AVIOLI NAMED BREEDERS' CUP PRESIDENT

Greg Avioli, who has been serving as interim president and chief executive officer of Breeders' Cup Limited since June of last year, yesterday was named to those posts by the organization's Board of Directors. Avioli, 42, earned the appointment after an intensive six-month selection process conducted jointly by a Breeders' Cup board and the international executive search firm SpencerStuart. "Since his appointment last June, Greg has done an excellent job running our operation and positioning the Breeders' Cup for growth," said Breeders' Cup Chairman Bill Farish.

"He has the overwhelming support of the Board." He added, "The Board shares his vision for the future development of the Breeders' Cup World Championships and the Breeders' Cup brand. We are pleased to announce his appointment effective immediately."

Avioli, who was deputy commissioner and chief operating officer of the National Thoroughbred Racing Association from 2001-2006, graduated from the North Carolina School of Law in 1989 and worked at a law firm in Atlanta for five years before joining the sports marketing firm International Sports and Entertainment Strategies in 1994. He was moved to the NTRA in 1998, serving as general counsel and vice president of business affairs from 1998-2000. "This is an exciting time for the Breeders' Cup," said Avioli. "We will continue to focus on growing the international market for our championships, creating a successful two-day event and promoting the Breeders' Cup brand with both our television and sponsorship partners. I look forward to fulfilling the Breeders' Cup Board members' collective vision for the property."

SANTA ANITA GETS 2008 BREEDERS' CUP

The 25th Breeders' Cup has been awarded to the Oak Tree Racing Association at Santa Anita and will take place Friday, Oct. 24 and Saturday, Oct. 25, 2008, pending completion of a formal agreement between Oak Tree and Breeders' Cup Limited. "We're excited to reunite with the Oak Tree Racing Association in returning to California and Santa Anita Park for our 25th Breeders' Cup World Championships," said Bill Farish, chairman of Breeders' Cup Ltd.

"Santa Anita is one of the world's great racing venues, an outstanding facility with a great tradition that will showcase top flight international racing for our fans." Santa Anita, which previously hosted the championship event in 1986, 1993 and 2003, will be installing a synthetic surface this summer, a first

for the Breeders' Cup. "This will be a groundbreaking Breeders' Cup," said Sherwood Chillingworth, Oak Tree's executive vice president. "It will be the first to be run on a synthetic surface and the second time it will be a two-day event. Add in the natural beauty of Santa Anita, the outstanding Southern California weather and the new stakes program to be run on Friday. We expect this to be a Breeders' Cup weekend to remember." The Breeders' Cup will be televised live on ESPN. "With the addition of new Breeders' Cup World Championships races and the two-day format, and as we continue to build and promote the Breeders' Cup brand nationally and internationally, our track partners must meet the highest standards," said Breeders' Cup President and Chief Executive Officer Greg Avioli. "Oak Tree at Santa Anita is an ideal venue for the world's best horses and horsemen, our television partner, ESPN, and our sponsors." Earlier this year, the Breeders' Cup issued an RFP for 2008, 2009 and 2010 to top racing venues in the U.S. and abroad. Avioli indicated that the board would evaluate proposals for 2009 and 2010 at its next meeting in July. This year's Breeders' Cup will be held on Oct. 26 and Oct. 27 at Monmouth Park in Oceanport, N.J. Friday's program will debut three new \$1-million Breeders' Cup races. The Championships will conclude on Saturday with eight Breeders' Cup races.

