NOBIZ STEP CLOSER TO DERBY DATE

GI Wood Memorial S. winner **Nobiz Like Shobiz** (Albert the Great), who worked five furlongs at Belmont Park on Monday, continues to impress connections as he prepares for the May 5 GI Kentucky Derby. The colt was credited with a time of :59.59. "He worked very good," jockey Cornelio Velasquez said after the work. "I had a strong hold of him, he relaxed and he stayed straight." Trainer Barclay Tagg, mapping out his charge's path to the Derby, said, "We'll work him once more at Belmont before shipping to the Derby. The last plane out is Wednesday. That's about three days earlier than I'd like to go."

BOLGER PAIR HEAD GUINEAS LISTS

Jim Bolger's unbeaten **Teofilo (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) yesterday headed the 38 remaining entries in the £350,000 G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 5, while Michael Ryan's **Finsceal Beo (Ire)** (Mr. Greeley) featured among the 32 fillies left in the following day's £350,000 G1 1000 Guineas. Both hail from Bolger's Coolcullen base and the former will bid to confirm the placings of the G1 Dewhurst S. with Sultan Ahmad Shah's G2 July S. and G2 Vintage S. winner **Strategic Prince (GB)** (Dansili {GB}), Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Haatef** (Danzig), Fasthandle Ltd's G2 Champagne S. scorer **Vital Equine (Ire)** (Danetime {Ire}) and Derrick Smith, Michael Tabor and Susan Magnier's **Adagio (GB)** (Grand Lodge), who finished third, fourth, fifth and seventh, respectively. Sir Michael Stoute saddled the last named to take the G3 Craven S. at Newmarket on Thursday and he is one of a host of Coolmore interests remaining. Among others who could be running under the Magnier-Tabor-Smith banner are the Aidan O'Brien-trained G1 Criterium International winner **Mount Nelson (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) and **Duke of Marmalade (Ire)** (Danehill), not seen since finishing runner-up to Strategic Prince in the Vintage in August, while Tabor and Joseph Allen's Listed Prix Djebel winner **US Ranger** (Danzig) is likely to be supplemented by conditioner Jean-Claude Rouget on Monday.

BEWITCHING QUEEN

Heavily favored **Safari Queen (Arg)** (Lode) caused her backers no anxious moments with a confident two-length victory in yesterday's GIII Bewitch S. at Keeneland. The five-year-old mare, a multiple Group 1 winner in her native Argentina, was looking for her fourth U.S. graded victory after wins in last year's GII Long Island H. and GII La Prevoyante H. Second in the Feb. 25 GIII The Very One H. to begin 2007, Safari Queen returned to the winner's circle with a 1 1/2-length triumph last time out in the Mar. 31 GIII Orchid H. Sent off the 2-5 favorite yesterday, Safari Queen rated easily in fourth before angling out three

took charge with a quarter-mile to run and pulled clear for the win. The victory was Safari Queen's fourth win in her last five starts at 1 3/8 miles to 1 1/2 miles. "That's where we really found her niche," winning trainer Todd Pletcher said. "She was a nice filly before that, but once we stretched her out to a mile and three-eighths and a mile and a half, that's been her game."

Jockey John Velazquez was happy with Safari Queen's effort yesterday. "She let herself rate very well on the backstretch," he said. "Since she broke from the outside, I didn't want to be caught wide the whole way. She broke well enough that she dropped inside and we saved ground. When we went into the second turn, she was closing up and I let her do her own thing. From then on, she did it pretty free and easy." As for his charge's next target, trainer Todd Pletcher said, "We might get a little freshening here. Cara Rafaela is the dam of last year's Eclipse champion three-year-old Bernardini. Darley received the P.A.B. Widener Award Trophy, KTOB's top breeder award. The Kentucky Thoroughbred Development Fund Award winners honored for 2006 are: Ashford Stud's **Grand Slam**, for leading sire; KTDF Leading Earner **Very Vegas**; KTDF Leading Trainer Dale Romans; and KTDF Owner and Breeder Overbrook Farm. Edward Bowen received the Charles W Englehard Award, given to a member of the media in recognition of his service to the Thoroughbred industry. William Fishback and Carter Thornton were honored as the 2006 Hardboot Breeders. State Senator Damon Thayer was honored by the KTOB for his leadership in getting the Breeding Incentive Fund passed in HB272.

