STYLING AT KEENELAND APRIL

A filly from the first crop of Horse of the Year Mineshaft out of GISP Stylish Talent (Forty Niner) brought a final bid of \$1.75 million to top the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale in Lexington yesterday. Consigned by Hartley/De Renzo Thoroughbreds, the bay was purchased by B. Wayne Hughes. Randy Hartley and Dean DeRenzo went to

\$400,000 to get the March foal at the Keeneland September sale, and she rewarded their faith by breezing an eighth in a record-equalling :09 3/5 at the first under-tack show. "That felt wonderful," said De Renzo. "She performed like we talked about, and there aren't many like her going through the ring. People realize that. You won't see another one like her again for some time." As for the final price, DeRenzo remarked, "We didn't have a reserve on her, because we didn't think we

needed one. We thought she'd bring that much--she's just that good. And I'm tickled to death that B. Wayne Hughes got her--now she'll go to Richard Mandella. We're really excited, and he is really excited to get her." Seth Semkin, racing manager for Hughes, signed the ticket. "I don't know if I've ever seen a better filly than that," said Semkin. "She separated herself from the others during the first breeze show and that is very difficult to do on the Polytrack. The talent that she showed was a huge factor. She speaks for herself." Semkin was also pleased with the way the filly looked back at the barn. "She's such a striking individual," he said. "Her physical type is exceptional and we are very happy to have her." The sales topper's dam was third in the 1998 GI Oak Leaf S., and her second dam is MGSW Stylish Star. She will get a break before beginning her racing career. The price easily surpassed the previous record of \$1.25 million for a juvenile filly at Keeneland set by Lochlin Slew (Seattle Slew) in 1999. She was ironically also purchased by Hughes.

Wishful Thinking...

Trainer Wesley Ward was the center of attention after saddling **One Hot Wish** (Bring the Heat) to a world record-breaking debut victory at Keeneland Apr. 12. But rather than field a thousand phone calls inquiring about the two-year-old filly, Ward put his head together with Tom VanMeter of Eaton Sales and decided to send her through the ring at Keeneland April.

But what seemed like a solid plan didn't quite pan out. The Cal-bred chestnut, co-owned by Ward and Robert Tanklage, RNA'd at \$300,000.

"We didn't sell her," VanMeter said. "We certainly thought we'd get a lot more than that. It was a really great idea, I thought, but it didn't go the way we hoped."

One Hot Wish looked perfect during her 12 1/4-length score, but according to VanMeter she's not quite a 10 when she's standing still.

"She's very fast, and everyone came to look at her, but she has one wheel that's a little bit off in conformation and it was tough to get that past this market," he explained.

As for what's next, he added, "We never had any offers, and I don't think she'll be on the market after this. I think they'll want to go on and race her. They are happy to keep her. There's nothing wrong with her, but she'll get a little time off now, after that huge performance, and I think you'll see her at Del Mar."

Classic Aspirations...

Centennial Farms has high hopes for hip 165. The son of Mr. Greeley, consigned by Kirkwood Stables, joins the Centennial string after attracting a final bid of \$600,000, and his new connections would love to hit the Triple Crown trail with him next year.

"We felt he fit our criteria as a Classic-type conformation," said Centennial President Don Little Jr. "Of

course, he was very, very athletic on the racetrack, and we are very high on Mr. Greeley as a stallion. We came here to find that special horse, and of all those we looked at, we felt he was it. We were fortunate to get him."

But, as much as he liked the bay, Little was at his limit when the hammer fell.

"He was right at the number we figured," he said. "That was it for us, to be honest."

Looking ahead, Little added, "He'll go our farm in Middleburg, Virginia, and get 30 to 60 days off. Then he will go into training

either with Michael Matz or Jimmy Jerkens."

Out of MSW Crusie (Country Light), hip 165 is a 1/2 to SP Chuckie's in Love (El Prado {Ire}). He was purchased for just \$22,000 by Bobby Rankin as a KEENOV weanling, but worked a quarter in :21 flat at the first preview.

"Obviously he developed great, but my friend Eric Reed got him ready, I just picked him up when I got [to Kentucky]," said Kirkwood's Kip Elser. "Whatever he did on the racetrack, that was Eric and the horse."

