A VERY SENSIBLE FINAL WORK

Champion **Street Sense** (Street Cry {Ire}) turned in his final workout for Saturday's GI Kentucky Derby, stopping the clock in 1:01 for a five-furlong breeze at Churchill yesterday. With jockey Calvin Borel in the irons, the GI Blue Grass S. runner-up was timed in fractions of :13.60, :26, :38, :49.80 and galloped out six furlongs in 1:13. The five-furlong move was the fifth fastest out of 22 workouts at the distance. "The work was good," trainer Carl Nafzger said. "Everybody saw it. He got his first quarter in :26 and picked it up and galloped out. That's him. If we had slowed him down, we'd have gone too slow. He wanted to have fun and we let him. We'd have really messed him up if I had told Calvin 'now don't let him run down the lane.' He wants to do this. He loves to do what he is doing."

COBALT BLUE OUT; TEUFLESBERG IN

Cobalt Blue (Golden Missile), last seen finishing seventh in the GI Illinois Derby Apr. 7, will not be entered in the GI Kentucky Derby, his connections announced yesterday. "The horse is doing great," trainer Doug O'Neill said. "I talked to [owner] Merv [Griffin] and he thought it was in the best interest of the horse not to tax him 1 1/4 miles. So we're going to slow it down, go back to California and look for a race." With Cobalt Blue's defection, **Teuflesberg** (Johannesburg) has now earned a spot in the gate on the first Saturday in May. "Doug O'Neill's our hero," said co-owner Donnie Kelly.

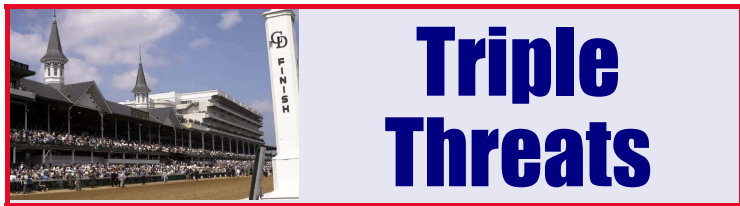

No Derby For Xchanger...

Xchanger (Exchange Rate), winner of the Federico Tesio S. last time Apr. 21, has been withdrawn from the GI Kentucky Derby, trainer Mark Shuman announced Tuesday. "In the best interest of the horse and us, we've decided to look at the Preakness," Shuman told *the Blood-Horse*. "I've said all along that the reason we would go to the Derby is if the horse sold to someone who was buying him to go there. There were some offers and a substantial amount of money involved, and if we hadn't explored all of our options, we would have been crazy. But it wouldn't be fair to the horse or the new owners to rush in there. We're all very comfortable with the decision."

Imawildandcrazyguy Takes Xchanger's Spot...

Imawildandcrazyguy (Wild Event), sixth in the GI Florida Derby most recently Mar. 31, has entered the Derby picture with the defection of Xchanger. "We are officially running," trainer William Kaplan said. "The owners are ecstatic. It's been a harrowing, nervous time, but we're happy now. The owners have been dreaming about this."

REBEL REBEL EUTHANIZED Rebel Rebel

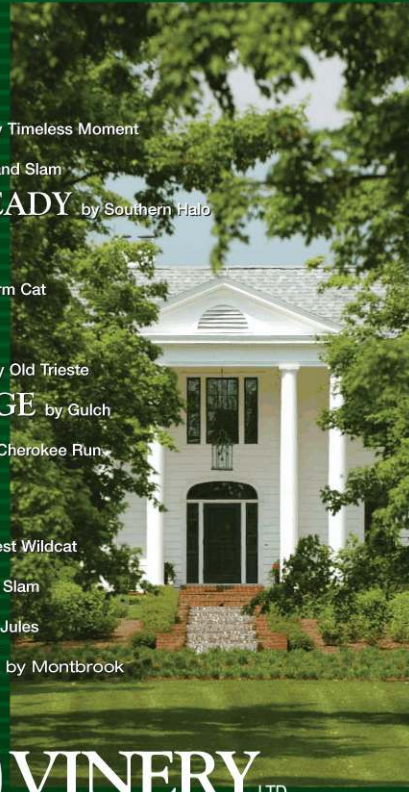
(Revoque {Ire}--French Quarter {Ire}, by Ile de Bourbon), last season's GIII Poker H. winner and GI Woodbine Mile runner-up, was euthanized in early April after suffering a condylar fracture to his right front cannon bone in an unplaced finish in the G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Mile in December. The IEAH Stables colorbearer was kept under the care of Dr. Chris Riggs at the Hong Kong Jockey Club's Equine Hospital following his eighth-place finish in the Mile. "This was terribly tough on everyone involved, especially since our experience in Hong Kong was such a thrill, even though he ran eighth that day," said Michael Iavarone, co-president of IEAH Stables. "It really stings because he had been in Hong Kong since December and it'd been such an up-and-down battle. He was a great competitor on the track, and following his injury, he showed a great will to live and fought for his life to the very end. Rebel Rebel was one of our best runners and he'll be missed in the stable." Rebel Rebel, runner-up in the 2005 G1 2000 Guineas S., won five of 22 lifetime starts and bankrolled \$606,554 in earnings.

