STREET SENSE PUTS IN STRONG WORK

With 11 days remaining before the GI Kentucky Derby, Jim Tafel's **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) registered what by all accounts was a brilliant five-furlong breeze yesterday under the Twin Spires of Churchill Downs. The colt, with trainer Carl Nafzger looking on

and regular jockey Calvin Borel in the irons, stopped the clock in a bullet :59 flat, the co-fastest of 36 works at the distance. Clockers caught the move in :12 2/5 for the first eighth, :24 2/5 for the quarter, :36 2/5 for three-eighths, :47 4/5 for the half-mile and out six furlongs in 1:11 2/5. The internal splits were :12

2/5, :12 flat, :12 flat, :11 2/5 and :11 1/5 for the five panels. The work, which occurred before the renovation break, came over a track labeled fast. Track notes stated the colt "did not draw a deep breath coming off the track," prompting a broad grin from trainer Carl Nafzger. "I told Calvin what we want here," Nafzger related. "He's fit; we don't worry about fitness. All we are trying to do here is make him happy. That's the way I always work. I don't want to stress him; don't ask him for something he doesn't have. Let him do what he enjoys doing, but don't ask him to do a lot, and that's what he did. He likes to run. He did everything right. He's done everything right the whole time." While Street Sense was the consummate pro during his work, the homebred was a bit green at times in his runner-up effort in the Apr. 14 GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, where he ducked in several times in the stretch. Nafzger was asked yesterday whether he was worried about his colt's behavior on Derby Day. "I'm more worried about 19 other horses," the trainer replied. "I'm not really worried about what he is going to do. You don't change anything. When you get to a Grade I race with horses of that quality, it is a jockeys race. You have done your part. I don't change the dimension of my horse. My horse's dimension is where we have found he is most effective and we leave him in that dimension and let him do it from there."

Slew's Tizzy Possible for Derby...

Trainer Greg Fox indicated yesterday that a start in the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby might be in the cards for last Saturday's GI Lexington S. winner **Slew's Tizzy**

(Tiznow). "I've never had a horse come out of a race so well," said Fox. "Right now, we're just sitting on the fence and we'll make a decision probably by this weekend." The three-year-old enjoyed a quiet day Tuesday, walking the shedrow at Fox Stables, located near the Thoroughbred Center in Lexington.

"Right now, we're 50-50 and we're just talking about it a lot," Fox added. "I'm just enjoying the fact that the horse is doing as well as he is." Also possible for the Derby is Circle Z Stables' **Xchanger** (Exchange Rate), winner of last Saturday's Federico Tesio S. at Pimlico. "He is not out of the question, but I don't like to come back in two weeks," said Mark Shuman. "I want to do what's best for the horse." Shuman said he would meet with the colt's owners over the next few days and likely have a decision by Friday.

High Again Works at Churchill...

High Again (High Yield) worked five furlongs in 1:01.40 at Churchill Downs Tuesday. Partnered by Larry Melancon, the filly recorded the 12th fastest work of 36 at the distance yesterday. "She went super," Kenny McCarthy, assistant to Bill Mott. "We gave her a target and she breezed right by her."

CAMILLO DOUBTS Sir Robert Ogden's **Sander Camillo** (Dixie Union) might not make the line-up for the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket, connections announced yesterday. Having tied up when second in last Wednesday's G3 Nell Gwyn S. at that venue, the Jeremy Nosedo-trained filly is undergoing tests ahead of the May 6 Classic. "We are running routine tests on her at the moment and we will just take it one day at a time, but it's going to be difficult for her," Ogden's Racing Manager Barry Simpson told *PA Sport* yesterday. "We are still hopeful we are going to get there, but it's too early to make a decision. It will be well into next week before we do and we need to get some positive feedback." Last year's impressive G2 Cherry Hinton S. winner, Sander Camillo had started as the 4-7 favorite for the seven-furlong trial, but failed by a neck to catch Scarlet Runner (Ire). "Jeremy's done nothing with her since the Nell Gwyn," Simpson added. "All she's done is walk out each day, so we are some way off. It's going to be a week today or tomorrow before we get to the stage of saying whether or not we are going to run and even then we wouldn't be 100 percent certain. We know what the problem is, but it's not the ideal preparation. It's far from ideal. If she doesn't run, she doesn't run. There's no point running her if she's not right. We don't want excuses."

