned by Stonewall Farm; William S. Farish's **Student Council** (A.P. Indy), victorious in the Maxxam Gold Cup H. Jan. 27; GSP **Irene's Mon** (Maria's Mon); and Flaxman Holdings' **Rathor (Ire)** (Machiavellian).

### Showing Up Set for Friday Breeze:

Lael Stable's MGSW **Showing Up** (Strategic Mission), winner of last year's GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland, will breeze publicly on the turf following this afternoon's first race. Trainer Barclay Tagg is considering the GII Maker's Mark Mile Apr. 13 as a possible 2007 starting point for the chestnut colt, winner in his most recent appearance of the GI Hollywood Derby. "We'll make that decision once we see how the race looks," said Robin Smullen, Tagg's assistant. "He's training very well." Also under consideration is the GIII Beaugay H. over the Aqueduct turf Apr. 28.

### Apprentice Alvarado Out With Shoulder Injury:

Apprentice jockey Junior Alvarado will be sidelined indefinitely after dislocating his left shoulder during the running of Wednesday's eighth race at Gulfstream Park. The 21-year-old native of Venezuela was aboard M.S.M. Stable's Pink and Sweet when his left shoulder popped while he was using his whip. "I don't know how it happened, but it's not the first time," said Alvarado Thursday morning through an interpreter. "I had to wait all the way past the wire because I couldn't pull the horse up. I have to see the doctor and find out if I need surgery." Alvarado was able to reset the shoulder, but opted off his remaining mounts to seek treatment. Through Wednesday's action, Alvarado had ridden 15 winners from 122 mounts, including a 95-1 longshot for trainer Nick Zito.

**Update on Eastern and Forest Tent Caterpillars:**

Experts in Kentucky report that Eastern tent caterpillars and forest tent caterpillars, which have been linked to Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome (MRLS), are developing normally this spring, with egg hatching complete and populations feeding, making this an optimal time for area horse farms to assess caterpillar activity and implement control strategies while the larvae are still small and most susceptible. "There is no indication of widespread high populations of the eastern tent caterpillar this year," said Lee Townsend, University of Kentucky College of Agriculture entomologist. "There are, however, abundant populations of the caterpillar in some localized areas." Townsend added that this week's freezing nighttime temperatures won't adversely affect populations of the eastern tent caterpillar.

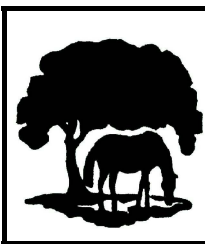