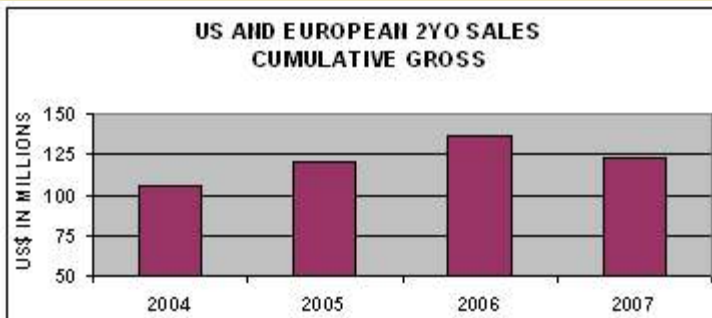

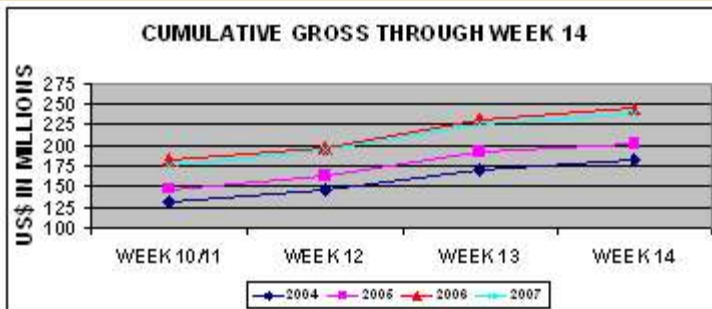

The In Horse...

When you can boast Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg) in your immediate pedigree, you are going to attract attention. It didn't hurt that hip 60, consigned by Ciaran Dunne's Wavertree Stables Inc., also worked an eighth in :10 flat at the first preview. The colt, by Hussonet out of Reina Victoriosa (Arg) (Interprete {Arg}), brought a final bid of \$525,000 from Jerry Frankel.

"I bought him mainly because his mother is a full sister--not a half-sister, like they said--to the dam of Invasor," Frankel said. "It's a good family, he's good-looking and the mare has already produced. Hussonet hasn't had the chance to do much here, he only has one [Northern Hemisphere] crop, but I think he has [22] percent stakes winners in Chile. Of course, that's Chile, but he breezed nice and he looked nice."

Hussonet (Mr. Prospector-- Sacahuista, by Raja Baba), who stood the 2004 season at Vinery in the U.S., currently stands at Arrowfield Stud in Australia, where his first crop have just reached the races. The 16-year-old was leading sire in Chile seven times and leading two-year-old sire in that country six times. He has 17 champions to date and boasts a ratio of 22-percent stakes winners to runners.

Reina Victoriosa has produced two stakes winners from her two foals to race, More Than Regal and Ready Ruler.

As for where hip 60, a May 18 foal, heads next, Frankel said, "He'll go to Michael Stidham, who is here at Keeneland right now. Then he'll go to Chicago, and hopefully he'll be on the move from there. We hope he'll be at Churchill Downs a year from May."

Southern Exposure...

The Southern Hemisphere was well represented yesterday when Jerry Frankel went to \$525,000 to secure a son of South American leading sire Hussonet out of an Interprete mare Reina Victoriosa (Arg). From the family of Horse of the Year Invasor (Arg), the bay was purchased by Stan Ryan at last year's Keeneland September Sale for \$165,000 with the intention of reselling the handsome colt at the juvenile sales. And while active in racing for many years, Ryan made his initial foray into the pinhooking game last year.

"I liked the mare, she had a couple of starters who ran pretty well as two-year-olds, so we thought he might sell well this year," said Ryan, explaining the purchase. The North Dakota resident currently has five horses in training with Western Canadian-based trainer Greg Tracy, and also boards some of his stock at Kentucky-based farms, including Katalpa Farm in Paris. "It was quite a bit more than we expected," he said, referring to the price. "Now we can come and buy more for next year."

Looking at the Bigger Picture...

Robert LaPenta's Whitehorse Stables bought [hip 43](#) for \$180,000 at Keeneland September, but opted to forgo an immediate profit as the son of Fusaichi Pegasus RNA'd at \$725,000. The bay will race for LaPenta. "He's just a really nice horse and we thought a lot of him," said Dave Scanlon, who consigned the colt. "He's a real late foal, May 26, and he has done everything so well so far, he can only get better. There is a lot of upside to the horse. We had a high price in mind for him, and the owner is really happy to keep him."