YAQEEEN GIVEN GREEN LIGHT Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Yaqeen (GB)** (Green Desert) will start in the May 6 G1 1000 Guineas, trainer Michael Jarvis revealed yesterday. Her win in a seven-furlong Newmarket maiden Apr. 19 earned her a tilt at the Newmarket feature. "Yaqeen is an intended runner in the 1000 Guineas," Jarvis commented. "She has come out of last week's race well and seems fine. It was only a maiden, but I thought she has done it well, and she was doing it at the right end of the race. Given an extra furlong, she would have been an even more clear-cut winner. A mile will be to her liking."


ART STILL ON COURSE Susan Roy and Cheveley Park Stud's **Dutch Art (GB)** (Medicean {GB}) will take his place in the line-up for the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, trainer Peter Chapple-Hyam confirmed yesterday. Despite losing his unbeaten tag when second in Saturday's G3 Greenham S. at Newbury, last year's G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. hero remains on course for the May 5 Classic. "He has come out of the Greenham fine," the trainer commented. "As I suggested beforehand, he'd need that race. I was happy with his exercise this morning, and I'm looking forward to running him in the 2000 Guineas."

DUBAI STARS SET FOR HONG KONG Japan's **Admire Moon (Jpn)** (End Sweep) and Hong Kong star **Vengeance of Rain (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), impressive winners at Nad al Sheba of the G1 Dubai Duty Free and G1

Dubai Sheema Classic, respectively, will face off in Sunday's G1 Aude-mars Piguet QE II Cup at Sha Tin. Admire Moon shipped to Hong Kong immediately after his Mar. 31 score. "He has travelled well from Dubai," trainer Hiroyoshi Matsuda said about the four-year-old. "He has been very settled since he arrived." Vengeance of Rain, winner of the QEII Cup in

2005, worked a half-mile yesterday, covering his final 400 meters in :22.9. Jockey Anthony Delpech was cautious about his mount's chances. "He worked well, but I don't think he's in quite the same form he was in before the race in Dubai," Delpech said. "He was at his best ever then, and that's why we were so confident. It's hard for any horse to maintain that level of form for long periods of time, so while he is still doing everything right he doesn't seem to have to be as brilliant as he can be. He seems to be more at the kind of level when he won the Gold Cup early in March."

At one point this year, Tiznow had several members of his second crop looking as if they might break out on the Triple Crown trail. Undefeated Tiz Wonderful had established himself as one of the potential leaders of his crop by defeating the highly regarded Any Given Saturday for the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. in November; on the West Coast, there was Liquidity, who had been beaten inches by Stormello in the GI Hollywood Futurity; Boutrous, winner of maiden and allowance events on his second and third starts; and Bob Baffert's promising maiden winner Tenfold.

One by one, however, the dominoes began to fall. In January came the news that Tiz Wonderful had rapped himself, injuring a right front tendon, and would be sidelined indefinitely. Liquidity kicked off the new year with a game second to the potentially top-class Ravel in the GIII Sham S., but although he remains pointed to the Derby, he has since finished sixth in the GII Louisiana Derby and fourth in the GI Santa Anita Derby. Boutrous began the campaign with a promising second in the California Derby, after not receiving the clearest of runs, but has since finished off the board in the GII Robert B. Lewis S. Tenfold opened his campaign with a second to Notional in the GII San Rafael S., but has not been seen under silks since his next race, another runner-up effort, this time to the well-thought-of Court the King, in an allowance race in early February.

In the meantime, another Tiznow colt, Slew's Tizzy, had been flying under the radar, not surprisingly, since his only two starts at two had seen him run unplaced in maiden events at Belmont and Turfway. He did break his maiden at Turfway first time out at three. In his next start, he hit the headlines, but not in the way his connections were hoping. The longest shot on the field for the GIII Risen Star S., Slew's Tizzy was moving well in fourth turning for home when he clipped the heels of the horse in front, throwing his jockey. At the time all the focus was on the horse immediately behind Slew's Tizzy at the time, the favorite, Circular Quay, who lost all chance when being virtually pulled up to avoid the incident.