Teofilo Flying...

Jim Bolger has reported **Teofilo (Ire)** (Galileo {Ire}) firmly back on course for Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket after working sharply over the weekend. Last year's G1 National S. and G1 Dewhurst S. winner appears to have put the recent injury setback behind him, and came through Saturday's gallop without any problems. "I'm very happy with him," the conditioner told *Racing Post*. "He worked exceptionally well on Saturday morning for Kevin Manning over 6 1/2 furlongs on our wood-chip gallop, on which we do most of our work. Until he has a couple of weeks behind him and is well and truly out of it you never know, but it's a case of so far, so good with him." Bolger also revealed that Teofilo will be joined in the mile Classic by maiden **Slaney Time (Ire)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}), who set the pace for his stable companion in the National S. last term. David Moran has the mount aboard the colt.

Robinson Sweet on Tobosa...

Jockey Philip Robinson is hoping that **Tobosa (GB)** (Tobougg {Ire}) will prove better than his likely long odds in the G1 2000 Guineas. Having ridden the Listed European Free H. runner-up for the first time in a spin yesterday, he issued a positive bulletin on the Willie Jarvis-trained colt. "I was very impressed with him and he's in tremendous form," Robinson said. "He is stepping up, but he loves Newmarket and was a bit unlucky there last time. I wouldn't be surprised if he gives them a run for their money." Robinson believes the likelihood of a large field could see the runners split into groups as witnessed in 2002, when Hawk Wing was beaten by Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) on the other side of the track. "If there is a big field, there's a great chance they'll split and a lot will depend on the draw then," he added. "There are going to be a lot of hard-luck stories, and you've got to get the run of the race."

Hopes High for Haatef...

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum's **Haatef** (Danzig) received a vote of confidence from connections ahead of the 2000 Guineas. The homebred has not faced the starter since finishing fourth behind Teofilo (Ire), beaten three lengths, in the G1 Dewhurst S. over Newmarket's seven furlongs in October. Trainer Kevin Prendergast is hoping he can bridge the gap. "He's a pretty good colt and we think he'll better his current rating by quite a lot his year," Prendergast commented. "I think he's improved as much as he was beaten [in the Dewhurst], but Teofilo could have improved as well. I shouldn't think the mile will be a problem, as he has a very relaxed way of going, and we think he'll handle the fast ground well."

Ink Spot-On...

Richard Hannon was in a confident mood yesterday ahead of saddling Raymond Tooth's **Indian Ink (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) in Sunday's G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket. Last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine was runner-up to Majestic Roi in the G3 Fred Darling S. at Newbury Apr. 21, and her conditioner is expecting a bold show from the chestnut. "She's been working beautifully and is a lovely filly," Hannon said. "What beats her will win, I think, as she's a very high-class filly. The Newbury trial was very good, and we had to weave our way through a bit. The two of them [Majestic Roi and Indian Ink] went to the line and were quickening good, so I think it was a good trial."

Wells Straight to Epsom...