Adagio started out with a short-head score in a seven-furlong maiden at this track in September and it was evidence of the regard in which he was held that he was chanced in the G1 Dewhurst next time. Despite finding Teofilo (Ire) and company too hot on that occasion, the imposing bay went into many notebooks for his effort trapped out wide racing away from the main action on his way to a seventh-place effort. Missing the break under Kerrin McEvoy here, he was soon enclosed against the fence in mid-division as Sonny Red carved out the fractions under Jamie Spencer. With no room to his outside passing halfway, Adagio was switched back to find a golden rail and rolled by the long-time leader in the final 150 yards to win geared down. "He was always going to do well over the winter," trainer Sir Michael Stoute said. "He has a big frame to fill into, but I think he's made particularly good physical progress and he's a very nice horse." Connections confirmed that Adagio will add another string to the Coolmore team's bow in the May 5 G1 2000 Guineas over course and distance. Manduro earned a reputation as something of a nearly horse last term, having placed in five Group 1 contests after his success in the G2 Prix d'Harcourt at Longchamp in April. The pick of those efforts came when third behind Ouija Board (GB) and Electrocutisionist in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot in June and when a neck runner-up to Librettist in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville in August. Returning off a winter break having finished at the bottom of the exacta again in the G2 Prix Dollar at Longchamp in October, the bay turned this competitive renewal into a procession to suggest he will be enjoying the limelight this season. Racing close to Speciosa's honest pace early, he was let loose by Stephane Pasquier at the quarter pole and drew away to win unchallenged. "He's been a bit unlucky in some group races and he needs a bit of room to extend himself," trainer Andre Fabre said. "Today we rode him closer to the pace and it worked well. He loves this sort of ground and he's going to go for the [May 20] G1 Prix d'Ispahan at Longchamp and then come back for Royal Ascot. He needs an extended mile." 'GRACE' UNDER PRESSURE AT INGLIS

The penultimate session of the Inglis Broodmare Sale trundled forward at Newmarket Thursday, with the smartly bred Infinite Grace (Aus), in foal to young sire Oratorio (Ire), fetching a top bid of A\$850,000. Agent Dermot Farrington landed the eight-year-old mare and was bidding on behalf of an anonymous client who wishes to send her to Encosta de Lago (Aus) this season. Bred and raced by Martin O'Connor, Infinite Grace is by Irish 2000 Guineas winner Prince of Birds out of Infinite Charm (Aus) (Tristino {NZ}). She was retired last August, but had done plenty to recommend herself with seven wins and 18 minor placings from 47 outings, for earnings of A\$846,500. Her victories included two renewals of the G2 Tristarc S. and placings in the G1 Emirates S. and G1 Toorak H. Her dam Infinite Charm (Aus) is a stakes-placed half-sister to dual G1 Cox Plate winner Fields of Omagh (Aus) and to the Group I-placed Malcolm (Aus), as well as to the stakes winners King Brian (Aus) and Timeless Grace (Aus). Infinite Grace was consigned by Coolmore Stud, which stands Oratorio, a dual Group 1-winning son of Danehill.

Make the Grade?

Yesterday's session at Inglis saw a further 140 lots sold for A\$9,322,500 at an average of \$66,589, taking the overall tally to A\$37,271,950 for 539 lots and a respectable average of A\$69,150. With almost 1000 mares catalogued and the stamina of some participants beginning to flag, some prominent consignors suggested that the sale should be graded in 2008. "Almost every major sale like this in the world is graded, and it would encourage the internationals who attend the Easter Yearling Sale to stay for the first part of the broodmare sale," reasoned Coolmore's Michael Kirwan. Inglis director Jonathan D'Arcy said the idea would be further discussed with breeders. "We are always open to ways to improve our sales and we'll definitely discuss it," said D'Arcy, adding that with one session remaining, the sale was easily the best broodmare sale staged at the Inglis complex to date. **Cont. p4**

Demerger Deal Concludes...

A memorable chapter in the lives of 10 money men who worked on the separation of Australian industrial giant BHP Steel from BHP Billiton climaxed in the sale ring at Newmarket yesterday when the aptly named mare Demerger went under the hammer for A\$725,000. She was selected by trainer Danny O'Brien at the 2002 Inglis breeze up sale as a A\$20,000 purchase for the 10 friends and entered the ring today as the winner of A\$835,650 with her eight victories including the G1 Adelaide Cup. She ran twice, without success, in the Melbourne Cup, but picked up races such as the G3 VRC Queen's Cup and the G3 Matriarch S. along the way. At the wind-downs after arduous working days in the long de-merger process over 2001-02, beer talk often turned to racing and, said lawyer Peter Cook, the 10 decided to give themselves a memento of the deal. "Not just a paperweight, a real live animal, so we could share the dream and cost," he said at the time. But their first purchase, a A\$65,000 filly, broke her neck in the paddock and they bought her full-sister--Demerger--who rewarded the trainer's faith winning at Sandown in April 2003 and racing through 47 starts to last spring's Melbourne Cup. She is the only stakes winner for her beautifully bred, but diminutive sire Saithor, a Storm Bird half-brother to A.P. Indy who stands at a fee of A\$3,000 at Larneuk Stud, where he has attracted only a handful of mares. Demerger missed the filly Classics because she was perilously ill, but since then, her graph has taken the shape investment bankers adore. Her dam, Triattica (Aus), sold for A\$650,000 in 2005. Most members of the original Demerger syndicate now have various other bloodstock interests: Steve McCann bought into Vinery Stud with racing big names John Singleton and Gerry Harvey; others had an interest in stakes winner Ferocity (Aus) and other horses with O'Brien.