After coming out of the Risen Star in good shape, Slew's Tizzy headed into the GII Louisiana Derby, but faded to seventh after pressing the pace in the early stages. Returning to action in Saturday's GII Coolmore Lexington S. with blinkers removed, Slew's Tizzy was once again a longshot. This time, however, he led from the start and, despite all the talk about the Keeneland Polytrack's closing bias which followed last week's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. and after turning back a challenge at the half, drew off to score by 3 1/2 lengths. Slew's Tizzy has now made the top 20 Derby entries by graded earnings, Slew's Tizzy's connections remain on the fence concerning the colt's participation in the Derby.

Slew's Tizzy's victory saw him join Tiz Wonderful and the Sunland Oaks heroine, Tough Tiz's Sister, as the third stakes winner and ninth stakes horse to appear from Tiznow's second crop. Of course in his first crop--which saw him carry off leading freshman honors--he was responsible for GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies heroine and two-year-old champion Folklore.

A homebred who represents the Joseph LaCombe Stable, Slew's Tizzy is the third foal and first winner for his dam, Hepatica. A winning daughter of Slewpy, Hepatica is out of Summer Dress, a mare who has spent the majority of her stud career on the West Coast. She has flourished there producing Best Dress, a Jacklin Klugman daughter who took the GIII Junior Miss S.; Best Dress's stakes-winning sister, Francie; Ginseng, a Saros filly who took the Santa Clara H.; and to the Kentucky sires Honest Pleasure and Wild Again, listed-placed Dresser and Mini Skirt. By the Gummo stallion Summer Time Guy, Summer Dress, who won twice, was a sister to the Hollywood Turf Express H. victor Summer Sale. She is also a half-sister to West Coast stakes winners Double Discount--successful in three graded stakes and runner-up in the GI Santa Anita Derby--and Chain Store. While so far been a California story, Chain Store has added an international dimension to the family. Her Blushing Groom daughter, Al Bahathri, captured the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas, and went on to produce three stakes winners, headed G1 English 2000 Guineas winner Haafhd, and Irish Highweight Hasbah. Chain Store is also dam of the multiple graded winner Geraldine's Store; English stakes winner Peplum (granddam of French group winner and Group 1-placed colt, Early March); Bloudan (dam of French group winner Radevor; granddam of French group winner Lateen Sales) and Chain Fern (dam of GI Yellow Ribbon S. victress Spanish Fern).

While Chain Store was the most prolific tap-root mare produced by her dam, General Store, we should also note General Store's Grade 1 placed daughter Fashion Book, the dam of two stakes winners in California; and her non-black-type daughters Mazda's Miracle, ancestress of several stakes winners, including the Grade 1 winning Mea Doma; and Foreign Store, the granddam of King of the Roxy, winner of the GII Futurity S. and GII Hutcheson S., and a close second in the GI Santa Anita Derby on his most recent start.

Hepatica's fourth dam, Cigar Maid, won the National Stallion S. and Fashion S., and is out of the imported French-bred mare, Never Again II, also the dam of Oil Capitol, a top-class son of Mahmoud who earned nearly \$600,000 while running in the early 50's, and ancestress--through a different branch--of Champion two-year-old filly Forward Gal and four-time Grade 1 winner Bien Bien.


Slew's Tizzy owns a rather interesting pedigree, as he is the product of the same cross as his own sire, since both he and Tiznow are out of mares by sons of Seattle Slew. This crossing back of a stallion back over his own broodmare sire line is one which seems to work quite well, an obvious example being the success of stallions bred on the Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross with Northern Dancer-line mares. Oddly enough, both the Seattle Slew horse involved here--Seattle Song, the broodmare sire of Tiznow and Slewpy, the broodmare sire of Slew's Tizzy--are examples of the same phenomenon. Seattle Slew is out of a mare by Poker, a grandson of Princequille, and both Seattle Song and Slewpy are out of mares by sons of Princequillo (and both the broodmare sires have second dams by Blue Larkspur). It's also worth noting

that Tiznow's Seattle Slew strain sits between 4x4 inbreeding to Northern Dancer, and it can often pay to duplicate a horse which sits between close inbreeding.

FROM THE DESK OF...