Kevin Prendergast confirmed yesterday that Iona Equine Syndicate's **Mores Wells (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) will be trained up to the June 2 G1 Epsom Derby without a further prep run. Successful in the G3 Ballysax S. at Leopardstown Apr. 22, the bay colt was reported to be in good order. "He won the Ballysax well and he's not a horse that takes an awful lot of getting ready," Prendergast explained. "He can only improve for going another couple of furlongs, as his dam [Endorsement {GB}] won the [G3] Queen's Vase at Royal Ascot. He's progressing well from the run and, hopefully, we'll arrive at Epsom fit and well and give it our best shot."

Nelson Doubts...

Derrick Smith's **Mount Nelson (GB)** (Rock of Gibraltar {Ire}) may sidestep Saturday's G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket, Aidan O'Brien warned yesterday. After working his Classic quartet at Ballydoyle yesterday morning, the conditioner admitted that last year's G1 Criterium International winner may have been brought along too quickly this season. "All four horses worked this morning, but Mount Nelson didn't blow off as much as the others, so we'll have to see how things go with him over the next few days," O'Brien explained to *Racing Post*. "It's very possible he might not run as all the ticks have to be in the right boxes going to the Guineas." After the unplanned retirement of Holy Roman Emperor (Ire), O'Brien had been forced to look elsewhere for Guineas contenders, and now feels that Mount Nelson may have suffered for the tight timetable ahead of the Classics. "We had to rattle a lot of cages when Holy Roman Emperor went off, and maybe we've probably rushed him a bit recently and [Mount Nelson] needs to be left off for a while," he added.

Racinger endured a winless 2006 campaign, but posted a breakthrough score in the Apr. 2 G3 Prix Edmond Blanc over course and distance on seasonal return last time. Stepping up on that in this career high, he wired the field under a tactically astute ride by Frankie Dettori to lead home a carbon copy of the Edmond Blanc trifecta. Taking control after breaking on level terms, Dettori maintained a uniform pace into the straight. He urged his mount forward when pressed with 300 meters remaining and the pair required negligible force to hold the persistent bid of Turtle Bowl. "After he won the Edmond Blanc, I said this horse had taken time to mature even though he ran some fine races in defeat last year," explained winning trainer Freddy Head. Vadapolina, second in a one-mile conditions race at Longchamp last September, was pitched into the Oct. 17 G3 Prix des Reservoirs for her only other juvenile start at Deauville and finished a respectable fourth. Returning to Longchamp for her seasonal bow Apr. 8, she tore apart a hot conditions event, which included **Terra Incognita**, and repeated the dose with this hugely impressive display to book her ticket to the June 10 G1 Prix de Diane at Chantilly. Handily placed in third until turning for home, the chestnut eased to the front at the quarter-mile marker, quickly established daylight and cruised to the wire in hand for a first pattern win. Much of the focus this weekend was on the final works of the Derby hopefuls. However, Saturday revealed a colt who won't be at Churchill Downs next weekend, but could well be a force in the three-year-old ranks later on this season.

The colt in question is Divine Park, who didn't make his debut until Feb. 10 this year, but took his record to three-for-three with a 3 1/2-length score in the GIII Withers S. at Aqueduct. While he may not follow last year's Withers winner Bernardini into the GI Preakness S., Divine Park could be ready to meet some of the best of his generation in the GI Haskell Invitational H.

Divine Park is a member of the third and final crop of Chester House. Owner of a flawless pedigree--by Mr. Prospector out of Grade I winner and super-producer Toussaud (also the dam of Empire Maker, Chiselling, Honest Lady and Decarchy)--Chester House began his career in England.

A maiden winner at two, Chester House took the Listed Steventon S. over 10 furlongs at three, and at the same age was also beaten just a neck in the G2 Prince of Wales's S., and finished third in the G1 Juddmonte International. At four in England, he won the Huxley S. and G3 Brigadier Gerard S., and was again third in the G1 Juddmonte International. In his only start on dirt in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, he stumbled at the start, but still finished fourth, beaten four lengths by Cat Thief, Budroyale and Golden Missile. Despite this bright debut on dirt, the following season Chester House fared best when switched back to the turf, and on that surface won GI Arlington Million S. and finished second in the GI Eddie Read H.