The two-year-old, out of SP Pas Who (Pas Seul), is a half to SW and MGSP Go to the Ink and stakes winners Bay Barrister and Pas By Pas. He worked :10 4/5 at the first preview and came back to get the distance in :10 3/5 Monday.

A Tough Act to Follow...

It was hard to live up to the 2006 Keeneland April sale. Last year's edition saw a 30.6-percent gain in the average and a 15.4-percent hike in the median, and there were 14 horses that sold for \$400,000, up from seven in 2005. And even with 14.8 percent fewer horses catalogued and 16.4 percent fewer horses sold, the gross was up nearly \$1.4 million. This year, while the median saw a 3.3-percent rise, the average dropped off 4.3 percent and the RNAs, at 40.8 percent in '06, rose to a sale high 47.1 percent. There were 10 horses that brought \$400,000 or more.

While both Darley (who purchased two at the top of the market last year) and Coolmore were represented at the sale, they signed no tickets, nor did Stonestreet Stables, which had bought two of the \$400,000-plus juveniles in 2006.

"It's just the dynamics of the two-year-old market," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "There is high risk and high reward."

Kip Elser of Kirkwood Stables echoed Russell's assessment.

"We had a good sale overall, but it has been somewhat of a rollercoaster," said Elser. "There were some very, very good hits, and some horses that got no interest at all. You don't know where the hits are going to be. It's been very much like the other sales we have been to this year--it's the same market we've been dealing with all year."

Russell pointed to a couple of early outs that might have boosted the final numbers.

"We were probably missing a top colt," he said. "We had a couple of promising colts that didn't make it and that might have made the difference."

Fair Enough, her 2000 colt by Diesis (GB), went for \$400,000 as a KEESEP yearling; and her 2003 filly by Giant's Causeway, Fairy Princess, was a \$425,000 KEESEP yearling. This dark bay failed to find a home at \$45,000 last fall at KEESEP, but a furlong's breeze in :9 4/5 made her a desired commodity here.

Dynamic Duncan Draft...

Another vendor who offers drafts small in number but consistently high on quality is Philippa Duncan and her hot pink-clad team enjoyed a successful day selling several well-known matrons on behalf of clients. One such mare was 16-year-old **Procrastinate (Aus)** (Jade Hunter) who sold to BBA Ireland yesterday for A\$660,000. Procrastinate's name has appeared in Easter yearling catalogues since 1998 when agent James Bester gave A\$575,000 for her Danehill filly Laisserfaire (Aus) who proved a flag-bearer in South Africa, winning dual G1 Fillies and Mares Sprint races and the G1 Kenilworth Cape Flying Championship among 12 wins. Her colt by Redoute's Choice (Aus) was sold for A\$2 million last week to Sheikh Mohammed's agent John Ferguson. Procrastinate is also the dam of Group 1-placed young sire Foreplay (Aus) and juvenile stakes winner Personify (Aus), the latter purchased by BBA Ireland at Easter in 2005. Her filly Patasi (Aus), a A\$1.6-million purchase for Bob Scarborough's Wood Nook Farm at Easter 2006, is also stakes placed. Procrastinate is out of the Century mare Reigntaine (Aus), an unraced sister to New Zealand stallion Centaine (NZ). Reigntaine produced multiple group winner Galapagos Girl (Aus) and New Zealand stakes winner Kampaigh (Aus).

Commands a Lot...

The Barbara Joseph-trained **Commands Nothin' (Aus)** (Commands {Aus}), who sold a year ago for A\$360,000, went through the ring yesterday for Duncan and fetched A\$620,000 in foal to Encosta de Lago (Aus) when knocked down to Lee Fleming's Victorian Farm Eliza Park. "She was bought as a race mare and it was a nice return, taking the service fee into account," said Duncan of the 3/4-sister to Group 1-placed Aint Seen Nothin' (Aus) from the immediate family of Golden Slipper winner Polar Success (Aus). Sold as a yearling at the 2003 Inglis Sydney Classic for \$24,000, subsequent family developments have seen this family pedigree become a much sought-after commodity in the sale ring. Ain't Seen Nothin' sold for A\$460,000 at last year's broodmare sale. "I wasn't going home without this mare," said Fleming. "We focus on quality and that's exactly what this mare is." Another highlight for the Philippa Duncan team was the sale of the Rodrigo de Triano mare **Embraceable You (NZ)**, a half-sister to G1 Epsom H. winner Allez Suez. "She was a NZ\$340,000 yearling from a nice family, she is everything you look for in a broodmare. It's been a good day," said Duncan. Of the overall sale, Duncan added, "The strength in the market is for young mares with attractive services from nice families and it is tough elsewhere." Asked if her expectations rose after a record-breaking yearling sale last week, she said: "Yes, but again, the yearling sale proved that the top end is really strong and lower down it was more difficult. I think there are a lot of bargains here today further down." A total of 202 lots sold for receipts of \$10,315,850 at an average of \$75,298, bringing the cumulative total to 251 lots sold for \$21,522,600, averaging \$85,747. The sale continues through Friday.