DATELINE: WESTERN AUSTRALIA

It's a huge and thirsty country, Australia. Various considered a continent or the world's largest island, its land mass is about the size of the 'Lower 48' states, or what is sometimes called the 'Continental U.S.' We spent three weeks in the lower Southwest quadrant of Western Australia, itself the largest state in Australia, roughly four times the size of Texas. So the area we covered is about the size of Texas, and is in fact the very southwest corner on the map of Australia.

It may have been only a small corner of the whole place, but it illustrates the impressive size and diversity you encounter. Mostly it was hot and dry, like the American Southwest, but with whole different sets of things like birds, animals, and trees. There is also a little pocket in the very southwest corner which is more like Northern California; Margaret River, for example, has become the most respected wine-growing region in Western Australia. It's a more temperate climate, with annual rainfall over 30 inches, compared to the low 20s in Perth, and only 10 in the vast bush and desert to the north and east.

With the exception of WA's southwest region, it is hot and dry, but with stunning scenery and literally thousands of miles of beaches and ocean frontage. Perth, with 1.2 million the biggest city west of Adelaide (nearly 1,500 miles to the East), is a real boom town now (oil and gas offshore to the northwest, and mining all over the state—iron ore, gold, nickel, silver, ect). There are homes with great views of the Indian Ocean for 60 miles north to south, roughly the same range as in the San Francisco Bay Area, if you measured from Richmond in the north to San Jose in the south. A huge building boom has shot house and land prices way up, to the point where it is markedly more expensive to buy a house in Perth than the same house would cost in Melbourne, Australia's 'second city.'


We were based with our friend Philip Day in the Swan Valley, in Perth's northeast suburbs. Here we saw quite a few kangaroos, as well as wild parrots that are just part of the normal bird life, along with laughing

kookaburra, which are from the kingfisher family and have a cry which literally sounds like they're laughing; that's pretty interesting to hear first thing in the morning. Then we spent a week on the far west coast of the Southwest, on Wyadup Road just below Yallingup, and above Cowaramup. In the language of what used to be called Aboriginals but now (since 'aboriginal' is a combination of Latin words) are collectively referred to as the 'native peoples,' 'up' meant 'a meeting place,' or 'place of water' (they were the same). I nearly drove my wife, Lou, crazy by practicing my 'ups' all the time as we were driving around that region, because the emphasis is always on the last syllable: yalling-UP, wyad-UP, cowaram-UP. You can imagine.

This filly out of Stylist Talent, who equalled a world record of :09 3/5 for her eighth of a mile breeze, topped the Keeneland 2YOs in Training Sale. Another MINESHAFT colt was the fourth highest price at \$500,000.

When we left Yalling-UP, we embarked on a spectacular six-day, 1,200-mile road trip which took us over 550 miles to the east, then 250 miles north, finally about 400 miles back west to Perth. We drove south

and east from the Indian Ocean, to Denmark, on the Southern Ocean. Near Denmark we went on an amazing, 800-meter (half-mile) Treetop Walk, through a forest of rare Red Tingle trees--but at up to 60 meters (180 feet) off the ground, thanks to a system of elevated walkways which are totally safe

(even has wheelchair access)--an incredible feat of engineering completed in 1996 at a cost of only about US\$1.5-million! On the other side of Denmark there is the Southern Ocean port city of Albany, now a fast-growing town of 30,000. There are some seriously big-time boulders all around this area, and outside Albany, on the ocean, is a formation called Natural Bridge (pictured), where two huge rocks about 50 feet across do form a sort of natural bridge, sculpted by the massive force of the ocean. If you look at the boulder on the right of the picture, that one is about 20 feet high. The boulders measure mighty big in Western Australia, and you duly feel small and insignificant, no doubt about that.

From Albany we drove east to Esperance, which had been discovered in 1792 by the French ship, L'Esperance. There are not a lot of stops between Albany and Esperance, another little boom town, with a population approaching 15,000, but the rainfall along that route is nearly in the 30-something range, and there is a lot of farming there, including cattle, sheep (merino), and cereals, mainly wheat and canola. Esperance itself has the most beautiful white sand beaches you can imagine, and is one of those charming, comfortable coastal places you'd love to stay, as long as you didn't need to get back to anywhere in a hurry. We also found, in Esperance, this year's nominee to our list of the World's Great Out-of-the-Way restaurants, which previously included the Plockton Hotel in Plockton (Scotland) and last year's nominee, Wedholm's Fisk Bar in Stockholm. This year's winner is the Loose Goose, in Esperance. Get the Esperance scallops as a starter, then maybe as a main course, too. I may never eat scallops again; they were unsurpassable.