Chester House retired to his breeder's Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms, but unfortunately died from cancer after just three seasons at stud. Chester House sired stakes winners Exceptional Ride, Spring House, Pressed and Houseofroyalhearts in his first crop. In his second crop came Take the Ribbon, a back-type winner who also finished second in the GI Garden City S., and other stakes winners Kalyrra, Latitude Forty and Mighty Martha. Chester House's third crop appears to be his best yet, as in addition to Divine Park, it also contains Warning Zone, who became his sire's first graded scorer when taking the GIII Generous S. at Hollywood Park last November; three-time stakes winner Devil House; and Miss Grillo S. winner Chestoria.

A \$20,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase, Divine Park is the fourth foal from his dam High in the Park. By the English-raced Danzig son Ascot Knight, who was subsequently a useful sire in Canada, High in the Park won three times in 26 starts. She is half sister to the Summer Squall stakes winner Summer Prince, and also to Moonland Princess, the dam of the 2001 Queen's Plate hero T J's Lucky Moon. She is also a half to Hail a Princess, the dam of the stakes winning and graded placed Stormy Atlantic colt All Hail Stormy. Divine Park's granddam Czar's Princess (by the Nijinsky II stallion Czaravich), was a minor winner, but is extremely well-bred. She is half-sister to GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Hollywood Starlet S. heroine Sardula; and to Imperial Gesture, winner of the GI Beldame S. and GI Gazelle H. and runner-up in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Imperial Gesture is by Langfuhr, a son of Danzig, and is bred on very similar lines to Divine Park's dam. Czar's Princess is also a half to Tempest Dancer, a stakes-winning sister to Sardula, who also produced the GIII Stymie H. victor Windrush.

Last week we wrote about Tiznow's son Slew's Tizzy, whose is out of a mare by a son of Seattle Seattle, and who is therefore bred on the same cross as his sire. We pointed out at the time that this pattern is one which is frequently seen, with the most prolific current example being stallions bred on the Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross doing well with Northern Dancer line mares. Six of Chester House's 12 stakes winners are out of Northern Dancer line mares, and the mating of stallions bred on the Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer cross back over Northern Dancer line mares has also been responsible for Group and Grade I winners Commentator, Elusive City, Dark Ending, Roman Ruler, Bandini, Yagli, El Condor Pasa, Voodoo Dancer, Rule of Law, Russian Rhythm, King Kamehameha, Divine Proportions, Alkaseed, Virginia Waters, Hello, Nannina, Almerita, Whipper, Numerous Times, Kela, Circular Quay, Shot of Thunder and Zenda.

Of course, the Mr. Prospector/Northern Dancer combination does have tremendous numbers working for it, but it also has another edge. Mr. Prospector is a Native Dancer/Nearco cross, and that is a reverse of the Nearco/Native Dancer cross which produced Northern Dancer, so everytime Mr. Prospector and Northern Dancer appear together it duplicates influential ancestors through reverse crosses. Divine Park not only has Mr. Prospector, but also three crosses of Northern Dancer, giving four incidences of the combination.

SHOWTIME

Last Saturday was the final day of the 2006-07 British jumping season, and it closed out with the eight-year-old Hot Weld (by the dual Group 3-winning stayer Weld, by Kalaglow) completing a double which had never been achieved before. He followed a win in the four-mile, one-furlong Scottish Grand National at Ayr Apr. 21 with a near all-the-way win in the three-mile, 5 1/2-furlong Betfred Gold Cup at Sandown last Saturday. No horse had ever before won both races, much less seven days apart. That's 62 1/2 furlongs, or seven miles and 6 1/2 furlongs, if you're counting.

So, Street Sense (Street Cry {Ire}) can win the GI Kentucky Derby, even though no winner of the previous 20 GI Breeders' Cup Juveniles has ever completed that double. He has three really important factors in his favor. One, we know he likes the track. Admittedly he cut the corner, but he ran the fastest winning Beyer ever (108) in the Juvenile, and won by a record margin (10 1/2 lengths) at this racetrack. Moreover, his last serious breeze at this racetrack had *Blood-Horse* reporter Steve Haskin in raptures. They have to like Churchill Downs, and he does. Second, he ran in the GI Blue Grass S. The late, great Eddie Gregson, who sent out Gato del Sol to win the 1982 Kentucky Derby from the 18 hole, always said you don't have to win the Blue Grass, you just have to run well in it for the conditioning. Gato del Sol was beaten 5 1/2 lengths in the Blue Grass by Linkage. Street Sense was second, beaten a nose by Dominican (El Corredor), a horse who is three-for-three on the all-weather, and 0-for-four on dirt.

