ROCK ON

After his disappointing seasonal debut in Dubai, J Paul Reddam's **Red Rocks (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) got back on track yesterday defying a seven-pound penalty in Sandown's G3 Gordon Richards S. Only ninth in the Mar. 31 G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba, jockey Frankie Dettori made no mistake as he steered the 11-4 second favorite to a two-length success from **Mashaahed (GB)** (In the Wings {GB}). "Things didn't work out in Dubai, where there was a lack of pace, but he came back so well and got a solid pace today," trainer Brian Meehan said of last year's GI Breeders' Cup Turf hero. "This was a pretty decent race with top horses, so it's a big relief." **Cont. p2**

A SURE THING AT KEENELAND

Bidding for his second straight score on the Keeneland turf, **Ascertain (Ire)** (Intikhab) held off **Always First (GB)** (Barathea {Ire}) to take the GIII Fifth Third Elkhorn S. by a neck yesterday. The chestnut gelding settled in second for 10 panels before forging to the front in the stretch. BOB AND JOHN RETURNS AT LONE STAR

GI Wood Memorial S. winner **Bob and John** (Seeking the Gold) makes his four-year-old bow in the GIII Texas Mile S. at Lone Star Park today. The dark bay, 17th in the GI Kentucky Derby and eighth in the GI Belmont S., has not been out since finishing second in the El Cajon S. at Del Mar Sept. 2. He has been working steadily for his return, with a mile work in 1:37 2/5 at Santa Anita Apr. 4 and a bullet half in :46 2/5 Apr. 10. He prepped for this with a five-eighths move in 1:01 2/5 at Hollywood Apr. 23. "He's ready," trainer Bob Baffert said. "I thought this would be the logical spot to bring him back because he's been training well and he ships extremely well." Baffert won this race with Preachinattthebar last year. Bob and John, has a record of 12-4-2-3 and earnings of \$701,330 to date. **Texas Mile Field, p4**

O'Neill Trio Work at Keeneland...

Trainer Doug O'Neill worked his trio of GI Kentucky Derby candidates at Keeneland yesterday. All three were sent out for six-furlong moves, with **Liquidity** (Tiznow) clocking the distance in 1:11 3/5, **Cobalt Blue** (Golden Missile) getting it in 1:11 4/5 and **Great Hunter** (Aptitude) going in 1:13. Exercise rider Tony Romero was in the irons for each work. "With Cobalt Blue and Liquidity coming off mediocre races, we were looking for them to show interest early and late in the work, and we saw that today," O'Neill said. "We saw what we were hoping to see and, again, credit to Tony, who has an amazing clock in his head." Cobalt Blue was seventh in the Apr. 7 GII Illinois Derby in his latest, and Liquidity was fourth in the Apr. 7 GI Santa Anita Derby. Great Hunter was fifth in the Apr. 14 GI Blue Grass S. The O'Neill contingent will head to Churchill Sunday afternoon. **Videos, p7**

Ascertain went to the shelf after finishing third by a neck in the July 2 GIII Stars and Stripes BC H. at Arlington. He made his return in the Mar. 17 Tejano Run S. at Turfway, finishing fifth on the Polytrack, but got back on track with a Keeneland grass allowance score Apr. 7. "He's had some problems over the years, but he's never been better," trainer Niall O'Callaghan said. The winner goes next in the June 9 GI Manhattan H. Trainer Kiaran McLaughlin, explaining Jazil's poor effort, said, "The turf was yielding and, since it was the last day of the meet, it was pretty chewed up. But he just didn't run well. If he'd liked it, it would have given us more options. But we'll probably go back to the dirt."

Red Rocks did not look back after opening his stakes account in the Listed Fairway S. at Newmarket last May. He finished at the bottom of the exacta in Royal Ascot's G2 King Edward VII S. in June, the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp the following month and the G2 Great Voltigeur S. at York in August. Third in the G1 St Leger back at that track in September, the bay shook off his nearly tag with a fluent success at Churchill Downs and connections blamed the tepid fractions for his no-show in the desert on his four-year-old return. With pace not an issue here, Dettori dropped the anchor in rear early to reserve energy for the final uphill climb. Taken widest of all at the top of the straight, Red Rocks produced a sustained run to lead approaching the eighth pole and asserted on the run to the line. "The key with him is a decent pace and that was a tremendous performance giving seven pounds to the other horses," Dettori said. "He is one of the best turf horses in the world and he had plenty of excuses for his Dubai run. I have made the running on him in the past, so he's quite versatile." Meehan is considering either the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup at The Curragh May 27 or G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 20. "The big target is the Breeders' Cup at the end of the year, so we'll work back from there," Meehan explained. **Click for the [racingpost.co.uk](http://www.racingpost.co.uk) chart.**

Fifth in the GIII Fair Grounds BC H. in January, he was beaten a head when third in the Mar. 4 GI Kilroe H. and has not been out since running second behind Silent Name (Jpn) in the GII Arcadia H. 387 days ago. He is four-for-eight at a mile. **Sound Breeze** capped a four-race winning streak with a 1 3/4-length victory in a handicap race at Nottingham in October, then disappeared for more than 17 months. The chestnut made his U.S. bow in a Santa Anita allowance Mar. 31 and missed by just a nose, finishing second after setting the pace.