Most of the trees in Western Australia are eucalypts (gum trees), including the massive Karri forests (Redwood size) just south of Margaret River, but when we left Esperance for Kalgoorlie, 250 miles to the north, most of what we saw along the way were what are called 'salmon gums,' because of the color of their bark.

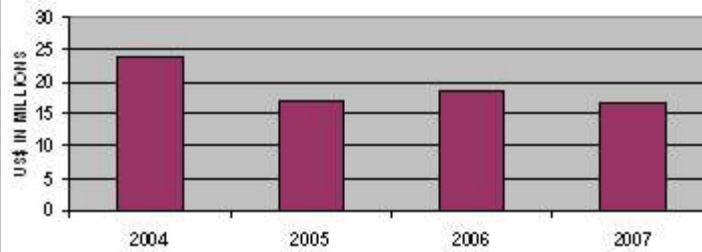

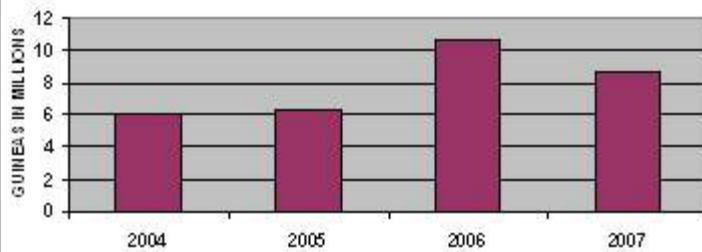

There's really not much between Esperance and Kalgoorlie. About halfway there you come to Norseman (named after a horse who kicked up a gold nugget in the street and founded the town), where you can turn right and 1,000 miles later get to Adelaide. But we continued north on another 'ribbon of highway,' in temperatures approaching 100 degrees Fahrenheit (pretty hot for the Southern Hemisphere equivalent of the middle of October). Along the way we did come to a little outpost with the engaging name of Widgiemooltha, but that was only a pit stop on the way to the mining town of Kalgoorlie.

Nearly 400 miles inland from Perth, gold has been mined in Kalgoorlie continuously since its discovery there in 1893. By the early 1900s, Kalgoorlie was a boom town, with a population over 25,000. Though its fortunes ebbed and flowed with the times, another rich vein of gold was discovered in 1931, with the result that Western Australia was less affected by the Great Depression than many other places. Today the vast mine known as the Super Pit (currently about 2 1/2 miles wide and a half-mile deep) yields one ounce of gold for every ton dug out of the ground; in the early days of Kalgoorlie, the yield was measured at 40 ounces per ton. They couldn't get through as many tons, though: the economy of scale used in mines the size of the Super Pit was unheard of little more than 20 years ago. They make a big deal of all the restoration work and replanting they are doing, and at least, if you're going to have holes in the ground of that size, the operators do seem to be at least conscious of environmental and community concerns--whether or not they are satisfying all those concerns.

Kalgoorlie is booming again, too. Its population is back up to 30,000, and there's a pistol-hot real estate market in building and selling, too--just like in virtually all the towns in Western Australia with populations of 10,000 or more. Many of the original 'frontier' facades have been restored, with contemporary improvements inside, and the town has two excellent mining museums, including one where tourists can go 120 feet down, escorted by ex-miners who can describe in detail the processes they had to use even 30 years ago (yep,

we did that). It's all very different today; huge Haulpak trucks hump 220 tons of rock each to the surface, one after another, so they can be sifted in hopes of finding a nugget or two of gold. Kalgoorlie itself was always a town with wide, spacious streets, so the camel trains and oxen could turn around in the early days. Combined with the restoration and development, it makes Kalgoorlie a rare example of a mining town which isn't a ghost town; quite the contrary. Then it was nearly another 400 miles back to Perth, following an amazing water line which was engineered nearly a hundred years ago back to its source, the Mundaring Weir, in the Perth Hills.