Incidentally, the Blue Grass was notorious long before Andy Beyer was complaining about its reliability as a pointer to future events. Keeneland's old dirt track had a wicked inside rail, and two-turn speed horses enjoyed a huge advantage--which is why the winner of the Blue Grass didn't often win the Derby. And the third reason why Street Sense can break that 0-for-20 hoodoo is his trainer, the wily Carl Nafzger. He trained Unbridled to win the 1991 Kentucky Derby and he knows what it takes. I suspect he also knows he has the right horse, for the first time since Unbridled.

Dangers abound. Street Sense isn't even the favorite, at this writing (admittedly the pool is only £10,000), on the Betting Exchange, Betfair, which is often the most reliable guide to the real odds at which horses are trading. The favorite at 9-2 is Curlin (Smart Strike), winner of all three of his starts, including a 10 1/2-length romp in the GII Arkansas Derby with a 103 Beyer. Plenty of us would be quite happy to see Curlin win, because his sire Smart Strike has been the most underrated top-five sire of the decade.

But Curlin will have to overcome stats of the Hot Weld variety. A horse who was unraced at two hasn't won the Derby since sometime before the Great Depression. Then there is the Michael Tabor/Todd Pletcher duo of GI Florida Derby winner (Beyer 98) Scat Daddy (Johannesburg) and GII Louisiana Derby winner (Beyer 102) Circular Quay (Thunder Gulch); GI Wood Memorial (Beyer 97) winner Nobiz Like Shobiz (Albert the Great); and a host of other contenders. These include another Pletcher duo, both by Distorted Humor and part-owned by WinStar, Cowtown Cat and Any Given Saturday; the J. Paul Reddam duo, Great Hunter (Aptitude) and Liquidity (Tiznow); GI Santa Anita Derby winner (Beyer 100), Tiago (Pleasant Tap); and GII Lane's End winner (Beyer 101) Hard Spun (Danzig). There will be no hiding places and, always, they have to get the trip. It's a 10-furlong race.

Speaking of Danzig, in reviewing the field for the G1 English 2000 Guineas--run earlier Saturday at Newmarket--I went back and looked at the form, and even watched again last year's G1 Dewhurst S., traditionally the top two-year-old race in Europe. Danzig's footprints were all over that race. The winner, unbeaten Teofilo is by Galileo out of a Danehill mare. The next six finishers were all by Danzig-line sires.

In order, they were: Holy Roman Emperor, by Danehill, but retired to stud as a last-minute replacement for George Washington; Strategic Prince, by Danehill's son Dansili; Haatef, by Danzig himself; Vital Equine, by another son of Danehill, Danetime; Rallying Cry, by War Chant, a GI Breeders' Cup Mile winner by Danzig; and Adagio, by Grand Lodge, who was by Danzig's son, Chief's Crown.

After an injury scare, Teofilo was back as Guineas favorite at 11-4 on Betfair Tuesday morning. About everybody who has ever seen Teofilo, including his breeder/owner/trainer (well, he's officially husband of the owner) Jim Bolger, thinks he looks more like a four-year-old than a three-year-old. To my mind, with Holy Roman Emperor out, Teofilo's Dewhurst form entitles him to be hot favorite--especially as Adagio, now the hot second favorite after winning the G3 Craven S., was only seventh behind Teofilo in the Dewhurst. Adagio is currently about 9-2, while the third favorite at 13-2 is, would you believe it, another Danzig, U.S. Ranger, who is trained by Jean-Claude Rouget in the southwest of France. He was an easy winner of the Listed Prix Djebel at Maisons-Laffitte last month.

It is possible the 2000 could be won by a horse without Danzig in his pedigree if impressive G3 Greenham winner Major Cadeaux wins it. Major Cadeaux is by Cadeaux Genereux out of a Woodman daughter of Capades. But that's about it. Even Godolphin's likely runner Truly Royal is by Noverre out of a mare by Danzig's son Polish Precedent. Aidan O'Brien left four in at the six-day stage. Their likely first string is Duke of Marmalade who is by Danehill. His other three entries are all by Danehill's top-class son Rock of Gibraltar. It's roughly 1-to-10 on that Saturday's English 2000 Guineas winner will have Danzig somewhere in his pedigree.