Craven Breeze-Up Starts Today Following their racecourse workouts yesterday morning, just under 200 juveniles will be offered at Tattersalls over the next two evenings at what the Newmarket-based auction company is billing as the "best breeze-up ever assembled in Europe." With a second two-year-old sale set to take place at Tattersalls next month, this select event has been rebranded the Craven Breeze-Up Sale this year and vendors have spent more than ever before on their stock. Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables set a Tattersalls breeze-up record 12 months ago when selling a Green Desert for 625,000gns and the veteran Co. Tipperary consignor has 25 catalogued for 2007. Among Browne's offerings impressing on Newmarket's Rowley Mile yesterday morning were Lot 145, a first-crop Harlan's Holiday colt out of Flirted (Relaunch) who RNA'd for \$70,000 at Keeneland September, and Lot 165, a Dynaformer colt out of Designatoree (Alysheba), who cost \$260,000 at the same yearling sale. Lot 38, a Giant's Causeway half-brother to multiple Group 1 winner Balanchine (Storm Bird), realised \$250,000 at Saratoga in August, while Browne sells the only Kingmambo on offer, Lot 54, a colt out of The Seven Seas (El Gran Senor) who made \$200,000 as a yearling. Con Marnane's Bansha House Stables is the biggest numerical consignor with 27 catalogued. Lot 22, a Johannesburg colt who realised \$160,000 as a yearling, was among those who impressed in the breeze, as did Lot 71, a colt by the same sire. Lot 55, **Oasis David (GB)** (Oasis {GB}), worked to good effect under jockey Neil Callan, as well as Lot 39, **Tiger Dream (GB)** (Oasis Dream {GB}) and Lot 147, a Danzig filly from Johannesburg's family.

NO BREEZE

After some astounding results across the Atlantic and a sea-change in local attitudes, the nature of selling two-year-olds in Europe is altering dramatically. For a consignor like Jamie Railton, the time is ripe to exploit the Breeze-Up market and this week's Tattersalls Craven Sale marks another rise in the temperature.

While the former jumps jockey has built an enterprise the envy of any consignor over the past 12 years, the pressure remains.

"Everything has become more competitive, but competition is a great thing," he says and this week's draft

is his answer, featuring a daughter of Storm Cat as its focal point. "In reality, a sale is only as good as the horses that come out of it and we have a variety of pretty special pedigrees on offer."

Breezing in Europe used to be a low-key affair, but with ever-increasing demand for high-caliber juveniles, times have changed. It is no accident that the selling of a

1000 Guineas winner in Speciosa (Ire) by Doncaster preceded the advent of a Goffs Breeze-Up on Kempton's polytrack. Buying a son of the likes of Danzig in the spring in Britain is no longer a pipe dream and Tattersalls are so big on breezing, they are offering two bites of the cherry this year.

Nevertheless, the high prices quality foals and yearlings are demanding has led to a select two-year-old market potentially perilous for the pinhooking trade. More breeze-ups mean more choice for buyers and the stock have to be spot on to make a profit.

For Railton, this week is key.

"In the past, two-year-old sales have very much relied on foreign buyers, particularly the Japanese and the better horses have gone abroad, but the yen is quite weak and that's surely going to affect buying power," Railton explains. "Doncaster was selective and this might be more so, but hopefully the main buyers will be there and there are going to be expensive horses."

Apart from the issues of demand and currency strength, logistics of galloping green two-year-olds also adds stress to the vendor. While Goffs and now Doncaster see the need for all-weather strips to breeze juveniles, Newmarket have the infamous "dip" for the horses to encounter as the stopwatches seek the all-important answers.