Lou worked in Western Australia 25 years ago and was last here in 1991. She observed a significant change in the population in the intervening years: that Western Australia had matured, that the people are more confident now, therefore had less of a chip on their collective shoulders. Ironically, to at least some extent this may be due to the opening up of Australia to Asia, and the movement of Australia into Asian markets, in the last 15 years; that's certainly been the case in the horse business. Boom times and prosperity, in general, certainly help in that way, too.

This year's agenda took me to the West while the Sydney Easter sales were taking place, but I'm edging closer. The storied Easter Yearling sale grossed A\$148 million (about US\$122-million), and additional weanling and broodmare sales, which ended late last week, took the total to almost A\$195-million (about US\$160-million). That's big money in anybody's hemisphere.

Finally, a note of thanks to our old pals, Alan and Juliet Bonnin, for generally organizing and looking after us so well, along with their great friends, Konrad Alter (Professor of Fishing) and his wife, Dace (pronounced 'Darcy') Tomsons. We very much appreciated all you did for us (except the Scrabble lessons) on what turned out to be a really interesting and very enjoyable trip. Western Australia: a long ways away, maybe, but well worth the trip. Highly recommended.

By the way, on the Scrabble front, Lou was adamant that 'mooz' is or was film industry tech-speak for a reverse zoom. Can anyone confirm, she asks?

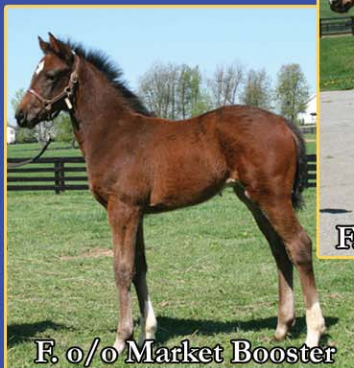

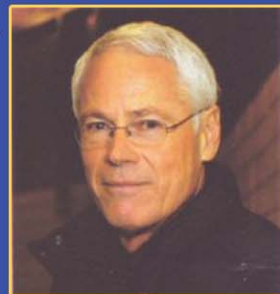

TRACKNET MEDIA RESPONDS TO YOBET In response to a release and teleconference by Youbet.com Monday concerning an impasse in its negotiations with TrackNet Media Group over account deposit wagering, Scott Daruty, chief executive officer of TrackNet Media Group, released the following statement: "Since its inception, TrackNet Media has sought broad distribution of its horse racing signals through a wide variety of wagering outlets and platforms, including ADW companies not affiliated with Churchill Downs Incorporated or Magna Entertainment Corp., the joint owners of TrackNet Media," said Daruty. "We believe ADW companies should differentiate themselves based on innovation, customer service, customer satisfaction and the quality of their wagering platform – not based on exclusive content agreements. Unfortunately, for almost a decade our industry, and the growth of ADW, has been encumbered by exclusive content arrangements held by Television Games Network. "In order to achieve our goal of broad distribution, TrackNet Media is seeking an agreement with TVG that would provide for a content exchange between TrackNet Media and TVG. Such an agreement would, subject to receiving appropriate horsemen and regulatory approvals, allow all responsible, regulated ADW companies to offer all major U.S. racing content. We strongly believe that such an arrangement is in the best interest of the race-tracks, horsemen and wagering public. We are awaiting a response to our proposal from TVG. "The Youbet management team is aware of the fact that we are seeking a content exchange agreement with TVG. Nevertheless, Youbet elected today to issue a public statement that mistakenly accuses officials from TrackNet Media and its joint owners of failing to keep their word to horsemen, customers and the industry as a whole. Youbet is the only large national ADW provider with a sublicense agreement in place allowing it to accept wagers on the TVG exclusive content on a going-forward basis. Youbet now seeks the right to accept wagers on TrackNet Media content as well – leaving Youbet as the only national provider able to offer its customers all major U.S. racing content. Such an arrangement would put all of Youbet's competitors, including TVG, AmericaTAB, XpressBet and the yet-to-launch TwinSpires account-wagering service at a disadvantage, and it would unfairly penalize customers of those ADW platforms who want access to a broad range of content. "We sincerely regret any inconvenience the present impasse between TrackNet Media and Youbet causes racing fans. However, we believe the ultimate solution we are trying to achieve is in the best long-term interest of the industry. To that end, TrackNet Media remains committed to its efforts to make all horse racing content available to all responsible, regulated ADW platforms on fair, market-based terms."