The Classic weekend begins Friday with Churchill's GI Kentucky Oaks. This looks like a strong field this year, headed by Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's A.P. Indy filly Rags to Riches, already a dual Grade I winner at Santa Anita. She is one of three runners for Pletcher in the race. He also has GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies' second Octave (Unbridled's Song) and recent GII Fantasy S. second Cotton Blossom (Broken Vow). Wire-to-wire GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies winner Dreaming of Anna (Rahy) has evidently been training well again at Churchill, and the race will also feature the GII Fantasy S. winner, High Heels, from E Dubai's first crop; and another Paul Reddam duo, Cash Included (Include) and Mistical Plan (Game Plan).

Sunday sees the G1 English 1000 Guineas, for which Bolger also trains the favorite, last year's champion European juvenile filly Finsceal Beo (Mr. Greeley). Second choice is another filly by an American sire, Sander Camillo (Dixie Union), who tied up in her prep race, the G3 Nell Gwyn at Newmarket, but reportedly worked well last weekend. These two have dominated the market for months. **Oppenheim cont.**

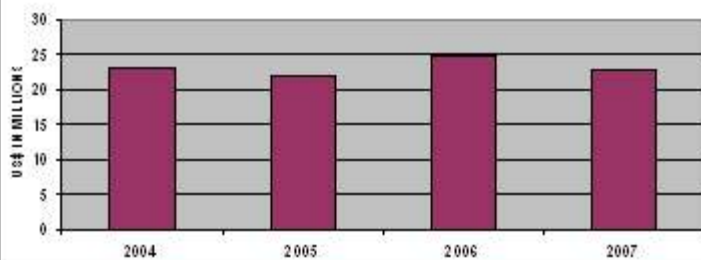

"A near-\$2-million decline in gross at OBS last week made it six out of eight North American Two-Year-Old Sales which declined in 2007, taking the total NA 2yo Sale loss this year to \$23-million. Those eight sales were essentially back to 2004-05 levels, though increases in the 'mixed sale' markets have kept the overall sales losses for the year so far around 4%, to just under \$300-million in gross, against \$312-million last year. 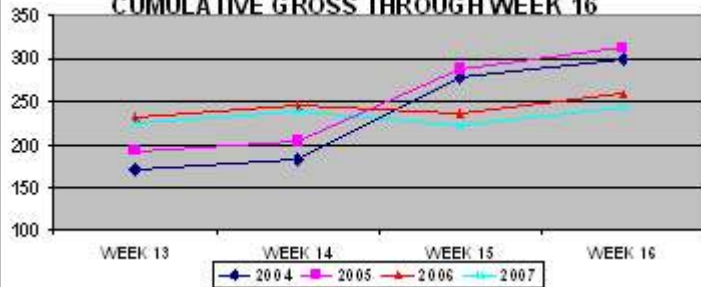

Other contenders include French and Irish prep winners Magic America (High Yield) and Arch Swing (Arch); last year's Goffs' Million winner Miss Beatrix (Danehill Dancer {Ire}); G1 Cheveley Park winner Indian Ink (Indian Ridge {Ire}); and possibly G1 Fillies' Mile winner Simply Perfect (also Danehill Dancer). Sheikh Hamdan's recent Newmarket maiden winner Yaqeem, by Danzig's son Green Desert, is well fancied. She is trained by the hugely respected Michael Jarvis, which shortens her price. And Sander Camillo's Nell Gwyn conqueress Scarlet Runner (Night Shift) is 35-1. That looks generous.

El Corredor Leads Third-Crop Sires...