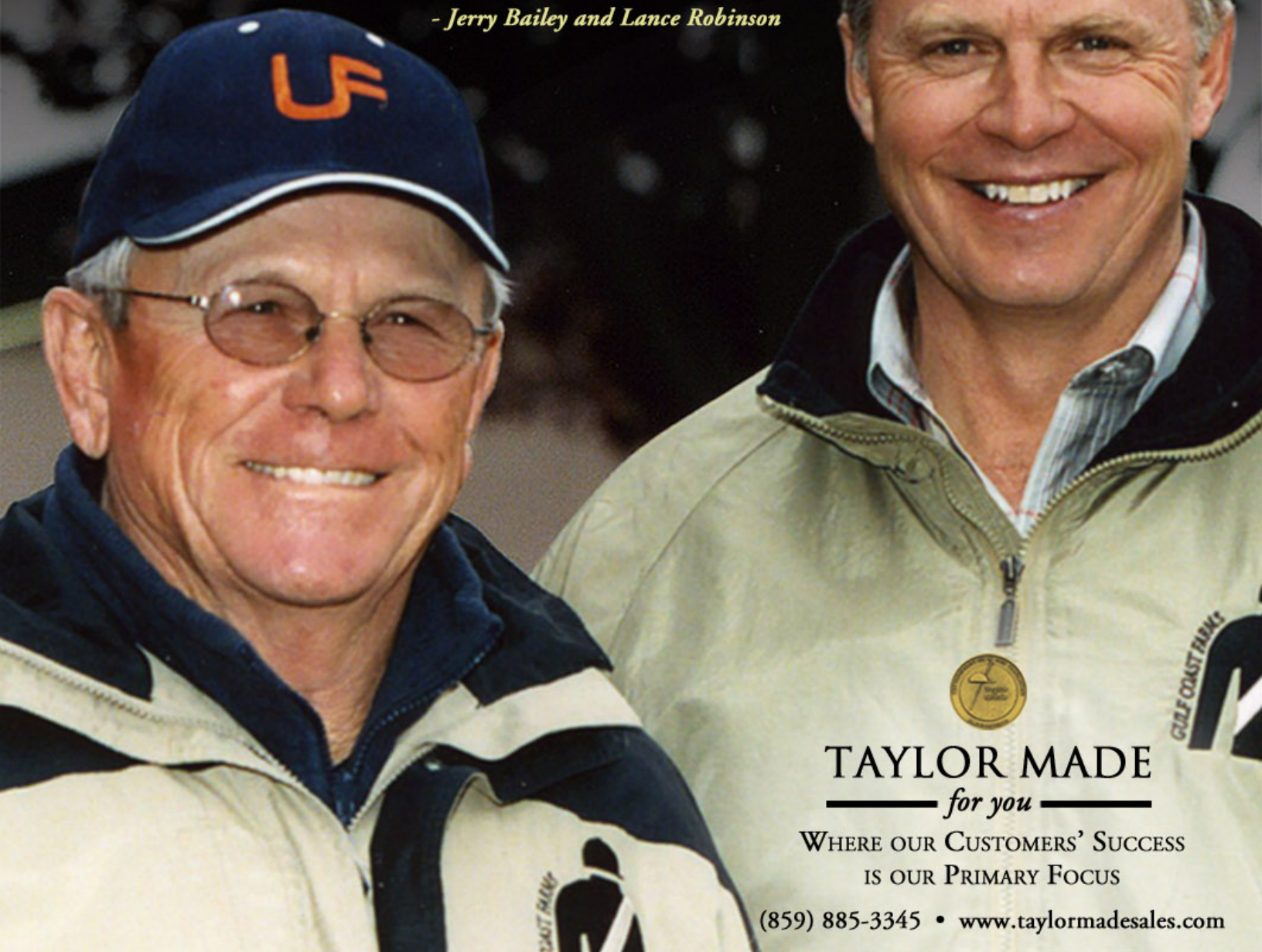

HOOK AND LADDER COLT TOPS OBS

WEDNESDAY A colt from the first crop of multiple graded stakes winner Hook and Ladder (Dixieland Band) topped yesterday's second session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Spring Sale of Two-Year-Olds in Training. The juvenile was consigned by Ricky Leppala, Inc., Agent II, and was purchased for \$260,000 by agent James Ventura. The dark bay colt, who worked a quarter mile in :22 at the Under Tack Show, is out of Expensive Tap (Pleasant Tap), a half sister to graded stakes winner Costly Shoes. During yesterday's session of the four-day sale, OBS sold 210 two-year-olds for a total of \$5,751,700. The session average was \$27,389--down 21.1 percent from 2006--while the median remained constant at \$19,000. The sale continues this morning at 10:30 a.m.