"There are more hoops to jump through selling two-year-olds," Railton adds. "People are focusing on timing and it's very difficult to get a handle on a track like the Rowley Mile, which has that unique drop from the two-furlong pole to the one and isn't level. It's very difficult to ask a two-year-old to gallop and remain balanced there. Without doubt, the increased use of synthetic surfaces will make the world even smaller and the next two years will be a very interesting time. America is becoming fully aware of the different type of horses required now that Polytrack is expanding."

Consigning at a European Breeze-Up may have its difficulties, but it provides the kind of high-octane rush someone like Railton thrives on. By the time hip 149, the Storm Cat out of G1 Fillies' Mile third Reach for the Moon steps into one of the world's most vital auction houses, he will pretty much know his fate.

"Historically, this business has always been a situation of feast and famine," he concludes. "It's high risk and not to everyone's taste, but there's great potential there."

All eyes will be on **Sander Camillo** as the impressive G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner returns after a subsequent 280-day absence. Breaking her maiden at Royal Ascot in the G3 Albany S., where **Scarlet Runner** was among her victims, she dispelled a quality line-up, which included subsequent group winner Alzerra (UAE) and G2 Queen Mary S. victress Gilded (Ire), in the Cherry Hinton over six furlongs of the July Course here. Connections believe the extra panel will hold no fears as she hurdles headlong toward the May 6 G1 1000 Guineas. "We don't have any doubts about her staying the mile," owner Sir Robert Ogden's Racing Manager Barry Simpson commented. "[Trainer] Jeremy [Noseda] felt last year she was looking for seven furlongs and she's strengthened up an awful lot over the winter. She has been working extremely well and Jeremy reports her in good form. The plan was to go for the G2 Lowther S. and the G1 Cheveley Park S. last year, but we did not get the right sort of ground and didn't want to risk her." Scarlet Runner bids to provide trainer John Dunlop with his third renewal, but needs to recapture the form of her defeat of Vital Statistics (GB) in the G3 Princess Margaret S. at Ascot in July. Her subsequent unplaced efforts in the G2 Lowther S. at York in August and G1 Cheveley Park S. here in October raise question marks. **Kaseema** represents the Sir Michael Stoute stable, which collected this in 1986 with Sonic Lady, in 1990 with Heart of Joy and seven years ago with Petrushka (Ire). She needs to show she is better than her latest seventh behind Finsceal Beo (Ire) in the G2 Rockfel S. at this track in October.

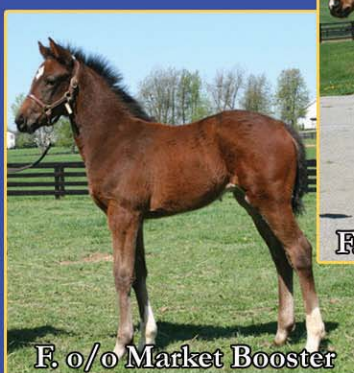

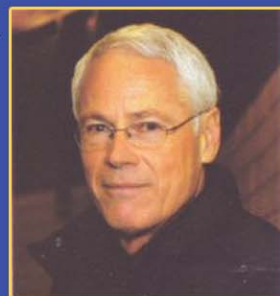

## DELAWARE JOCKEYS HELP PAY FOR \$2M INSURANCE POLICY

Delaware Park Jockeys Association president Robert Colton said April 17 a landmark deal that gives riders at Delaware Park the most comprehensive insurance coverage of any racetrack in North America has been finalized. Colton said the Delaware Park Jockeys Health and Welfare Board unanimously approved a deal that will more than double the current policy for jockeys, "send a strong statement to the horse racing industry," and set a precedent for jockey insurance coverage. As of midnight April 18, jockeys at Delaware Park will be entitled to \$2 million in on-track accident insurance, up from the \$1-million policy that they currently have. Coverage length will increase from 24 months to 60 months. In addition, the policy will afford injured riders \$500 per week in disability pay and \$100,000 in accidental death and dismemberment benefits, both double what the original policy offers. For the first time in the industry, Colton said, jockeys themselves will be financially responsible for some of the insurance coverage. Each Delaware Park rider will pay \$4 per mount to offset a portion of the policy. The remainder of the cost will be paid for by the health and welfare board. "We took a philosophical change in our approach," Colton said. "In the past, the Jockeys' Guild tried to take the position that we were employees. But we are not employees. We are independent contactors, and as riders, there is an inherent risk involved. The jockeys had to finally stand up and take part of the financial responsibility and stop pointing fingers. For the first time ever, we were willing to do that. "We approached Delaware Park and asked if we could add to the current policy that they have in place--really just piggyback on top of what is already existing. We researched it and figured out what it would cost each rider to have the best coverage possible. This is, to my knowledge, the highest level of benefits at any racetrack. Everyone agreed that it was well worth \$4 per mount." Colton, a retired jockey and former Guild official, said that every jockey who rides at Delaware Park is entitled to the insurance coverage, but that it is optional. He also gave credit to Delaware Park general manager Bill Fasy, Delaware Park Jockeys Health and Welfare Board chairman Ed Stegemeier, and insurance broker John Unick for helping make the deal possible. In 2004, Delaware Park became the first racetrack to offer \$1 million in on-track accident insurance. Colton said as long as jockeys are willing to accept some of the cost, similar deals can be reached at any racetrack in the country.