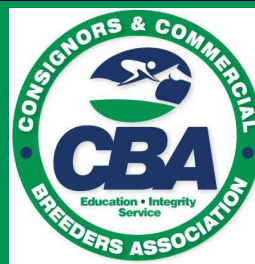

Jeremy and **Final Verse** bid to provide Sir Michael Stoute with his second renewal after Rob Roy, who collected this 12 months ago. While Final Verse has a run on the board this term, having finished third behind Manduro (Ger) in last Thursday's G3 Earl of Sefton S. at Newmarket, Jeremy has to prove his fitness on his four-year-old bow. Impressive when winning the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot in June, the flashy bay followed that effort with a sixth in Goodwood's G2 Lennox S. in early August before finishing runner-up in the G2 Hungerford S. at Newbury later that month. MIESQUE'S APPROVAL TO SOUTH AFRICA Live Oak Stud's reigning turf champion **Miesque's Approval** (Miesque's Son--Win Approval, by With Approval) has been sold to South African interests Kwazulu Natal Breeders' Club and Scott Bros Highdown Stud and will stand the 2007 breeding season at the latter for a fee of R50,000 (\$7,100), it was announced yesterday. "We are very happy to see Miesque's Approval go to a farm that truly appreciates all of his accomplishments," Live Oak Stud's General Manager John Rasmussen said. "We will retain Northern Hemisphere breeding rights to the horse and we wish them the best of luck." Last season's GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner was retired shortly after an unplaced effort in the G1 Dubai Duty Free H. Mar. 31. "He was one of the toughest, soundest and most durable performers in the modern era," Des Scott of Scott Bros Highdown Stud offered. "We're privileged to have him and were oversubscribed for shares."

TOP FLIGHT DQ REVERSED According to the *Daily Racing Form*, the New York State Racing and Wagering Board has reversed the disqualification that moved Gallagher Stud's **Rahy's Appeal** (Rahy) from first to second in the Nov. 24 GII Top Flight H. at Aqueduct. The bay mare crossed the wire three lengths in front of **Malibu Mint** (Malibu Moon), but was demoted because her jockey, Alan Garcia, had accidentally struck Malibu Mint in the face with his whip during the stretch drive. But a review of the rules revealed that a horse should only be disqualified if the jockey willfully struck his rival. Immediately following the race, the New York stewards ruled that, while they did not feel the use of the whip was intentional, they did feel it affected the outcome and placed Rahy's Appeal second. But the NYSRWB overturned that decision during a meeting Thursday. "The board agrees there was no dispute that the whip of Rahy's Appeal struck Malibu Mint, but there is no rule that allows for a penalty or disqualification like the one imposed based on the careless use of the whip, only the willful use of the whip," NYSRWB spokesman Dan Toomey told *DRF*.


PESLIER TO RIDE REBEL Olivier Peslier has been booked to partner Phil Cunningham's **Cockney Rebel (Ire)** (Val Royal {Fr}) in next Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket. Trainer Geoff Huffer has arranged for Peslier to ride work on last year's G2 Champagne S. third-place finisher ahead of the mile Classic. "He's a straightforward horse, but it is always nice to unite them before the big day," Huffer told the *Racing Post*. "Olivier Peslier is a world-class jockey and I am happy to have secured his services."

SWING BACK John Oxx has issued an upbeat bulletin regarding Pat Garvey's **Arch Swing** (Arch) ahead of next Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. Having been

found to have a temperature after her success in the Apr. 7 G3 Leopardstown 1000 Guineas Trial, Oxx reported her to be pleasing returned to fast work. "She's back in good form and in work," Oxx told *PA Sport*. "We've been happy with her this week, so her chances of running in the Guineas have certainly improved dramatically. But we will have to see how she takes her work, what effect it has on her, work her again next week and see how she goes on from one bit to the next. I would say she has at least a 50-50 chance of running in the Guineas, maybe a little better than that. We just have to see what effect getting her back into fast work has had on her. We will work her on Tuesday and see how she is the next day. I would say we will be in a position to make a decision on Wednesday."

Regulators Pass Model Rule on Steroids:

Regulators attending the Association of Racing Commissioners International annual conference Apr. 26 approved a number of model rules, including the prohibition in horses of nearly all anabolic steroid use. The proposed anabolic steroid policy, along with other model rules featuring bans against toe grab horseshoes and the adoption of safety reins for jockeys, were debated and passed during the morning general assembly session at the Snake River Lodge & Spa in Jackson Hole, Wyoming. "I think RCI is more important and relevant than ever in history," said new chairman Peter C. Burnett, the executive director of the Virginia Racing Commission, in his address to assembled regulators. "Racing needs to speak in a unified voice to the public. I hope we can turn talk into reality." Lending a loud voice of realism to the conference was guest speaker Bill Casner, chairman of the Thoroughbred Owners and Breeders Association and co-owner of WinStar Farm. Casner earlier in the week passionately delivered a planned presentation outlining the hazards of toe grabs, and then interjected himself into a lively debate on the steroid issue prior to the model rule passage. "I know that I am not part of the voting process, but I am an owner and the racing world is under a microscope," Casner said, noting similar steroid focus on other sports, such as baseball. "I think it is imperative to take a stand on this. We need this rule in place, and I am asking you to step up, be brave, and take a leadership stand on this." The adoption motion was then passed almost unanimously, despite concerns expressed by some on the scientific standards use on four allowed limited-use anabolics--stanozolol, boldenone, nandrolone and testosterone. **For the complete story, click [here](#).**