CAPITAL PLAY PARTNERS WITH PLAINFIELD

Capital Play, Inc., one of four companies bidding for the franchise currently held by the New York Racing Association, has joined in partnership with Plainfield Asset Management LLC, to “create a fully funded bid team with existing investments in New York racing,” according to a press release. Plainfield has committed to provide the full \$250 million in equity financing for Capital Play’s proposal for its bid for the franchise. Plainfield also is invested in the New York tracks Vernon Downs and Tioga Downs. Max Holmes, founder of Plainfield, said, “We are very impressed with the Capital Play team and their proposal for the rejuvenation of the New York thoroughbred racetracks. We already have a significant investment in New York racetracks and believe that Capital Play has the vision and plan for transforming New York’s Thoroughbred racetracks. We expect to eventually syndicate a portion of our risk to other institutional investors, but at this critical juncture, we wanted Capital Play to have the highest assurance of both equity funding and ultimate licensing.”

RCI PANEL DISCUSSES IDEAS FOR RACEHORSE SAFETY

Emphatic calls for change in dealing with horse racing injuries and related prevention methods were made Apr. 24 during a panel discussion at the annual Association of Racing Commissioners International Conference in Jackson Hole, Wyo. North American regulators in attendance at a Snake River Lodge & Spa conference center heard TOBA chairman Bill Casner make a passionate speech lobbying for the banning of toe grabs, an update by Florida veterinarian Dr. Mary Scollay on a fledgling racetrack injury reporting database, and pleas for standardization in racetrack surface certification by Dr. M.L. “Mick” Peterson. Casner, who is also the co-owner of WinStar Farm, said the only solution for the inordinate amount of catastrophic injuries connected to toe grabs is to outlaw that particular horseshoe variation. “To me, the solution is simple, and I think most of the top trainers have already realized this,” said Casner, who cited research which shows toe grabs are evident in 90 percent of all catastrophic injuries. Scollay said 23 tracks are now on board to provide injury data for a standardized national database she will manage, a project that was first discussed at the “Welfare and Safety of the Racehorse Summit” held last October. The official launch date is June 1, and the racetrack vet is looking both for funding and additional tracks to jump on board. She said an analysis of national data might be available in about six months, but won’t include released data on individual tracks. [Click for the complete story.](#)

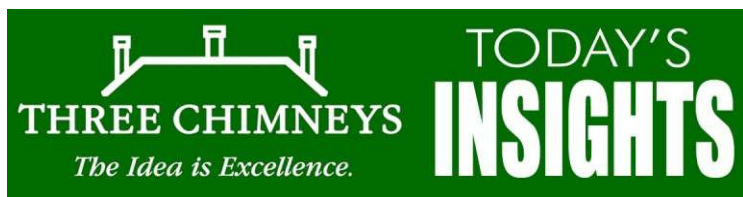

NIOSH to Investigate Racing Safety

The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH), part of the Department of Health and Human Services, will review health and safety issues for horse racing and industry "best practices" during a May 22 meeting to be held in Arlington, Va.

The meeting stems from hearings held by the House Energy and Commerce Committee's Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations (O&I) to examine the activities of the Jockeys' Guild as well as insurance and safety matters. Then-subcommittee chairman Ed Whitfield (R-KY) and then-ranking member Bart Stupak (D-MI) had requested that the department investigate safety conditions at U.S. race tracks.

Rep. Stupak now chairs the O&I Committee, with Rep. Whitfield the ranking member. The Energy and Commerce Committee has jurisdiction on the Interstate Horseracing Act.

The hearing is expected to cover racetrack safety, nutrition and eating disorders among jockeys, and riders' exposure to lead from saddle weights, among other issues.