He was much better on the better ground at Leopardstown when winning the G3 2000 Guineas Trial and came on an awful lot for the run. He did what we were hoping he would do--he is a very good horse and is probably the second best three-year-old in Europe."

Ezima (Ire), f, 3, Sadler's Wells--Ezila (Ire), by Darshaan (GB)

"She will probably run in the Classic Trial at Gowran over a mile and a half, and I think it will be later in the season when she really blossoms. She is a very sound filly and I am hoping that she will go on the better ground as well."

**Finsceal Beo (Ire), f, 3, Mr. Greeley--Musical Treat (Ire),

"She is in terrific form. She is working very well and is well on target for the [May 6] G1 1000 Guineas. **Teofilo (Ire), c, 3, Galileo (Ire)--Speirbhean (Ire),
by Danehill**

"He was doing dressage during the winter and he loved that. I didn't have the bottle to let him out, but we just cut back on his grub a bit and gave him light exercise. His mind is very good and he is the complete package. He has everything. He is very well and well on target. He has come in his coat and is in top form. He is about where we want him to be at this point in time. I couldn't be happier with him. He will go straight to Newmarket for the [May 6] G1 2000 Guineas and we'll be looking for good ground there. Nobody with a good horse wants bullet ground. They last longer if they are racing on nice ground. We'll see how he gets on at Newmarket, but his target after that is the [June 2] G1 Epsom Derby, then The Curragh for the [July 1] G1 Irish Derby. He was fairly well furnished last year and at the moment he is 10 kilos heavier than when he won the Dewhurst. He is not a very muscular horse--he is just a big framed horse--he is more like a middle-distance runner." As for the setback, Bolger added, "My only concern is that the injury might reoccur or it might be the start of something more serious, but has been swimming for a week and is moving well. I think it was an over-extension injury, as he seemed sore at the back of his knee, but the soreness went after some time in the spa."

Of the two-year-olds, Bolger has high hopes for a team of nine fillies and four colts by Galileo. "They have all been broken and have done a nice bit of cantering and know how to do it," he explained. "They are all out on grass at the minute and, with the exception of **Solas Na Greine (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Key to Coocullen {Ire}, by Royal Academy), they won't be out until the second half of the season. There are five Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) fillies there and they all need a little bit of time. All the Rock of Gibraltors have prospects and go nicely." Among the juveniles mentioned are: the filly **Alycansayis Wow** (Street Cry {Ire}--Crown of Jewels, by Half a Year); **Ard Fheis (Ire)** (Lil's Boy--Affianced {Ire}, by Erins Isle {Ire}), a half-sister to Ballydoyle's G2 Prix Noailles winner Soldier of Fortune (Ire) and Heliostatic; **Luminaire (Ire)** (Green Desert--Luminata {Ire}, by Indian Ridge {Ire}); and **New Express (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Park Express {Ire}, by Ahonoora {GB}). Of the latter, he said, "He is a mid to back-end of the season type. He has a very good method, but just needs to furnish a bit. He is a real three-year-old type." Of the aforementioned Solas Na Greine, he commented, "She could run in five to six weeks time and seems to be a nice filly. She will get entries in all the better races." Teofilo's brother is named **Slaney Wave (Ire)**, but Bolger warned, "He won't be as early as Teofilo was, but he goes well." Also receiving favorable mention is **Toirneach** (Thunder Gulch--Wandering Pine, by Country Pine), a close relation to Spain. "She is another mid-summer filly that goes well," he said. Bolger has a close relative to Teofilo in **Via Galilei (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}--Manger Square {Ire}, by Danehill). "He moves like a horse with a lot of potential," he said.