**HE'S NO PIE EATER DIES** Dual Group 1 winner and star sophomore **He's No Pie Eater (Aus)** (Canny Lad {Aus}--Ladies' Day, by Ascot Knight) was euthanized on Monday after fracturing his shoulder while engaged in light trackwork at Randwick. The Graeme Rogerson-trained colt had five wins, two seconds and three thirds from 16 starts for earnings of A\$756,500. He was fourth in the G1 AJC Derby Apr. 7 after winning the G1 Rosehill Guineas and G1 Chipping Norton S. earlier in autumn. "I'm shattered. He just started cantering and pulled up in one stride. It was unbelievable," Rogerson told Sydney's *The Daily Telegraph*. "The saddest part was this horse was getting better and better with racing. I've had horses break legs, but at full speed, not when they're just cantering. I don't want to dwell on it. These are the ups and downs of racing. The person I feel most sorry for is the owner, David Reid." Dean Watt, who bought and syndicated He's No Pie Eater for Reid's late father Bruce, revealed a Hunter Valley-based stud was this week about to formally sign off on a 50-percent share in the colt. He's No Pie Eater was scratched from the G1 Queen Elizabeth S. at Randwick on Saturday because of an elevated temperature.

**AQUA HAS TESTS TO PASS** **Aqua d'Amore (Aus)** (Danehill) must pass a series of barrier tests at Randwick on Wednesday and Friday before she will be allowed to participate in the Champions Mile run at Sha Tin on Apr. 29. The Gai Waterhouse-trained mare, who races in Coolmore's navy silks, must trial to the satisfaction of Racing NSW stewards after her barrier antics in the G1 Doncaster H. when she sat down in the stalls before the race. "She has worn our patience thin. She must have done it three or four times at least," said chief steward Ray Murrihy. Aqua d'Amore and Casino Prince (Aus) are due to depart Monday. Aqua d'Amore won the first leg of the Asian Mile series, the G1 Futurity S. at Caulfield, and was fourth in the G1 Doncaster at her last start. She has earnings of A\$1,926,850 with nine wins, four seconds and three thirds from 34 attempts.

**DARLEY ANNOUNCES '07 FEES** Darley Australia has announced its fees for 2007, with flagship stallion Elusive Quality's fee increasing from A\$110,000 to A\$137,500. The sire of recent Group 1 winner Camarilla (Aus) in his first Australian crop, Elusive Quality was among the star stallions at the recent Inglis Australian Easter Yearling Sale, with a filly from Group 1-winner Republic Lass (Aus) hammered down to Bob Ingham's Woodlands Stud for A\$2 million. Woodlands purchased Camarilla from Darley at the same sale last year for A\$900,000. Elusive Quality covered 99 mares last season. He was third leading sire on average with 19 sold at an average A\$545,526 at Easter, a remarkable feat after being leading first-crop sire on average last year. Newcomer Bernardini, who is standing his first season in Kentucky at \$100,000, has his Australian fee set at a competitive A\$82,500. First-season sire Henny Hughes's fee has been set at A\$27,500, along with fellow newcomer Librettist at A\$22,000. "We're absolutely thrilled with Elusive Quality's success with his first crop of two-year-olds and we're particularly excited to offer breeders the opportunity to send their mares to a stallion of Bernardini's calibre," said Darley Australia's Oliver Tait. "We've priced them to reflect their merits."