Dominican may be a 20-1 longshot to win the GI Kentucky Derby--as noted above, he's 0-for-four on dirt, including two third-place finishes at Churchill last fall-- but he's three-for-three on the all-weather, including two wins in two starts this year--Turfway's Rushaway S. and Keeneland's GI Blue Grass. His \$527,000 in 2007 earnings have taken his sire El Corredor back into the lead in cumulative progeny earnings among North American third-crop sires, according to figures supplied by The Jockey Club Information Systems. Runner-up to Tiznow as Leading Freshman Sire of 2005, El Corredor has now sired 67 winners, and the earners of more than \$5.4 million. He's sired six stakes winners, five from his first crop including GI winner Adieu, plus Dominican, the only stakes winner so far among 93 foals in his second crop. Broken Vow, who has Fantasy second Cotton Blossom going in Friday's GI Kentucky Oaks, leads this group in number of winners (83) and stakes winners (10). He currently ranks second in cumulative progeny earnings. Florida sire Trippi is second in number of winners (73) and third in progeny earnings, followed by the group's sophomore sire leader in 2006, Aptitude, who is represented by Great Hunter in the Derby. City Zip is fifth, followed by Point Given (eight stakes winners) and another Florida stallion punching above his weight, Exchange Rate. Then comes Tiznow, back up to eighth after slipping to 16th on last year's sophomore sire list. He has longshot Liquidity going in the Derby. He is followed by Songandaprayer, Forest Camp, Brahms, Five Star Day and Albert the Great, sire of a live Derby hope in GI Wood Memorial winner Nobiz Like Shobiz. Put It Back, Ecton Park and Freud also have cumulative progeny earnings over \$2.5 million to date.

In Other Contests...

Tomorrow is Local Election Day in England, as well as the voting for the Scottish Parliament and Welsh Assembly. Predictions are that the governing Labour Party is going to get hammered, which should result in sitting Prime Minister Tony Blair handing over to Chancellor Gordon Brown sometime pretty soon. In Scotland, the Scottish National Party is 1-to-3 to end up with the most seats in the Scottish Parliament, which may result in their party leader, horse racing fan Alex Salmond, becoming Scottish First Minister in a coalition with the Liberal Democrats and even the Greens. That's the betting, anyway. The second and final round of the French presidential election is Sunday, May 6. Nicolas Sarkozy is 1-to-4 to win over his Socialist rival, Segolene Royal. MGM MIRAGE WITHDRAWS FROM NYRA VLT DEAL by Tom Precious, courtesy of www.bloodhorse.com.

After months of intense negotiations, MGM Mirage has ended its deal with the New York Racing Association to build and operate a video lottery terminal casino at Aqueduct. The surprising announcement by the Las Vegas-based company will add further questions to the future of the racing franchise since MGM was, by law, in line to run the Aqueduct VLT facility no matter which entity wins the expiring NYRA franchise. The decision came as NYRA officials were predicting the sides were close to reaching a final deal with the state on a long-awaited agreement to let the Aqueduct project begin. "We have worked closely with NYRA and the state of New York for almost four years on this project," MGM Mirage chairman and chief executive officer Terry Lanni said in a statement. "It has been fraught with obstacles, ranging from NYRA's legal difficulties, its Chapter 11 filing, uncertainties concerning the grant of the racing franchise upon the expiration of NYRA's current franchise at the end of 2007, disputes between NYRA and the state, as well as escalating costs for the project. While we came close to reaching an agreement with the state and NYRA, certain unresolved issues have caused us to withdraw from this opportunity. We expended a lot of resources, time, and effort on the project, and regret that it did not come to fruition." NYRA chairman Steven Duncker called the situation disappointing. "Certainly, we had a very long road with them and I wish that they hadn't come to this decision, but certainly we have some avenues," he said. Duncker, who has been closely involved in the talks between NYRA, MGM, and the administration of New York Gov. Eliot Spitzer, said NYRA is now looking to enlist other VLT partners for Aqueduct "or other means of borrowing the money." The project had grown to \$215 million, which MGM was funding. "We will certainly keep trying to get this built," Duncker said, despite the fact NYRA has only eight months left on its Thoroughbred franchise to operate Aqueduct, Belmont Park, and Saratoga. REQUEST FOR PAROLE RETIRED Eight-year-old Request for Parole (Judge TC--Madison's Quest, by Deputy Minister), a Grade I winner with earnings of \$1,372,224, has been retired due to a chip in his knee, *The Blood-Horse* reports. Bred in Kentucky by Robert