COOLMORE ANNOUNCES AUSSIE FEES

Coolmore Australia has released its much-anticipated stallion fees with flagship sire **Encosta de Lago (Aus)** (Fairy King) increasing to A\$220,000 from the A\$176,000 he commanded in 2006, when he covered 231 mares. Encosta de Lago has enjoyed a stellar season on the racetrack and in the sale ring. He had 39 yearlings go under the hammer at the Inglis Easter Yearling Sale at an average of A\$644,487 and median of A\$600,000, with a top price of A\$2.2 million for a filly from Twyla (Aus) knocked down to leading buyer Woodlands Stud. On the racetrack Encosta de Lago has been represented by Group 1 NZ Oaks winner Princess Coup (Aus) among a squadron of sophomore stakes-performers, while two-year-olds to have earned black type this year including Cecconi (Aus), Press the Button (Aus), Moonboat (Aus), Perfect Persuasion (Aus), Encosta Don (Aus) and Familial (Aus). Encosta de Lago has covered books of more than 200 mares in Australia in each year since 2002, when his fee was a modest A\$12,500. He relocated from Victoria to Coolmore's Hunter Valley headquarters for the 2005 season, standing at a fee of A\$132,000. "There was a big demand for Encosta de Lago at the sales; he had a massive average and median increase and A\$220,000 is a genuine, realistic fee for a stallion of his calibre," said Coolmore Australia General Manager Michael Kirwan. "He is a very, very good sire--he produces very appealing sales horses and they race at two, three, and beyond. While Coolmore has added Danehill trio **Holy Roman Emperor (Ire)** (A\$44,000), **Aussie Rules** (A\$22,000) and **Ivan Denisovich (Ire)** (A\$11,000) to its 17-strong roster, two notable omissions are Galileo (Ire) and Footstepsinthesand (Ire), who stood two seasons in Australia at a fee of A\$22,000. Kirwan said Footstepsinthesand would stand the Southern Hemisphere season in South America. Galileo (Ire) is the sire of champion two-year-old and warm ante-post Guineas favourite Teofilo (Ire), who won the G1 National S. and the G1 Dewhurst S. while denying Coolmore's newly retired sire Holy Roman Emperor in both contests. The son of Sadler's Wells is among the most sought after sires in the Northern Hemisphere at a fee of €150,000 after enjoying a superb 2006 season, with Group 1 winners Red Rocks (Ire), Sixties Icon (Ire) and Nighttime (Ire) in addition to Teofilo. "Galileo is in big demand in the Northern Hemisphere and we decided maybe it was time for him to take a short rest, but he may well return in the future," said Kirwan.

Another sire whose fee has increased considerably is Danehill Dancer (Ire), who will stand for A\$110,000--double the fee that he commanded covering 98 mares last spring. "He is a very good son of Danehill; he has had a great season in the Northern Hemisphere and down here, too," said Kirwan. "He's doing very well--very few get champions, and he has Choisir and Private Steer." Kirwan added that his book would again be strictly limited. In 2006, G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Miss Beatrix (Ire) and G1 1000 Guineas heroine Speciosa (Ire) led the way for Danehill Dancer in Europe, while his black-type juveniles in Australia this season--including Downhill Racer (Aus), Patasi (Aus) and Shrewd Rhythm (Aus)--have not gone unnoticed. Danehill Dancer's son Choisir (Aus), at A\$33,000, is up slightly from A\$30,250 for his fifth season. He covered 175 mares last spring. "Choisir is currently the leading first-crop sire in the Southern Hemisphere and Europe, so we're very excited about his prospects," said Kirwin.

GET SQUARE TO WATTLE BRAE Wattle Brae Stud has announced that Group 3 winner **Get Square (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}--Let's Get Even, by Thunder Gulch) will enter stud at the Queensland nursery this spring. His fee will be A\$6,600 (inc. GST). The deal was brokered by Magic Millions. Acquired as a yearling for A\$500,000, the bay from the family of GISW Stephen Got Even won two of seven starts, topped by the G3 AAMI Norman Robinson S. last season. "Get Square will appeal to breeders in Queensland and across the country," said Wattle Brae's Gary Turkington. "He is a great-looking stallion and he has a first-class pedigree." Paul Makin purchased the colt privately after he began racing. "After his excellent [fifth] in the [G1 VRC] Derby, I thought Get Square was the ideal horse to purchase and campaign internationally, as I did Starcraft (NZ)," Makin said. "Unfortunately, things didn't go to plan and he was injured, and I elected to retire him to stud."