The group is frequently dispatched around the world and based overseas, but all are convinced the original A\$10,000 they outlaid had proved to be a cheap way of keeping a business team together as friends. The group included Adam Lennen, Campbell Lobb, Rob Stewart, Brendan Rudd (who was mergers and acquisitions leader, BHP Billiton), Brian Kruger, Scott Malcolm, Steve McCann, Peter Cook, John Haddock and Mark Burmeister. While her earnings have funded their three-year journey, it is more important that Demerger has brought untold fun and cemented friendships among business acquaintances as the group has spent winnings on a new horse a year. Some have been less successful than others. Decant, A\$65,000 buy, was decanted for A\$2,000 to North Queensland when he did not fire, but the group looks to have done well with the Montjeu (Ire) gelding Ballack (Aus), runner-up in the recent G1 WATC Derby. The lightly raced NZ\$70,000 yearling purchase has returned A\$105,140 to date.

Demerger's dam Triattica is out of Rosecay (Aus) (Marscay {Aus}), a sister to the blue-hen mare Triscay (Aus)-herself the dam of Group 1 winner La Baraka (Aus) and the granddam of Group 1 winner Defier (Aus). Demerger's yearling half-brother by Dehere was sold last week at the Inglis Easter yearling sale for A\$600,000 by Amarina Farm, with Anthony Cummings the purchaser. Demerger was signed for by Louis Mihalyka of Laurel Oak Syndications on behalf of David O'Keeffe's Lockyer Thoroughbreds. Mihalyka explained that O'Keeffe is currently in Barbados for the World Cup Cricket. Mihalyka commented, "David is a relative newcomer, but is serious about his bloodstock interests and realises that to be

at the top end, you have to pay good money for quality mares. Group 1 winners don't come cheap but he's delighted to get her." **Cont. p5**

Fabulous Hide...

The Giant's Causeway filly Hides (Aus) cost A\$800,000 when he was knocked down to BBA Ireland as a 2005 Easter yearling and, while she didn't quite reach those heights yesterday, fetched a very respectable A\$600,000 to the bid of Curraghmore Stud. Curraghmore purchased the unraced mare in foal to Danehill Dancer (Ire), whose fee is expected to rise substantially in Australia this year. While Hides may not have made the racetrack, she represents one of the most contemporary families in the Australian Stud Book as she is out of Machiavellian mare Subterfuge (GB), the dam of four time Hong Kong Group 1 winner Scintillation (Aus) (Danehill) and full-sibling Shania Dane (Aus), a multiple stakes winner who cost A\$470,000 and retired with almost double that in stakes earnings and is now in foal to Encosta de Lago (Aus). Hides is also a half-sibling to the stakes-placed Liatrix (Aus), a A\$1.3 million Easter yearling of 2006 sold to David Ellis of Te Akau Stud in New Zealand.