and Bea Roberts, the dark bay was sold privately to owners Sam and Jeri Knighton after his second start, a maiden victory at Ellis Park in July of 2001. He captured the Ellis Park Juvenile S. in his first outing for his new connections, and ended his two-year-old campaign with second-place efforts in the GIII Iroquois S. and GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. Request for Parole opened 2002 with a pair of Turfway stakes scores before finishing third by a neck in the GII Spiral S. That earned him a trip to

the GI Kentucky Derby, where he ran fifth, less than 10 lengths behind War Emblem. In six seasons at the track, the veteran won five stakes, including the GI United Nations H. in 2004. He was also second in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. that year, and came back to be third in the 2005 edition of the U.N. An allowance winner at Gulfstream in March of 2006, Request for Parole was off the board in his next seven starts, and was retired after finishing seventh in a Keeneland allowance Apr. 7. Overall, he compiled a record of 51-10-7-4. Stud plans have not yet been decided.

CHURCHILL LAUNCHES ACCOUNT WAGERING

Churchill Downs will launch its new advance deposit wagering service, TwinSpires, today at 9 a.m. The service will be available to accept wagers on this weekend's GI Kentucky Derby and GI Kentucky Oaks. Once the site is launched this morning, customers can register for the new account-wagering service by visiting www.twinspires.com and clicking the "Register Now" button. An initial minimum deposit of \$50 is required and accounts can be accessed on the web site or via telephone at 1-877-SPIRES. There is no fee to register, wager or maintain an account and TwinSpires offers free live video streaming of races and free race replays to all wagering customers. "Thousands of customers have expressed interest in signing up for a TwinSpires account," said TwinSpires President Vernon Niven. "TwinSpires offers customers a modern, convenient and secure way to place wagers on horse races from around the country, so they can still get in on the action if they can't make it to a racetrack or simulcast-wagering center."

EQUINE EQUITY ACT INTRODUCED

U.S. Sen. Mitch McConnell of Kentucky introduced legislation April 30 designed to promote investment in the horse industry by removing unfair provisions of federal law that favor other investments. The Equine Equity Act of 2007 would reduce the capital gains holding period for horses and allow horse owners to depreciate all racehorses over the same period. The proposed Equine Equity Act has been supported by the American Horse Council and National Thoroughbred Racing Association. "While I know that Kentucky's horse industry is most closely associated with the Derby, it is important to remember that horses remain Kentucky's largest agricultural product," McConnell, a Republican, said in a statement. "The horse industry contributes \$3.5 billion to the commonwealth's economy and employs 50,000 Kentuckians year round." The McConnell bill reduces the capital gains holding period for horses from 24 months to 12 months, which is the case with most capital assets. Currently, horses must be held for two years to receive capital gains treatment. The legislation also applies equal depreciation standards for all racehorses. Current law states that racehorses that begin training when older than 24 months of age are depreciated over three years, while horses that begin training before reaching 24 months of age are depreciated over seven years. Most horses begin training before they reach 24 months, but their racing careers do not last seven years. The bill reduces the depreciation period to three years to more accurately reflect the racing life of horses. The Equine Equity Act is co-sponsored by Senators Jim Bunning, a Kentucky Republican, and Blanche Lincoln, an Arkansas Democrat.

Competition Heats Up as TVG Expands Distribution:

In a move that will broaden its reach to nearly 26 million homes in the United States--and perhaps heighten its competition with a rival racing network--TVG announced May 1 it has amended its distribution agreement with DIRECTV to expand the scope and duration of its carriage. The long-term amended agreement will deliver TVG programming to more than eight million DIRECTV subscribers and strengthen TVG's position in the marketplace, according to a release. TVG is the only horseracing network available to DIRECTV customers. HRTV, the racing network owned in partnership by Churchill Downs Inc. and Magna Entertainment Corp., isn't available through DIRECTV. In a March interview with *The Blood-Horse*, MEC Chief Executive Officer Michael Neuman indicated HRTV was looking to expand its reach. "TV distribution is highly competitive," Neuman said. "Cable and satellite companies are sensitive to programming changes. DIRECTV may want to have a conversation with HRTV." CDI and MEC recently formed TrackNet Media Group, which is buying and selling simulcast signals. TrackNet Media and TVG, which has exclusive contracts for its most popular content, have been unable to strike a deal to share content. Thus, the competition between HRTV and TVG has gotten stiffer.