FERGUSON BUSY AT CRAVEN

John Ferguson signed for the night's top three lots at yesterday's second session of the Tattersalls Craven Breeze-Up Sale, headed by a 320,000gns Harlan's Holiday colt who was a \$70,000 RNA at Keeneland in September. Willie Browne's Mocklershill Stables sold the colt, on which agent Anthony Stroud, standing with trainer Jeremy Nosedo and owner Paul Roy, was underbidder. "He breezed exceptionally well and from our point of view he was the pick of the colts here," said Ferguson. "Therefore we knew there'd be a lot of competition for him. We bought a Harlan's Holiday in Calder this year who was a similar type and I've been impressed by them. We'll talk to Sheikh Mohammed, but I'd think it's likely he'll stay here to race." Ferguson also spent 260,000gns on a Dixieland Band filly from the Mocklershill draft. She had cost \$125,000 as a yearling and also attracted the attention of underbidder Richard Brown of Blandford Bloodstock. Ferguson signed early on for a 170,000gns Rahy colt from a distinguished Argentinian family offered from Con Marnane's Bansha House Stables. "This was another that breezed well and South American pedigrees are a lot sexier than they were 10 years ago--you only have to look at the two most impressive winners, Invasor and Asiatic Boy, on Dubai World Cup day," added Ferguson. Tattersalls' 2007 Craven Breeze-Up Sale failed to keep pace with the 2006 renewal with the 8.636 million guineas turnover falling by 20 percent and the clearance rate of 63 percent comparing with 84 percent 12 months ago. The 71,967gns average was just short of last year's figure, while the median rose by 10 percent to 55,000gns. Tattersalls chairman Edmond Mahony reflected, "The 2006 Tattersalls Breeze Up was a remarkable sale which completely rewrote the European Breeze-Up record books, but this week's Craven Breeze Up has struggled to match those spectacular figures which rose nearly 50 percent on the previous record levels." **Cont. p6**

"The top of the market held up well with keen competition for the two-year-olds who combined good solid breezes with smart pedigrees, but the middle market did not mirror the amazing strength and depth we experienced at last year's sale," Mahony said. "The strong Japanese contingent, who made such an impact in 2006, was much-depleted this week but to an extent the greater participation from the bigger European buyers compensated at the higher level. The domestic demand, however, has fallen some way short of last year and that is reflected in the figures. This sale has totally transformed in recent years and the turnover from the last two days is second only to 2006 while the average price, well in excess of 70,000gns, is only marginally short of last year's record. This however does not disguise the fact that we would like to have seen many more horses sold and greater returns for the pinhookers."



Illinois House Passes Anti-Slaughter Bill:

The Illinois House of Representatives passed a bill Apr. 18 that would outlaw horse slaughter for human consumption. Illinois is home to one of three slaughter plants in the country. The bill, which passed 74-41, would permanently shut down the plant located in DeKalb. A similar bill was introduced, but defeated in 2004. Both times it was supported by actress and animal-rights activist Bo Derek. The bill now heads to the Illinois Senate. However, due to recent federal rulings, the law may end up being symbolic. In March, a federal district court ordered the shut-down of a U.S. Department of Agriculture program that allowed the slaughter of American horses for human consumption to be paid for by the slaughter houses. As a result, the Illinois plant and the two plants located in Texas have been shut down. Additionally in Texas, a 1949 state law banning the sale of horsemeat for human consumption was upheld by the entire 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals Mar. 5. In January, the U.S. House of Representatives and Senate simultaneously introduced the American Horse Slaughter Prevention Act, which would prohibit horse slaughter for human consumption. In 2006, the bill passed the House by a vote of 263-146, but was not acted upon by the Senate before it adjourned for the year.

While Elusive Quality and Bernardini are the headline acts at Darley's Hunter Valley base, Darley Victoria will be home to five stallions as part of an ongoing expansion plan. "We want to be the most successful Thoroughbred operation in Australia and we think that having a Victorian arm of our operation will assist us in achieving that goal," said Darley Australia manager Oliver Tait. "We stood five stallions there last year and they were very well-received. Street Cry and Reset (Aus) were extremely popular, and Dubai Destination, Consolidator and Country Reel covered good books. This year they'll be joined by Gonski (Aus) (Danehill)." Tait added of Darley's Reset, a multiple Group 1-winning son of Zabeel (NZ), "[His] first yearlings sold well [14 at an average of A\$123,000 and top price of A\$375,000] at Easter. He hasn't hit the heights of Exceed and Excel (Aus) [26 sold for A\$285,000 and top price of A\$1.2 million], but nor does he stand at the same service fee as Exceed and Excel. There is a lot of Zabeel in his yearlings. They are not necessarily going to be early two-year-olds, but I think people who wait for them will be rewarded."
